REVIEW AND

he year 1987 is history, and 1988 looms ahead of us. Although the year ahead holds many uncertainties, it's safe to say that more and more people will be using computers, and a lot of those computers will be Apples. To help put things into perspective, I like taking a look backward and a look forward at the beginning of each new year.

Looking Back

Looking back at last year, I see a lot of

bright spots. Apple-Fest in San Francisco attracted more than 20,000 people, who were so enthusiastic that the show felt like a revival meeting for the Ap-

ple II. The Apple IIe continued to sell in large quantities and remains the #1 computer in schools. Apple sold more than a quarter million IIGs computers, and quite a few software companies finally shipped their long-awaited IIGS products. Many new companies started up and introduced many new Apple II software and hardware products. MS-DOS came to the Apple II Plus, IIe, and IIGs in the form of PC Transporter, which outperforms the IBM PC and many of its clones. And A + was voted "Best Computer Magazine" by the Computer Press Association.

Last year had some dark spots as well. Technical problems slowed down shipments of the IIGs, forced Apple to upgrade the IIGs's video chip (thankfully the company did so at no charge), and delayed the delivery of key elements of IIGs system software, which in turn delayed delivery of many software products. Some good companies either went belly-up or abandoned the Apple II market. And Apple started pitching the Mac Plus as the computer for the so-called "home office."

That last point particularly irks me because, despite what Apple says, many more people are using Apple IIs for home businesses than are using Macintoshes. Just take a look at the numbers. Apple has shipped somewhat more than a million Macintoshes, of which about a third have shipped to the education market. Of the remaining two-thirds, some have sold to people at home, others to small businesses, and some to large corporations. Thus, about a half a million Macintoshes are being used in businesses, with a smaller number in home offices. On the

That's right**year for** probably twice as many Apple IIs are being used in businesses as Macin-

toshes. Apple knows that, because AppleWorks (a business product) has sold way more copies than has any business-software program for the Macintosh. Now, it's true, the Mac is better suited for the needs of corporate America, but a home office is different from a corporate office, and for a home office, the Apple II-not the Mac Plus—is definitely the way to go.

If you have a computer at home, even as an office computer, you probably want to use it for other things as well. The Apple II, especially the IIGS with its color graphics, is better suited than the Mac Plus for home purposes such as entertainment, children's education, and even adult education. Since a computer is a significant expense, you should try to find as many produc-

tive and enjoyable uses for the computer as you can to try to maximize your investment.

Despite Apple's overzealous attitude towards the Macintosh, the fact remains that there are more homes and schools than there are corporations; I'm sure that the Apple II will continue to sell well into the "home office" market as well as the education market. And speaking of predictions, here's a look into my crystal ball for the year ahead.

Looking Forward

The year 1988 promises to be an exciting one for the Apple II. Three things I think will be of major significance to the Apple II in 1988 are local-area networks, CD-ROM drives, and desktop publishing.

With 1988, the local-area network may finally come of age in the Apple II market. Corvus, the pioneer in Apple II networking, has undergone a major business reorganization that places a greatly increased emphasis on Apple II networks. A group of A + editors recently visited a Corvus test site at San Jose High Academy and were impressed with how smoothly more than 200 Apple IIs were performing together. Other companies such as LanTech and Velan are also offering local-area networks for the Apple II. And any time now we expect Apple to announce the long-awaited AppleTalk network for the Apple II.

Networks provide many benefits to education and small-business users, such as fast data transfer and the ability to allow many computers to share the same peripherals, such as hard-disk drives, printers, and modems. Once localarea-network technology is better developed, the IIGs's built-in AppleTalk network will give the IIGS a major advantage over IBM and compatible offerings in the education and small-business markets. And although Microsoft is still working on IBM's OS/2 Presentation Manager, which makes an IBM system work like a Macintosh, the IIGs already has its own graphical operating system, which is more like the Mac's than any-


thing from Microsoft or IBM.

A CD-ROM is a compact optical data-storage disk similar to the audio compact-disc systems you find in home-stereo systems. A CD-ROM is analogous to a read-only hard disk that can store a whopping 500 megabytes of information. Unlike a hard disk, however, a CD-ROM can only be read from, hence the ROM designation. And, thanks to the manufacturing capacity the music industry has created for audio CDs, CD-ROMs can be inexpensively reproduced.

CD-ROM drives and data disks are already available for the Apple II from a few small companies, but in 1988 Apple is expected to light a fire under the CD-ROM market by introducing its own CD-ROM drive. Apple's CD-ROM drive will set hardware and software format standards for Apple II CD-ROM products, which will encourage more companies to develop CD-ROM products. CD-ROMs also tie in with the Apple IIGs; the IIGs graphics files and sound files can take up gobs of memory, which is just what the CD-ROM has to offer. The IIGs is a much better audiovisual computer than the IBM PC or even AT and compatibles-I've often thought that the IIGs would make a dandy CD-ROM player, so to speak.

The third major area of excitement for the Apple II world in 1988 will be desktop publishing. Desktop publishing has become a major product category on the Mac and IBM PC—as testimony: the Page-Maker page-layout program has now become the fourth-best-selling personal-computer software program. Many companies are hard at work developing ambitious desktop-publishing products for the Apple II series that will give IIe, IIc, and IIcs owners the ability to create typeset documents.

Because Apple is developing both the PostScript and QuickDraw graphics languages for the Apple II, it is reasonable to expect that Apple's forthcoming AppleTalk network will include the ability to connect groups of Apple IIs to laser printers and typesetting machines.

IIGS ACCELERATOR

Dear A+: A few days ago, I read a letter in your magazine by someone asking for a card that made the IIGs compatible with a Macintosh. I think such a product would be a good idea, but now what we IIGs owners need more than anything else is an accelerator card. The IIGs runs at a rather slow 2.8 MHz, compared to most new computers today. Is there a way to speed up the IIGs, or is there an accelerator card out for the GS, or will one be available-and, if so, how soon?

ROBERT A. WYATT BERRYVILLE, VA We know of two companies that are actively working on methods, to accelerate the operation of the IIGS. MDIdeas showed an early prototype of a card-based accelerator at AppleFest last September, but the availability date and price are still uncertain. Zip Technologies is planning a chip-based accelerator, and an availability announcement has been promised for late January.—Editors

MORE IIC COVERAGE

Dear A+: I am a happy IIc owner who, like others, it seems, is unhappy with your poor coverage of what we feel is a superb machine. When I subscribed to A+, I had reason to believe that your magazine was truly "The Apple II" magazine

that we teachers and students could enjoy. It seems, however, that a more apt description should be "The IIGS Magazine." The fact is that most of the people I know are not IIGS owners, and no amount of media hype has been able to convince them that the IIc is an obsolete machine.

CARLSBAD, CA It's hard to imagine how you got the impression that A+ was more a IIGS magazine than a IIe/IIc magazine. The vast majority of the products we cover in A+ are for the Ile and IIc, not the IIGS. A quick count of a recent issue revealed the following statistics about the products mentioned in that issue: 48 products worked with a He or IIc, as opposed to 7 that worked only with the IIGS. In fact, of the more than 100 A+ All-Star products that we have selected so far, fewer than 10% of them are IIGS products. The IIGS is an Apple II, so we feel it deserves some attention, especially since our research shows that many of our readers who own He and Hc computers are considering a IIGS as their next machine.—Editors.

I have called them several times with problems, and they have been extremely helpful, even to the extent of sending free updates and replacement parts. I have sent back their products for repair (after four years of hard use), and those products were returned to me at no charge and in less than seven days. Dealing with a company such as Videx is very nice.

My jeer is for PBI Software of Foster City, California. I purchased by mail order its graphics program Visualizer. It seems to be an excellent program, except for one problem: It works only with the ImageWriter printer. Now I don't really have a problem with this, except that there's no way to tell until you open the package. In order to open the package and use the disk, you must destroy the plastic box the program comes in. I tried to return it to PBI, but I was informed that I had to return it to where I purchased it. I don't know of any busi-

nesses that will accept a return after the package has been destroyed. Watch out for PBI.

Materials management, real accounting, project organization, production planning, long technical documentation of machinery, the coordination of information for several departments—all ready at your fingertips. As fast as a PC and a lot easier

to use. As easy to use as a Macintosh, and a lot less expensive.

Using the IIGs, it is easy to write a down and dirty program for quick engineering purposes and only slightly more difficult to write a highly sophisticated business-oriented program. Paint, shmaint: I intend to put this more-than-capable machine to work. I've already squeezed quite a bit of energy out of my IIe. Now, with the speed, memory, programming tools, etc. of the IIGs, I can't wait to really put this poor little "educational, game players' machine" to work.

Some have commented that the IIGS is overestimated—a IIe with more colors and a mouse. I really disagree. We have here a 16-bit computer with speed, memory, the best user interface designed to date, and most of the programming drudgery already done for virtually any application. All a programmer has to do is design an algorithm and display format. This computer has some real potential at a good price. I'd really be disappointed to see the innovative, leading-edge Apple II community allow the IIcs to be doomed to a life of painting pretty but useless pictures. Let's see this computer do what computers do best: work!

I hope my views are shared by others, and somehow I'd like to find out if they are. How about an opinion poll: What would you like to see the IIGs do for you? What should the IIGs be used for? What can the IIGs be best at? I wonder what people really think.



uct they should buy. Nothing could be further from the truth.

First, Activision's customer support is nonexistent, whereas the folks down at StyleWare are most sensitive to their customer-service responsibilities. I have had numerous problems with Writer's Choice elite, for which I have had little to no help from Activision. The manual for this program is poor and incompletely written. The printing features of WCE leave a lot to be desired. MultiScribe offers a printing choice that renders a very professional-looking page, whereas WCE printouts look like junk. Jaroslovsky mentions the difference in graphics handling between the two programs, but he does not emphasize enough that MultiScribe is much more flexible in both the way it handles graphics and the type of graphics it uses. For my tastes, WCE might as well not provide a graphics interface.

My poor experience with Activision is not limited to WCE but carries over into several other programs the company markets. For example, the company's game Shanghai, which is excellent, has a major bug for which I have been unable to obtain an upgrade in spite of numerous letters and telephone calls over the past four months.

Therefore, I suggest that in addition to all the other options that Jaroslovsky gave readers to help them choose between the Activision and StyleWare products, prospective buyers consider the very poor reputation that Activision has developed regarding customer support and service.







Big promotion bucks for the Apple II, on-line antipiracy efforts, National Geographic Kids Network, and other industry updates

DELIVERING ON A PROMISE

At a meeting of Apple developers the evening before AppleFest last September in San Francisco, John Sculley, chairman of Apple Computer, promised to spend multiple millions of dollars promoting the Apple II line prior to Christmas. It seems that he has kept his word. The first major promotion to appear was a new set of television

commercials highlighting use of the IIcs. Many of these appeared for the first time on an Applesponsored special about the U.S. Constitution called "Funny, You Don't Look 200," which appeared in early October. Since then, Apple has run other prominent ads on national television.

Then, about the middle of October, Apple's "Open House" began touring the shopping malls of the country. The Open House is an exhibit highlighting the use of

the Apple II (and to a lesser extent the Macintosh) for educational, entertainment, and homebusiness uses. The Open House A + reviewed was in San Mateo, California, and featured about ten GS computers, one IIc, and three Macintoshes. Apple demonstrated software packages from many of the larger software companies, including Paintworks Plus (Activision), Print Shop GS (Brøderbund), Instant Music (Electronic Arts), and Reader Rabbit (The Learning Company).

At the Open House, Apple publicized its new rebate program for peripherals, which is due to expire on January 2, 1988. Rebates are either \$50 (on 3.5- and 5\(\frac{1}{4}\)-inch drives, Personal Modems, and IIc or GS memory-expansion cards) or \$100 (on ImageWriter IIs and hard-disk drives). The company was also passing out ordering information for its "Beginner's Luck" video. This video (VHS format only) features real computer owners describing why they're glad they bought Apple computers and why you should tooone of the presentations is so hilarious that we recommend buying the videotape even if you already own an Apple. You can order the video anytime before January 12, 1988, by calling (800) 328-2791 and having

your VISA or MasterCard at the ready. The price is only \$6.90.

It's too early, of course, to tell what the result of these promotional efforts will be, but it's a relief nonetheless to see Apple Computer, Inc. putting some serious bucks behind the Apple II.

ON-LINE ANTIPIRACY EFFORT

We all know how serious the problem of software piracy has been for software developers since the first disk drive was invented. Inevitably, within days of a popular program's release, it reaches the hands of thousands of users who haven't paid a nickel for it. Copy-protection only



slows down this unauthorized distribution by a week or two. We've even heard of unauthorized widespread distribution of a new program before its official release!

In an attempt to find solutions to the piracy problem, a computer bulletin board in San Mateo, California, has recently commenced the Software Theft Opposition Project (STOP). It encourages software developers and pirates to debate the pros and cons of piracy issues in an on-line forum setting. If you're interested in participating, call the STOP BBS at (415) 349-8245. The BBS operates 24 hours a day at 300 or 1200 bps.

MILITARY SUPPORT GROUP

Here at A +, we get plenty of mail from U.S. servicemen in Europe who need help with their Apple II systems. Local support is apparently not too good, especially if you don't speak a foreign language, and regional users' groups are sometimes too small to provide needed assistance. If you're a II user in Europe and need more help, consider affiliating your U.S. Forces Apple club with the largest military-oriented Apple users' group, the Special Forces Apple Users Group (SF AUG). (You can affiliate even if your group isn't made up of members of the military.) Affiliates receive a periodic newsletter and the


NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC KIDS NETWORK

As we round the corner into 1988, as many as 200 schools will be participating in an exciting new science-education network. The National Geographic Kids Network is still in the field-test stage and involves sending fourth-, fifth-, and sixthgraders out to collect scientific data in their communities, which they then telecommunicate back to a central computer. At the central location, the data is compiled and then sent back to the participating classrooms, where the kids can see how their city compares to others in areas such as water quality and weather patterns.

