The program allows the teacher to write tests, tutorials, or practice lessons. The lessons will provide immediate feedback to the student and complete recordkeeping for the teacher.

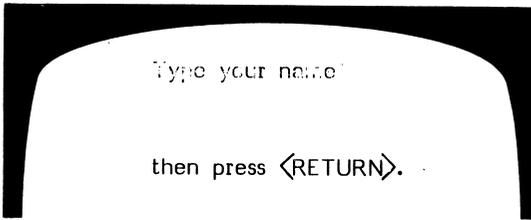
STARTING FROM SCRATCH

This disk will boot on a 3.3 Disk Operating System.

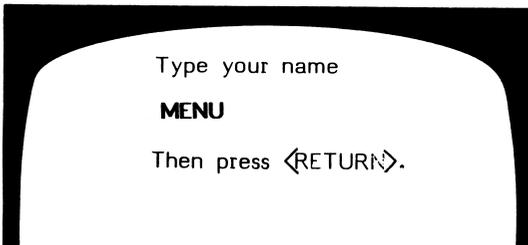
When running this program on the Apple IIe, you must keep the CAPS LOCK key down; the LOCK key on the Franklin ACE 1000.

Put the disk in Drive #1; close the door. Turn on your computer. If you are using an Apple II Plus, or Apple Ile, the disk will boot automatically when you turn on the computer.

If you have an Apple II, type **PR#6** and press **RETURN**. The program will load into you computer and run automatically - don't type catalog!



If you or a student were running the lessons, you would type in the name and press RETURN. However, you can't run lessons until you have written them! To put in your lessons, go directly to the Teacher's MENU. The teacher's programs are accessed by using the name **MENU** when the following screen is shown:



The following MENU will be shown:



This will tell you how much space is available. One lesson will take 10-20 sectors.

This MENU allows you to

1. Create your own lessons.
2. Make changes in those lessons after you have created them.
3. Delete a lesson. You may want to use this to get rid of an experimental lesson or to delete lessons your students have used to make room for new lessons. The disk will hold from 10 to 20 lessons, depending on the number of frames (instructions, questions, hints, explanations) in a lesson.
4. Check student results.
5. Return to the "Type your name." frame for the student to run the lesson.
6. See the "catalog" which will list the lessons you have created.
7. Print out the lessons you have created.

The following pages will describe exactly how to use each of these programs on the Teacher's MENU.

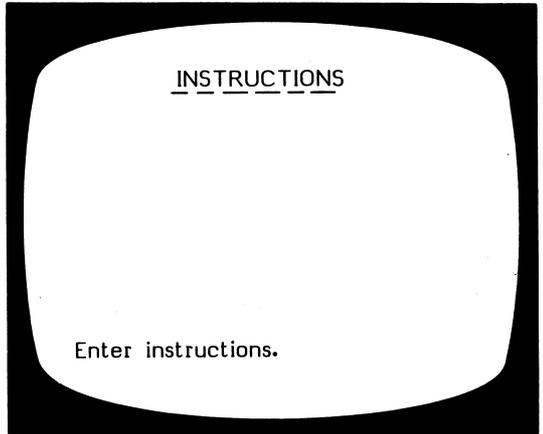
Start by selecting the first option on the MENU.

1 - CREATE A NEW LESSON

After selecting 1, from the MENU, this frame is the first to appear:

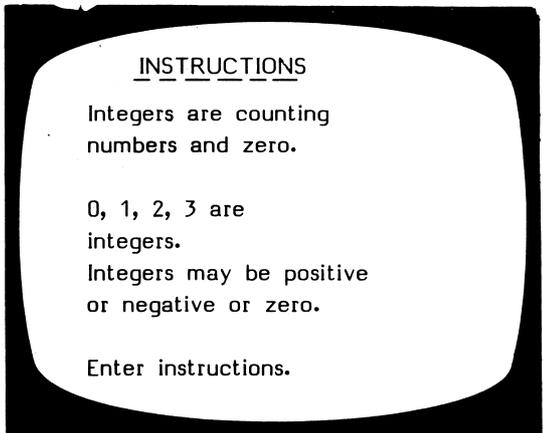
To back up a
line or frame,
use the ← key.



