COMPUTERS

f you want to get a peek at the future of home computing, take a look at your TV set. A computer and a television can make quite a team. In fact, they make such a good team that I think the future of home computing is directly related to television. TVs and home computers share some common features. For example,

> they both use video screens to display information. They both have the potential to be entertaining and educational at the same time. You can get

software for your computer on a magnetic disk, and you can get software for your TV on a magnetic videocassette.

There are, of course, many differences between TV and computers. TV is a one-way communications medium, whereas computing is an interactive medium. Computers cost thousands of dollars, TVs cost hundreds-thus, many people have more than one television, but most people don't have a home computer. TVs have better color graphics and sound than do personal computers.

Companies in the home-computer industry are hoping that someday in the near future computers will rank with VCRs as widely owned high-end consumer-electronics items. Recent market research has revealed some interesting parallels between VCR ownership and home-computer ownership. It seems that virtually everyone with a home computer also has a VCR and that the demographics of VCR and computer ownership are very similar. To try to sell computers to people with

VCRs, Apple has produced an entertaining videotape promoting the use of Apple computers. Apple is selling the tape, entitled "Beginner's Luck," for \$6.90. (If you want to order the tape, call [800] 328-2791 and have your VISA or MasterCard at the ready.)

I think the best way to sell computers to the people who own televisions and VCRs, however, is not to merely sell them a videotape of a lengthy, albeit interesting, advertisement. The best way is to find ways to make computers, VCRs, and TVs work together to provide new benefits to consumers. If connecting a personal computer to a televi-

The Intelligent VCR

Apple and other companies that are active in the personal-computer market need to persuade electronics manufacturers to make VCRs with a standard remote-control plug-in interface that provides access to all the VCR's internal functions. In this issue, the article "Using Your Apple II with a VCR" discusses special industrial VCRs that can be controlled by an Apple II computer. Companies should be encouraged to come up with a simple standard interface for consumer VCRs as well.

rect-connect remote-control port on their machines, someone should design an infrared controller for the Apple II that lets you use the infrared programming codes that hand-held remote-control units use. Although remote-control units don't give you access to all the features of the VCR, they do give access to the basic functions. Another advantage of infrared controllers is that TVs, hi-fi systems, and cable-TV boxes all use infrared codes. An Apple equipped with an infrared broadcaster could store and generate the codes for running virtually any of these remote-controlled devices. An infrared controller for the Apple would be inexpensive to build, since all the necessary parts are readily available at a low cost.

Controlling your VCR and TV with your computer can provide some interesting capabilities. VCRs are rather difficult to program. If you had a computer-to-VCR hookup, you could have an easy-to-use program on the computer that could control the VCR. Imagine, for instance, an on-line version of TV Guide-you could just indicate the show you wanted to tape by clicking on it with the mouse, and the computer could take care of the rest. You could also use a modem to program your VCR from a remote location, either from a computer terminal or a touch-tone phone.

The Well-Connected TV

Once you had your computer, VCR, and TV all hooked together, lots of other things could happenwith the right products. You could use your computer to create "desktop MTV," using animation, sound effects, and music software and then tape the finished music video with the VCR. With the addition of a device called a genlock board, you could overlay computer images directly onto VCR and TV images and create titles and special effects for your home videos. A major manufacturer is rumored to be working on a genlock board for the Apple II—we'll keep you posted as it develops.





GETTING THE MOST OUT OF THE II

Dear A+: I would like to congratulate you on the article "Hard-Disk Drives Made Easy," which appeared in the November issue. Michael Fischer presented an excellent comparison of some of the drives available. I particularly liked the small technical articles such as "SCSI Drives," which presented the differences between various interfaces. I have a Sider 10 drive on my Apple IIe, and nowhere does the documentation mention what interface it uses.

Regarding your editorial comments about the performance differences between the Apple II and the latest computers, I agree with you. I use IBM PC/AT-type machines at work, and although they have some advantages in business-software availability, the Apple doesn't lose much performance in the types of things that I commonly use it for, with the right software. The addition of a harddisk drive for the Apple He does a lot to bring the speed up to a competitive level with the IBM machines, which usually have hard-disk drives as a standard item. Great software is being developed for the IIe and the IIGS that is pretty powerful and reasonably fast. The problem that I have sometimes is becoming aware of what is available for the Apple, since some of the software developers for the Apple II are small and lack large advertising budgets.

I honestly feel that the II has suffered from a lack of serious software development, a situation that is only now seeing improvement. Look at the offerings from Pinpoint as examples of what can be done with Apple IIs. That company has some good software with very powerful features that is also fast in operation. I must add that I don't have an accelerator card or a large memory card in my IIe.

I like to kid people that the Apple IIe is not outdated technology but an early RISC computer!

SIDER QUIBBLE

Dear A+: I have been a reader of your magazine for several years (ever since Softalk folded and transferred my subscription to you) and normally found your articles and advice extremely useful in helping me choose the best software and periph-

erals for my systems, which include a IIGs and a IIe. Your October issue has finally brought that to a

In that issue is an article dedicated to reviewing the several harddisk drives available for the Apple II line. The comment on the Advanced Tech Services ROM for the Sider shows that you do little to no research. First, since the Sider software was upgraded to Revision D (about one year ago), the drive has been able to choose between Pro-DOS and DOS 3.3 as the bootup system. Second, since Revision C, you have been able to vary the size of the ProDOS volumes and in effect format the disk as one large volume by assigning the minimal size to the second volume (i.e.,

HARD2). Third, the drive does its own bad-block check during formatting without the additional ROM chip. Last, the Sider has always had the ability to recognize a second Sider daisy-chained to it.

The new ROM chip that was reviewed is unnecessary for any of these functions, although it may make the Sider run faster. I do not know what you were doing when you reviewed the ROM chip, but obviously you had never tried a Sider drive.

You're right-since February 1987, the Sider utilities disk has included a program that lets you boot ProDOS directly (the program is called PRO-DOS.BOOTER), but the default is still a DOS 3.3 boot. As for ProDOS volume size, on a standard 10-megabyte Sider, the largest ProDOS volume you can get after reserving minimal space for CP/M, Pascal, and DOS 3.3 is about 9 megabytes. With the Advanced Tech Services ROM, you get the entire 10.4 megabytes to work with, and you don't have to fiddle with a partitioning program. Are you willing to assign 10% of the capacity of your drive to operating systems you never use?

You are correct in saying that the Sider checks for bad blocks during formatting, but it does so very slowly, and if it finds a bad block, it throws out the entire track, not just the one bad block that the Advanced Tech Services ROM would reserve. You can daisy-chain two standard Siders, but only after "phantom-slotting" the second drive on a II Plus or IIe. Don't try to daisy-chain on the GS, because ProDOS 16 allows only two volumes per slot (and the standard ROM organizes each drive as two volumes), so you won't see the second drive. Even ProDOS 8 ignores a daisy-chained Sider on the GS. The easy solution is to use the ATS ROM so you have only one volume per drive.—Editors



offered, among other upgrades, motherboard upgrades in the case of the IIc, to accommodate a 3.5inch drive. This policy makes sense, since Apple wants to sell the drives. I took advantage of that offer and another such "dealer offer," upgrading from an Image-Writer I to a II, for about \$300. But these are just offers, sales promotions, not promises of continued technological upgrades. II Plus owners think Apple owes them a IIe, and IIe owners think they deserve an upgrade to a IIGS.

Try this sometime: Walk into the automobile agency you bought your 1986 car from. Say you know that the maker has improved the 1988 models and that you think that since you bought their product in good faith in 1986 and that because they have improved it over the years, the company should allow you to upgrade to the 1988 (at minimal or no charge, of course). Prepare your keester for a kick out the door! It won't work, because it can't be done. A company such as Apple relies on past profit margins to fund future research and development, not to mention dividends to shareholders, manufacturing innovations, and other necessary "capital investments."

Everyone forgets that we are interested in a field, computers, in which decades of normal technological changes happen in just years. You can hardly expect that a company such as IBM or Apple should offer to return profits made on one product line to allow customers to purchase discounted newer lines of products. I guarantee that if Apple did, there would be no need to upgrade in the future, as no funds would be available to develop any new products.





APPLE TO THE DEFENSE

Apple Computer, Inc., recently scored a big contract to provide the Department of Defense School Systems (DODDS) with 4000 Apple IIGs systems. Actually, Apple will sell the machines to a system integrator called Computer Dynamics, Inc. (CDI), which will in turn package them for DODDS.

Although Apples were chosen, the package must meet certain requirements for "operating system compatibility"— namely MS-DOS, the operating system compati-



ble with the IBM PC. In order to meet that requirement, the systems will include PC Transporter, a coprocessor board recently released by Applied Engineering (see our September 1987 cover story, "MS-DOS Comes to the Apple.")

CDI will furnish these systems to 270 schools throughout 23 countries in Europe, Central America, and the Far East. Apple expected to ship 1700 of the GS systems by the end of the year, with the remainder to go out over the next four years.

ON THE HILL

Apple Computer may be breathing a little easier these days, thanks to the decreased hubbub about a possible ban on the sale of Toshiba products to the U.S. Toshiba, Apple's sole source for the everpopular ImageWriter printer, came under fire when a subsidiary allegedly sold electronic equipment to the Soviet Union. Congress swung into action last summer

and proposed to punish Toshiba by preventing it from doing business with U.S. companies, including the proposal in a massive trade bill. Apple, and other American firms dependent on Toshiba, requested exemptions to the ban.

As it stands now, the 1000-page trade bill is bogged down in committee hearings and may not ever emerge because of its complexity, according to Charlotte LeGates, a



spokesperson for the Computer and Business Equipment Manufacturers Association. It's possible that proponents of the ban may introduce a separate bill to create sanctions against Toshiba, but LeGates says that it's unlikely because the current sentiment is that "Toshiba would not be particularly hurt by sanctions, but many U.S. companies would."

Since the bill resides in a holding pattern in committee, it's business as usual for Toshiba. No sanctions exist yet, so the flow of ImageWriters remains undisturbed.





have a chance to do a hands-on evaluation of the software before making a financial commitment to it. Some authors are trying to address this problem by using the shareware method of distribution and marketing. A shareware program may be freely copied and passed around, but the author still retains the copyright to it. Those who use the program are asked to send a registration fee (typically less than \$40) to the author if they continue to use the program beyond an initial trial period.

The trouble with shareware, from the authors' point of view at least, is that computerclub libraries, bulletinboard operators, and

other distributors often refer to the software as "public domain" (which means the author retains no rights) or fail to emphasize that a shareware payment is expected. As a result, most shareware authors see very little money for their efforts.







and video gear making a creative match

aturday mornings are changing from when I was a kid. I remember sitting on the sofa bundled in a blanket beside my brothers and sisters, quietly watching cartoons as my parents slept in. Today many families across the United States are experiencing a different Saturday morning ritual. Depending on what Santa has left under the tree, parents might be awakened by the sounds of kids cheering and bombs blasting as Johnny and Sally play with Captain Power Action Figures by Mattel, firing at their TV screens with Captain Power Vehicles and being fired upon by the TV. Thus, interactive television has come to many American homes.

But that's only one, limited approach to interactive video. As prices of video cameras begin to drop and VCRs are available in almost all schools and many homes, Apple enthusiasts are exploring ways to put video and computer technologies together. Another medium—videodisc—is also getting a run for its money with Apple-using educators.