The Kids Network is a joint project of the National Geographic Society and the Technical Education Research Centers (TERC) in Cambridge, Massachusetts. TERC received an award of \$2.2 million from the National Science Foundation to develop the network, and the National Geographic Society is throwing in another \$2.5 million. The project started with 9 schools in 1986 and grew to 30 in 1987, with the goal of having 200 schools participating by January 1988. Then, by the beginning of 1989, the plan is to have 1000 schools field-testing the concept. Testing is expected to be completed in late 1989, at which time the service is expected to become a product available to many other schools.

EARLY BIRD EDITION

In order to address the dilemma facing all publishers of tax-preparation software, Double Eagle Software is making available an "early bird" version of its 1987 release of The Tax Advantage. The dilemma is this: With tax-preparation software, publishers must wait until year's end for the IRS to finalize regulations that updated versions of the programs must account for. This waiting period means it's hard to get tax-preparation software out as soon as some people might want to get their hands on it.

So Double Eagle's solution is to release software that incorporates regulations that have been decided on as of August 1, 1987. The remaining regulations will be incorporated into a later final version. The Early Bird Edition costs \$59.95; buyers of this version can then get the final Tax Advantage for \$15.95. If you just wait for the final release, however, it will cost you \$59.95, so you

save some extra dollars by waiting a while. In this case, the early bird gets to pay more.


HOME WORK WITH APPLEWORKS

Although the Apple II doesn't get much play as a business computer these days, the fact is that people use the Number 1 Apple II program-AppleWorks-to do business work. This assertion is probably no shock to all you AppleWorks users out there, but what's interesting is how much mileage AppleWorks is putting in at the home office. According to a study commissioned by Microsoft Corporation, 45% of AppleWorks users use the program exclusively for work at home.

Microsoft researched this market in order to justify a push into the home-office market for the IBM PC version of its integrated program called Microsoft Works (having already discovered that the home market was pretty strong for the Macintosh version). Unfortunately, the published results don't say what percentage of users do their AppleWorks work in an outside-thehome office. Nor do they say what percentage use AppleWorks for something other than business-type stuff.






PRESENTATION GRAPHCS

After working us into a frenzy over desktop publishing, Apple recently decreed that publishing was only a small segment of a larger market called desktop presentations. That should come as no surprise to Apple II users; we've always had a wide range of software and hardware products for preparing presentations.


Who needs to make presentations? Anyone who wants to get a point across. Whether in an office, boardroom, classroom, auditorium, or club meeting hall, an effective presentation can sell a product or idea or illustrate a concept.

Your presentation can accompany a speaker or take place in a stand-alone, interactive environment. Either method can employ a wide range of media, from 35 mm slides to videotape to a computer itself that can deliver the visuals and modify them on the fly, and either method involves three key steps: the plan, the production, and the delivery.





Products for planning, producing, and delivering desktop presentations



STEP 1 PLANNING YOUR PRESENTATION

Let's start with the basics. Good presentations are distinguished by good planning. You first need a clear idea of why you're making the presentation, to whom you're directing it, and how you can most effectively make your point.

Be aware that reaching an audience through slides, transparencies, and computer visuals rather than printed materials means that the audience will be looking at a screen. If you've ever been subjected to a viewing of your friends' vacation slides, you know that staring too long at a static screen is a more effective snooze inducer than any sleeping pill on the market.

A viewer cannot assimilate too much material in one visual. You must hone your ideas so you can convey them in just a few key words or phrases. If you put too much text on a visual, the members of your audience will either spend so much time reading that they won't hear your talk, or—worse—you'll lose them because their thoughts are wandering.

Another key difference between most presentations and printed materials is that your audience can't reread earlier material—the visuals are in a particular sequence and presented one at a time. Therefore, you may want to carry some information over from one slide to another or even repeat a slide to assure that your viewers are following your logic.

Getting Started

Usually you begin with a variety of dissociated ideas that need clarifying, refining, and sorting. Here are some of the questions you may pose: How many visuals will I need to make my point? How will I achieve a logical flow of ideas from beginning to end? What points need emphasis? What can I eliminate? 3×5 index cards can come in handy at this point, but we prefer using idea-processor or outliner software for this critical stage in presentation development.

Outliners

Outliners let you easily organize your thoughts into main ideas and finer details; with minimal effort, you can arrange and rearrange your words. An outliner's distinction is that it can "collapse" and "expand" your text so that, whenever you choose, you can view only the key points of your presentation without being distracted by additional text. (See the roundup feature article "Idea Processors: A look at six Apple II programs that can help you structure your thoughts and organize your writing" in A +, November 1987.)

If you don't have an idea processor, you can use a word-processing program to list your main points and then use Cut and Paste commands to organize them logically.

Scripts and Storyboards

After we've used an outliner to organize our thoughts, we usually write a more detailed script. A script allows us to verify that we've properly developed our concept. It's a lot easier to make corrections to a script than to finished slides. Scripting is essential if you're going to speak throughout your presentation.

From the script, we develop a storyboard. A storyboard is simply a sequence of small drawings that illustrate the main points of the script and that is keyed to paragraphs or phrases in it. We either sketch the visuals by hand or use printouts of screens we've created in a draw or paint program. Here is where we concentrate on perhaps the most important aspect of the presentation: making sure our visuals will be consistent.

Good presentations are held together by common threads—the visuals should flow from one to the other. For example, all the slides may share a common border. Placement of text or other elements should be consistent across your presentation. Don't start one slide at the top of the screen and the next in the middle. Consider using an icon, a logo, or another graphic element in the same position on each slide. Keep your "color meaning" consistent: If you mark important words in orange on three visuals, don't suddenly switch to green on the others.

More often than not, preparing a storyboard makes you aware of any missing pieces in the script or thoughts that are inadequately developed and require further exposition. If you're creating the presentation for a client or are working in a group, the script and storyboard stage is a good time to

get approval before committing yourself to a lengthy (and sometimes costly) project.


Script and storyboard in hand, then, you're ready for production.

STEP 2. PRODUCING YOUR PRESENTATION


The tools you use to make your visuals depend on your delivery medium. Although we tend to think of presentations as graphic visuals of bar and pie charts, many presentations require text-based slides as well.

Text-Based Visuals

Although a visual may contain only text, it is best produced in a




graphics program. The standard Apple character set, even in the 40-column mode, is too small and unattractive for use for presentations that will be projected either as 35 mm slides or overheads or through a computer-video projector. Further, if your presentation combines text slides and graphics slides, the visuals you make in the text mode



won't be consistent with the graphics-based slides.

Two particularly important considerations for all visuals, especially text-based ones, are typeface (font) and color. Text-based presentations require high-quality, proportionally spaced fonts. Most modern paint programs, including Blazing Paddles and Dazzle Draw, offer such fonts. If you're working in standard hi res and require specialized typefaces, Fontrix is probably the best choice. Fontrix, a program that specializes in character generation, provides an incredible variety of fonts, including foreign characters and accent marks. With its built-in font editor, you can create logos and icons and, if you're ambitious, a custom typeface.

Don't go overboard on fonts; restrict yourself to one or two per presentation. Be aware that, with few exceptions, every standard-hires and double-hi-res program uses



its own character generator and typefaces. To avoid problems and inconsistencies, don't mix and match fonts from different programs. If, for example, you're creating business graphics in The Graphics Department, a series of illustrations in Blazing Paddles, and text slides in Fontrix, create the text for all your slides in only one of these programs.

You won't have to worry about discrepancies if you're creating your presentation on the Apple IIGS in the super-hi-res mode; most IIGS programs use the standard GS Toolbox font routines and produce high-quality text from fonts installed in the system.


If you're producing overhead transparencies on an Apple IIGS, you may want to use a draw program, rather than a paint program, to create your text-based visuals. When you print on an Apple LaserWriter, a draw program instructs the printer to use highquality PostScript fonts rather than the jagged-edge screen fonts, giving your transparencies a much more professional look. Both Top-Draw and Draw Plus use these fonts. (See a comparative review of these programs elsewhere in this issue.)

You can produce text-based slides in IIGS word-processing programs such as MultiScribe or GraphicWriter.

If you're working in standard or double hi res, stick to black-andwhite text. Because of the way color is produced in hi res and double hi res, most typefaces lose their character, and legibility, when they appear in color or on a colored background—too many pixels disappear. We get the best results when we use colored boxes or underlines to emphasize words or phrases we would otherwise have drawn in color. In super hi res, the color restrictions disappear-colored text looks as good as white or black text. Text on a colored background is equally possible.

Hints

Color, whether in boxes, underlines, or text, lets you easily develop consistency in a set of visuals. If, for example, you're speaking of three goals for the coming year, make three slides that list the same three goals. On slide 1, color the first goal; on slide 2, color the sec-



ond one (using the same color); and so on. When you show the slides, the color draws the viewers' eye to the appropriate goal.

The two most common errors in creating text-based slides are putting too much text on the slide (and therefore using too small a typeface) and placing type inconsistently. You can avoid the former problem by careful scripting, and you can skirt the latter with careful production.

Graphic Visuals

Producing graphic visuals is a bit more complicated than preparing text-based ones. If you are artistic, you can create the graphics from scratch, using any graphics program. The program choice depends on the elements that your images require.

In hi res, only Blazing Paddles allows easy access to Apple II shape libraries. The advantage of using Apple II shapes to enhance your images is that you can scale and rotate them. The program comes with a variety of shapes, and more are available on supplemental shape-library disks. In double hi res, Beagle Graphics allows you to work with Apple shapes.

If you need to create hi-res threedimensional objects, The Complete Graphics System has a 3-D module that is relatively easy to use. In super hi res, DeluxePaint II is the answer.

If you need business graphics such as pie, bar, or line charts, consider several good programs that create such charts, either directly from data created in AppleWorks or from other spreadsheets. For standard-hi-res charts, the Visualizer from PBI or the line of Spectral Graphics products fit the bill. Spectral Graphics' AlphaChart, Curve-Plotter, and 3DChart offer an incredible range of chart types.

We're particularly partial to Sensible Software's The Graphics Department because it provides a complete graphics environment. With this program, you have all

the tools necessary to create dynamic visuals and put them together into a slide-based presentation. For super-hi-res presentations, Visualizer GS is the only graphing product available at this writing. (For information on two new business-graphics programs, Graphic Edge and Timeout Graph, see the AppleWorks section of this issue.)

There's no shortage of powerful paint programs for the Apple II family of computers. You can't go wrong with Blazing Paddles (hi res), Dazzle Draw (double hi res), or Paintworks Plus or DeluxePaint II (super hi res). Paintworks Plus not only provides a complete set of painting tools, but it also offers easily accessible animation capabilities. DeluxePaint II provides incredibly powerful painting tools, including special effects such as images that bend and shrink.

If drawing is not your forte, you can create graphic-based visuals by using clip art. The range of clip art for the Apple II is astonishing. A roundup of available clip-art products ("Picture and Clip-Art Formats for the Apple II") accompanies this article; many of them are suitable for use in presentation graphics.

Another solution to the "I can't draw" blues is to use digitizers. If you want realistic, photograph-like graphics in your presentations, a digitizer is all you need. Digitizers for the Apple II come in two flavors, video and scanner. Video digitizers use video cameras. Focus the camera on your subject and, in a matter of seconds (sometimes minutes), you'll see a digitized version of it on your Apple screen. Video digitizers have the advantage of working with three-dimensional objects, including live models, and images captured directly from videotape, as well as flat art.

Scanners use a special device that replaces the ribbon cartridge on an ImageWriter printer. When you insert a drawing or photograph into the paper feed of your printer, the scanner goes back and forth, scanning every line, until the digitized version is on your monitor. Scanners work only with flat art and are considerably slower than video digitizers (a full-page picture can take as long as 20 minutes to scan), but they generally produce higher-quality images



than do video-based systems. They are also less expensive because you need not invest in a video camera, tripod, and lighting equipment.

On the video end, we've already reviewed ComputerEyes (A+, August 1986) and AST's Vision Plus (A+, May 1987). The AST product works only with the Apple IIGS, but a version of ComputerEyes is available for every Apple. A new video digitizer is also due from Applied Engineering. The best known scanner-type digitizer for the Apple II is ThunderScan, which we review elsewhere in this issue.

Once you've created your digitized images, you'll need to use a paint program for touch-up and perhaps labeling. If your paint program has scaling, you may find that digitized images look better when shrunk to quarter-screen size or less.


Hints

Whether you've hand-drawn your visuals, assembled them from clip art, digitized them, or created them in a graphing program, remember that you want to achieve visual consistency from screen to screen. Don't go from "tight" geometric images to "loose" paint graphics in the same presentation. Keep colors and palettes consistent. This caveat is especially significant with super-hi-res presentations, where palette switches can be quite distracting when you're changing from one image to the next. If you're using digitized images, don't mix high-contrast and dithered images. Finally, don't use a graphic just to have a graphic; carefully choose your images, like your words, to contribute to your message.

STEP 3. DELIVERING YOUR PRESENTATION

Once you have all your visuals, you must get them into final form for delivery.

Computer-based presentations require a slide-show program to sequence your visuals and present them to your audience. (In this case, slides refers to projected screen images, not 35 mm slides.) If your presentation is to run automatically, you'll want to be able to control the timing between each visual and the next. If your presentation includes a speaker, you may



want that speaker, or an assistant, to be able to change slides with a simple key press. You may also want to control the way your images arrive on the screen. Should they scroll on from the left, right, top, or bottom? Perhaps you want some images to spiral out from the center. Transitions, or wipes, can increase your presentation's effectiveness.

Your presentation can be interactive, with users controlling the visual elements. Most such presentations use custom slide-show programs. A good example of a user-controlled presentation, albeit an elaborate one, is the Buick Dimension disk produced by SoftAd (see "NewsPlus," November 1987).

Simpler presentations can use slide-show programs such as those that have appeared in our column or in many books on Apple II graphics.

For standard-hi-res presentations, The Graphics Department and Koala Graphics Exhibitor can create a sequenced slide show for you. Graphics Exhibitor lets you edit, print, and exhibit hi-res graphics. The exhibit section of the program lets you create a plain-vanilla automatic or manually operated slide show. The length of your show is limited by the capacity of one disk, so your presentation can only consist of 12 screens. You cannot take advantage of multiple disk drives.

The Graphics Department offers a more powerful slide-show program. Using the Slide Projector module, you can prepare an automatic or manual slide presentation with up to 32 images by using two disk drives. You can show the pictures in any order and reuse each several times during a show, for up to 99 picture "frames." You can caption each of the frames with a line of text at the bottom of the screen. Since frames can appear as quickly as one slide every 11/2 seconds, you can obtain limited animation effects.