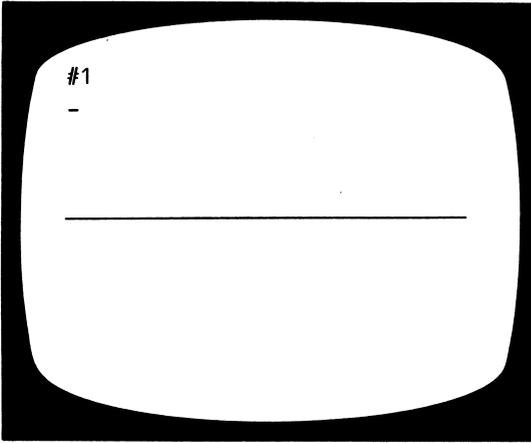
To capitalize a letter, press the ' ^ ' just before the letter to be capitalized. To make a blank in a question, use the '@' sign.

The Instruction frames may be accessed at any time by pressing 'H' when a response is called for.

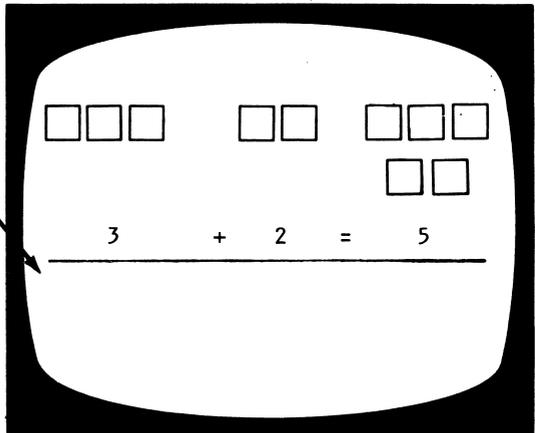

Information Frame

This frame requires no response.

The % in the answer's place will indicate to the computer that there will be no answer.



Question Frame

These may take any format you would like.

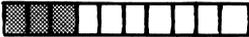

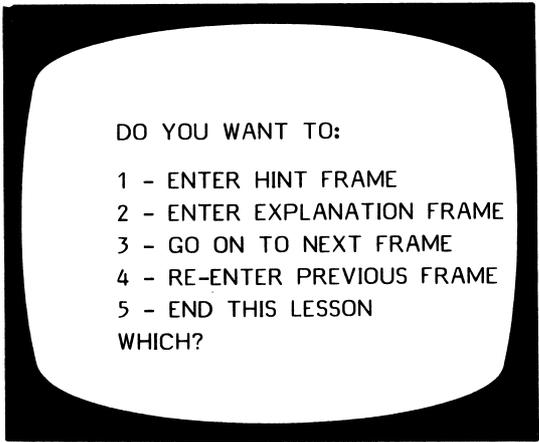

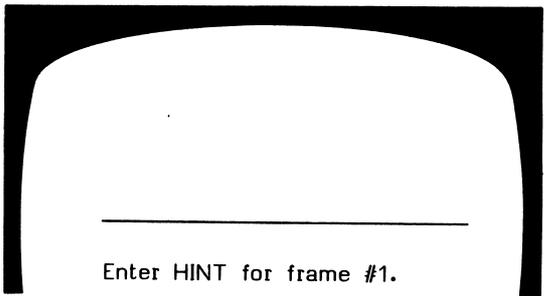
Many commonly requested 'shapes' have been stored in the computer. You may use these in your lessons just as if they were letters. The keys to use to create these shapes are listed on page 25.

After entering a question frame, you will be branched to this secondary MENU:



This allows you to enter a 'Hint' frame or an 'Explanation' Frame. The hint frame will be shown to the student after he misses the question. If you wish to enter a Hint frame for the first question, select 1 - **Enter hint frame** and this will appear:

You may enter 6 lines. Either text or graphics may be displayed.

