




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

TIP BOOK #1

INT TO FP CONVERT: Converts Integer BASIC to Applesoft. Then you must correct syntax. See INT/FP CONVERTER; it's better.

FP TO INT CONVERT: You must correct syntax FIRST.

DENSITY: How dense (lbs./in.) are you? Your wife? Your dog?

INTEGER FLASHER: Now Integer Basic can flash non-letters.

RUNDOWN: A nice greeting program. Rename it "Down".

WHY DOES THIS DO THIS? A Lo-Res mystery.

AND THIS? A common DOS occurrence.

RANDOMRACE! A race between a red dot and a white dot.

INT DECIMAL QUOTIENTS: Not normally possible in INT.

INT RUN COUNTER: Counts number of RUNs.

PACK MY BOX: A letter sorter. The shortest sentence we know with all 26 letters is "Pack my box with five dozen liquor jugs." Find one shorter.

LO-RES TEST PATTERN: Sorts colors by grey-value.

JACK'S TEXT PRINTER: Dump text to your printer.

ASCII SCREEN PRINTER: Make your own free chart.

IMPRESS YOUR FRIENDS: A many-number adder.

NUMBER ROUNDER: Rounds numbers.

NAKED CITY: A thrill a minute! List it and learn.

TIP BOOK #2

VISI-SORT: An alphabetizer.

DAUGHTER OF EYES: Self-explanatory.

SECRET DE-CODER: Works only without a lower-case chip.

AND WHY THIS? FP math is strange!

TWO-LINER CARTOON#1: Thump-thump...

HANDY-WIPE: A waste of time. Don't run it.

WORDSTAR: Not on this disk. What do you want for \$20?

APPLESOFT CRUISE: Peeks at Apple's ROM.

TYPING TEST: Might need calibration for your Apple. Time it and adjust Line 30.

TEXT FORMAT: Apple's text layout.

PDL CHECKER: Should report 0 to 255 for both paddles and light up with button-presses. A joystick checker too.

GOSUB POKER: List and learn.

BETTER GETTER#1: Accepts inverse input and leading spaces.

BETTER GETTER#2: Accepts COMMAS and COLONS. Hooray!

MARQUEE: Traveling words.

LINE TRACER: Which line is being executed?

RND CHART: Fun, but sometimes repeats itself.

THE GREAT TRACE MYSTERY: Can you explain?

TOKEN LISTER #1 & #2: Both zap their first lines.

DENUMBER: List BEFORE you run.

REM EXPANDER: List BEFORE you run.

TIP BOOK #4

SHAPES: This file is BLOADED for the next four.

SHAPE DISPLAY: Displays the above.

ROT TEST: A rotating arrow.

SCALE TEST: An expanding box.

COLLISION TEST: Peeks location 234.

VISI-FRAME: Text framer.

VOWEL SCRAMBLER: A reil pein.

GUESSTIMATION: Have an infinite number of people (or fewer) guess the size of a dollar bill or something else rectangular. Their average guess should be correct(?).

STRIPE-CAT: Not a better catalogger. Just different.

BIT SPLITTER: A nice Binary demo.

WEATHER CHART: Enter each day's high and low temperature to make an informative hi-res graph. Instructions—

1. Run Weather Dates Writer
2. Load Weather Chart.
3. Exec Weather Chart.
4. Save Weather Chart.
5. Run Weather Chart.

WEATHER DATES WRITER: See above.

BATON GETTER: Better than a hit in the eye with a flashing cursor.


BATON ROLLER: Text animation!