For double-hi-res presentations, Dazzle Draw allows you to automatically create a slide show with a choice of timing and wipes between slides, but, as with Graphics Exhibitor, the length of your show is determined by the capacity of one disk. If you're using a 54-inch disk, therefore, your slide show will be limited to six images. Beagle Graphics provides a more pliable (and complex) slide-show "skeleton" that you can modify to suit your needs. If you're moderately skilled in programming, you'll be able to enhance the slide show. Otherwise, you'll have to be content with the program as is—no bells and whistles. This slide-show program also limits you to the capacity of one disk, but you can store more pictures on a disk by using the Beagle Graphics compressor program to reduce the size of your images.

For super hi res, several of the public-domain slide-show programs that we've mentioned in our column and that are available on GEnie, CompuServe, or from your local users' group's library may provide the power you need.

Projection

If you're delivering your presentation to a group of people, you should plan to have several large-screen monitors or a video projector. The Apple composite video output plugs into the monitors or projector. If you're using more than one monitor, a y-jack, which you can find in the audio departments of Radio Shack and other electronics stores, will take care of splitting the signal.

Another option, newly available from Dukane, is a liquid-crystal-display (LCD) device, the Dukane MagniView 200, that plugs into the composite-video output of your Apple and allows you to project the Apple screen with a standard overhead projector. The image is projected in monochrome but is quite legible and, according to the manufacturers, does not suffer from the "fade out" problems earlier LCD products experienced.

A similar product, the Telex Magnabyte Electronic Imager, connects to a special interface card for the II Plus, IIe, or IIGS.

The analog RGB output from the Apple IIGS is more difficult to deal with, since large-screen monitors






and projectors for analog RGB are much more expensive than those for composite video.

When computer presentations are not practical, you can transform your computer graphics into overhead transparencies, 35 mm slides, or videotape.

Overhead Transparencies

Overhead transparencies are easy to produce; all you have to do is print your screens on film instead of paper. Many graphics programs are capable of producing such printouts directly. In addition, several good stand-alone "graphics dump" programs are available, including Printographer and Triple Dump. The stand-alone




The Telex Magnabyte Electronic Imager (above), and the Dukane MagniView 200 (below).



programs frequently offer more options than the built-in ones. They usually allow you to crop, scale, and invert your screens. Printographer can produce a terrific cameo cropping effect.

You can print directly on overhead-transparency film or have a transparency made from a standard printout at many copy centers. Color may not reproduce well, but once you have a black-and-white transparency, you can color it with markers or inks.

Overhead transparencies offer one major advantage over direct



computer-generated and photographic media: You can get neartypeset-quality text by using a Laser-Writer to create the transparency. At this writing, the Apple IIGS is the only member of the Apple II series that "officially" works with Apple-Talk and the LaserWriter, although many individuals, most notably Don Lancaster, have harnessed the LaserWriter directly to the Apple IIe, avoiding the need for an AppleTalk card. As we mentioned earlier, draw programs, because they maintain object descriptions of graphics, can instruct the LaserWriter to use highquality PostScript fonts rather than the bit-mapped fonts on the screen. Although paint-type graphics do not benefit from printing on the LaserWriter (unless the images are shrunk considerably), PostScript text reproduces at 300 dots per inch and makes superb overhead transparencies. Be sure to use overheadtransparency film manufactured specifically for laser printers; other film may melt in the printer!

35 mm Slide Presentations

The simplest way to create 35 mm slides from your Apple is to photograph the screen. To do so, you'll need a tripod, a macro or close-up lens, and a shutter release. Shoot the screen with the room darkened to prevent glare and be sure to set the shutter speed at 1/30 second or longer. You should probably take three exposures for each visual: at the f-stop suggested by your light meter, another one fstop below, and the last one f-stop above—a technique called bracketing. You may have to crop your image to prevent the frame of the monitor or too much border from appearing in the shot.

If you produce lots of slides, you might consider investing in the Polaroid Palette, a film recorder that contains its own monitor, filters, and camera-mounting hardware. The Palette works only in the hires mode and does not raise the available resolution, however. Although the hardware can produce

a wide range of colors and much higher resolution, we know of no similar software for the Apple II.

Video

You can connect the compositevideo output of the Apple to a videotape recorder and record the signal like any other video signal. Unfortunately, only the Apple IIGS produces a standard video signal and, therefore, the highest-quality tape. With other Apple II computers, the tape you record may not be editable or, at the worst, may lack color. The quality depends on your individual Apple and the tolerance of the VCR you are using. Keep your eyes on A + for an in-depth exploration of creating video with your Apple II.

Mixed Media

Some presentations benefit from mixed media: slides, video, audio, and so on, combined with computer-generated visuals. This field is specialized and, until recently, has required lots of custom programming. Brøderbund's ShowOff, a new presentation program, includes the ability to control devices through the Apple IIGS serial ports. With the proper connection devices, a presentation created in ShowOff can control a VCR, slide projector, audiotape player, videodisc player, or any other device.

Looking Ahead

Preparing computer-generated presentations usually requires using a few different graphics programs. It would be so much simpler if you could use one package to do it all. The ideal presentation program would allow you to create your presentation from start to end. With Apple's new emphasis on desktop presentations, we expect that many such programs will be available in the near future. Indeed, the future is now: We're happy to say that one such program is already here (see "The Future is Now: ShowOff," which accompanies this article).


While most of the personal-computer market is just awakening to the potentials of desktop presentations, Apple II users have had the pieces in place for a long time. Let's show 'em what we can do.







draw-type program and, in fact, has a lot in common with such programs. ShowOff lets you place text and simple graphics elements (lines, boxes, circles, and so on) on the screen. You can combine these elements with graphics you bring in from The Print Shop and other paint programs. In addition, the program provides a library of impressive borders and graphics to enhance your visuals.

ShowOff's pull-down menus, graphics tools, and the Apple mouse make the creation of presentations virtually effortless. You can easily copy elements from slide to slide or create a template to achieve the consistency your presentation should have.

Once you've created your visuals, you go to the sequencer part of the program to sequence them into a full presentation. All you have to do is click, in the desired order, on the miniatures of your slides. You can add or delete screens at any time and resequence the order of your slides.

When you've previewed your presentation and are satisfied with your production, ShowOff creates a self-booting, self-running presentation disk. Your presentations can be quite elaborate, since you can specify branches based on key presses so that different users can

progress through the presentations differently, in an interactive manner. As we mentioned before, ShowOff can control 35 mm slide projectors, tape players, and other devices, using the Apple IIGS as a controller.

Incidentally, ShowOff also lets you create and print custom 3.5inch disk labels for your presentation disks.

SHR files

A standard SHR (single-hi-res) file is a \$2000-byte binary file, representing either graphics page 1 or page 2.

DHR files


A standard DHR (double-hi-res) file is a \$4000-byte binary file. The first \$2000 bytes represent the screen image in auxiliary memory; the second \$2000 bytes represent the screen image in main memory. A Beagle DHR file is actually two files—one contains the main memory image ("filename"), and the other contains the auxiliary memory image ("filename.aux").

PNT files

There are currently three types of PNT files (file-type code \$C0), distinguished by the auxiliary filetype code, each of which is a representation of the GS super-hi-res screen. Aux type \$00 is a special format Activision used in the first release of Paintworks Plus. Aux type \$01 is in "Eagle" compressed format (the 32K screen, scan-line control, and palette area are compressed by the PackBytes function). Aux type \$02 is the "Apple preferred" format, a format that is flexible enough to work with different image dimensions and resolutions.

PIC and PICT files

A PIC file (file-type code \$C1) with an auxiliary file-type code of 0 is essentially a snapshot of the 32K memory area the GS super-hi-res screen, scan-line control bytes, and color palettes use. The file is not compressed. If the auxiliary file-type code is \$8000, the file is referred to as a PICT file and contains a recording of the QuickDraw calls necessary to draw an object on the screen.



he Apple II has always been noted for its graphics, adding color and high-resolution images to personal computing when most system designers saw those features as mere amusements. The Apple logo itself—color bars on a bitten apple stands as a testimony to that early strength. When the Macintosh appeared in 1984, with its mouse and built-in graphics routines, graphics were again a hallmark of a new Apple system. Some people were unpleasantly surprised that they had to sacrifice color to gain the other advantages of the Mac, however.

The II family has attracted its share of painting and drawing pro-

Fraternal Twins

When you first run TopDraw and Draw Plus, they are amazingly similar, from their identical prices to their specifications. Both are ProDOS 16-based, and both set up a Macintosh/MacPaint-style display for drawing. In fact, they are so similar that if you learn to use one, you will be immediately able to use the other, with only a lit-

grams, and even a few elementary CAD (computer-aided design) programs. Recently, the first IIGS drawing programs reached the market, packages that take advantage of the mouse, the punch of the new processor, and the colorgraphics gift of the GS. The two I looked at, StyleWare's TopDraw and Activision's Draw Plus, don't reach the level of professional CAD-they lack the precision, speed, plotter support, and file interchange that CAD implies—but they are simple and inexpensive tools for drawing colorful two-dimensional forms, floor plans, lo-

sitions and a few different commands. And, if you are at all familiar with any drawing program that has pull-down menus, you'll be able to get started with either TopDraw or Draw Plus without even consulting a manual.

Both programs require the use of the mouse, and both include a bunch of text styles and sizes; Top-Draw has the selections out in the open on a pair of pull-down menus, whereas Draw Plus buries them in a cramped dialog box. Both programs produce color copy on an ImageWriter II and sharp blackSample images from Draw Plus






Figure 1: TopDraw, like Draw Plus, lets you select the print size for a file, ranging from a single page to many pages in both the horizontal and vertical direction.

and-white copy on a LaserWriter printer, and both let you select the print size for a file, ranging from a single page to many pages in both the horizontal and vertical direction (see figure 1).

Limits and Lacks

These programs are noticeably slower than Mac and PC programs, both in loading and in printing. Draw Plus needs a full minute and a half just to get into your GS, and TopDraw eats up that and few seconds more. Printing one of the simple example files from Draw Plus in color on an ImageWriter II chewed up eight and a half minutes. TopDraw was in the same boat, needing nearly seven minutes to print the sample file. Naturally, black-and-white printing is much faster with either program.

If you come to Draw Plus or Top-Draw from Mac or PC CAD programs, or from older, more expensive Apple II CAD programs such as MATC-CAD or discoverCAD, you will have to sacrifice some features such as dimensioning, layers, parallels and tangents, and text modification. But then, these GS packages don't claim to be CAD stuff, just colorful drawing tools. Text in Draw Plus and TopDraw, for instance, is defined by its font, size, and style. CAD programs frequently define text as a set of drawn lines and so are able to more freely change the slant, angle, and other characteristics of text. Both Draw Plus and TopDraw also have only a limited zooming ability. They can double or halve your drawing view

a couple of times in each direction, and that's it. More complete zooming would let you choose the zoom factor, jump to a previous zoom, and move through several magnitudes of enlargement or reduction.


either program possesses a healthy selection of sample drawings. Draw Plus has a measly two very simple images, and TopDraw has only four files. Two of those TopDraw files, though—the RAM Card and the Spheres—are stunning images. They demonstrate how TopDraw can help you create a detailed, complex 2-D image or even a simulated 3-D solid model with shading. Strangely, neither manual includes any color prints, leaving you to learn in black and white how to use programs that emphasize color.

TopDraw


TopDraw's drawing area occupies the majority of the screen and is surrounded by the menu bar and three other windows (which you can show or hide while drawing). The Tools window contains individual icons for entering text and for drawing lines, rectangles, ovals, arcs, circles, polygons, and freehand shapes (see figure 2). Holding down the shift key while you use these icons constrains the tools. For instance, shift-oval draws only circles, and shift-polygon draws polygons with only 45° and 90° angles. (Draw Plus has this same constraint feature with its tools.) A selection pointer lets you draw boxes around objects you want to select for copying, deleting, or modifying. The Lines window lets you choose from seven line thicknesses and lets you cap your lines with arrowheads on either or both ends. The Patterns window contains the colors and patterns available as object boundaries and fills.

TopDraw works on only one window at a time. Besides including the standard options for opening and saving files, TopDraw adds a Revert command for returning to the disk version of a file. The Load Picture command lets you read color, bit-mapped files from programs such as Paintworks Plus and DeluxePaint II.

The editing facilities include standard Cut, Copy, and Paste but also boast Duplicate, Select All, and Undo. More selection commands would be handy—to let you select by object type or color for in-




Figure 3: The pallette in TopDraw's Edit Colors box shows all of the colors available.

stance—but neither of the two drawing programs obliges. Top-Draw's Undo command is certainly welcome, but it can back up only a single step and doesn't work with all commands. You can undo moves, stretches, and rotations, for instance, but cannot undo the last segment of a polygon you are drawing.

The editing menu is also the place to customize your object-boundary widths, smooth polygons and arcs, or select the radius of a round-cornered rectangle. Most of these adjustments occur graphically in dialog boxes, where you can watch what happens to sample shapes as you tinker.

You can reduce or enlarge a drawing, and you can zip to a particular view of a large drawing by moving the Set View window. Individual objects in a drawing can be rotated, flipped, shuffled above or beneath other objects, aligned to a grid or another object, locked (which protects them from editing), and grouped together with other objects for mass editing.

n Options menu lets you hide or show rulers and ruler lines, monitor the size of objects as you draw them, and see how much memory is left in your system as you draw. The ruler lines sit on the top and left of the drawing area, showing the cursor's position. The Options menu is also the place for editing the colors (see figure 3), patterns, and rulers that show in the windows. You can save your option choices on disk and make them the default choices for future drawing sessions.

The basics of drawing with Top-Draw are simple, and even the more advanced features, most of them tucked into the Options menu, are easy to figure out without recourse to the well-organized and indexed manual. The tutorial in the manual is long and thorough, but I didn't really need to go through it. When I contacted the company for help (it has a separate number for technical support), a representative answered immediately and responded to questions. The program is copy-protected

with a key-disk scheme, but for \$20 extra you can buy a non-copy-protected disk or, for \$10, a backup of the copy-protected version.