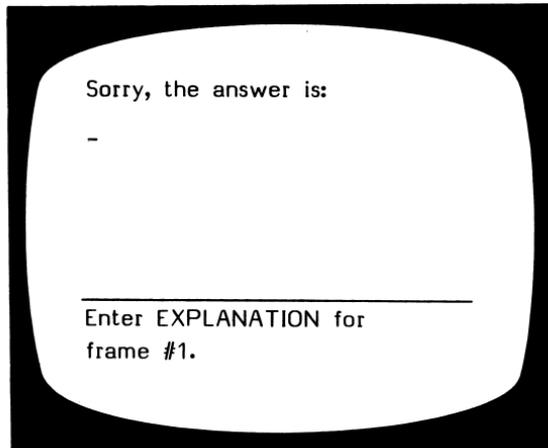


After entering the hint frame, and pressing **RETURN**, the computer will automatically place you at Frame #2, ready to write the next question or information frame.

Select **2 - Enter explanation frame**. This would be used when a hint might not be appropriate, but you want to give the student feedback other than just the answer. The Explanation frame will be shown to the student after he has missed the question on his last try. (The number of tries is set by the teacher at the end of the lesson.)

You may enter 6 lines.

You may enter graphics or text.



3 - Go on to next frame

This simply allows you to go to the next consecutive frame without entering a hint or explanation frame for the previous frame.

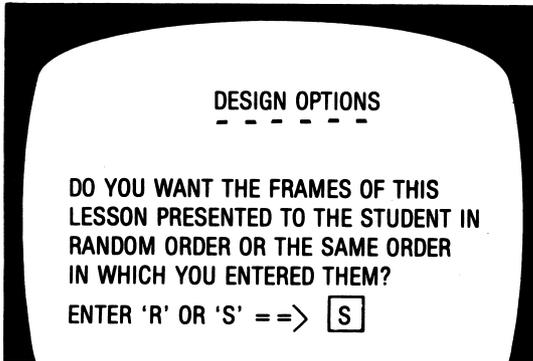
You may **4 - Re-enter Previous Frame** if you have given a hint frame and want to look at the question frame you just entered.

Selecting **5 - End This Lesson** will take you to the **DESIGN OPTIONS** for the lesson you have just entered. The first frame will ask you to enter the concept being taught, i.e.,

CONCEPT: COUNTING BY 2'S-3'S-4'S

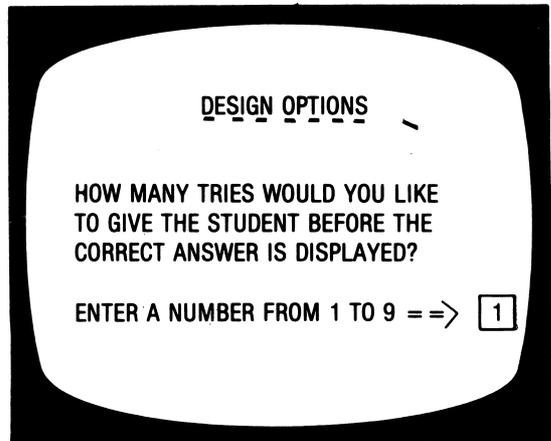
This will be used in the Student Planning section.

The first of the Design Options will be given:



For instructional lessons that are carefully sequenced, you would want them presented in the same order. For drill or tests, you may want random order.

If you are using hint option, you will need at least 2 tries.



The following 'Student Safeguards' allow you to set the criteria upon which the computer will branch to the end of the lesson. It is the philosophy of the teachers who designed this disk that if a lesson is too easy or too difficult, the computer should terminate the lesson. The TEACHER should make the new prescription.

STUDENT SAFEGUARDS

IF THE STUDENT IS DOING POORLY,
THE LESSON WILL TERMINATE IF HE/SHE
HAS LESS THAN % CORRECT ON THE
FIRST TRY.

(ENTER A NUMBER FROM 1 TO 49)

The next question relates to the above decision.