Elsewhere in this issue of A+, you'll find how-to-get-started stories on computer/video applications, but let's take a look here at what several creative individuals are actually doing with their Apple IIs and video equipment. Represented here are home creativity, as well as art, foreign language, and

science in the classroom. Let's hope these give you lots of ideas for your own applications.

usan Griffis of Indianapolis, Indiana, is a computer/video explorer. When her daughter, Sarah, was very young, Griffis introduced her to the Apple IIe, using preschool software. As Sarah started identifying with the software characters, Griffis came up with the idea of creating "video storybooks" that used pictures and animation sequences from some of Sarah's favorite software programs.

With the VCR's TV-video switch set to Video and the TV tuned to the video channel (usually 3 or 4), Griffis found that by connecting a cable from the Video Out (monitor) port on the back of the Apple IIe to the Video In port of the VCR, she could record the video output of a computer program. (The VCR connection to the TV does not change, which allows the TV to serve as the monitor.) Griffis also found that with a microphone plugged into the Audio In port of the VCR, Sarah could tell a story to go along with the visuals. Thus, Sarah's narration could accompany a sequence of Apple II animation.

Sarah, now seven years old, also uses Koala's KoalaPainter to make her own pictures to accompany her stories. And with the help of a slide-show feature, she can easily tape her creations, as pictures are saved and displayed in a prearranged sequence. She has also discovered that turning your video storybook into a conventional book can be pretty exciting. To do so, Sarah prints out her pictures and types the narration, using a wordprocessing program. Then she puts the pictures and the words together into a magnetic-mount or slidein photo album.

Although Susan's video bookmaking began as a personal and fun way to introduce reading to her daughter, it has evolved into a small business in which Griffis and a partner share video story and book ideas with children, parents, and teachers in workshops and conferences and through a monthly newspaper column.


Interactive video and other video-related technologies also are finding their way into schools. Teachers are discovering how to interface their Apples with video technology. Although the use of computer-controlled video is still in its infancy, more and more teachers are experimenting with using video cameras to capture pictures for use in school newsletters or databases and to "film" footage

he most basic connection between an Apple II and video is through a video camera. Jeanne Krapauskas, for instance, is using this hybrid of technology to change how students at Victor Andrew High School in Tinley Park, Illinois, think of art. So many students at Andrew High were signing up for computer courses that other departments were suffering. Krapauskas believed that by integrating the computer into her curriculum she

would attract students to art classes, and she was right.

For the past two years, Krapauskas has offered a course on computer-based art, and the response has been overwhelming. Art classes are now attracting computer whiz kids as well as students who are unfamiliar with computers but want to learn more about high-tech art. Krapauskas' curriculum explores the use of Apple computers (IIs and Macs) to create art forms. The primary thrust of the course is to develop methods for manipulating image making. In addition to using graphic tablets, light pens, and








Jeanne Krapauskas and her students use Apples and video cameras to explore the possibilities of art and technology.

paint software, Krapauskas teaches students how to use video equipment to explore the endless possibilities of art and technology. Her students use AST's VisionPlus digitizer with a IIGS to capture images and then use paint programs such as Activision's Paintworks Plus to modify and enhance them.

To date, Krapauskas has met with some exciting successes. In 1986, she was named a winner in Apple Computer Clubs' National Merit Competition for her efforts to integrate computers into the cur-

sored by Scholastic.

elen Hamerstrom, a teacher at the Severna Park High School in Severna Park, Maryland, has used interactive video with her foreignlanguage classes since spring 1986.

Hamerstrom's first project provides her students with an experience that simulates an actual visit to France, using videotaped footage Hamerstrom took on a visit to that country. Her students can see the countryside and hear native speech at full speed-a few minutes of "really being there." The class watches the whole tape and then works through each segment by entering answers to a computer program's questions and reviewing the parts of the tape that were hardest to understand. Because the computer can read the frame numbers encoded on the second track of the videotape, students can access any segment of the video program as they need it. Hamerstrom performs this feat by using an Apple IIe equipped with a BCD videotape-interface card and a Panasonic AG6300 video recorder/player (see "Using Your Apple II with a VCR" in this issue for further information on this equipment).

The other members of the Se-


verna-Park foreign-language department have become interested in interactive videotape and are expanding its use to the Spanish and German classes. In addition, the county Board of Education purchased a Pioneer videodisc system for Hamerstrom and her colleagues. With the assistance of authoring software, nonprogramming teachers in her department and some students are now writing videodisc lessons.

Hamerstrom plans to continue using both laserdisc video and computer-controlled videotape. Even though videodisc systems have more durable disks and provide increased speed in accessing individual segments, she still likes the idea of being able to use her own videotapes and edit them to include just what she wants.

ita Henry, a ninth-grade earth-science teacher at Glen Ridge High School, Glen Ridge, New Jersey, has created an interactive laserdisc program entitled Mission: Earth that helps students discover astronomical concepts and terms.

Using Optical Data Corporation's authoring software and its Astronomy and Earth Science laserdiscs, which contain more than 20,000 still images and 115 video clips, Henry created a simulation experience that combines the laserdisc images with text and questions; it runs on a Pioneer videodisc player controlled by a IIe.

Henry's students, who begin the project on a space station on Alpha Centauri, receive radio transmissions that seem to originate from Earth or its planetary environs. The content of the coded message indicates that intelligent life may exist there, thus justifying an intergalactic trip to Earth's solar system. In the course of their mission, the students go through four lessons that are designed to utilize what they have learned from their textbook readings and lectures. The program allows students to "fly" past stars and galaxies, study the

sun and solar system, and explore other planets.

A high-school science teacher for 24 years, Henry put the project together after her principal, James Buckley, asked her to design a yearlong earth-science course that would be required of all ninthgrade students.

ow would your kids like to create their own MTV video? Well, that's exactly what Richard Steele's students at Westchester Lutheran School, Los Angeles, learn in their computer-literacy classes. Steele teaches his students in grades 4-8 how to create pictures and animation sequences on an Apple com-

puter, using a video digitizer and software.

Over the period of a school year, Steele's students learn BASIC and Logo programming, try paint pro-

grams such as Baudville's Blazing Paddles, experiment with animation using Brøderbund's Fantavision and Baudville's Take-1, and explore the various uses of a video digitizer—all in preparation for creating, editing, and producing a videotape.

As the end of the year approaches, Steele works with his students to create a video. They gather computer-generated pictures and animation sequences created on the Apple computer or captured with the video digitizer. Finally, a videotape recorder records the various video animation sequences and pictures in real time. Later the students add an audio portion. Thus they create their own music videos.

Integrating computer, video, and laserdisc technology does require extra time, thought, and money. The computer/video pioneers we've met all agree that the effort is well worth it. Furthermore, they all regard video and laserdisc technology as a powerful new medium that teachers and parents have only begun to explore. See "Videodisc Primer," "Using Your Apple II with a VCR," and "How to Make Video Valentines" elsewhere in this issue for tips on how to get started yourself.





People had high hopes for the commercial success of laserdiscs in the late 70s, but that became another consumer-electronics fad that came and went. Still, videodisc lives on, primarily in classroom applications and increasingly under the control of personal computers.

For many educators, the connection between a videodisc player and an Apple II now offers a rich medium for presenting a broad range of topics. The key asset of this combination is the control the Apple provides over the audio and visual goodies on the videodisc, allowing teachers to create lessons around the videodisc material.

Videodisc technology comes in a couple of different varieties, but the common denominator is that the discs are encoded with lasermade pits that you read back with a player that also uses laser technology. The discs can contain a sizable amount of information: up to an hour's worth of audio and video on one side of the tape, or 54,000 individual still pictures. To date, hundreds of videodiscs are available. covering numerous educational topics, and teachers are learning how to "repurpose" them-i.e., design an interactive lesson around

the videodisc's contents.

The advantages of videodisc technology in the classroom (depending on the type you use) are:

- the possibility of exerting control over the order and depth of presentation;
- the high-quality realism of filmstrips, without the fuss of projectors and the film itself;
- the availability of two audio tracks, which means you can have two levels of sophistication (or even two languages) for the sound track accompanying the material;
- the capacity to store the equivalent of thousands of slides without having to keep track of them individually;
- random access of material, at a greater speed than with videotape, film, or slides; and
- · a sturdiness unavailable with

other media—discs won't break, deteriorate, or fade.

That said, videodisc is still a relatively new educational technology that can be fairly puzzling, considering the different flavors of videodiscs and videodisc players—as well as the complications that arise when you propose to hook a player up to an Apple II.

With that background, let's start at the very beginning and take the point of view of an educator with an interest in using an Apple II with videodisc technology, using commercial videodisc material as a starting point.

Applications First

Here's the same advice you heard when you went out shopping for a computer in the first place: Evaluate your needs and survey the software scene. Before you buy any hardware, get an idea of what software (in this case, videodisc) you want to use, because it will probably determine what sort of equipment you need to run it and what you can do with it. To find out what's available on videodisc, start by ordering one of the catalogs listed in the accompanying "Videodisc Resource Guide." Some distributors specialize in domains such as science, whereas others are broader-based.

In reading these catalogs, you'll discover that some types of videodiscs let you play them only from beginning to end on a videodisc player, and others let you control the sequence of events with a computer connected to the player via educational software—the key difference among videodisc formats.

The first type is called CLV (constant linear velocity), which contains up to an hour of audio and video material on one side and can be played only from beginning to end; you can't stop a CLV disk and examine an individual frame. (A software publisher has recently released a product to give you random-access capabilities with CLV, however-details later.) You can find everything from "Faerie Tale Theatre" to auto-repair training in CLV format, and the discs can cost anywhere from \$30 to \$2000, depending on the complexity of the application. A great many CLV discs, though, fall in the less-than-\$50 range. Among the best known are those from the National Air and Space Museum and The National Geographic Society.

The other type of videodisc format is CAV (constant angular velocity). A CAV-format disc contains thousands upon thousands of still pictures that comprise half an hour of material. You can sequence the stills to show a process such as mitosis and freeze them for examination at any step. Or you can view the pictures individually, as in an art-history application in which individual paintings appear. By its nature, CAV lends itself more readily to computer control. It typically costs quite a bit more than its CLV cousin because it often comes with courseware or the software for creating courseware. To use a CAV system, you'll need an interface board with which to connect your Apple to the videodisc player.

The bottom line is that you need to determine whether the video-discs you're interested in are in CLV or CAV format and take it from there. If it's CLV and you're just interested in viewing the discs, then all you need is a videodisc player on which to play it. If you want to create a lesson around them, however, then you need to consider Whitney Educational Ser-



vices' authoring software (see below). A CAV videodisc, on the other hand, typically requires you to buy an interface card, and you'll want to find out about authoring software here too if you want to repurpose a CAV disc. (Sometimes the software comes as part of the CAV package.)

Authoring a Lesson

Authoring software that controls videodisc players is available from a variety of companies (see "Videodisc Resource Guide," on pages 40-41). By and large, these authoring systems pertain to CAV applications. Often publishers sell package deals: typically the software plus interface cards, cables, and sometimes the videodisc players themselves—as well as the subjectspecific videodiscs. The software allows you to manipulate the video sequence, create menus, ask questions, review difficult areas, and generally tailor the material to your course objectives.