Draw Plus

Draw Plus can open up to eight drawing windows at a time, all on a single drawing or on eight different drawings. Draw Plus has a Revert command, just as TopDraw does, and has the same general printing commands, although it doesn't offer the Scaled printing command of TopDraw. Draw Plus has an option for creating paint files, which you can change with a program such as Paintworks Plusit's in the same position as Top-Draw's option for loading paint files. Both programs let you select the print size for a file, ranging from a single page to many pages both horizontally and vertically.




Figure 4: The Draw Plus drawing board displays everything you need to create drawings. The freehand and arc tools are hidden under the polygon and oval tools.

The same tools show up here as in TopDraw, but the freehand and arc tools are hidden under the polygon and oval tools, showing only when you click the mouse and press Option-Shift. There are only four line widths (three less than in TopDraw), and the default fill patterns in Draw Plus are much simpler and less appealing than those in TopDraw. You get a color editor with sliders, just as in TopDraw, and a pattern editor, which lets you replace default patterns with your own color or black-and-white selections (see figure 4).

Draw Plus automatically selects objects after you draw them, which

Here are some handy hints to make your use of these two drawing programs more effective and efficient. **TopDraw**

For most drawing work, you want to have objects selected for modification as soon as you draw them, so enable Auto Select in the Options menu and then use Save Defaults in the same menu to make this automatic selection the regular practice of the program.

Give yourself as much room as possible by moving or hiding the tool menus you aren't using. If you need to pop back to the program's initial state, just use the apple-W command, Clean Up Windows.

Mix-edit, that is-your palette and patterns before you start, whenever possible. Save your drawing after you do so, to save the palette and patterns.

Draw Plus

If you want bigger menu text titles, try the apple-menu Change Resolution option and switch to

Use the icon library. Customize its icons to your purposes, including objects you use frequently.

Experiment with having multiple windows open on the same drawing, using different levels of zoom in the different windows to see both detail and an overview at the same time.

To interrupt printing, press apple-period. This trick isn't in the documentation, but it works.

Both Programs

Print in black and white for quick hard copies of drawings. Doing so can take less than half the time of color printing.

Learn to use the Group command to combine objects into groups you can then copy or modify all at once.

Experiment with the transparent color (it appears as an asterisk in Draw Plus and as None in Top-Draw) for filling objects. Overlapping objects can be a necessity for creating shadows and other complex effects, and transparency is a tool you'll need for competent overlapping.

Use arcs and polygons when possible, instead of freehand curves. They are easier to modify in a controlled fashion.




Figure 5: The Draw Plus corner-rounding command.




Figure 6: Choose Font lets you also choose type size and style.

isn't the case in TopDraw. The basic editing commands are the same in both programs, but Draw Plus doesn't have the polygon-smoothing abilities of TopDraw, and its corner-rounding command (see figure 5) offers six vertical and six horizontal numeric radius values instead of the graphic dialog box of TopDraw. The Undo command of Draw Plus is much more fluent than TopDraw's, able to undo anything except File menu commands. You control text from a single menu that controls Uppercase, Lowercase, and Title text styles. Stuffing all these choices into one menu makes it hard to get at the fonts and styles (see figure 6).

Draw Plus can also show or hide rulers and its tool windows and lets you customize the rulers, giving you a choice of metric or English measurement and the number of divisions, for example. A Show Size command lets you see the dimensions of an object as you draw it. You can put all of these settings into a default file.

Instead of a View menu, Draw Plus offers simply a pair of zooming icons and a status box that tells you what percentage the current view is of the full-size view. You




Figure 7: Draw Plus lets you move objects to the front or back, group, lock, rotate, flip, or align them.

can move objects to the front or back (although you can't shuffle them one step at a time as in Top-Draw), group, lock, rotate, flip, or align them to the grid or each other (see figure 7). If you want to see how many objects you are using, in the current drawing and in all open drawings, you have to pull down the apple menu and check the About... box. This method is not as handy as the constant monitor TopDraw offers in its Options menu. The apple menu also contains a Change Resolution option for alternating between high-resolution drawing (with 4 colors mixed into 16 choices) and low resolution (with 16 true colors).

alling Activision to ask about Draw Plus is not as easy as calling StyleWare to ask about TopDraw. Activision's phone-mail system makes you answer several menu questions before directing you to technical support. On my first call, I waited a couple of minutes before giving up, but on my second call, after threading through the same maze, I reached someone helpful and knowledgeable after just half a

The tutorial in the Draw Plus manual is not as simple to follow as that of the TopDraw book, but the two manuals are generally equivalent in other respects, although TopDraw's has larger pages and includes a Quick Reference Card. Both are typeset, spiral-bound, and easy to read. Although Draw Plus was copy-protected when it was released, it is one of the products from which Activision recently dropped copy protection.

One unique feature of Draw Plus

is its icons, a small library of images you can use or modify that you can summon with a pull-down menu command and copy to the current drawing instantly.

A Toss-up

After a first run-through, I thought Draw Plus and TopDraw were almost the same program and certainly hard to choose between. After more practice with them, I see the differences, but the competition between them is still almost-excuse me-a draw. Top-Draw has more object-modification and movement commands, moreaccessible text options, more line widths, a simpler and richer pattern palette, more view commands, and more understandable (to me) color-editing commands. On the other hand, Draw Plus has multiple windows, more ruler-customization facility, several more text commands, a more powerful Undo command, zoom icons, and that icon library. I think I would go with Draw Plus for its multiple windows and powerful Undo, although I'd be tempted by the interface in TopDraw, with its color patterns and ability to move and hide tool windows. Either way, you'll get a fine drawing tool.


A new method of backing up IIGS memory is introduced by Applied Engineering. A new plug-in card called RamKeeper can be used with a GS-RAM, GS-RAM Plus, and Apple IIGS memory card and most other IIGS memory cards to keep system memory intact when the computer is turned off. RamKeeper has its own battery and separate power supply that powers your IIGS memory card when the computer is turned on and when it's off. IIGS computers can now "cold boot" in about 4 seconds with programs and data available for instant response. With RamKeeper, two IIGS memory cards can reside in the same IIGS memory slot. RamKeeper has an additional benefit by reducing the strain on the Apple IIGS power supply because it no longer has to supply power to the IIGS memory card(s).

RamFactor upgrade doubles RamCharger's battery back-up time. An upgrade kit for RamFactor, consisting of two replacement chips, will double the amount of time the RamCharger battery back-up option can last in the event of a total power failure. This upgrade costs \$20.00 and increases the back-up time from 6 to 12 hours for a 1 megabyte RamFactor. And with this upgrade, the back-up time for a 5 Meg RamFactor will be about 7 hours. Since RamCharger has its own built-in power supply, it can back up a RamFactor indefinitely. The reason for the improvement on RamFactor is to increase the back-up time in the event of a total power failure. The new RamFactor piggybacks are available in 1, 2, 3 and 4 megabyte sizes.

A new high performance parallel printer interface card is introduced by Applied Engineering. Parallel Pro is compatible with virtually all parallel printers and offers extensive graphics printing capabilities: hi-res, double hi-res, IIGS super hi-res screens, mixed graphics and text, emphasized, double sized and inverse text, 90° rotate, center, right and left justification, and spectacular color printing (up to 22 colors). A six foot cable is included for connection to a parallel printer. Parallel Pro sells for just \$89.00. Parallel Pro has an optional plug-in buffer called Buffer Pro. Buffer Pro can free your Apple from controlling the printer and can handle up to approximately 256 pages of text. The expandable 32K Buffer sells for \$89.00 and the 256K buffer sells for only \$139.00.

Transforming artwork into digitized images

ong promised, ThunderScan for the Apple II has finally arrived. Like its Macintosh sibling, ThunderScan fits into the ImageWriter printer, replacing the ribbon cartridge and transforming the printer into an inexpensive, high-quality scanner. It lets you read graphic images into your Apple II. The reason for the delay in this ThunderScan's release is obvious: ThunderScan works in standard hi res on vintage, unenhanced Apple IIe computers, all the way to the super-hi-res graphics of the Apple IIGS.

Getting Started

The ThunderScan package includes the ribbon-cartridge-shaped scanning head; software; a comprehensive User's Guide; and a gizmo

that lets the device work on Image-Writer I, II, and wide-carriage ImageWriter printers. Installation is a snap; the scanning device plugs into the game port and snaps into the cartridge holder of your Image-Writer. The Configure utility lets you set the slot location of the printer and the type of printer you have. Once the scanning device is installed, you're ready to scan.

As with all roller-type scanners, your art must be flat and in singlesheet form. If you want to scan an illustration from a magazine, you'll have to tear out the page or photocopy it. It's a good idea to photocopy certain types of art anyway especially full-color materials—as ThunderScan recognizes intensity rather than color, and careful photocopying can give you the best control over the black-and-white intensity of your art. Once you have the art ready, you merely roll it into the printer as you would a single sheet of printer paper.

The ThunderScan software guides you carefully through the steps of producing a scan and gives you lots of control over the process. You first determine the size of the scan and its location by using the arrow keys (sometimes in concert with the apple keys) to move rect-




Figure 1: The image (left) from Art Nouveau Typographic Ornaments (Dan Solo, ed., Dover Books, 1982) appears as a standard-hi-res scan in the line art mode (below).

angles around an image of a piece of paper, complete with rulers. You also set scan format (hi res, double hi res, super hi res, ultra hi res, or special), magnification (dots per inch), and a variety of other parame-

ters. After setting these parameters, you focus ThunderScan by moving the scanning head to the lightest area of your artwork and turning a knob until a number on the screen reads at its highest level. Now you're ready to scan.

Scanning is slow, and if you want to change any of the scanning parameters, you must return to the main menu and go through the entire setup process again. Once you're acquainted with how the various parameters work and with the proper way to set up your art, however, you shouldn't need to reset the parameters too often. The lady in figure 1 took ThunderScan less than 5 minutes to scan, but I spent about 30 minutes positioning the artwork and setting the scan parameters. If I'd copied her freehand with the mouse or tablet and a paint program, it would have taken much longer.

After scanning, you can display the image and change some of the parameters, including the format, mode, brightness, and contrast. You can also apply a filter to the image to adjust assignments to the gray scales. In the super-hi-res formats, you can assign colors to the gray levels.

The ThunderScan software reminds you to save your scanned image as a ThunderScan file when you try to do a new scan or quit. When your scanned image is being displayed, you can save a picture file in the current format: single hi res, double hi res, or super hi res.

For super hi res, you can choose to save the image in the Paintworks Plus screen or paint format or in Apple's preferred format for DeluxePaint II and other programs. At this writing, only ThunderScan software can use the scan file, but you should save the file

so you can reopen the image for later adjustment of the mode, format, and other parameters.

ThunderScan files can occupy lots of disk space, depending on the mode of scanning and the magnification you choose. If you are scanning large areas, you may have trouble fitting the scan files onto floppy disks. The picture files, of course, occupy the standard 8, 16, or 32K necessary for hi res, double hi res, or super hi res, respectively. **Printing**

ThunderScan also lets you print your images. After you've removed the scanning cartridge from the printer and game port and reinstalled a ribbon cartridge in your ImageWriter, the ThunderScan software can print your graphic. Here also you have a variety of options, depending on your printer. ThunderScan allows both regular and high-quality printing on any ImageWriter and color printing on the ImageWriter II. The Image-Writer printouts were excellent, but I couldn't access the Apple LaserWriter (connected through AppleTalk) and therefore was unable to take advantage of ThunderScan's potential as a very-high-resolution scanner.

If you get the impression that ThunderScan offers you a lot of options, you're right. Although the software looks a bit old-fashioned to those of us who are used to programs with fancy mouse-based interfaces, it is well produced and easy to use. The excellent 70-page users' guide includes both a tutorial and a reference section.

I put ThunderScan through its paces with a wide range of artwork, from four-color magazine illustrations to simple line art. Needless to say, ThunderScan did the best job with simple line art, but it also did a credible job with the four-color illustrations. The latter looked best when I scanned and viewed them in the Apple IIGS super-hi-res modes. Line art scanned well in all modes. Once you've saved your images, you can use a paint program to spiff them up (see figure 2). The image quality, as you can see, is superb.

A note of caution here: As with any digitizer, you can reproduce all

sorts of artwork, much of which is copyrighted. Depending on what you are doing with the artwork, you can be sued for improper use of copyrighted material so seek permission from the copyright holder to reproduce the art.

ThunderScan's natural competitors are video digitizers (see A +, May 1987). Video digitizers are terrific for capturing three-dimensional objects but require a camera (or other video source), tripod, and proper lighting to work. The flexibility of a video digitizer is more than offset by ThunderScan's ease of use and the high quality of ThunderScan images. If I had my druthers, I'd have both a video digitizer and ThunderScan, but if I could have only one digitizer, I'd opt for ThunderScan.

With desktop presentations, video, and publishing coming to the Apple II world, ThunderScan provides many needed capabilities. It was worth the wait.

Page layout comes to the Apple II—for those who have the time.

PRINTRIX


hat is an Apple II owner to do? It's so hard to keep up with technology. No sooner did you buy your computer than someone came out with a bigger and better model. What is worse, a whole new area can open up. Take desktop publishing. What to do? You can buy a Macintosh computer, of course. But chances are you're more likely to make a smaller investment in Apple II software such as The Newsroom or MultiScribe—or the latest alternative-a powerful and fullfeatured page-layout program called Printrix.

Printrix works with word-processing files from AppleWorks, AppleWriter, WordPerfect, and Word Juggler, or ProDOS ASCII text files from other programs. Using these files, you can control the printout with different fonts, spacing, or graphics. The program includes 43 fonts and can use standard-hi-res graphics; Print Shop graphics; or Graffiles from Fontrix, another program from Data Transforms. You can also convert and use the collection of fonts from the Fontrix font collection.

Using Printrix means you first have to configure your Printrix program for your computer, printer, and word-processing software—an easy job once you get started. Welcome to the world of ProDOS pathnames. You need to start Printrix; exit to BASIC; flip over the disk; set the prefix; and, finally, run the Configure pro-

gram. The manual spells out this procedure step by step. When Configure is finished, you restart Printrix. Sample files and a tutorial move you through the various parts of the program.