STUDENT SAFEGUARDS

EVEN IF THE STUDENT IS DOING
POORLY, AT LEAST 4 FRAMES
WILL BE PRESENTED BEFORE THE
LESSON IS TERMINATED.

(ENTER A NUMBER FROM 1 TO 25)

You will need to skip at least some frames. If you don't, the lesson will terminate on the first frame if there is an error (0% will be below any % that you set in the previous step).

STUDENT SAFEGUARDS

IF A STUDENT IS DOING WELL, THE
LESSON WILL TERMINATE AFTER 10
CONSECUTIVE CORRECT ANSWERS
ON THE FIRST TRY.

(ENTER A NUMBER FROM 1 TO 25)

If there is a variety of skills taught or reviewed in one lesson, you may want the student to complete all the work no matter how well he/she does on the first 10. If so, change to 25.

Note: By using the random order option and the Design Options, this disk was designed to allow you to create a modifiable item pool. Rather than drawing a specific number of items, the items will be used until the student meets the criteria you specified (in terms of the number of items in a row correct).

This type of criteria was considered preferable to a % because it takes into account the fact that the child may do poorly in the beginning but learn the concept during the lesson and begin to answer all items correctly.

The student safeguards do not apply to these questions. The authors assumed the teacher would want all missed items reviewed.

After the 'Design Options' and 'Student Safeguards' you will then be asked if you want to

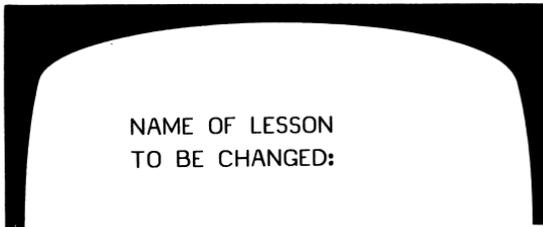
SAVE THIS LESSON? (Y/N)

You must then enter the LESSON NAME: Keep it short. Two or three letters is sufficient to identify the lesson. The computer will store your lesson and you will then be returned to the Main MENU.

2 - CHANGE AN EXISTING LESSON

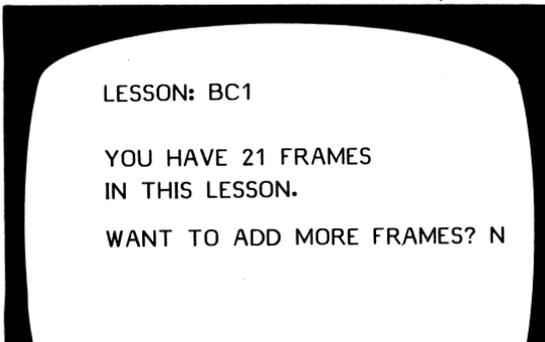
If you wish to change a lesson that you have written, select 2 from the Main MENU.

First, you will need to identify the lesson you wish to change or add to.

A lesson may have up to **30** frames.

If you want to increase the number of frames, type **Y**. You will then be asked:



After indicating the number of frames you wish to add to the lesson, the 'Instructions' frame will be shown with the option of changing it by indicating **Y** or **N**. If you answer **Y** the cursor will move to the first line of the instructions. You may then type new instructions. If you don't wish to change a line, just press **RETURN** to move the cursor to the next line.

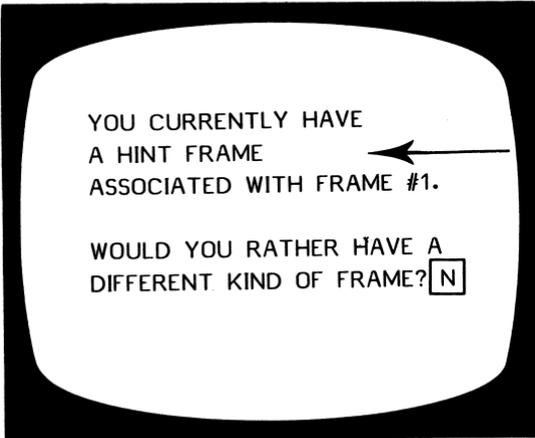
Next, you will be shown the frame you wish to add. (If the lesson already had 19 items, Frame #20 will appear blank; the cursor on the first line, ready for you to type in the item. After entering the item, you will then branch to the secondary MENU (see page 6) so that you may enter either a hint or explanation frame. When adding frames to an existing lesson you cannot use **3 - Go on to next frame** unless you have indicated that you are adding more than one frame.