One of the newer developments in this area is Whitney Educational Services' release of VideoLesson-Writer, which allows you to fiddle with the previously inalterable sequence of CLV material, but only on two new Pioneer players called the LD-V2000 and the LD-V4200. Whitney's objective in releasing this product is to take advantage of the large base of low-cost, high-quality CLV discs. VideoLesson-Writer lets you combine both text and graphics with the videodisc

VIDEODISC CHECKLIST

Here's a quick checklist to run through when looking at video-discs:

- Do the discs you're interested in come in CLV or CAV format?
- Do you want to use them as is or modify them?
- Are they hardware-specific in any way? That is, do they require an interface card or software that works with only, say, Pioneer or Sony?

material. It does not, however, let you freeze frames, still an impossibility with CLV discs. VideoLessonWriter, which costs \$489, includes the authoring software, an interface controller, and a sample disc; it also works with CAV discs.

Hardware Hints

As you undoubtedly know, computer software works only on certain computers. Apple II software, for instance, doesn't run on the Macintosh. Similarly, in the world of interactive video, you must locate authoring software that's written for the Apple II, but there's an additional twist: Software designed for interactive video also tends to be specific to certain brands of videodisc players. The most common brand is Pioneer. You can find videodisc players to hook up to your Apple that are made by Sony, Magnavox, Hitachi, and others, but the software, interface cards, and cables you need to control them may not be as readily available as those that work with Pioneer players. The operative hint here, then, is to make sure that the authoring software you have in mind works with the videodisc player that you are considering.


The cost for videodisc players starts at about \$600 (the approximate price of the Pioneer LD-V2000) and ranges up into the thousands of dollars. You'll want an industrial model, rather than a commercial/retail one, since only the industrial type allows computer control. The higher the price, of course, the fancier the features.

The Drawbacks

Obviously, you can run into a fair amount of expense getting set up to prepare an interactive videodisc lesson. But price isn't the only concern. With competing video-related technologies-videotape, DVI (digital video interactive), and so on-it's hard to say what tomorrow's dinosaurs will be. The chief disadvantage of videodisc is its read-only capability. You can't record and rerecord, as you can with videotape. Still, the quality of videodiscs and the control they afford over their contents have made them an attractive medium for many adventurous teachers.

Setting up an interactive system

USING YOUR APPLE II WITH A

s an avid user of computer and video equipment, have you ever paused in a moment of reverie to dream of the ultimate audiovisual machine? This machine would break free of the constraints imposed by the designers of computer or video technology and sport the best features of each within an integrated system.

Your wish list might include the following capabilities:

•computer programs that capture the live, full-color action and realistic sound of video;

 video programs that harness computer control to provide users with quick access to desired video scenes; and

•an authoring system that puts these powerful features to work in tandem with computer text and color graphics in a wide variety of applications.

You may have imagined yourself in the driver's seat, taking this machine on a test drive:

 creating an audiovisual database of your favorite videotapes,

•designing a computer-controlled video-editing suite,

 developing interactive-video training programs for classroom or business, or

•devising attention-grabbing A/V presentations to promote products or services.

Your dreams can come true with an existing technology—computerassisted interactive video (CAIV) which began with computer control of videotape machines roughly ten years ago and is more recently associated with control of video-

VCR

disc players. Videodisc technology offers faster access time than videotape (roughly 12 times faster: 3 seconds for disc vs. 36 to 40 seconds for tape access of the end of a half-hour program, starting from the beginning). Despite this speed advantage, videodisc is currently a read-only technology—you can't create your own video programs or copy others. You are limited to what producers and publishers create and distribute.

Instead of waiting for videodisc to evolve, you can use versatile and familiar technology—an Apple II computer, an "industrial" VCR, and a color TV or display monitor with audio—for CAIV, rounded out by the purchase of a CAIV interface and authoring software.

Besides being an affordable read/write medium, videotape is the mastering medium for the production of videodisc. Successful CAIV programs using videotape can serve as reliable prototypes for subsequent videodisc versions. Some of the CAIV interface systems allow control of both videotape and videodisc.

The Method behind the Magic

Today, an Apple user can choose from a handful of interactive videotape interfaces and authoring systems (see "Three CAIV Tape Systems for your Apple," which accompanies this article), and a wide variety of compatible add-on products, ranging from touch screens for keyless input to video-overlay boards that superimpose computer text or graphics directly over the video image. Before looking at how hardware and software can help you create interactive video, let's take a look at video technology itself.

Three types of signals are recorded onto videotape. Video signals are recorded in the center as slanted tracks, every pair representing one completely scanned image (a video frame). Every ½0 second, a control pulse marking each video frame is recorded along one edge of the tape (except with Sony machines, which use two control pulses per frame). On the other edge are two parallel audio tracks.

he method behind the magic of computer-controlled VCRs lies in the predictable series of video frames and their corresponding control-track pulses. A computer (connected to a VCR via an interface) can count the control-track pulses to determine the location of any video segment on a tape. Once the computer knows where the tape is positioned, it can send control signals to access the VCR's transport functions (play, record, fast forward, reverse, stop, pause).

VCR Nuts and Bolts

The videocassette recorder or player must be an industrial model that allows control of the machine's functions through a remote-control port (usually on the rear panel). Edit controllers commonly use this multipin connector to access precise locations on the tape for editing. Industrial VCRs use electronic switching to control tape-transport functions. Thus, a computer can send electronic control signals to control the VCR via this port. Consumer-type VCRs don't allow this type of remote control, so you must control the tape's flow manually.

VCR compatibility depends on the interface card you choose. The industrial VCRs that generally work with currently available CAIV interfaces are the ¾-inch Umatic or ½-inch Beta format by Sony and the Panasonic or JVC ¾-inch U-matic or ½-inch VHS machines. The Nationwide Computer & Video interface works only with



Panasonic AG 6000 series VCRs (½-inch VHS), and the others are compatible with most industrial VCRs (¾-inch U-matic and ½-inch VHS or Beta).

Many media departments in schools, corporations, and other organizations use industrial VCRs not only for the remote-control feature but also for their durability. If you don't have access to an industrial VCR and are anxious to try your hand at interactive video, consider the purchase of a "player-only" model for roughly the same price as a consumer VCR.

The CAIV Interface

The common means of connecting and controlling an industrial VCR is through a CAIV interface card inserted into one of the Apple II expansion slots (Apple IIc computers don't work with this type). A ribbon cable extending from the interface attaches to the remotecontrol port on the industrial VCR with a multipin connector. In addition to the control cable, one video cable (BNC or RCA) and two audio cables (RCA) route these signals from the VCR to the interface (see figure 1).

Connecting the Apple video to the interface allows you to toggle a single monitor's display between computer text/graphics from the Apple and video from the VCR. If you wish to use a separate monitor for the computer text/graphics,

THREE CAIV TAPE SYSTEMS

What excites and involves interactive-video producers and users is the immediacy of live video action teamed with an interactive computer program that prompts for input and branches to appropriate text, graphics, or video segments, depending on individual responseu. Such a system is what Bob Whitney of Whitney Educational Services envisioned in 1977 while working at the University of California Medical Center. Seeking a way to create a computer-controlled video presentation system, he teamed up with John Starkweather, creator of the Pilot authoring language. Together they developed interactive video hard-



ware and modified Apple Computer's SuperPILOT authoring language to work with videotape machines.

Their current Apple-based products include an interface card that controls both videotape and videodisc (Supercircuit II for the Apple II Plus, IIe, and IIGS—see figure A) and an authoring system (IN-

SIGHT) that creates interactive video programs in BASIC. INSIGHT allows easy modification to access a wide range of input devices and incorporate graphics from popular programs. Its users have unlimited license to copyright, sell, and distribute authored programs.

Another pioneering company shared this vision by developing hardware and software with a unique sleight of hand. Bob and Diane Howard of BCD Associates created two videotape interfaces: the Model 450 interface card, which fits neatly in slot #4 of the Apple II Plus and IIe (see figure B), and the VideoLink 232 external interface (see figure C), which connects to the serial port of an Apple or any other computer (Mac and IIc users, take note). Their authoring program (The Instructor) provides powerful features while maintaining the ease of menu-based authoring. Currently in development is an Apple IIGS interface that will control tape or disc (but not the two simultaneously).

A low-cost (\$545) but effective system is the recently introduced VILM (Video Instant Lesson Maker) from Nationwide Computer & Video, which combines both interface and authoring software. Although lacking some of the VCR compatibility and authoring-program power of the other (more costly) systems, it comfortably fits the limited budget of many schools and individuals just getting their interactive feet wet.





Figure 2: Cable connections from interface to display monitor

simply connect the Apple Video Out to the computer's display monitor as usual. The remaining cables route the VCR's video and audio signals and the Apple video signal already joined at the interface to the display monitor or TV (see figure 2).

Writing Control Code

If you are preparing your own production or copying existing video, try to have video signals recorded over the entire length of the tape. Even if your program material is limited to a small portion of a

long-duration cassette, recording video signal and the corresponding control pulses over the entire length ensures that you can determine the exact location, no matter where the tape is currently positioned. If the tape extends beyond the length of your program, put "video black" signal over the remainder by recording with a video camera with the lens cap on. To reduce access time, try to use a tape length that closely matches the length of your video program (allowing for 5 to 30 seconds before the beginning of the first scene).

Your next step is to determine how the interface card will read the location of the tape at any point during an interactive session. Two addressing schemes, relative and absolute addressing, are in common use. Relative addressing

counts the passing pulses on the control track. Since these pulses are automatically laid down with each video frame, this method is the quickest and easiest for preparing a tape. As the interface card feeds each passing control pulse to a counting routine in your computer, a pulse count defines each location on the tape. When the tape rewinds during the interactive session to access earlier scenes, this count is decremented and constantly updated to the current tape location.

Since this count is relative to the starting address at the beginning of the tape, you should rewind the

tape before starting an interactive session. Some tape slippage occurs during repeated fast-forward or reverse searches for scenes, and this cumulative error in the relative count may cause slight problems in accessing a precise point on the tape. If you anticipate frequent searches during a typical session, you may need to allow extra time before or after each scene when defining each scene by its pulsecount numbers.

Absolute, or frame-accurate, addressing solves the slippage problem by assigning an electronic code number (frame code) for each frame of video. Authoring software contains a routine that allows you to record frame code on one of the audio channels (see figure 3). Depending on the flexibility of your VCR, you can use the audio-dub function to write this code on channel 1 or either channel, without erasing video or the other audio channel. If you need both audio channels for stereo or bilingual narration, however, then relative addressing is the style of choice.

Now it's time to put on the director's cap. With a firm idea of how you want to use sections of the video material on the tape, you can use a "logger" program to mark the beginning (IN) and ending (OUT) points of each "scene." With the VCR in the Play mode, you can toggle back and forth between the video and the logger-program display,



pressing a specified key to mark the IN and OUT points of each scene (see figure 4). The system will use the data file you create during this process to access defined scenes when your interactive program calls for a video scene.

A CAIV authoring program is similar to a general-purpose authoring program. It lets you create text and graphics "pages" to present information. Each authored page is represented by a single screen area. You can present users with choices from menu pages or question pages. Depending on the range of user responses, you can create a series of branches to other text or graphics pages for reinforcement or additional information. A CAIV authoring program adds video and audio segments to the list of page styles (see figure 5). Record management of user responses is also a common part of the program features.