When you're ready to actually use Printrix, the first step is to prepare your word-processing file. You write the document as you normally would and then add im-



bedded commands for Printrix, referring to the Command Quick Reference Card, which comes in the Printrix package. The imbedded commands tell Printrix where to start a new font, set the margins, and change the font color (if your printer can give you color); they also control the spacing of lines and characters and placement of graphics.

To begin, you probably want to change the fonts in your text, just to get a feel for the program. Changing fonts involves the command F = n, where n is a number from 1 to 4. Four fonts are stored per layout file, but you can load other layout files, meaning that you can use an unlimited number of fonts.

Wherever you place an F = n command, the font changes, even in mid-sentence.

After you've saved your text, you load Printrix and construct a layout file, which sets the four fonts as well as the margins, spacing parameters, graphic formats, and any other parameters you need. You can construct different layout files for different applications, although you can set up a default file to load automatically.

Now you are ready to print. The program accesses the fonts and the word-processing file as needed during printing, so you'll want to use two disk drives (although the program will wait for you if you don't mind shuffling disks).

The printout is spectacular and gratifying after all the work, but Printrix is not the easiest program to use, nor is it bug free. The manual, which is required reading, gets off to a good start, but it tends to skip around. Its index is helpful, however.

Since I am fairly computer-literate and am comfortable with Pro-DOS pathnames and structure, I decided to test Printrix with a simple one-page letter I use to introduce people to The AppleWorks Users Group. I went into the text and added the needed commands for the fonts I wanted. I also decided, while playing around, to print the document in two columns, a feature Printrix offers. Six hours later, I had a final printout. Granted, this excessive time expenditure was due in part to first exposure to a new and full-featured program, but part of the blame belongs to Printrix and its inconvenient user interface.

The program has its quirks. You need to be comfortable with prefixes and pathnames—Printrix is not

a Print Shop-type menu-driven program. My first problem involved changing fonts. You can place four fonts in each layout file. When I tried to change the fonts, I went through the procedures and specified the pathnames, and the program accessed the disk, but the new font didn't load. No error message of any type appeared—the font just didn't change. This glitch happened several times until I finally figured out how to fix it. The program has other minor new-pro-

gram bugs that I'm sure Data Transforms will correct eventually.

Another price to pay in using this program is the time it requires to print. A single-page document, in near letter quality with an ImageWriter II, printed in about two minutes. The same document, with four fonts, medium quality, and two columns took more than 20 minutes. You can specify five different print qualities. Quality 1 means one printhead pass per line, and quality 5 gives you five passes per line. Making and seeing changes in a document is tedious, since the program has no preview or fast-draft mode. (Version 1.1 of Printrix, which may be available by the time this review comes out, will have a preview mode, however.) The moral is to make sure you don't make any mistakes. Because of the way the program prints, a print buffer does not speed up access to the computer.

You can copy the program onto a 3.5-inch disk, which helps organize all the parts of the program (it is not copy-protected). A more convenient user interface and a draft-print or screen-print mode would really enhance this program. Be willing to spend some time learning Printrix.

It is not a program to use for short memos, but if you really want an impressive looking document with fancy fonts and text that wraps around graphics, it is—currently—the way to go.

QUICKTAKE

A two-dimensional drafting package for educational applications

ENTRY LEVEL CADAPPLE

n a few more years, the drawing board and T-square will be as obsolete as the slide rule in American engineering and manufacturing offices. Computeraided design and drafting that used to require specialized \$100,000 workstations is now at home on desktop CAD systems that cost less than \$10,000. Electronics, aerospace, architecture, technical illustration, and many other fields are experiencing a growing demand for trained CAD operators. Thousands of drafters need to adapt their skills to the world of computers. Vocational and technical educators, in particular, must face a real challenge in meeting this demand. A roomful of PC-based CAD systems may be "low cost" to an auto maker or planning department, but not to a school district.

Apple II to the rescue. **Drafting Isn't Drawing**

A drafting program differs in several important ways from the paint and draw programs familiar to most Apple users. Drafting requires great precision in the placement and dimensioning of objects. CADApple, an Apple II drafting package, can store and manipulate numbers to seven significant digits. That means a line can be precisely 132.0625 inches long. Whereas simple drawing programs are limited to a single screen, or an 8×11-inch page, CADApple uses

real-world coordinates. If you are drawing a room 20 feet square, that is how big the computer makes the lines. You have to zoom out to see the big picture and zoom in to work on fine details. Also, paint and draw programs use dot-matrix printers, whereas drafting pro-



grams need pen plotters to deliver smooth, sharp lines for technical drawings.

CADApple, now up to version 3.5, is a veteran drafting program with more than 5000 users, largely in high schools and colleges. The price has recently been reduced from \$1495 to \$995. The latest revision (which was not available for review at this writing) will be able to use the 320×200 and 640×200 video modes of the Apple IIGS.

CADApple has 17 submenus, with a total of 179 options. About the only thing CADApple's missing that you find on high-end CAD workstations is the ability to create fancy curves, such as parabolas, cubic splines, and logarithmic spirals. The high price of this program will make it prohibitive for most educators, however.

A Better Price

Besides considering the latest update of CADApple, though, you can now also look at Entry Level CADApple, a downsized and repackaged version of its bigger brother that's much less expensive. It comes on four disks, like its sibling, but it can run on a 64K system and costs only \$99. It has only 12 submenus and far fewer options. Documentation has been reduced to a 45-page booklet and a superbly illustrated 170-page textbook authored by a quartet of community-college drafting professors.

The package includes three function-key templates (for the Apple II Plus, IIe, and IIc) and a professionally narrated audiocassette tape with a guided tour of the program.

Entry Level CADApple works under the Apple Pascal operating system (version 1.3)—a significant drawback for most Apple users. Pascal handles drives, files, and devices according to its own rather tricky and cryptic syntax. I never could figure out how to set up my

extra memory as a RAMdisk, which was a shame, since the program is painfully slow, with disk access required for almost every menu selection, and occasional disk swapping, even on a two-drive system. The Help files, for example, are on a separate disk, so any Help call requires a disk swap. On the other hand, the program is virtually fail-safe; everything saves to the work file on disk as it is created, so a system crash or power failure cannot destroy more than a

few seconds of your work.

The documentation includes an extensive reference section on the Pascal system Filer, but beginners can expect a slow, frustrating learning curve.

What You See . . .

The limitations of the Apple II graphics screen impose an awkward display format on Entry Level CADApple. You must toggle between a text screen (for menus); a graphics screen (for drawing); and a split screen, in which a text line

that reads out the coordinates of the cursor and some status codes replaces the bottom sixth of the drawing window.

With a Videx UltraTerm or VideoTerm card in slot #3, however, you can use two monitors, with text on one and graphics on the other.

You create all graphic objects—arcs, circles, ellipses, lines, polygons, rectangles, points, and text—in Entry Level CADApple by using single-letter commands from the Add menu.

You can set up a grid and have the cursor "snap" between points, to aid in precise positioning and alignment—great for drawing schematics, org charts, and floor plans. Keyboard input can be absolute (grid coordinates of a point), relative (x and y distance from the last point specified), or polar (angle and distance from a reference point).

You can draw lines in several solid, broken, and dotted styles and up to eight different colors, depending on the type of plotter you are using.

An important feature of the program is its ability to do dimensioning (provide text showing the measurements of lines and angles in the drawing). Using this feature can be a little tricky, since you have to place the cursor *exactly* on the end points of the entity you want to dimension.

The program accepts input from the keyboard; a joystick; a mouse; or digitizing tablets from Houston Instruments, Kurta, and Summagraphics. You can toggle between keyboard input and other modes, using a function key.

Plotters that work with this software include the Apple Color Plotter and those from Hewlett-Packard, Houston Instruments, Ioline, and Roland.

Registered owners enjoy a 90-day warranty, and the disks are not copy-protected. Lucky owners of 3.5-inch drives can copy all the program files to one 800K disk, which speeds up operations dramatically.

Evaluation

The product should be rewritten, optimized for speed, and designed to run under ProDOS. The Apple II family will never have a math coprocessor to speed up number







crunching for precision graphics, so programmers need to squeeze maximum performance out of the hardware.

The program could be improved by a mouse-based interface that used icons and pull-down menus. Professional CAD/CAM workstations are increasingly adopting this sort of interface, so programs designed for training need to keep up with the trend.

CADApple's maker should provide drivers for screen dumps to popular dot-matrix (and laser) printers. No low-cost dot-matrix printer can equal the fine line quality of a pen plotter, but sometimes a quick-and-dirty printout is sufficient for teachers and students.

Despite these limitations, I recommend Entry Level CADApple to any high school, community college, or vocational program that needs a low-cost way to get started in computer-aided design.

Secondhand Apple II computers are available to schools at very low cost, so the biggest capital expense would be for plotters. The cheapest new single-pen plotter might cost about \$500. By sharing a plotter between two or three workstations, a school can set up a CAD lab for less than \$1000 per seat, including software.

Other CAD programs for the Apple may be available at lower cost, but I have seen none that offer so much value for less than \$100.



TWO NEW GRAPHICS PROGRAMS

AppleWorks users who want to produce business graphs from their spreadsheets have long had few choices. In the November 1987 issue of A +, we just about covered the universe of AppleWorks graphing programs, by reviewing Visualizer IIe and GraphMerge. Since then, both Beagle Bros and Pinpoint have introduced products to help you create graphs from spreadsheets. The Beagle program works from within AppleWorks and is easy to use, whereas the stand-alone Pinpoint product is more powerful and complex.

TIMEOUT GRAPH

Timeout Graph, one of Beagle Bros' new Timeout desk accessories for AppleWorks, lets you create seven basic types of business graphs from AppleWorks spreadsheet data. To use it, you must modify your AppleWorks start-up disk, after which you can access Timeout Graph (or any other Timeout accessories you may have) from inside AppleWorks by holding down the open-apple and Escape keys, as long as the disk containing the desk-accessory files is in an available disk drive.

Being able to run Timeout Graph

from inside AppleWorks offers two key advantages. You don't have to quit AppleWorks and run a separate program when you want to produce a spreadsheet graph, and because Timeout Graph uses the spreadsheet's own facilities for cursor movement and selection of data points, it's faster at these activities than graphing programs that work by themselves. Timeout Graph works with spreadsheet files of any size and is compatible with most other AppleWorks enhancements, including Super MacroWorks, AutoWorks, and the Pinpoint accessories, and RAM-card modification software from Applied Engineering and Checkmate.

Fast and Easy Graphs

As a desk accessory, Timeout Graph doesn't offer as many graphic-enhancement options as a full-featured, stand-alone program would, but it is fast and easy to use. You load the spreadsheet you want to graph and then use the open-apple and Escape keys to bring up the Timeout menu showing the available accessories. Once you've chosen Graph, the program loads, offering a menu of basic options at the bottom of the spreadsheet

screen. Choosing any of these options brings up one or more submenus. With the Type command, you can select from bar, stacked bar, line, pie, XY, high-low, and area graphs. The Data command lets you select up to eight sets of data for plotting. Because Timeout Graph uses the spreadsheet's own facilities to select data, you can use open-apple/arrow-key combinations to select groups of cells.

Using the Options command, you can add main titles and subtitles to the graph, specify a legend for each data set, select a specific scale (or use auto-scaling), or display horizontal and vertical grid lines. Scale numbers can be displayed in all the AppleWorks spreadsheet formats: dollars, percentages, and so on. Scale numbers and legends appear in the program's built-in font, and you can't select a different font. The View command plots the graph on the screen.

Trade-offs

One drawback of having these graphing features within Apple-Works is that, because AppleWorks itself can't handle color, you can't display color graphs. On the other



hand, updating a graph with | changed spreadsheet data is easy. You can press the Escape key twice from a graph screen to return to the basic spreadsheet file, change a number or two, and then run Timeout Graph again and use the View command to plot the changes. Timeout Graph remembers any graph settings you've chosen for a spreadsheet file, as long as that file is on the desktop, and you can save the settings with the spreadsheet file by using a Save command on Graph's basic menu. You can save only one graph definition per spreadsheet file, though.

Along with graph definitions, you can save displayed graphs themselves as standard double-hires picture files, so you can produce a graph and further enhance it with Beagle Graphics or another double-hi-res graphics program. The Print command lets you print the last graph you viewed in one of three different sizes.

working environments-the filecard, worksheet, and drawing environments-each with its own set of commands and capabilities. The file-card environment looks a lot like the AppleWorks desktop, with file cards containing menu options that let you add, remove, or save desktop files (which are spreadsheets with graph definitions linked to them) or make new files. You can work with up to 12 spreadsheet or double-hi-res files on the desktop at a time. The Other Activities menu lets you format disks, make subdirectories, specify the type of printer you're using, select the type of RAM card you're using (the program works with Apple, Applied Engineering, AST, and Checkmate RAM cards), select a standard chart definition to use automatically, and edit one of the program's ten fill patterns that identify different data sets.

Worksheets

Graphic Edge's worksheet environment lets you select a chart type and charting options and identify the data sets you want plotted. The menu that appears when you load a spreadsheet file contains only options for defining a graph, plotting a graph, or displaying the data points and charting options of the current chart definition. Before

you can define a graph, you must name the file that will contain the set of chart options you select. If you have already created one or more chart definitions for the spreadsheet file you have loaded, you can select a particular chart definition by number or create a new definition.

Using the Define Graph option from the basic menu, you can select from eight different graph types: point, line, bar, stacked bar, area, high-low, pie, and XY. The program has no option for exploded pie charts, but you can edit all the elements of a chart in the drawing environment to create any type of chart explosion. You can select up to ten sets of data points for plotting. Cursor movements and screen scrolling are a little slow when you select data, and you can't use AppleWorks spreadsheet shortcuts such as open-apple/arrow key to select ranges of data quickly.

Chart options include x- and y-axis grids; automatic or manual scaling; main titles and subtitles, as well as x-and y-axis titles; time labels (to denote quarters, months, and so on); and legend labels. You can also enhance graphs with tick marks inside the grids, frames around graphs and legend boxes,

and different colors or patterns for different data sets. If you want to enter a chart title that isn't contained in a spreadsheet cell, you can specify any cell's contents as the title and then edit the title later in the drawing environment to produce the title you want.