If you just wish to change some of the lessons and not add new items, type **N** to the question:

ADD MORE FRAMES? (Y/N)

You will be shown all the frames as they exist. If you wish to change a line, type in the new line. If no change is desired, press **RETURN** to go on to the next line. Use the ← key to back up to the preceding line or frame. Use → key as a short cut to go from frame to frame.

After each question frame, one of these messages will appear:



You may use a Hint frame, or Explanation frame, or No Extra Frame.

If you answer **N** and press **RETURN**, the computer takes you to the next frame for changing. (In this case, it would be the Hint frame for Frame #1.) If you reply **Y**, you will be branched to the secondary MENU (see page 6 for complete explanation of all items on this Menu), for your entry.

From this Menu you can:

- 1 - add a hint frame,
- 2 - add an explanation frame,
- or
- you can eliminate a hint frame by selecting
- 3 - go on to next frame.

YOU CANNOT HAVE BOTH A HINT FRAME AND AN EXPLANATION FRAME FOR ONE QUESTION.

After you end this lesson, the computer automatically branches you to the Design Options as they were originally set, and you will be given the chance to change the Design Options if desired. Then the question:

SAVE THIS LESSON? (Y/N)

Type **Y** if you want the corrections to replace the lines that were in the original list. Type **N** if you have changed your mind about the corrections or additional frames, or did not make any.

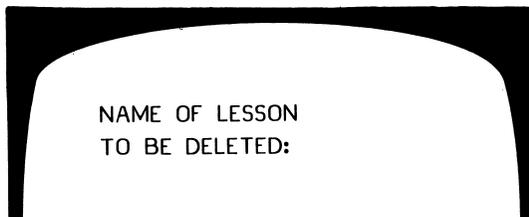
If you type **Y**, you will be given the chance to change the lesson name, if desired.

If you only want to change a few frames, you may branch to the end by typing 'END' and press **RETURN**, on the first line of a frame. These 3 letters will tell the computer to save only the changes up to that frame. The other frames in the lesson will remain the same.

(Teachers are always unbelievers when it comes to this. Experiment with a lesson you don't want to keep-see how it works!)

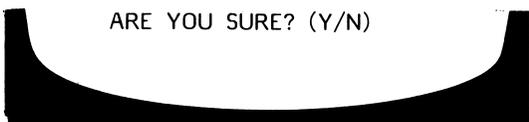
3 - DELETE A LESSON

Bring up the Main MENU and select **3 - Delete a Lesson**. This frame will appear:

Type the name of the lesson you want deleted and press **RETURN**. You will be asked:

If you reply **Y**, the lesson will be deleted. If you've changed your mind, type **N** and the lesson will not be deleted. If **N**, you will be returned to the Main MENU.

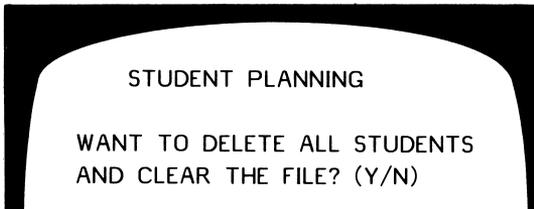
CAUTION: Be sure you want to delete a lesson--once it's gone, you can't get it back unless you retype it in by means of the Create a New Lesson program on the Main MENU.