You can write your programs using an authoring language such as SuperPILOT or access the machinelanguage drivers that control the VCR from your own BASIC programs. Alternatively, you can use an authoring program that comes with CAIV interface cards (bundled or at additional cost), which is generally an easy-to-use, menuoriented system. During the authoring process, the software prompts you at each step, and you can also view the interactive program or user responses on hard copy or the screen. The authoring programs differ in terms of how many additional features they offer and what software or hardware they work with. Generally, the higher the cost, the more features and compatibility.

Next month, watch for a step-bystep tutorial on using authoring software to create an interactive video lesson.







SPEAKING OF GRAPHICS

Create homemade Valentines on paper, disk, or even video.

lthough this is the February issue of A+, chances are you're reading it in January. Like us, you're probably recovering from a hectic season of shopping and sending cards and gifts. Did you notice how, after a while, the greeting cards all seemed to look alike? We did—and it made us wonder. Why aren't more people using their Apples to send greetings?

You've got a super computer with an extraordinary offering of software that's perfect for the job. Don't let lack of artistic skill stand in your way; it's the thought that counts. Besides, so much clip art's available that you can create professionallooking greetings with minimal effort.

Are you ready? Valentine's day is just around the corner. Use your Apple to show someone you care. Of course, the obvious way to create a computer-generated greeting is to print it out on paper. Less obvious, perhaps, is the possibility of putting greetings on disk to send to another Apple owner. And then there's the notion of mixing Apples with video to get a multime-

dia effect: a video greeting. Since video is the theme of this issue of A +, let's tackle video first.

Valentine Videos

Many people these days have video recorders and are just waiting for you to send them a videotape. Anything you can put on disk you can put on tape—all you need to do is make some connections.

Use a cable with an RCA jack to connect your computer to a VCR, and the VCR will intercept the signal that the Apple sends to the monitor. With your VCR in the video loop, anything on the Apple's screen will be captured on tape. Just insert a tape into your VCR and press Record. If you're taping a slide show or animation, start the tape playing when the

show or animation starts.

Let's take it a step at a time.

First, turn all your equipment off. If you have a IIe or IIc connected to a standard Apple composite monitor with an RCA cable, unplug the monitor and plug the cable into the Video In jack of your VCR. When you turn your equipment back on (including the TV at-

tached to your VCR), the Apple's screen should be on the television.

If you have an Apple IIGS with an Apple RGB monitor, plug one end of an RCA cable into the GS's composite Video Out connector and the other end into the Video In of your VCR. When you turn your equipment back on (including the TV attached to your VCR), the Apple's screen should be on the TV


and on the GS monitor. (To achieve this simultaneous display with an Apple II Plus, IIe, or IIc, use an RCA y-jack at the Apple Video Out. The y-jack allows you to keep your monitor and the VCR on-line at the same time).

Your system may require different cabling; there are so many possible variations that we can't describe exactly what you might need. A local electronics shop should be able to help you with the correct cables and connectors. By the way, these cables and adaptors are inexpensive.

Also, you'll need a different kind of setup if you plan to exert more control over the videotape than just saving images to it. If you plan to use any sort of au-

thoring software, see this issue's "Using Your Apple II with a VCR" on how to set up for that.

The quality of the video you get depends on your Apple. Apple IIGs computers produce a good, clean video signal, but older Apples fudged a bit with the video signal, so your video may not be high quality. It's been our experience



that Apple/VCR combinations vary: Some produce no color, and some produce unrelenting rolling images, but most produce decent video.

Mixed Media


If you have two VCRs, you may

be able to combine live video with your Apple images by recording the Apple graphics on one tape and the live-action footage on another. Then, make a third tape that combines pieces of the first two tapes. Use one VCR for playback and the

other for recording. You'll lose some quality, as your new tape will be a second-generation copy, but the compromise shouldn't be too noticeable. You can create your own loving but funny silent video, a la Charlie Chaplin, by doing the captions with your Apple. Fontrix would be perfect for such a project. Remake the classics. Start by gathering photos of famous love scenes from books on film. Then, use a digitizer to capture them as Apple graphics. Digitize yourself. Finally, with your favorite paint program, cut and paste your face over an actor's and intersperse these graphics with footage from the real film.

If you have a camcorder, try this. Tape the Apple graphics (title screens, introductory animation, and so on) and remove the tape from your VCR without rewinding it. Then put it into your camcorder and tape the live scenes onto the rest of the tape. You may get some glitches between the graphics and the live scenes, but you'll have a unique and memorable greeting to send.

Unfortunately, we know of no way short of using an expensive



video special-effects generator to overlay Apple graphics onto a video image. This feat requires a genlock device, which synchronizes the two video sources so you can combine them. Amiga owners can buy such a device, and we're hoping that one for the Apple IIGS won't be long in coming.

On Paper

The more traditional type of greeting is, of course, the printed card. The Print Shop, The Print Shop Companion, or Print Master Plus let you create cards effortlessly (see figure 1). Although the cards you can produce with these programs have a certain charm, we find them a little too pedestrian.

You can use these programs, however, to send less traditional greetings. Why not send a banner? I LOVE YOU is impressive in foothigh letters. Mailing the banner won't be a problem. You can purchase mailing tubes in stationery stores. If your banner is small, you can use the cardboard tubes from paper towels.

How about a calendar? Print a calendar and circle the date. A simple heart drawn in the February 14 box says it all. Or circle another date and enter an invitation: "Dinner at 8:00—my treat."

Are you inspired yet?

Have you ever received a certificate honoring an accomplishment? Something about a certificate makes it special; it has an aura of importance. Why not send a certificate greeting? All you need is Certificate Maker or Award Maker Plus (see "Praise in Print," A +, November 1987, pages 90-92). We prefer Award Maker Plus because the borders are particularly impressive. Also, with this program you can use your own graphics in some of the templates; you can even put a digitized photograph onto a certificate.

So, now you need a digitizer. You do have a digitizer, don't you? No? Well, why not celebrate the new year by buying yourself a present. Tell yourself it's an unselfish act, since you'll be using the digitizer all year to create greetings for others. There's the AST Vision Plus if you're using a GS; the ThunderScan for the IIe, IIc, or IIGS, if you're using an ImageWriter; and, of course, ComputerEyes, which has a model for every Apple.

Read All About It

How about a newspaper greeting? With The Newsroom and a little imagination, you can send a greeting that will take more than ten seconds to read. The theme for a Valentine issue can be "famous lovers," or you can gather some quotes about love (Bartlett's Familiar Quotations is available in any bookstore or library) and intersperse them with graphics. Sending the greeting to your mate? How about a newspaper that chronicles the highlights of your relationship?

If a multipage newspaper is too intimidating for you, you can send a flier—one page that effectively declares your love. The Newsroom and Fontrix work just fine for such a purpose.

On Disk

If you know people who have Apple computers, send your greetings on disk. The program can be as simple or elaborate as you want. The easiest approach is to create just one screen, using a digitized photo of yourself. The fun of using the computer instead of simply sending a real photograph is that you can enhance the picture. Add some hearts. Put a small Cupid on

your shoulder. He can be aiming his arrow directly at you. Add some text: "He got me."

Send a series of pictures, perhaps the family (including the pets, of course), organized into a simple slide-show presentation. Draw balloons (as in comic strips) to have each of the characters say something. Use any paint program for this part.




Figure 2: DeskWorks' Enigma is a pop-up code-solving game.

An animated greeting can be sensational (see figure 2). Hearts can flicker and fly. Cupid's arrow can detour around trees, signs, telephone poles, and who knows what else as it pursues its subject. The Graphics Magician, Take 1, or Fantavision can help you here.

When You Care Enough

We hope we've inspired you, because you'll have to hurry. Valentine's Day is only a few weeks away. In March we have Saint Patrick's Day. Easter and Passover come in April. Mother's Day is in May. Father's Day is in June. There's graduation day, Halloween, Thanksgiving . . . •

Desk accessories, those helpful little utilities you can access while you're in the middle of another program, have been around for several years now in limited fashion for the Apple IIe and IIc. Pinpoint, for example, has had great success with packages such as Pinpoint Desktop Accessories that add "pop up" calculators, calendars, and the like to specific programs, notably AppleWorks. Beagle Bros now has a similar set of utilities in its Timeout series, which is specifically designed for AppleWorks 2.0 only.

The Apple IIGS was designed with desk accessories in mind. Apple has built in capabilities that make it easy for programmers to write desk accessories that you can use while running many different programs, without the need to patch or alter the programs.

For months, the only GS desk accessories available were public-do-


GS come in two types.

One type, called a new desk accessory (or NDA), appears in a list under the colored apple icon on the menu bar of ProDOS 16 programs that use the standard GS desktop interface. To use an NDA, you just pull down the apple menu and select the one you want. NDAs usually operate on the desktop in a separate on-screen window, and you can keep them open and ready for use while you continue to work in another window with your main application.

The other type of accessory, which you can access from nearly all programs, whether they use the mouse-driven pull-down menu interface or not, is called a classic desk accessory, or CDA. To use one, you just press Control/open-. apple/Escape, as you would to reach the GS's Control Panel. If you have other CDAs on your start-up disk, pressing these keys won't merely produce the standard menu of Control Panel, Alternate Display Mode, and Quit. Instead, you'll see a list of

desk-accessory choices you can choose from. Unlike NDAs, these CDAs usually take over your entire screen while operating and return you to the CDA menu, rather than directly to your program, when you quit them. Their great virtue, however, is that you can use them from within almost any ProDOS program, including those written

Public-domain CDAs and NDAs include simple clocks, calendars, notepads, utilities to save screen images to disk, and several programming tools. The challenge for commercial vendors offering deskaccessory packages for a fee is to go well beyond what's available in the public domain.

DeskWorks

StyleWare, Inc., publisher of MultiScribe GS and TopDraw, also offers a set of new desk accessories called DeskWorks. DeskWorks clearly meets the challenge of improving on public-domain offerings—it includes a dozen desk accessories, available from any ProDOS 16 program (not just Style-Ware products), that use the standard GS pull-down-menu interface. For the most part, the accessories are sophisticated and powerful, adding real value to existing applications.

You get an appointment calendar, which shows the current month (or any month from 1935 through 2034), and an appointment list you can fill out for any date on which you click. Days on which you've added appointments are boldface on the calendar display.

Another useful accessory is a phone filer, which presents a scrollable stack of note cards, arranged alphabetically; it includes the name, address, phone number, and notes on each person or business you care to list (see figure 1). Phone Filer can search through the cards for any word or part of a word. With the addition of a piece of add-

on hardware (called HyperDialer) that StyleWare is promising to sell, this accessory even allows the GS to dial your phone with any phone number you select by clicking the mouse.

An accessory called Keymac lets you create and use macros—StyleWare claims it can automate many popular ProDOS 16 programs. Macros can either allow the entry of common phrases (such as your name and address) with a couple of keystrokes or let you translate common program commands into a two-stroke macro.

A Scrapbook permits collection and editing of common text and favorite graphic "scraps" that you can call up from a special disk directory for pasting into documents via the GS's built-in Clipboard.

DeskWorks includes a scientific calculator that is, if anything, much too powerful for the average user. It certainly does common calculations, but it has many other functions that are unlikely to be useful for anyone but research-scientist types.