You can choose to display chart elements in color or black and white, but the color option works well only with composite color monitors. The manual warns that text and small objects don't display well on RGB monitors such as the IIGS monitor—a common problem with color programs on the IIGS.

Drawing

Once you've displayed a graph (or if you choose the option to create a new graphic file within the file-card environment), you enter Graphic Edge's double-hi-res drawing environment. You can draw lines, boxes, rounded boxes, ovals, or text on the screen, using the Apple's cursor keys (the program does not work with the mouse). You can also edit any part of a graph or any graphic object you've drawn on the screen.

Graphic Edge works with three different levels of graphic objects. First, graph objects are the lines, grids, titles, and legends the computer draws when you plot spreadsheet data. You can select individual objects and move them, change their color or pattern, or edit the text in legends or titles. The second level-user objects-includes lines, boxes, and text you add by using the drawing tools. Last but not least, pictures and bit maps are images of the screen that you can save as files. (A bit map is a portion of a graphic screen.)

The different levels of graphic objects are what give Graphic Edge its real power. The program treats each level of objects independently, so you can load a picture from disk into a screen that contains a graph, to dress up the graph. If you have a standard company logo in a graphic file, for example, you can load that file into each graph you plot to achieve a standard look. You can also plot a graph, save it as a picture, and then load it in on top of another picture so the graph has a full background. You can use

graphics from clip-art disks, from programs such as The Print Shop, or from files you've created with Dazzle Draw or other programs to customize spreadsheet graphs almost infinitely. Graphic Edge can even load Print Shop graphics from either DOS 3.3 or ProDOS

Goodies

Along with moving or editing the text in user objects or graph objects, you can use "goodies" available within the drawing environment to select different brush sizes (to change the thickness of lines, boxes, or chart frames), colors, or patterns to draw with, or to change the text font. You can select right, left, or center justification for text when you type. The program has dozens of other options: you can add shaded boxes around text. You can move graphic objects in front of or behind other graphic objects. You can change the colors or patterns of bars or pie slices on charts. You can set the program to redraw the screen automatically, or only when you tell it to.

When you're finished with your graphic creation in the drawing environment, you can save it as a double-hi-res file, in binary format for use with Dazzle Draw, or as a photo file. You can also save portions of the screen as bit maps. With the Picture File option or the Bit Map option, you can create a picture and then use Pinpoint's GraphMerge to paste it into an AppleWorks word-processing document. You can choose to save all the objects on a screen or only the user objects you have added yourself. When you print a picture, it prints in the full-screen size—the program offers no size selection for printed charts.

Another important feature of Graphic Edge is that it saves graphic objects as sets of mathematical coordinates, so the resolution of those objects adjusts to the resolution of the output device. Pinpoint is contemplating a service that will produce high-quality color slides of Graphic Edge files for its users.

Graphic Edge is a flexible program that goes far beyond basic business graphics. Although its drawing tools don't rival those in

Dazzle Draw or other hi-res drawing programs, it offers enough power to let you create some artful embellishments to business graphs or produce quick bullet charts, organizational charts, or other business tools. When Graphic Edge's drawing tools aren't enough, you can import drawings from other programs with ease.

This program is powerful but

also complex. The three levels of interaction and the nests of menus in the worksheet and drawing environments make it somewhat harder to learn than simpler programs such as Visualizer IIe or Timeout Graph. You don't get a real sense of how the program is organized and what its full capabilities are until you've read chapter 4 of the manual.

Nevertheless, Graphic Edge is the program to choose if you want maximum graphic flexibility when producing business graphs and if you don't mind having to do it with a stand-alone program. You can create and save multiple chart definitions with your spreadsheets so you can produce recurring updates of graphs with ease, and the program lets you use custom artwork you've created with other programs.

As an additional enticement, Pinpoint is offering enhancements to Graphic Edge, including a font editor that lets you create your own custom fonts, a clip-art collection, and a slide-show maker that lets you store and display graphic screens in sequence. Graphic Edge takes business graphics out of a world of lines and boxes and makes them an art form.

ZIPFILES TEMPLATES

AppleWorks, as we all know, is one of the best-selling programs of all time. Because of its popularity, it has inspired a large collection of related software, hardware, and other enhancements, not to men-

tion three users' groups devoted exclusively to AppleWorks and a seemingly endless supply of public-domain templates that help you do almost anything you'd like. AWUG, The AppleWorks Users

Group, with which I am connected, has a collection of more than 1100 templates. So, when I was asked to review ZipFiles templates for AppleWorks, I wondered what it could have that I hadn't already seen.

Well, I was pleased with what I saw. Petit Designs sells six different sets of templates. I received Desktop Accessories ZipFiles, which are considered by the author to be low-cost alternatives to Pinpoint or Jeeves. This disk includes 11 accessory spreadsheet files and one file that contains all the other templates.

The two Calendar accessory files generate calendars to the year 2000. A Calendar is a full month and takes a full screen to view, whereas the Compact Calendar shows four months at a time. Both have an interesting note feature. An asterisk appears next to the date, and when you place the cursor on it, a one-line note shows up on the bottom of the screen.

Another accessory, the Task List, lets you list and rank things to do. KwikEnvelope and KwikLabel print envelopes and labels, using the print block from the spreadsheet. Both files suggest keeping a directory of names and addresses in an AppleWorks spreadsheet file for quick printing. Calculator Set performs simple scientific, factorial, or trigonometric calculations and appears as a graphic of a calculator, with a space to enter a problem that the AppleWorks spreadsheet program can calculate. Sleeve List is supposed to print a screen dump of an AppleWorks catalog in 17 characters per inch (cpi). It does so by loading a word-processing file set to print at 17 cpi. Then you go to Add files to the desktop and do a screen dump. In theory, the printer is now set to 17 cpi and will dump at this setting. My ImageWriter kept reverting to 10 cpi for the screen dump, however.

Flash Pad contains all the aforementioned files on one spreadsheet, which means you have to have only one file on the desktop to access all the accessories. Even if you haven't added any of your in-

formation to the files, this file takes up about 18K of desktop space, a sizable percentage of a 55K desktop. Flash Pad includes a unique mapping system that shows you where the various accessories and instructions reside, so you can speed to those areas. The program's author suggests using a macro program to set up one- or two-keystroke access to these accessories.

On the surface, none of these templates are all that exciting. Then why do I like them? The answer lies in their programming. They boast unique components that everyone who designs templates should look at, including visual alarms and flags that are programmed to "light up," depending on different circumstances. The speed-map idea should be used for clarity and ease of use by anyone who constructs large spreadsheet templates.

The manual comes in Apple-Works word-processing files on the back of the program disk. The author plans to supply a printed manual "when sales warrant the expense." The manual, like the software, is well thought out. As AppleWorks files, the templates are not copy-protected and can work with any other AppleWorks accessories that you currently use.

CONVERTING GRADES

The September 1987 issue of A + (page 105) contained an inquiry entitled "Grading Spreadsheet." The macro in figure 1 for use with Super MacroWorks converts numerical grades to letter grades (90-100 = A, 80-89 = B,70-79 = C, 60-69 = D, and <60 = F). The grade for a zero entry is marked with I (for incomplete). You can modify the macro for alternative criteria.

The macro is compiled by openapple/=. To use the macro:

- 1. Numerical grades must be in a column. No text or blank entries are allowed in the columns.
- 2. The column of grades, if generated by formula, *must* be copied to and then from the clipboard as "values only."
- 3. Insert a –1 below the last numerical grade to indicate the end of the list.

4. Visually scan the numerical grades for any values that are less than 20 (but not 0), since they provide a letter grade of A instead of F. 5. Activate the macro by placing the cursor on the topmost grade

and typing closed-apple/G

Letter grades will appear in the column immediately to the right of the numerical grades.

THOUGHTS ABOUT LEARNING

Educational software should promote higher-level thinking skills.

Last October's issue of A + contained a "debate" between Jan Davidson and me on the merits of drill-and-practice software in the classroom. Jan (whose company is a world leader in the development

and sale of such software) took issue with some of my published commentaries on the topic. In fact, our differences of opinion have nothing to do with whether or not children should use drill to reinforce basic skills-we both agree that basic skills are important. The point I made was that the classroom computer is a scarce resource and that it should be reserved for tasks that students cannot perform with workbooks or other traditional classroom tools.

As I thought further about this comment, I realized that the computer is such a flexible

tool that it can easily develop and reinforce all the thinking skills that are important in learning, but that most of the energy in software development has been expended on software for one of the lowest levels of thinking skills, the acquisition of factual information.

This month I want to explore the challenges that face developers of

software designed to help promote and support "higher-order thinking skills" and creativity.

How Do We Learn?

I recently came across an interesting model of learning attributed to Chuck House at Hewlett-Packard. He identifies four stages of the learning process:

Step 1. You don't know that you don't know,



Step 2. You know that you don't know,

Step 3. You know that you know, and

Step 4. You don't know that you know.

Let's explore this model for a task such as learning to ride a bicycle. At some stage in the learners' life, the word *bicycle* doesn't exist.

They have never seen a bicycle and, consequently, don't know that they don't know how to ride one (step 1).

Next, our learners see someone riding a bicycle and try to ride one as well, falling down in the process (step 2).

Through diligent effort, the learners are able to ride the bicycle, with much attention to every

move. The wobbliness of the bike at this stage is an indication of the thinking that is going on—the learners *know* that they know how to ride a bike.

Finally, bike riding becomes second nature. The skills are so well ingrained that the riders don't have to think about it anymore—they just hop on the bike and take off down the street (step 4).

Many personal-computer drill programs are designed to help students move from step 3 to step 4, to make computation or reading or some other task such a common experience that learners don't have

to think about it much, if at all. Unfortunately, these programs are sometimes used by learners who are trying to make the transition from step 2 to step 3—the software is being used for the acquisition rather than the reinforcement of a skill.

Skill acquisition is important, and computers can be an appropri-

ate aid in this area, but the software for skill acquisition should be markedly different from that for skill reinforcement.

Thinking Skills

Let's explore the scope of the thinking skills that we use (or should be able to use) every day. The following model is my own extension of a taxonomy of thinking skills by Benjamin Bloom. His list comprises six thinking skills arranged in the following hierarchy, starting with the lowest-level skill:

- 1. Knowledge—the ability to recall information,
- 2. Comprehension—the simple understanding of knowledge,
- 3. Application—the ability to use principles in new situations,
- 4. Analysis—the capacity to break a complex situation or problem into parts,
- 5. Synthesis—the capacity to construct new things by applying several separate principles or ideas, and
- 6. Evaluation—the capacity to

make judgments about one's own thinking.

To this list I have added three more thinking skills of an even higher order:

7. Creativity—the power to spontaneously develop new solutions to challenges, to invent new things through spontaneous insight,

8. Intuition—the capacity to "know" or understand the characteristics of a situation without prior factual knowledge, and

9. Connection to the "collective unconscious"—the Jungian domain in which (among other things) discoveries in one part of the planet are "spontaneously" rediscovered in other parts at about the same time without direct communication between the discoverers.

I've come to the conclusion that children seem to be born with skills 7-9 and that they need to be taught skills 1-6. Unfortunately, there seems to be overwhelming evidence that through lack of validation and support, the highest three skills are submerged by the time a child reaches sixth grade (if not before then). The recent interest in developing skills 4-6 is a positive sign, since mastery of these higher-order thinking skills is essential for students. I believe these skills can be approached from the analytical or from the intuitive perspective-or from both perspectives at the same time.

Unfortunately, philosophical discussions of this topic seem to have little impact on reality (although this situation is starting to change). Even through high school, most of the teaching and almost all of the standardized tests focus on the three lowest-order thinking skills. If the status quo is to change, educators need to understand the immense power of higher-order thinking and ways that these skills can allow children to explore the traditional educational topics.

For example, a history lesson can consist of a lecture in which the students are expected to memorize names, dates, and places for later regurgitation on an examination. Alternatively, the same subject matter can become a class project in which the teacher gives the students tools with which they can construct their own knowledge base on the topic. With the second

alternative, student retention of knowledge (not to mention enthusiasm for study) is likely to be high.

Where Do Computers Fit In?

Computers, being adaptable machines, can support any style of learning. Creating programs that support the first three levels of Bloom's taxonomy is easy, since a rich collection of source material is available and because student interaction with a computer tends to follow a simple stimulus/response model: The computer asks a question, the student responds, and the computer evaluates the response.

The next three levels require more sophistication on the part of program designers. Programs in these areas tend to present opportunities for students to respond to a question in several different but equally correct ways, or they ensure that student interaction with the program is so intense that the computer becomes "transparent." Good user interfaces are essential for all educational software, but they become more important as you move up the hierarchy of thinking skills.

The top three levels generally place stringent demands on computational hardware. A program that supports the user's creative process must be instantly responsive. Perceptible delays can block creativity, as can poor resolution and limited color. Note that powerful hardware is not enough, however. The Apple IIGS is well suited for software in the creative domain-it has a fast CPU, lots of colors, and excellent sound capabilities-but the first software specifically for this machine was designed to show off the machine's capabilities, not to respond properly to human beings.

As I asserted last month, I have vet to see a graphics programs for the IIGS that is worth opening the box for. The problem is not the hardware—it is developers' lack of understanding of users' needs.

When you consider the role of computers in creativity and intuition, think of the computer as a support tool like a pencil, not as a cocreator of ideas.

Some deceptively simple programs can further the development of intuitive skills, and I will publish one of them in next month's column.



I recently served as one of the judges of the A + "How I Use the II to Teach" contest and was amazed at the number of entries submitted by parents and teachers who used

computerized word games and cartoon programs as supplemental language-arts activities. By far the most popular program mentioned was Crossword Magic from Mindscape. The program's popularity among our

contestants inspired me to look around for other cartoon, wordgame, and puzzle programs that combined humor with learning something about language.

Word-game and puzzle programs provide a nontraditional framework for gathering, organiz-

Like Crossword Magic, Wordmaze is useful in any subject area. It takes words from preconstructed lists contained on the disk or from lists created by teachers or students and hides them among random letters. The words are difficult to identify because they are positioned in all sorts of odd directions. Selecting the words hidden among the rows and columns of letters requires good spelling, vocabulary, and visual-discrimination skills. The size of the maze is adjustable, with a word maze consisting of 3letter words as easy to construct as one containing 20-letter words.