4 - STUDENT PLANNING

As a student works through a lesson, the errors that he/she makes are recorded into the Student Planning file. To see this file, bring up the Main MENU:

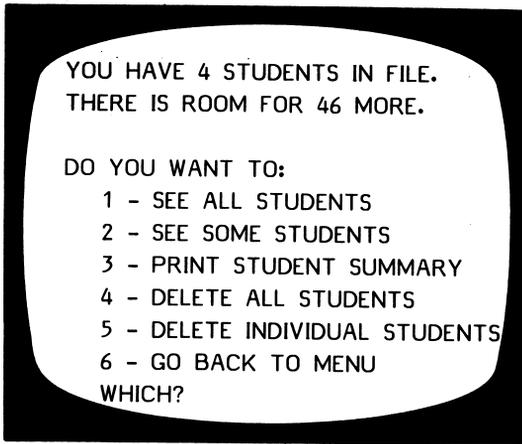


and select **4 - Student Planning**. The first frame to appear is:



type **N** if you want to see the file; **Y** if you want to completely erase all student results. Press **RETURN**.

If you typed **N**, indicating you would like to see the file and not erase it, this frame will appear:



If you choose **1 - SEE ALL STUDENTS**, the computer asks:

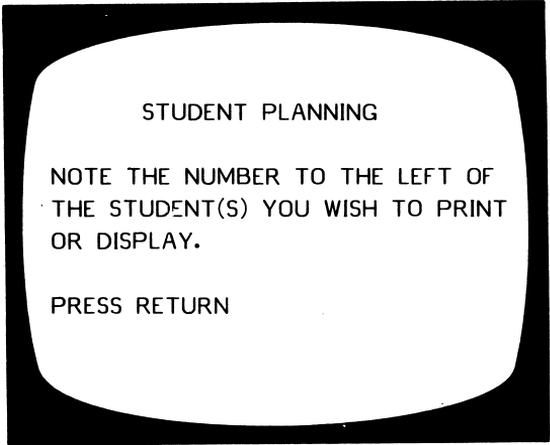
ARE YOU USING A PRINTER? (Y/N)

If **Y**, it will ask for the slot. Then all records will be printed.

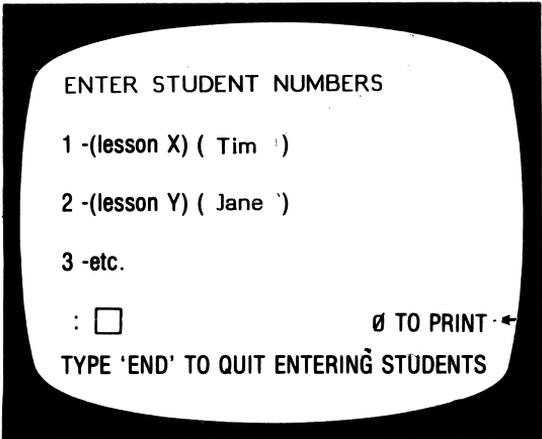
If you are not using a printer, results will be displayed on the screen. Scrolling of results is under control of the teacher.

If you want to see only some of the students, select **2 - SEE SOME STUDENTS** and press **RETURN**.

The frame on the following page appears.

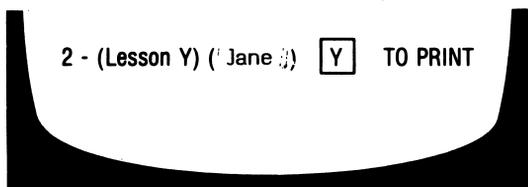


As you select the students whose records you want to view, you will be typing just the number.

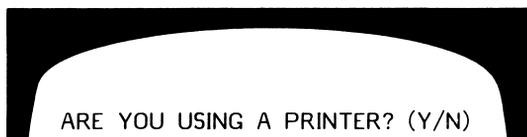


The computer keeps a running tally on the number of students you have selected.

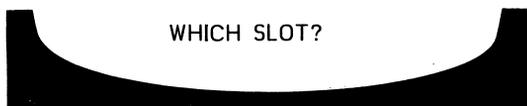
Type the number of a student you want to see and press **RETURN**. For example: If you type **2**, the lesson name and student name will appear at the bottom of the frame with a default value **Y** to indicate that is the student you wish to see. This gives you a chance to change your mind and enter **N** if you don't want to see that particular student.