There's also a notepad that allows entry of up to 8 separate brief notes of 11 lines each—useful for

jotting down thoughts while using another program.

Other features built into Desk-Works include three clocks: a standard time display similar to that of the public-domain accessories, an alarm clock that gives off a piercing sound no matter what you're doing, and a menu clock that places a constant time display on the far-right end of the top menu bar on programs using the standard GS desktop interface. The program also has an accessory that blanks the monitor screen after a specified period of inactivity, one

that makes the apple icon on your menu bar swirl around, and even a pop-up code-solving game (a MasterMind clone) called Enigma (see figure 2).

Most of the DeskWorks accessories are well thought out and easy to use, featuring the standard GS window setup with mouse control of scroll bars and so forth. Several let you cut and paste text among them or between them and application programs, using the GS Clipboard. You can shrink many of the accessories to little icons and keep them out on the desktop while you work on your main programs. You can add as many or as few of these accessories as you like to ProDOS 16 programs that use the standard interface, by choosing which ones to copy into the DESK.ACCS subdirectory on your boot disk. Different ones can go on different disks.

DeskWorks does have a few irritating problems. Instead of building in all those scientific features that are irrelevant to most users, StyleWare should have made it more obvious how to cut and paste calculator results into your application-program documents. The company told me it was possible, but it wasn't apparent to me how to do it. Also, unless you turn off the menu clock, you may find the time of day blocking menu features in some programs or showing up in pictures you save from some paint programs.

If StyleWare cleans up these glitches, DeskWorks promises to add real power and versatility to GS desktop programs.

Deskpak

Much less impressive is Deskpak (Volume I), a set of nine desk accessories (eight NDAs and one CDA) from Simple Software. Although it is the least expensive package reviewed here, at \$29.95, and was the first of the three on the market, it barely goes beyond the accessories that were available earlier in the public domain.


Deskpak's calendar displays the current month but can't show any other months, future or past, and permits no appointment entry. It has two standard clocks, one digital and the other a hard-to-read analog version. The two entertainment features, a puzzle and a "meltdown" accessory that appears to cause the screen to "drip," are simi-





Deskpak includes three different accessories that blank the screen at your command. One is an NDA, selectable by mouse from ProDOS 16 programs with the standard GS interface; one is a CDA, selectable from all programs, provided you first boot into ProDOS 16; and the third is an NDA that allows you to blank the screen and require entry of a password of your choice to reactivate it.

As with DeskWorks, you can use any or all of Deskpak's accessories on any or all of your disks by simply copying the ones you want into the DESK.ACCS subdirectory. But even at \$29.95, Deskpak Volume I adds only marginal value to your

The Desktop Manager (TDM)

Adapted from a desktop-accessory system for the Apple III, The Desktop Manager deliberately ignores Apple's two built-in methods for integrating desk accessories on the IIGS. Instead, it goes its own way, using a proprietary accessoryinstallation method. You can use TDM in conjunction with standardized GS desk accessories, but at \$89.95 for the starter set and \$40 or \$50 each for sets of add-on accessories, once you start down the TDM path, you may be financially committed to it.

On Three, Inc., the company that sells TDM, is a long-established maker of Apple III products that is trying to break into the Apple II market. The company says it rejected Apple's built-in GS desk-accessory standards as too limiting in

several respects. It also admits, however, that it was interested in adapting its successful Apple III desk-accessory system for the GS, and that didn't conform to Apple's new approach.

What results from this parentage is sophisticated, capable accessories that show a lot of clever programming, but—although TDM works only on a GS and only if ProDOS 16 is booted first—its accessories have a distinctly pre-GS "feel" to them. They are all-text—somewhat like Pinpoint accessories or some CDAs. They are among the rare GSonly programs that don't work with the mouse, and editing commands don't follow GS conventions, though they borrow heavily from AppleWorks. The accessories aren't loaded into memory, except for a 74K core of shared code, which means that TDM must access the disk whenever you request an accessory.

In addition, you have to become




Figure 3: TDM's menu offers eight starter accessories, plus special programs for managing TDM itself.

familiar with a nomenclature borrowed from the Apple III that is foreign to the Apple II. To send displays to the screen, for example, you must specify the destination as CONSOLE. TDM has an optional device-naming system in which Slot 5, Drive 1 is represented as .D51.

TDM appears compatible with most major applications, but you can't use the GS Control Panel, and in ProDOS 16 graphics-based programs, the TDM accessories can't share the desktop screen with application windows. They shift to their own screens to work.

Installing TDM is a bit more complex than usual, but the program's installer utility makes it a smooth process, putting a special TDM loader in the SYSTEM.SETUP subdirectory and a TDM directory on your disk to hold the accessories. The same installer adds new accessories when you buy extras.

The TDM menu, which you access by pressing Option and Escape, offers eight accessories in the initial package, plus special programs for managing TDM itself (see figure 3).

The eight starter accessories are a notepad, appointment calendar, calculator, printer manager, envelope labeler, clipboard, screen saver/printer, and ASCII chart. The accessories all do their jobs well. Some are directly accessible without menu entry, and they are generally more powerful than those in the other two packages reviewed here.




Figure 4: TDM's appointment calendar pops up in the middle of other programs to remind you of appointments.

For instance, TDM's appointment calendar (see figure 4) allows much lengthier appointment notes than the one in DeskWorks, and it pops up in the middle of other programs at the appointed time to remind you of your appointments.





TDM's calculator, which is also overly complex and scientifically oriented, can display a "tape" on the screen, or you can print it out. You can also cut and paste results into documents.

The notepad is a fairly full-featured word-processing program, able to accommodate 245 "notes" of 59 lines each. The printer manager lets you send special codes to printers, to customize your printouts. The program can also print or save as disk files the images of text screens or save graphics screens to disk.

On Three also sells a TDM Com-

munications accessory that provides a popup telecommunications program (\$49.95) and a TDM Disk Manager with pop-up file copying, deleting, etc. (\$39.95). It is also preparing a TDM Super Accessories package (\$39.95) with file-search and -display features.

All of these capabilities are very powerful, but this power carries a price. Learning to use TDM accessories fully takes much more effort than does learning those in the DeskWorks or Deskpak packages. Each accessory is almost like a stand-alone program.

The Desktop Manager has already acquired some fans, but it isn't for everyone. Its price and deliberate deviation from Apple standards and the GS interface put it outside the mainstream of GS desk accessories, but the package is so well produced that it deserves a following.

How They Stack Up

IIGS owners who make heavy use of ProDOS 16 software that takes advantage of the GS interface will find StyleWare's DeskWorks a solid value. Deskpak may disappoint any user with access to pub-

lic-domain desk accessories. And The Desktop Manager is a capable package, but mainly for those who seek a different path, prefer all-text, or dislike the mouse.





he Music Class, for teaching music fundamentals to beginners, comprises five volumes. They concentrate on five different areas of music reading and understanding:

•Volume 1, Fundamentals, covers a broad range of the basics, including what notes are and where they fall on the written staff;

•Volume 2, Rhythm, has lessons on recognizing and following note lengths and rhythmic patterns;

•Volume 3, Ear Training, shows how to recognize and identify notes, intervals, and chords;

•Volume 4, Music Symbols, explores and tests knowledge of rest and note symbols, as well as chromatic and volume symbols; and

•Volume 5, Note Reading, picks up where Volume 1 left off and continues through note recognition, both in a variety of clefs and on the piano keyboard. The volumes are independent: You definitely don't need to buy more than one at a time.

Wenger Corporation says the Music Class is suitable for "ages 8 and up." That worried me a bit: It's such a broad range. For someone of my advanced age (almost four times that bottom level), I thought

the presentation might be too cute. Besides, as someone who has played the violin since before that bottom-level age, I was pretty sure the programs wouldn't have anything to teach me. I was wrong on both counts. The presentation was simple but not offensive to older folks, and the practice the programs offered in identifying notes, sounds, and symbols were a good brushup for me. I can now read some clefs and identify keyboard notes better than ever.

Still, some of the volumes aren't useful to anyone except a true novice to music. Volume 2 on rhythm, for instance, sticks to fairly tame

rhythms in its quizzes and didn't nave much challenge for me (although I did learn that I released the first note in an eighth-note pair too soon).

Perhaps I should explain how the programs work. First of all, they run on just about any Apple II around, needing only 64K of RAM and a single 5¼-inch disk drive. I had no problem running them on my IIGS, although I did have to attach a 5¼-inch drive, and the programs took no special advantage of the GS's sound or graphics abilities. (The GS has some problem with record keeping, which I'll explain later.) Each volume comes on two disks, and the disks have lessons on both sides.

hen you start any of the programs in The Music Class, you can jump right into the lessons, or you can type the instructor's password and see the Manager utility menu.





The Manager, a utility that lets teachers keep track of student scores and progress in The Music Class, is part of all five volumes. The Manager can also allow more than one person to use the same disk. That is, it can keep track of who is allowed to use the disk and store passwords for those users. If you don't use the Manager to turn internal Record Keeping on, the program uses the generic password MUSIC and stores new scores under that name.

he Manager can save scores for as many as 125 students. Each time a student completes a tutorial, exercise, or drill-and-practice session, it stores the score to disk. There is a special instructor password for entry to the Manager, and teachers or orga-

nizers can change this initial password to whatever they choose, to maintain confidentiality.

The Manager's menu shows graphically how many of the 125 potential student slots is occupied and offers a list of commands and options (see figure 1). These let you enter and change names and passwords, turn record keeping on or off, view or print individual scores, and set standards for scores (levels that rate an E for Excellence, for example). Other commands let you customize some of the volumes. You can choose to use the Apple's speaker or an ALF synthesizer and set difficulty levels (with numeric coefficients) for the Rhythm (Volumes 2 and 5), Interval (Volume 3) and Melodies (also Volume 3) tests. There is even an option for drawing and using custom symbols in the Music Symbols (Volume 4) quizzes. Finally, the Manager lets you transfer names and passwords between the disks in the Music Class series.

Although I did not detect any problems with the Manager, I was using it only for myself and an imaginary learning partner: I didn't test The Music Class on a real class. I called Wenger's support line (an 800 number, which was answered immediately) and asked which Apples the programs ran on. The service representative volunteered that although all five volumes ran on all models of the Apple II, the company had received reports of some intermittent bugs with the Manager utility on the IIGS. Apparently, the Manager sometimes keeps scores and sometimes doesn't. According to the representative, there was no way to tell when the bug would appear, and—as far as she knew—Wenger had no present schemes or planned improvements to deal with it.

General Approach

All five volumes work in generally the same way. After you start your system, you can choose to enter the Manager or get right to the lessons. If you choose the lessons, you select either keyboard or joystick/paddle operation. I stuck to the keyboard. Next a menu appears that shows the different lessons or tests on the disk. The lessons generally explain a principle, ask you for a response on a multiple-choice question, and then move on to the next part of the principle or a related subject. When you fail to provide the desired answer on a question, the programs lead you by stating that the answer wasn't quite correct and suggesting how it might be related to the right answer. If you answer correctly, they will congratulate you and move along to the next section.