Scrabble

The computer edition of the classic Selchow & Righter board game Scrabble is an amusing alternative to crossword-puzzle programs. Electronic Arts distributes this product, which comes from Leisure Genius, a London-based entertainment-software company. The computer version of Scrabble remains



remarkably faithful to the original board game. Two to four players can play, and, if no human challengers are available, the program can provide up to three opponents in any one game. The playing vocabulary comprises more than 20,000 words selected from *The Official Scrabble Player's Dictionary*. The program uses the vocabulary to check and challenge all entries. The vocabulary is also available to computer opponents, and you can be sure that these challengers will pick the most obscure word with the highest point value every time. **Puzzles and Posters**

Puzzles and Posters consists of four utility programs for teachers that create puzzles, mazes, and banners. 
otes•n•Files, from DataPak Software, Inc., is designed to take the drudgery out of mailing lists and form letters. It combines a simple but effective database with text processing and uses an intuitive file-cabinet metaphor. Pull-down menus, dialog boxes, icons, and detailed graphic screens form the IIGS look and feel of the product, while specialized features such as record flagging, indexing, and conditional filtering of records power the datamanagement end.




Figure 1: Each Notes*n*Files database centers on a two-drawer filing cabinet depicted on the screen. Each drawer contains alphabetically arranged folders.

Each Notes•n•Files database centers on a two-drawer filing cabinet graphically depicted on the screen (see figure 1). Each drawer contains alphabetically arranged folders, each of which represents one record in the file (about 2500 folders per 800K data disk). Double-clicking on a folder opens a folder window. Icons that represent the documents in the folder are stacked on the right side of this window.

You can page through these icons one at a time, double-clicking to choose a document, or you can open the Folder Summary on the right side. The Folder Summary shows the names of the fields it contains (name, address, phone, etc.) as well as a list of all the documents in the folder and their creation dates. Double-clicking on a document name in the Folder Summary opens that document. Use the Folder Summary also to add to or change the database information.

Each Folder Summary contains a

preset list of 15 fields, and, although you can change the field names, the field types are always the same. Notes•n•Files has no calculated fields and treats numbers the same as text. The program provides four miscellaneous fields as well as a Comments field that allows longer entries. You might rename miscellaneous fields to repre-



sent specific information—an Amount Owed field, for instance, or a label to categorize employees by job description (you can use it later for sorting or to select specific groups of records).

You can have as many windows open as memory allows. In fact, as one DataPak spokesman stated, "You can be as messy in Notes as you are on your own desk." Handling all the graphics is sometimes slow and response time sluggish,

so you're generally better off if you keep the number of open windows to a minimum. You can, however, cut and paste information between documents and even move documents easily from folder to folder.

Notes•n•Files includes two builtin indexes and a Master List. You can view the contents of either drawer in the Master List and select the alphabetical point for the starting record. Double-clicking on a folder name in the Master List opens that folder.

You can use the two indexes to modify field order and display and also to determine new sorts and subsorts of the data. Either index list can be used in place of the Master List. When you select the Master List, Index 1, or Index 2 icon at the bottom of the desktop screen, the folders in the cabinet change sort order and folder label to reflect the field order of the selected list.

Both the Master List and the two indexes feature optional AND and OR conditional criteria for record filtering, which means you can display all folders from New York AND with a last name Smith, or display all folders from New York OR California, and so on. You use these same conditional filters when printing mailing labels and form letters.

The word-processing section of Notes•n•Files includes features such as word wrap, variable tabs and margins, auto paragraph indents, and several justification options. You can print documents in



several sizes, too (3×5 card, letter, legal, or wide). You can selectively change fonts and sizes within documents, but, to date, only two fonts and three sizes are available. Keyboard handling in documents is fairly slow—a fast typist can easily get ahead of the screen display.

You can imbed database information anywhere in text by inserting field names within brackets. During printing, documents automatically reformat to accommodate text from the field variables. Unfortunately, you can't display form letters on the screen that contain field data. Also, Notes • n • Files makes it easy to work with standard document formats. You can keep standard documents (formletter templates or letterheads, for instance) in a special Stationery window. You open these standard documents as templates for recurring jobs and use Save Document As to change the filename without affecting the original template.

Printing labels is a snap. They come in three styles, printing one-, two-, or three-across. A test-print option allows you to align the paper before beginning a label run.

One particularly useful feature is Record Flag. This option instructs the program to enter the current date into special fields whenever you print labels or form letters for a particular folder. Thus, you can determine if a specific letter has gone out to a particular person or group. You can also set up a print run that uses conditional criteria to exclude any folders flagged after a specific date—useful for mass mailings and for situations that might require follow-up correspondence.

Notes•n•Files is a versatile mail-

ing-list manager, and the manual is carefully written to explain its use, doing a superlative job for the most part. A few confusing sections and a need for more specific examples are only minor flaws.

The program's many features are easy to use, powerful, and effective. It does not boast blazing speed, and its documents are limited to ten pages maximum, but it's an excellent tool for managing a mailing list and performing routine mailing chores.

AUTO-MAPPING

What are seven of the most disheartening words in the English language?

"You are in twisty little maze."

Suddenly, the carefree, danger-defying life of a computer adventurer becomes an accountant's nightmare. Game playing turns from key punching to wielding finely sharpened No. 3 pencils and squinting at blue-lined grid paper. Hands dart from computer to pen as you scratch out the part of that twisty maze you are in when you go north.

days of computer entertainment, mapping has been an integral part of the experience. When 16K of RAM seemed like unlimited memory, popping a maze into an adventure game was a relatively simple and efficient means of adding difficulty without overtaxing the limits of the computer. The appearance of bigger computers generally didn't inspire games with more imaginative challenges—just bigger maps.

Enough. In 1987, mapping fans were blessed with a watershed achievement in mapping complexity: Wizardry IV. Roe Adams and Robert Woodhead conceived ten levels of mapping ecstasy in this ingenious game. It's a brilliant accomplishment and should satisfy the paper- and graphite-hungry mapping community for some time to come.


So, let the rest of us move on to different challenges.

As intriguing as mapping is for many, it stands as an obstacle to others. How many "GamePort" readers, dedicated computer gamers all, shun roleplaying or text adventures because they despise mapping? How many of the great unwashed—those poor souls who don't play computer games—have

avoided the genre because they want to become engrossed in the fantasy and not buried in the paperwork? Downplaying the importance of mapping may lure the mass audience that publishers dream about.

As 1987 came to an end, a small nonmapping movement began to develop. In his latest Infocom text adventure, Bevond Zork, Brian Moriarty provides an auto-mapping feature. The computer sketches out a map in one corner of the screen as you explore the landscape. Though Moriarty insists that the feature does not eliminate the need to map, it does remove some of the paper burden and enables the addition of geographical puzzles and is an inventive means of making the game different for every player.

Some useful items in Beyond Zork are randomly scattered by the computer within a predefined geographical area. A magic ax, for example, is always in the woods for some adventurers, but in a clearing or a thicket for others. "I never liked the syndrome of playing a game and then getting into a conference and getting a move-bymove solution," said Moriarty in an interview at AppleFest in San Francisco last fall. "This will

make that kind of thing almost impossible."

By reducing the mapping requirements, Moriarty has opened the portal for new, ingenious kinds of puzzles.

The Bard's Tale III: Thief of Fate, from Electronic Arts, also includes an auto-mapping feature. As you wander, the computer fills in a dungeon map in an on-screen window. According to codesigner Brian Fargo, several of the early maps in the game are completely drawn as you enter a dungeon, to help players quickly become involved in the fantasy.

What auto-mapping brings to BTIII is the freedom to use dungeons of various sizes. No more can BT enthusiasts count on dungeons of a specific shape or grid design.

Another Electronic Arts role-playing game, Wasteland, scorns the concept of unlimited geographical spaces entirely and directs its computing power toward more elaborate interaction between human players and their computerized colleagues —less breadth but more depth.

So, in 1988, let's hope for less of the past and more of the future. Mapping is a grand problem but not the only possible problem. Game designers

have been trapped in a twisty little maze. Count the move away from mapping as encouragement to step out of the labyrinth and move into new regions of game design.

IN LIEU OF **AUTO-MAPPING**

All right, so I don't love mapping. Call me a quitter, call me cowardly, call me a weenie. Hey, just because I said it was OK. you don't really have to do it.

In any case, we all know that dedicated "GamePort" readers dig zestfully into a mapping challenge, a slight smirk lighting their uncommonly attractive faces and a self-confident chuckle bubbling from their lips. They stand undaunted by brain-numbing obstacles that would paralyze less capable mortals (readers of competitive computer magazines, for instance).


Considering our mutual superiority among gamers, we can only conclude that the dozens of letters I receive each month asking for game hints are actually being written by imposters who are using your names. Yeah, that's the ticket.

Because of the volume of mail, I can't personally answer every hint request that I get, but I can point those questioning individuals toward Marvin K. Simon's book Keys to Solving Computer Ad-

venture Games published by Prentice-Hall.

The title wrongly implies that this book is a cerebral dissertation on the procedures and techniques that will lead the perceptive adventuregame practitioner to a triumphant conclusion. But forget that—it's just what you want, the Real Poop on adventure games. There are maps and hints to 25 adventures and complete walk-through solutions to 19 of them. All in all, this is a 286page guided tour, from twisty little frustrations to pat-on-the-back victories.

A problem with adventure-game help books is that players often have to glance selectively at a complete walk-through solution in order to get a



nudge out of their current predicament. And too often, while searching for "just a hint," gamers' eyes will stray guiltily over the page and cull much more than they need or want.

Simon's hint-handling system eliminates the wandering-eyeball syndrome. A single Master List gathers hints from all 25 games in scrambled and numerically coded



a realistically detailed control room, using the mouse to move an animated figure between various battle stations. When you're on the surface, you can get a wideangle view from the bridge or spot targets with binoculars. When submerged, you can use the periscope down to a depth of 44 feet. Below that, you have only your ears and the plot on the map table to guide you.

You steer, rotate the scope, launch torpedoes, and fire your deck gun by clicking on various icons at the bottom of the screen.

You can speed up the action (up to a factor of 4) by clicking on a time-

scale indicator. You can also use keyboard commands for various game functions. For example, pressing I identifies the target in the cross hairs on your scope, and pressing Control-E blows your emergency tanks, to halt an uncontrolled dive.

You can play Silent Service on three levels, selected from an opening screen. Torpedo/Gun Practice gives you the feel of pointing and shooting, with moored hulks as targets. Convoy Actions are six historical battles from different periods of the war, some easy, some very tough. War Patrols require you to set out from a base and hunt down your own convoys, being sure to leave enough fuel to get back to base. Before starting a War Patrol, you

must identify a ship silhouette, using small drawings scattered throughout the manuala standard MicroProse defense against software piracy.

The most important thing for a player to remember is that torpedoes run out of steam at 4500 vards. It's best to wait until a target is no more than 3000 yards away, to ensure a hit. You only have 24 "fish"-14 forward and 10 aft. A torpedo tube takes ten agonizingly long minutes to reload, so make every shot count. Your little deck gun has 80 rounds and can reach out 8000 yards, but it is deadly only to small ships. .

The game also offers increasing levels of difficulty, with enemy escorts using better tactics, con-


voys zigzagging to throw off your aim, and dud torpedoes (which were frequent and demoralizing until 1943) giving you fits. Your victories can be recorded on the disk, in a submariner's Hall of Fame, where your

The quality of the color graphics and sound is outstanding. An entire wall of detailed gauges and indicators changes with your situation. When a torpedo strikes a ship, you see the smoke and flames. When a shell misses a ship, you see the splash. The appearance of a target changes realistically, depending on the range and angle. There are more than a dozen digitized sound effects, including the sonar "ping" of approaching destroyers, the splash of depth charges hitting the water, the "whoosh" of torpedo launching, the crackling sound of an enemy ship breaking up,

and a variety of motor noises and explosions. For greater realism, and to avoid disturbing the neighbors, I recommend playing Silent Service with earphones, rather than external speakers. The game was designed by Sid Meier, and the IIGS version was developed by Ed Magnin. They should give lessons to other game designers. Mike Markowitz

PLAY IT AGAIN, RIPLEY

Why would anyone want to return to the place where she saw all her crew members killed, one after another? I guess Ripley is just cast in the mold of a heroine.

Aliens is actually a col-

lection of six action games based on the sequel, Aliens, to the movie Alien. This series of games exactly duplicates the movie's sequence of events. For instance, in the first level, you must identify all your equipment and, thus equipped, use a joystick to guide the Drop-Ship down through the varying atmospheric conditions of LV-426 to a planet's surface. Basically, you follow a twisting, tube-like outline and attempt to stay in its center. This part of the game is pretty easy and tunes you up for what's to come.

If you fail at this attempt to land (or at any of the other five mission levels), you can try again. You can also proceed to the next level without completing the current one, but you won't be able to see the final screens of the game if you haven't completed any earlier levels.

The second mission is the most interesting level. Here, you attempt to guide four lost marines back to the armored per-

sonnel carrier. Using the joystick, you maneuver each marine, one at a time, through a series of rooms in sublevel 3 of the atmosphere processor. The screen shows a readout of each marine's vital statistics and a danger screen that shows when aliens are near. Since you can control (and see) only one marine at a time, the game becomes a race to bring the marines all safely through the maze while you're switching quickly to any marine currently in danger.

Although killing the aliens is easy with a shot from a machine gun, the enemy comes quickly and can overwhelm an unwary soldier.

If you can get two or more marines into the same room, they are safe from alien attack. Also, if a marine is captured by aliens, you have a short time in which to bring another soldier to his rescue. Don't take too long, though—the aliens are quick to finish their captives. Get any marines safely to the APC, and you can continue on to Mission Three, the Operations Room Rampage.

In the operations room, you have only a flamethrower to hold off an attacking horde of aliens. A simple touch of the flame is enough to make them retreat temporarily, and firing the joystick button fries any alien in range, but there are always more attackers, and occasionally one catches you unawares by running alA mistake, miscalculation, or moment of inattention, and vou'll lose again.

most twice as fast as the others. Any aliens that get by you capture one of your party until none are left and you lose. If you hold the aliens off long enough, your compatriots will have time to cut a hole into the steel door, and you will escape to Mission Four.