Continue selecting students whose records you want to see. When you have entered all of the students you wish to see, type **END** (in place of another number). This frame will appear:



If you type **N**, the records will come up on your monitor screen. If you type **Y**, you will be asked:



It will usually be **1** or **2**. If you are not sure, take off the cover and check. The printout will be in the following format:

PRESS RETURN

After all the information is displayed, you will be asked:

WANT TO DELETE ALL STUDENTS
AND CLEAR THE FILE? (Y/N)

Respond as desired.

The **ESC** key may be pressed at any time to terminate display or printout of student results. A maximum of **50** records can be stored in this Student Planning file before they must be emptied. To empty the file, answer **Y** to the question at the end of the display/printout, or use option **4** from the Student Planning Menu - **Delete all students.**

3 - PRINT STUDENT SUMMARY from the Student Planning MENU allows you to see or printout a summary of records for the entire class. The summary is in the following format:

The printout of the Student Summary will include more information than you can see on the screen. The printout includes: the skill statement and the number correct/number of questions.

4 - DELETE ALL STUDENTS

If you want to clear all of your records, use this option.

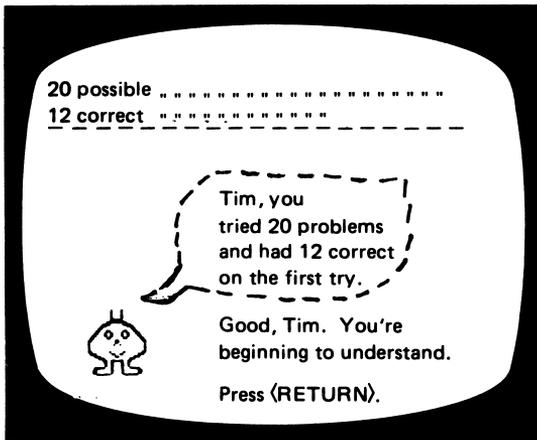
5 - DELETE INDIVIDUAL STUDENT RECORDS

A number of teachers have asked for this option. This is most valuable when a variety of teachers are using the same disk. This allows you to print the records of just a few of your students and then erase only those selected records from the file.

5 - RUN LESSONS

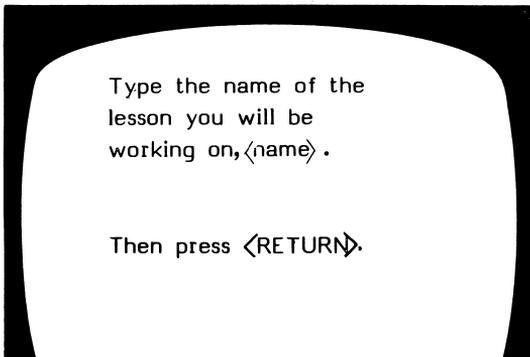
After you have created a lesson, go through it as a student. This will allow you to check the grammar, spelling, and format. It will also show you the way the student results are displayed and, of course, introduce you to GORB. GORB is a little graphic that 'tells' the student how well he/she did on the lesson just completed. He appears after all items have been completed or if a student escapes out of a program. He also appears as a reinforcer within the lessons.

6 - CATALOG DISK

This file keeps a list of all lessons you have created. This file may also be accessed by typing ? when this frame appears:

After indicating the lesson to be printed, and the slot your printer is in, a printout of the lesson indicated will be given.

Note: This will not print out a worksheet for the student.

The option to print out the lessons has been added to allow you to edit your lessons more easily.

The shapes are not *ASCII. They may, or may not print out. The may be shown as &8!

ASCII is a standard code when you type a letter. The printer prints a letter; when you type &8, the printer will not know to make the shape, it will just type &8!

CREATING SHAPES

To type the shapes on the screen, you need to use two keys. The combination of these two keys 'tell' the computer that you want a special shape.