Throughout the programs, simple graphics and sound illustrate the principles and parts of the tests. At first, the graphics consist merely of circles for notes and lines for the staff. Later, the programs sometimes add musical symbols, along with liberal use of color for pointing out the relevant parts of the display. Some of the lessons use an image of a keyboard, and others depend on a Mr. Metro Gnome, a graphic stick figure who can play a trumpet (although it doesn't sound like one) and beat his foot in proper time. For example, in the rhythm tests of Volume 2, several bars of a musical rhythm appear on




Figure 2: Mr. Metro Gnome teaches rhythm with his tapping foot.

the screen, and the Gnome taps his foot to the beat while you tap the displayed rhythm on the keyboard (see figure 2). The sounds in the program generally consist of simple beep tones—you definitely don't need peripheral sound gear to get your money's worth.

ach of the volumes comes with a 22-page booklet that includes information on the Manager utility, the elements of the current volume, summaries of the other volumes, and possible solutions to error messages and assorted problems. These booklets explain how to use the programs but spend only a concise page or so on the musical principles of the programs.

Here's more detail on what the volumes cover:

Volume 1: Fundamentals

This pair of disks begins at the absolute beginning, showing how circles can represent tones and how the height of those circles on a page can correspond to frequencies. The four programs in Volume 1 cover note reading and staff note reading; rhythm of whole, half, and quarter notes; major and minor scales; and interval counting.

Volume 2: Rhythm

The versatile Mr. Metro Gnome is the star of this entire volume, as he taps out rhythms and challenges you to tap them in turn on the space bar. Starting with whole, half, and quarter notes, the four lessons progressively add eighth notes, dotted notes, and sixteenth notes. When your tapping does not match the displayed rhythm, Mr. Metro Gnome stops the action and shows you a graphic depiction of the length of your notes alongside the correct note lengths.

Volume 3: Ear Training

Four programs cover melodic er-





ror detection and correction, aural interval recognition, and melodic and rhythmic dictation. The program plays intervals and melodies and asks you to correct melody lines and enter notes on a staff. In the dictation lessons, you also attempt to enter rhythm values.

Volume 4: Music Symbols





Figure 3: A screen from Volume 4, Music Symbols

Three programs use animated graphics and games to show the meanings of sheet-music symbols (figure 3). Rests, accents, repeats, sharps, fermatas, flats, and naturals are in the first part. The second part adds slurs, crescendos, tied notes, triplets, common time, and cut time. The last part is a tool kit for drawing up to 80 new symbols for use in the recognition game.

Volume 5: Note Reading

In some respects, Volume 5 is like a compressed version of Volumes 1 and 3. The note reading is more advanced, however, challenging you to read notes in a variety of clefs and on ledger lines beyond the confines of Volume 1. The second program is dedicated to keyboard note reading of similar complexity, where the note's letter is shown and you have to move the cursor to the proper key of the note. The third and fourth programs represent the return of Mr. Metro Gnome and have rhythm exercises with sound and graphics.

In their favor, the lessons in the Music Class series are very simple to start and to follow. They do a thorough job of covering the fundamentals of music reading for be-

ginners and can even help drill experienced music-literates in quick note and interval recognition, both in clefs and on a keyboard image. Unfortunately, buying the entire series would set you back more than \$200—too much, in my opinion, for a program that covers only fundamentals and cannot boast anything beyond rudimentary graphics and sound.

With the options of the Manager utility program and the ability to keep scores for as many as 125 students, the Music Class series can be a good deal for a large group of students. Keep in mind, though, that only one person can use each disk at a time (the full set can handle ten students at once). That is assuming, of course, that you don't have GS systems in the classroom. GS owners should basically ignore the Manager utility until Wenger decides to straighten the bug out and should just think of the series as a single-user package.



A new round of Apple books

hen you buy an Apple computer, you get more than a machine—you also get the mythology: the two Steves; the Los Altos garage; the Cinderella story of Apple's rise to fame and fortune; and the ongoing, larger-than-life escapades of the company's founders. All that legendary stuff is as much part and parcel of every computer Apple sells as is the rainbowstriped logo on the front of every Apple system. Of course, some of us buy Apples for purely practical reasons, but the fact is that owning an Apple II means having a connection to one of the most intriguing success stories of the decade.

For those fascinated with Apple lore, there are precious few ways to keep up with current events in Cupertino. You might find national business coverage of Apple's latest financial performance or major product announcement; local, sensationalized stories about Steve Wozniak's pending divorce; and trade-press coverage of Steve Jobs' public appearances, but that's pretty slim pickings. To get the dirt on what's happening within Apple, your best bet might be to look

Young; and Accidental Mil-

> lionaire: The Rise and Fall of Steve Jobs at Apple Computer, by Lee Butcher. Obviously, the Young and Butcher books are specific to Steve Jobs, Apple's 32year-old cofounder. But the Sculley book spends a great deal of time exploring Jobs' personality as well.







Odyssey

The book that rings most true is Sculley's, an autobiography that he cowrote with John A. Byrne, a *Business Week* editor. The veracity



should come as no surprise; after all, since Sculley was a participant in the boardroom and not a reporter relying on interviews to triangulate the evidence. What is surprising is Sculley's candor, the descriptions of his mistakes, and his confession of how far out of hand he let Jobs get. It's an emotionally told story that carefully recounts the corporate courtship, marriage, honeymoon, and bitter split-up of Sculley and Jobs.

Odyssey is a page-turner because it takes such a thorough behindthe-scenes look at Apple. If you've ever wondered what it might be like to sit in on an executive staff meeting at Apple, or to visit President Mitterand in Paris or IBM's corporate headquarters with Steve Jobs, then this book will give you a glimpse. It's got all kinds of interesting anecdotes: Alan Kay's disparaging memos about the Macintosh, Ben Rosen's bet with an Apple manager that Jobs would outlast Sculley and eventually oust him, and Apple's flirtation with buying Xerox Corporation, among many others. Equally fascinating are Sculley's early chapters describing executive life at Pepsi-Cola, the company from which Apple lured him. He draws a remarkable contrast between the opulence and cigar-chomping competitiveness of the soda-pop conThe fact is that owning an Apple II means having a connection to one of the most intriguing success stories of the decade.

glomerate vs. the seat-of-yourpants creativity and chaos he chose to join at Apple.

Apple lovers will want to skip Sculley's minichapters on marketing and positioning strategy and get right to the heart of the power struggle. (*Odyssey*, Harper & Row, \$21.95)

The Journey Is the Reward


Jeffrey Young's book has its own surprises. The trendy Zen title makes it sound as if he'll trump up Jobs' already outsized image, but he makes it clear early on that he intends an evenhanded approach. He paints a fairly unsparing portrait of Jobs—as genius, tyrant, showman, and silver-tongued salesman. Young, a founding editor of *MacWorld* magazine, captures perfectly the paradox between Jobs' humanistic ideals and his propensity for cruelty.

The Journey is the Reward could be subtitled Everything You Always Wanted to Know about Steven P. Jobs but Might Never Ask. As a good biography should, this one contains voluminous, interpretive detail on Jobs' childhood and youth, with all you'd care to know about his trip to India and experimentation with drugs, diet, and sleep deprivation. It's interesting material but may be a bit excessive for the average Apple watcher looking for insight into the workings of the company. Nonetheless, if you've never picked up Fire in the Valley or The Little Kingdom, Young's book thoroughly covers the nascent days of Apple and Jobs' tumultuous relationship with company cofounder and Apple inventor Steve Wozniak. It also explores Jobs' obsession with proving himself as important to Apple as Woz.

What's really remarkable about Young's book is the way it contrasts with Sculley's. Sculley's story hinges upon Jobs' behavior, but the reverse is hardly the case in

Young's book. In fact, Sculley appears to be one of a vast number of supporting players in Jobs' universe, making it appear that Sculley's infatuation with Jobs was unrequited. In fact, Jobs seemed to think Sculley was something of a "bozo." It's hard to tell where the truth lies here, though, since both Jobs and Sculley refused to be interviewed for this book.

The biggest surprise appears near the end of Young's book, where he credits Steve Jobs with the turnaround at Apple. The company took a nosedive in early 1985—culminating with losses and layoffs at midyear and Jobs' resignation shortly thereafter-and has since climbed back, quarter after quarter, to record profits. Young's assertion is that, since Jobs championed the LaserWriter against upper-echelon resistance, he made it



possible for the desktop-publishing market to emerge and thus paved the way for Apple's salvation. Sculley merely "found himself sitting at the head of a company perfectly poised to take advantage of a groundswell of profits from the advent of desktop publishing," says Young in his book, acknowledging, though, that John Sculley's "reorganization, streamlining, and appearance of stability all contributed."

It's a pretty naive analysis of the way things do and don't happen in the personal-computer marketplace. If Sculley hadn't done all those things, desktop publishing wouldn't have mattered. And, as Young points out, Sculley had to do all those things because the lowpowered Macintosh that Jobs in-

Accidental Millionaire, written by the former editor of the San Jose Business Journal, follows pretty




much the same chronology as Young's book, but with a vituperative twist. As you can tell from the title, the thesis here is that Steve Jobs was in the right place at the right time—an opportunist's opportunist. "Because Jobs had so little to do with the creation of the first personal computer that led to Apple Computer, many people feel that he became important only through hanging onto Wozniak's shirt tails. Hence the title Accidental Millionaire," writes Butcher.

Accidental Millionaire is fun to read in the same way that pulpy made-for-TV movies are fun to watch. Besides the book's brazen premise, its climax includes an incredibly hokey scene wherein the San Jose Business Journal has gotten wind of Apple's reorganization

plans. "You've got to get something more solid than rumors," says the editor (presumably Butcher) to reporter Jimmy Olsen-oops, I mean Nick Arnett. When something more solid is found ("Let's go with it," the editor says), the story forces Sculley to announce the reorganization earlier than he planned, according to Butcher. It's a gratuitous scene that's more self-serving than anything in Sculley's book. If you're really interested in a biographical look at Jobs, pick up Young's book, which makes a lot of the same points as Butcher does, but in a more gentlemanly, betterresearched, and better-written fashion. (Accidental Millionaire, Paragon House, \$19.95)

Fire in the Valley

The "classic" Apple history is The Little Kingdom, a thoroughly researched account by Michael Moritz, a former Time reporter, that is now out of print. Fire in the Valley, the quintessential computer-industry primer, is still in print, however, and certainly deserves a mention here. Written by Paul Freiberger and Michael Swaine, two writers who go way back to the



heyday of *InfoWorld* in the early 80s, it covers much more ground than just the Apple story per se. In fact, Apple doesn't really get much play until about two-thirds of the way through the book. But it's the book to read if you want to understand the context in which Apple evolved and get the original "two Steves" story. (*Fire in the Valley*, Osborne/McGraw-Hill, \$11.95)

A product that gives you color with a capital K

Are you disappointed in the color output of your ImageWriter II? Are you longing for an easy, relatively inexpensive way to add color to your printouts? I mean real color: bright, intense, opaque reds, blues, greens, and so on. I have good news for you. Read on.

With the help of my Apple IIGS and LaserWriter, I just wrote and printed a five-page report. It looks good, especially the cover page. It's on dark-blue card stock with a 64point title, and the type is silver. Impressive!

No, I'm not hallucinating. And I don't have a \$30,000 color printer. I know that the LaserWriter doesn't print in color, but I can do it anyway. I can take anything printed on a laser printer and color it quickly, easily, cleanly, and professionally. In fact, I can do the same thing with any photocopied page. You can too—with a KroyKolor or Omnicrom system.