The Air Duct Maze Scramble has you and a little girl named Newt scrambling through an alien-infested maze of air ducts with an escort of three marines. The maze is fairly convoluted, with ducts passing over and under each other, and it extends horizontally over four screens. If an alien spots you, it makes a beeline for you. If it catches you, your only alternative is to press the joystick button, thereby sacrificing a marine, who detonates a grenade but dies in the process. The secret to the air duct is stealth and patience.



In the Newt Rescue Race, the aliens are slower than in the APC Rescue, so it is really quite easy to avoid them most of the time. There are also some other tricks you can use in this part of the game, but getting by the queen is fairly tricky. You may need several attempts to figure this level out.

THE FINAL CON-FRONTATION, the one you've been waiting for, between Ripley and the queen: You come out in the massive power-loader, which makes you almost the queen's equal in size and power. But it will still take some strategy. You have to pummel the enemy until she is unable to resist, then grab her with the loader's claws, and drop her out the airlock.





When Apple put the Ensoniq sound chip into the IIGs, it opened (CREEEAAKK) a demon's forge of sonic impact. With its ability to digitize and play back real-life sounds, the chip turns the IIGs into a computerized tape recorder.

The potential of IIGS sound was not lost on PBI Software. Its sister company, MDIdeas, markets the SuperSonic stereo card, an add-on board that reroutes IIGs audio from Apple's typically scrawny internal speaker to an external hi-fi and does it in two-channel stereo. The audio power is overwhelming. The output rivals that of the finest digital synthesizers. Little wonder, then, that PBI's adventure game is a showcase for MDIdeas' stereo card.

But what can digital sound contribute to computer gaming? The answer is audible a few seconds into Tower of Myraglen. A brooding castle appears on the screen, and lightning sears the night sky. (WHAM) A full postromantic orchestra blasts a volley of fanfares (TA TA-TA DAAAHH), Violins and cellos climb chromatically into the stratosphere (VRUUM-VRUUM-DEEDLE). And a real thunderclap (BBBRRRROOOMMM) climaxes the tidal wave of symphonic grandeur.

The knight's heels click and echo through the Myraglen halls. As

the hero moves across the screen, footsteps ricochet from one speaker to the other. Enter a roomful of monsters, and sonic hell breaks loose with grunts, groans, and growls pingponging on all sides. You can play the game without stereo sound, but its addition makes the action roar to life. Furthermore, the sound is an integral part of the game. Audible cues throughout Myraglen contribute clues and warnings of events to come.

The story is traditional role-playing fare. An evil force has taken the Medallion of Soul Stealing, and only one knight has the purity, strength, and daring to recover the talisman and defeat ultimate evil. Guess who that is.

Designers Richard L. Seaborne and Jeffrey A. Lefferts haven't fashioned this tower as a monument to hack-and-slash antics, even though an unlimited supply of arrows frequently find use in real-time combat. Each of the ten levels of the tower contains puzzles to be solved, objects to be recovered, and se-

cret passages to be found. You must increase your fortitude by locating weapons and armor, but don't neglect to choose your battles carefully and spend hit points wisely. Rambos in chain mail won't live to see the tenth level.

The puzzles are logical, although sometimes fiendish. Level 1 includes a particularly surreal problem unique to the Apple IIGs. I'll say no more. Hints are tucked away throughout the corridors if the adventurer is sufficiently observant to spot them. Mapping is helpful but not required. Myraglen contains medium-level challenges and places more emphasis on entertainment than on difficulty.

Graphically, Tower of Myraglen descends from the lineage of Epyx's Temple of Apshai. The super-hi-res screen boasts lots of color and a wealth of detail, realized by the game's audiovisual wizard Lefferts. The basic tile-graphic style, however, remains simple. An on-screen window provides an animated overhead view of the hero, the current room, and its inhabitants and contents. Additional windows display character status and occasionally offer hints and room descriptions.

The game comes on two disks: a start-up disk and a game disk. You store saved games on the game disk, and you can make copies for each game in progress.

Overall, Tower of Myr-

aglen is an enjoyable diversion. It won't yield the hours of role-playing challenge of, say, a Wizardry, Bard's Tale, or Ultima fantasy, nor do its handsome, uncomplicated visuals do much to push the envelope of IIGS graphics. It's just fun to play. And, oh those noisemakers. When vou've mastered the tenth level and slain the last demon, you'll find yourself returning just to listen to the keening of restless spirits (WWWWHHOOOO), the rumble of pulsating crystals (HHUUUMMMM), and the gurgles of slime monsters (BBLLURRP). 

reputation for mindnumbing complexity and appalling length. Russia, by Roger Keating and Ian Trout, is a welcome exception. The game provides situations that require historically realistic strategic decisions, yet you can play it out in a single evening.

Australians Keating and Trout design and program computer war games as a labor of love. Under the Strategic Studies Group label, their credits include Carriers at War, Europe Ablaze, and Battlefront. Their distinctive style involves extensive nested menus that regulate the flow of the game, and elaborate utilities that enable players to design their own scenarios.

Russia includes a grand-campaign game, which places you in the role of Supreme Commander (Hitler or Stalin). as well as three short scenarios covering the drive on Leningrad (summer 1941), the Battle of Stalingrad (1942), and the Battle of Kursk (1943). In the campaign game, each

turn represents a month; in the scenarios, each turn is about a week of real time. Each hexagon on the screen grid represents a patch of terrain more than 40 miles across, and the individual units are groups of 3 to 6 divisions—anywhere from 30,000 to more than 100,000 men. The game uses 27 different unittype symbols, ranging from German SS Panzer Korps to Soviet Cavalry armies.

Weather played a critical role in this war, and the game models the tactical effects of mud and snow separately for each of 11 regions on the map. Only one region (9 \times 9 hexes) is visible on the screen at a time, but you can scroll the map in any direction by moving the cursor.

The sequence of play varies, depending on whether you are playing a scenario or the campaign game and also on whether you are playing against the computer or a human opponent. Typically, you begin a turn by reviewing the status re-

ports for your subordinate units: fatigue levels, training, and overall condition. You might then select Map Walk from the menu, to examine your units and the terrain in detail. Another option lets you view the schedule of expected reinforcements. Finally you select

the all-important Operations menu, which has two options: Doctrine and Orders. Doctrine determines the overall level of activity (Main Effort, Normal, or Rest). Orders depend on the condition of an individual unit and whether it is in contact with the enemy. You can order a unit to hold, deploy, advance, retreat, defend, probe, or assault.

After each side has issued orders, the program automatically resolves combat and movement. Unlike board war games, where the players determine every detail of fire and maneuver, units in Russia have a mind of their own. You give armies under a Main Effort doctrine an objective city, and they advance toward it automatically. Retreating forces pick their own path. Forces in contact select their own targets. It

is all rather disconcerting for players, but it accurately simulates the "fog of war."

The game comes in a handsome album folder with a full-color, doublesided map for each player and a variety of reference cards. A 72-page players' manual is well illustrated and includes a helpful tutorial, but it badly needs an index.

If you have a dot-matrix parallel printer and a graphics-interface card, a screen-dump feature will let you print out the current screen by pressing Control-P. This printing method does not work for serial printers such as the ImageWriter, though.

Russia is a highly detailed and complex historical simulation that offers plenty of challenge to experienced wargamers, but the basic game system is so smooth that it should not frighten away beginners. The design is based on a deep understanding of the war, balancing the effects of dozens of historical variables in relation to your command decisions. SSG publishes a quarterly journal, RUN 5, packed with design notes and new scenarios for its games.

MAKING SCREEN NEGATIVES

The routine in figure 1 inverts hires page 1. That is, it turns off every pixel that is on and vice-versa. It is particularly useful for those who dump graphics screens to a printer. It can also be good for making "negatives" of Print Shop graphics. Simply load the graphic by typing BLOAD graphicname, A\$2000, run my program, and then save the graphic back to disk with BSAVE new name. A\$2000. L\$240.

SINGLE-DRIVE APPLEWORKS

If you're trying to use AppleWorks on a IIGS with a single 3.5-inch drive, here's a tip that will save you some disk swapping. First of all, name all your AppleWorks data disks / APPLEWORKS (that is, the same name as your AppleWorks start-up disk) and then copy the SEG.PR file from the AppleWorks system disk to each of your data disks. (This file contains printer and printing information.) Since the SEG.PR file isn't loaded into expanded memory at start-up time, you normally have to eject the data disk and insert the AppleWorks disk whenever you want to print. That procedure is now not necessary, since you've fooled Apple-Works into looking for the file on the data disk.

A COMPACT CATALOG

If you have more than 20 files in a directory, CAT or CATALOG produces a display that quickly scrolls off the screen—frustrating if you want to scan through all the filenames to find one in particular or to see which ones you can delete. The listing in figure 2 provides a simple remedy, a program that produces a listing of filenames in a wide format. Each file takes up 20 character positions, allowing a display of up to 40 files on a 40-column screen and up to 80 files on an 80-column screen.

The listing includes the type of file, a symbol if the file is locked (not an asterisk but a colon, for readability), as well as the filename itself. You also get a count of the number of files. When the program asks you to press Return in order to continue, you can press Escape or Control-C if you want to quit instead.



EDITOR'S NOTE: APPLEWORKS AND PRINTING

One of the common "Rescue Squad" questions I get is "how do I use my brand X printer with AppleWorks?". This kind of question is difficult to answer unless I just happen to have the manufacturer's reference manual handy (and I usually don't).

Enter the National AppleWorks Users Group (NAUG). NAUG publishes an informative wall chart that contains the printer codes for of all the most popular printers (and some of the obscure ones, too) and other useful AppleWorks information. Just punch in these codes when you're adding a custom printer to AppleWorks, and you can start taking advantage of underlining, boldfacing, superscripting, and so on. The chart is available for \$7.95 from NAUG, Box 87453, Canton, MI, 48187; (313) 397-1594.

NAUG also publishes a monthly newsletter for AppleWorks users to which you can subscribe for \$24 per year.

OLD DATA DISKS/NEW DATABASE PROGRAM

Q. I have plenty of old PFS:File data disks that I want to use with a more recent database program. What do you suggest?

A. If you're looking for a new database program but don't want to sacrifice your PFS data, consider ProFILER 3.0 from Pinpoint Publishing (5865 Doyle Street, Emeryville, CA 94608; [415] 654-3050). Pinpoint sells an optional utility for ProFILER that converts data files from the Pascal version of PFS:File to ProFILER 2.0 files, which ProFILER 3.0 can then read. The utility also converts files from the ProDOS version of PFS:File into standard text files, which either ProFILER 2.0 or 3.0 can subsequently read.

REENTERING APPLEWORKS

Q. Is there any way to reenter AppleWorks after accidentally pressing Control-Reset?

PHIL DAVIS COSTA MESA, CA A. What you need to know is the address of the main-menu subrou-

tine for AppleWorks, an address

that varies from version to version. Rather than trying to track it down, why not take the opportunity to purchase Super MacroWorks or any of the Timeout series of AppleWorks enhancements from Beagle Bros ([619] 296-6400). All these products automatically trap Reset and take you back to Apple-Works' main menu. (By the way, even though you have a reset handler installed, don't get into the habit of returning to the main menu this way; there's no guarantee that critical internal data structures won't be damaged when you press Reset.)

ProDOS FRUSTRATION

Q. I've just purchased a IIGS for my daughter and myself and have become very frustrated by the ProDOS operating system. (I'm a longtime user of MS-DOS machines.) Could you please tell me how to send a directory listing to my printer? And speaking of directories, the size of a file is indicated in blocks. How big is a block?


A. Learning a new operating system is never very much fun, but you will get accustomed to it as time goes on.

In order to print your directory, first enter the Applesoft command mode (that's where you see the] prompt), enter PR#1 (with the printer on and selected), and then enter CATALOG. When printing ends, enter PR#3 to start sending output to the screen again.

A block refers to the basic unit of storage on a ProDOS mass-storage disk device and is 512 bytes in size. To convert from blocks to K units, you simply divide the number of blocks by 2.

EDITOR'S NOTE: FILE TRANSFERS

George McClelland of Southeastern Software, 7743 Briarwood Drive, New Orleans, LA 70128; (504) 246-8438, recently wrote to remind me that his Mac.Transfer program is useful for transferring text files between an Apple II and a Macintosh. The transfer requires a cable that connects the two computers via their serial ports. (You can also purchase a disk that allows transfers between a Macintosh and an MS-DOS computer.) McClelland also runs a service for converting data files between nontext formats (AppleWorks to Microsoft File, for example). Call him for a quotation.



MOUSE CONTROL

Q. I'm trying to enhance some of my Apple II programs by adding support for a mouse. My problem is that I haven't found a way yet to "get in touch" with the mouse from the Applesoft programming language.

A. Taking advantage of the mouse from inside an Applesoft program is actually quite simple. First, you must activate the mouse with the following two statements:

PRINT CHR\$(4); "PR#4" : PRINT CHR\$(1)

(assuming the mouse interface is in slot 4 or port 4). Follow them with a PRINT CHR\$(4); "PR#3" to direct output back to the 80-column screen, if necessary. To read the current mouse position, use two statements of the form

PRINT CHR\$(4); "IN#4" : INPUT ""; A, B, C

After the computer has executed these statements, A contains the horizontal mouse position, B contains the vertical position, and C indicates the status of the mouse

button. The position values range from 0 to +1023, and the absolute value of C takes on one of four values: 1 means the button is down and was also down during the last INPUT statement; 2 means the button is down and was up during the last INPUT; 3 means the button is up and was up during the last IN-PUT; and 4 means the button is up and was up during the last INPUT. A negative value for C means a key has been pressed on the keyboard; subsequent readings stay negative until you clear the keyboard strobe with a POKE -16368,0 command.

The only other command you need to be aware of is the one to turn off the mouse:

PRINT CHR\$(4); "PR#4" : PRINT CHR\$(0).

For more information on how to use the mouse, refer to the Apple IIc Technical Reference Manual (Addison-Wesley) or my Inside the Apple IIc (Prentice-Hall Press). There are also some useful demo programs in the appendix of the AppleMouse II User's Manual.