You must always push the '&' sign before the next character to produce a symbol. i.e. (SHIFT) & then 1 = x

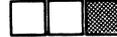

SUGGESTIONS FOR USE

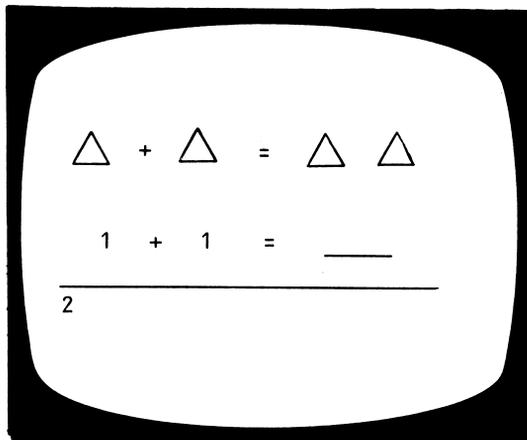
This disk is a culmination of suggestions from teachers across the country who have been using other Hartley Create programs.

Although the limited room on the frames makes this disk most appropriate for elementary grades, some secondary teachers have used it effectively.

Drill & Practice

You may use the instructions followed by 30 questions. These may be randomly presented. The Design Options may be used to terminate the lesson when the student reaches the specified performance level.

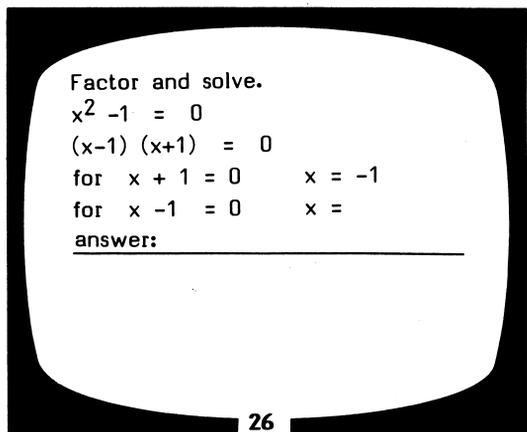

This program has also been used for such diverse things as:

- teaching students to use the library.
- working with LD students to develop sequencing skills .
- matching vocabulary with definitions.

Any instructional sequence which could be more effectively presented with the information broken down into small steps would fit nicely on this disk.

Note: You can save lessons you have created only on a Create-LESSONS back-up disk. Simply use the **Change An Existing Lesson** file. Load the lesson into the computer. On the first line of the first frame shown, type 'END'. Go through the Design Options and when it asks you, "WANT SAVE THIS LESSON? (Y/N) SWITCH DISKS, and then say **YES!** You cannot save the lessons on a blank disk.

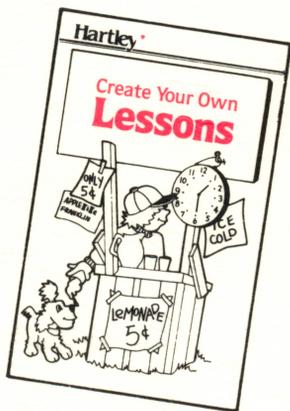

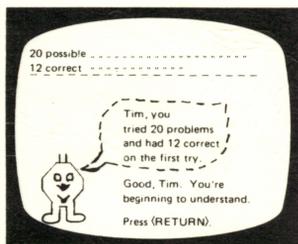

This program allows you to easily write your own tutorials, drills, or tests. Each lesson may begin with 9 lines of instruction followed by questions or additional instructional frames. Questions may be followed by HINT frames or EXPLANATIONS.

Ideas and suggestions from computer-using teachers all over the country have been used to develop this disk.

Questions may be random or sequential; students may return to instructional frames. The teacher sets the number of tries, and criteria for branching.

Large, upper/lower case letters, and recordkeeping (individual and class) are included.

This disk has special graphic symbols for l , $^{\circ}$ (degree), $<$, $>$, $=$, $-$, $+$, \div , \times , the exponents 2 and 3 , \square , \blacksquare , \triangle , and the number line.

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