I first saw KroyKolor at a computer store. I looked at some sample output, and then I colored one of my own LaserWriter prints. My instantaneous reaction: "Wow, I want it!"

The KroyKolor system, from a company that is well known in the graphics field for its sign systems, consists of a processor, a rather large unit (26½ inches wide by 9 inches high), and color-transfer film. The system is made by Omnicrom Systems Corporation and is also available directly from that company under the Omnicrom



The KroyKolor/Omnicrom processor and

name. The processor is basically a temperature-controlled heating unit. The color film, when properly heated, adheres to toner (a dull, black powder). Laser printers and most photocopiers print with toner. Put it all together and - welllet me explain how it works.



Fast and Easy

Take any laser-printed or photocopied page. Slip the page between a sheet of color film and the film's backing paper and feed it into the processor. In seconds, the paper rolls out of the rear slot of the processor. Peel off the film and presto! Wherever there was toner, there is now vivid color, color that is permanently bonded onto the paper. Your document looks as though it had been professionally printed.

What is most impressive about the KroyKolor system is the quality of the transfer film. The $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$ -inch sheets come in a variety of different colors and finishes. Presently, you can get 35 matte, 11 gloss pastel, and 14 metallic colors. All the colors—matte, gloss, and metallic—bond perfectly: no wrinkles and no uneven shading. The colors are opaque, so the paper does not show through. The metallic sheets are fabulous. Imagine seeing your computer output in gold, silver, bronze, metallic blue, and so on.

It's Fun

You'll find yourself printing and photocopying just about anything, just so you can color it. At first, you'll probably be content with using one color to a page, but soon you'll want to create multicolored prints. You can do so easily by cutting pieces of different-color film and taping them over the appropriate areas of your image. When you run the sheet through the processor, each color bonds to the area you placed it on. Alternatively, you can print or copy part of an image, KroyKolor it with one color, send the same sheet through the printer or copier again to print another area, KroyKolor the newly printed area with another color, and so on.

It's Practical

Fun aside, the KroyKolor processor is a useful tool that allows you to do professional-quality color work economically.

If your business or organization does low-volume presentations and reports, you can create color covers for considerably less money than you'd have to spend to have them done professionally at a print shop. Kroy provides paper and card stock in a range of colors that are perfect for such covers.

You can use any Apple graphics program to create business charts; print them; and, if you're not using

KroyKolor can take anything printed on a laser printer and color it quickly, easily, and professionally.

a LaserWriter, send your printout through a copier and use Kroy-Kolor to add pizzazz to the charts.

Are you an artist? Instead of using colored markers or adhesive-backed sheets that you have to meticulously cut with an art knife, you can prepare layouts and comps with KroyKolor.

If you need lots of small signs and change them often, you might want to check out Kroy's new software program called SignXpress, which positions text and graphics on predefined sign templates. The templates fit into special plaques, also available from Kroy. Pop out one sign and insert a new one.

Schools are using the Kroy system with programs such as Certificate Maker and Award Maker Plus. Print the certificate on an Image-Writer, photocopy it, and then KroyKolor the photocopy. Certificates look fabulous with metallic-colored borders. Print Shop signs and posters come alive. Newsroom fliers with colored mastheads demand attention.

Black is Black

If you use a LaserWriter and find yourself bemoaning the fact that the black is actually a dull, lifeless gray—a problem especially when you're printing graphics—you can take that dull page and apply Kroy's matte or gloss black film to it. You'll surely be impressed with the results.

The processor is also an excellent laminating machine. Instead of using color film, sandwich your document between a sheet of laminating film and backing paper, send it through the processor, and you have it.

One Complaint

I like this system. I like it so much that I wish it were priced so that schools, small businesses, organizations, and individuals like me could more readily afford it. That's my only complaint. I think the \$995 price is steep for what is, after all, just a heating unit. When I

questioned the price, Kroy personnel told me that the processor's infrared bulb is the same high-quality, expensive bulb as the one in Apple's LaserWriter, only bigger. The rollers in the processor had to be meticulously designed to provide just the right pressure for wrinkle-free bonding of the film to the toner. I'm sure that's all true, and this attention to detail is undoubtedly what lets you produce superior-quality colored output at a fraction of the cost of commercial printing. Still . . .

Try It

If you'd like to use KroyKolor but are not ready to purchase it, check out some of the service bureaus in your areas. Some of these bureaus, where you pay by the page for LaserWriter or Linotronic output, now have a Kroy processor. For a minimal fee, sometimes just the cost of the sheet of color film, you can use the processor to color your documents.

Or Buy It

Whether you're using Kroy-Kolor with a LaserWriter or copier, you'll love the new color in your life. If you plan to use it with a copier, check with your dealer, or call Kroy, to be sure your copier is compatible. Then, while you're waiting for delivery, clear out a few shelves in your paper cabinet—you'll want to try all the colors and finishes.

PREPARING A TAX-DEDUCTION DATABASE

Well, it's that time of year again: time to think about preparing last year's tax return and to make resolutions about how to be better prepared this year. Let's look at how the AppleWorks database module can make your tax preparation less tedious.

Many excellent financial-management and tax-preparation programs are on the market, but most of them require a lot of learning time and, frankly, do more than is necessary for most of us.

If you operate a small business or have enough deductions to file Schedule C (itemized deductions) on your tax return, you can use the good old AppleWorks database module to itemize your deductions quickly and easily and provide you with a subtotal for each deduction category.

You don't have to do data-entry work every time you write a check—if you spend half an hour at the end of each month and enter only checks for expenses that are deductible, at the end of the year you'll be able to face tax preparation with ease.

Here's how to set up the tax-deduction database:

From the AppleWorks main menu, choose Option 1, Add Files to the Desktop. Then choose Database from the Add Files menu and From Scratch from the Database menu. Enter an appropriate name for the

file, such as TaxDedctns87. Create the category names that appear in figure 1: Date, Check, To, Amount, For, and Type. If you have special needs, you can add extra categories.

Once a month, or whenever it's convenient, sit down at your computer and enter your deductible ex-

penses, working from your checkbook ledger or stubs. Don't forget to go through your credit-card bills and receipts and add deductible expenses charged to credit cards.

In the Type category, use a list of standard abbreviations for allowable types of deductions: contrib (charitable contributions), suppl (supplies), legal, office, repairs, and the like. (If you're not sure what's deductible, look at last year's tax return.) You can use code numbers instead, if you prefer.

If you use more than one checking account, enter a letter next to the check number to designate which account it came from (362P could be from a personal account, for example). If you file more than one return, create an additional category to designate which entity each deduction belongs to (e.g., P for personal, B for business).

Be sure to save your work to a data disk frequently. Make a notation in your checkbook showing the date when you entered the information into AppleWorks, and







After you've entered a month's worth of deductions, use open-apple/Z to look at all the records in your file simultaneously (see figure 2). You'll see that all the information does not fit on the screenthe Type category is off to the right somewhere. You can make an adjustment by typing open-apple/L, and changing each category to an appropriate length using the openapple key in combination with the left- and right-arrow keys (see figures 3 and 4).

Formatting Reports

At tax time, you'll need to print your itemized deductions in a way that makes sense to your tax preparer and the IRS.

Presumably, you've already entered your expenses in chronological order and check order. If not, you can arrange them that way by putting the cursor on the Date or Check column and typing openapple/A. Choose Chronological or From 0 to 9, depending on which category you've chosen to arrange.

Next, and most important, you must group similar deductions together for subtotaling. Put the cursor on the Type column and type open-apple/A. Choose From A to Z to create an alphabetical listing of deductions by type. (You can do so regardless of whether you're in the Review/Add/Change mode or the Print mode).

To create a report format, type open-apple/P. Choose option 2, Create a new ''tables'' format. You can name the format anything you like, such as Totals.




Figure 5: When formatting reports, notice the number under Len on the far right. Len indicates how many characters wide your report is.

Using the open-apple key with the left- and right-arrow keys, change the category widths so the categories will all fit on your printed page. Note that at the far right of your sample report format, Apple-Works gives you the total width of your report under the letters Len (in figure 5, it's 78 characters). If the length is greater than 80 characters, or if it's off the screen to the right entirely, you'll have to do some adjusting of category lengths

or type size to make everything fit on the printed page.

If you are using more categories than the examples show, you will probably have to use a smaller type size than the normal 10 characters per inch. To change the size, type open-apple/O. Type CI; press Return; and then enter 12, 15, or 20, and press Return.

The larger the number of characters per inch, the smaller the type size. Use the largest type that lets you get all the necessary information printed on one line. You may need to do some experimentation to get everything just right.

Note that near the middle of the screen, AppleWorks tells you Char per line (est). This is the number of characters that will print, based on left and right margins, characters per inch, and other printer options. It should be equal to or greater

than the width of your report described above (mine is 78 characters wide). If it's not, try a smaller type size. Finally, press Esc to go back to the report format.

Next ask AppleWorks to group things together for subtotaling. Put the cursor on the Type column and press open-apple/G. Select No in response to the questions Print group totals only? and Go to a new page after each group total? (No is the default answer to both questions, so just press Return.)

Finally, tell AppleWorks to calculate totals by putting the cursor on the Amount column and typing open-apple/T. Choose two decimal places, press Return, and put one or two blank spaces after the category. Your report format should now look like figure 5. Save it to disk before going further and again every time you modify it.

Give it a try: Type open-apple/P (Print the report) and choose The screen. Add the current date and press Return. Then study the report on the screen to see if it looks





correct and if each category is being subtotaled. Note: If your report is too wide for the 80-column AppleWorks screen, it will not be completely visible.

If everything looks acceptable, try sending the report to your printer. It should look something like figure 6.

You can add a title to your report while you're in the Report Format mode: Type open-apple/N. Don't change the report name—press Return to accept it, and you'll see the cursor move to the top of the sample format. You can now enter a one-line title, such as Itemized deductions for Steve Miller. Calendar year

1987, which will appear at the top of every page of your report.

Keep in mind that a report format does not arrange the data each time you print it, so if you add more deductions to your file, you must again arrange the Type category alphabetically before you print the report.

Here's the good news: Next year, you won't have to go through all these steps to create a new file! Just add the old file to the AppleWorks desktop from your data disk, change the name (using open-apple/N), and delete all the old data (using open-apple/D).

There's nothing like a big, healthy list of deductions to make a taxpayer smile! Why buy a new program to organize your deductions, when AppleWorks is ready to do it for you?



TELECOMMUNICATIONS

The new year brings higher speed for better prices, and other improvements.

BY MICHAEL FISCHER

his last year has seen a significant increase in the speed of telecommunications, with 2400-bps modems becoming much more commonplace as prices for them fall. Now the first internal 2400-bps modem is available for the Apple II. (By the way, bps is an abbreviation for bits per second and is a measure of the speed at which a modem sends in-

formation over the typically sends each bit, eight data bits, and ADVANCES one stop bit, for a total of ten bits per character. Thus, 2400 bps is 240 characters per second.)

When I first started telecommunicating, the basic speed was 300 bps, and some people still used 110 bps. A few pioneers used 1200 bps, although most of us thought that standard voice-grade telephone lines were too noisy for that speed.

Today you generally find a basic speed of 1200 bps—a few people still use 300 bps. We're witnessing a fairly steady move on the part of many telecommunicators to 2400 bps, and some advanced users are currently using 9600 bps.

All this speed comes at a price, and even though the price of modems has generally dropped recently, most 2400-bps modems tend to cost at least \$300.

A new modem company called Epic Technology has recently introduced 2400-bps internal and external modems for the Apple II at

prices less than \$200. The external modem works with any computer equipped with an RS-232 interface. The internal 2400-bps modem fits into one of the Apple II Plus, IIe, or IIGS slots, the first such internal modem for the Apple II that runs at 2400 bps. (Practical Peripherals recently announced a similar modem, the Practical Modem 2400II, but it is not yet in production.) The

price for either of these units is less than the cost of many 1200-bps

If the price is not enough to interest you, Epic claims that its modems are upgradable. If you want the special hardware error-correcting protocol (known as MNP) available on some 2400-bps modems, you simply replace a chip on the modem. If you want data encryption, just change a chip. The company plans other features for the future.

So far, I have only been able to look at a modem and discuss the product with company officials. I have not yet tested one in my system, so I cannot report on how well the modems work. They look promising, however, and will be

Charges

For a while now, CompuServe Information Systems has provided on-line services at either 1200 or 2400 bps, at the rate of \$12.50 per hour plus a network surcharge of \$.25 or more per hour, depending on the method of access. GEnie (General Electric Network for Information Exchange), using the slogan "Stay on Line Longer for Less," has service at 1200 bps for only \$5 per hour. It imposes certain conditions, though:

•The GEnie rate is available only during nonprime time (6 P.M. to 8 A.M. weekdays and on weekends and holidays), whereas the CompuServe rate is available 24 hours a day,

7 days a week.

•The GEnie rate is for 300 and 1200 bps only; 2400 bps carries a surcharge of \$10 per hour, resulting in an effective rate of \$15 per hour.

GEnie has lowered its 2400-bps surcharge to \$7.50 per hour, however, making the total rate at 2400 bps \$12.50 per hour—the same as CompuServe's before addition of





the CompuServe network surcharge. Now if GEnie could only be available around the clock.

Looking for an Address

In the old days, before micro-computers, I used to communicate by a method still in use known as mail. Note that the word is spelled without an initial *E*-. One way I had to obtain addresses was through telephone-company directory assistance. The phone company did not like that use of its service, but it did dutifully supply the addresses of my out-of-town correspondents who were listed in the telephone directory. Alas, that system is no longer available.

The problem is more significant in electronic mail (E-mail), since you not only need your correspondents' E-mail address but also access to the same service to which they subscribe. Some services have gateways to other services, allowing you to send E-mail to people on services to which you don't belong, but getting their E-mail address is still a problem.

A partial solution is the National E-Mail White Pages, an on-line directory of service subscribers with their name and address, together with a preferred and alternate E-mail address. If you want to register your name and E-mail address, all you have to do is call the toll-free modem number to enter your listing. Before calling, be sure to set your system to seven data bits, even parity, and one stop bit.

When I called the number, I had to try several times—at times the host system was either not functioning or simply did not respond to my system. The software on the host system is basic but does get the job done eventually.

The listing suffers from one major problem. You can list only two E-mail addresses, a preferred and an alternate. I'd like to see a system that allowed you to list all addresses, perhaps in order of preference.

You can also search the listings for an E-mail address for any person, although you must use a different phone number (it's a Connecticut listing and not toll-free, and there is a charge for each successful search). Search charges are either 20 cents per search or \$95 per year for unlimited use. You must make a minimum purchase of \$10 for 50 searches.

AESP has several charts that tell you exactly what cable to get for your equipment.

The Cable Solution

I have finally found a solution to a problem that plagues many new owners of external modems: how to connect the modem to the computer. Many different types of cables are available, some of which claim to function with various combinations of computers and modems. You can't always find the correct cable at your local computer store, however, and ordering one through the mail can be risky unless the dealer knows cables very

A company called AESP (Advanced Electronic Support Products, Inc.) specializes in cables and Apple computers. It has several charts that tell you exactly what cable to get for which combination of modem and Apple computer. It will either sell you the cable by mail order or tell you the name of one of its dealers in your area.

LEARNING CURVE

A simple public-domain program that gets your ideas flowing

any people—adults as well as children—sometimes experience creative blocks. I've seen sixth-graders at the top of their class who become completely blocked when they have to confront a creative challenge.

For many people, the normal response to a creative block is to become anxious and frustrated,

which often has the effect of making the block deeper and stronger. Fortunately, techniques have been developed that help melt these barriers to creative thought, techniques that can open us to ideas we've had all along without knowing it.

Last month I discussed computers as tools to promote the development of intuitive skills and promised to publish a simple program this month that would further such skills. Accordingly, I'm presenting a public-domain Apple II program in this issue to help keep you in touch with your creativity. Before going into this program, I need to describe some general strategies for unlocking your creative blocks.

Relax!

Although some people do their best work under pressure, many find that the pressure of an unsolved problem just makes its solution more difficult. Activities that remove this pressure can sometimes help. If you've ever had a brilliant idea while relaxing in the shower, you know how powerful a change of focus can be.

Premature judgment is a major creativity blocker. The mind does only one thing at a time. If we try to create and judge our ideas simultaneously, we end up inhibiting their flow. I don't mean to say that judgment isn't useful—it is. Judgment is an essential part of all problem solving, but when we bring it to bear too early, we miss

stuck trying to think of others. Your mind was probably bubbling over with possible answers (paperweight, door knocker, fly killer, and so on), but if you were judging and rejecting your ideas, you ended up sitting there with your pen in your hand and nothing in your mind.

Research by Gabriele Rico, Tony Buzan, and others has shown that

> anyone can be helped to gain access-with practice-to the vast reservoir of thoughts and ideas that normally lie undetected. The techniques these researchers have developed have many names: webbing, mind mapping, clustering, and the like, but they share one common element. Each technique gives all new ideas equal validity, whether or not they are relevant to the problem. You suspend all judgment until after you've captured all the ideas. Only at this point do you look at your list of thoughts and pursue those that make sense to you.

> The ability to capture thoughts without judgment comes with practice. When I'm working with a group of students, I have each stu-

dent draw an oval with ten radial lines around it, like rays from the sun. Next I give the students a target word to write inside the oval. As soon as they've written this word, the students write the next ten words that come to mind as fast as they can, one per line. Relevancy is irrelevant; the only goal is speed.

If you try this exercise with a tar-

the opportunity to let loose the diverse collection of ideas waiting for expression.

Much of our judgment takes place unconsciously. To see how it can interfere with ideas, try the following experiment. Write down 20 uses for a brick. If you're like most people, you probably wrote down a few obvious choices and then got

get word such as FOOD, you may find yourself with a list containing some food-related words, along with some other words that don't mean much to you. You may also find yourself stuck during this process. If you do, just write any

word—no matter what it is—and keep going.

By doing this exercise frequently, you will find it easier and easier to come up with a rich set of ideas whenever you have a challenging problem to solve, and—best of

all—you will find new ideas easier to come by when you are solving a "real" problem.

The paper-and-pencil mapping exercise works well when others can monitor your performance, but it is hard to monitor your own performance while you are doing it. That's why I've written Mapper.

Mapper


Mapper is a program that presents you with a target stimulus word, lets you type the next ten words that come to mind, and charts the time delays before you start to type each word. The chart lets you see when you were blocked. The program also gives you a total score and challenges you to get your score as low as possible, since a low score indicates that you are learning to suspend your judgment.

Because the program measures the time between pressing Return and typing the first letter of the next word, a slow typing speed does not adversely affect your score.



by a main program. The program runs in any Applesoft BASIC environment, so it should work on Apple II computers of any vintage.

The program measures the delay time before the typing of the first character in line 2140 by counting loop cycles until a key press. If you are using an Apple IIGS, you may want to set your processor speed to "normal" to slow this process down a bit.

The subroutine starting at line 3000 plots your performance with a bar graph. Each bar's length is related to the square root of the delay time (line 3160), to provide more sensitivity for fast responses than for slow ones.


Figure 2 shows a printout of a typical Mapper session. As you can see, the user got stuck in two places. As you practice, you will find your score dropping steadily, and the number of "block" points will decrease.

You can use Mapper as a warmup for a creative-writing project or before working on a complex problem requiring imagination.

Each time I publish a program in A +, I get lots of responses from readers who have great modifications and enhancements. I welcome any contributions—please send them to me in care of this magazine.

I've already made a rudimentary modification that saves and loads the data for the score of each trial word (see figure 3). To use this modification, simply type Control-S to save or Control-L to load your data. (Use the Save option only after the results have been displayed!) Files are saved under the name of the target word; you can load them any time you see the PRESS ANY KEY TO CONTINUE message.

Three alternatives to the keyboard for special-education and basic-skills students

Curricula designed for children in preschool and kindergarten class-rooms have a lot in common with their counterparts in special education; both have a similar commitment to the enhancement of a broad range of developmental skills and provide opportunities to experience the world from a variety of perspectives. Fortunately, basic-skills curricula in early and special education generally present information in ways that allow children to experience it through multiple sensory pathways.

Several years ago when computers began trickling into such classrooms, I worried about how the machines would fit into the curriculum and be compatible with the educational philosophy. Yes, computers could present information to a variety of sensory channels, but the abstract association necessary to use a standard keyboard was difficult for many children. Before the days of the arrow keys, children had to use bizarre combinations of keystrokes to move a cursor. Not only was it difficult for them to understand that pushing the letter N made a cursor go sideways, for example, but sometimes they did not have the necessary hand/eye coordination to press a single key. The outcome was usually a crashed program.

Today some good alternatives to the standard keyboard are available for young and special-education children. They make the computing experience more compatible with a basic-skills curriculum because they allow children to explore software in a manner appropriate for their developmental level—computing becomes more intuitive and less dependent on mature hand/eye coordination and fine motor skills.

In this column, I review three alternatives to the standard keyboard: Muppet Learning Keys, Touch Window, and Wonder-Worker. Each input device has a

unique interface structure and a large body of compatible software that makes it easy to integrate into a preschool, kindergarten, or special-education curriculum.

Muppet Learning Keys

The Muppet Learning Keys are the result of a collaboration between Sunburst Communication and Henson Associates, the creators of the Muppets. The keyboard is a colorful tablet for the desktop or lap that plugs into the game port. It has a blackboard with the uppercase and lowercase letters (arranged alphabetically), a paint box for colors, a ruler with the numbers 0-9, mathematical signs, an eraser, a zap button, and special function keys coded with pictures of some familiar Muppets. My personal favorite is Miss Piggy, tied to train tracks, screaming for HELP!

The Muppet Learning Keys come with Muppets on Stage, an award-winning software program that uses a clever set of graphics and music to present elementary lessons in number, letter, and color recognition. Muppets on Stage is also the first in a series of Sunburst programs that make up a complete kindergarten curriculum. The other titles are Muppet Word Book and Muppetville. The breadth of the three programs is evident in a chart, included with the manuals, that details the correlations with standard kindergarten curriculum objectives. In addition to the three kindergarten programs, nine other Sunburst programs work with the Muppet Learning Keys. The programs, which cover multiple topics and an age range from preschool to adult, are listed in the Sunburst catalog.

Touch Window

The Touch Window from Personal Touch Corporation is a combination touch screen, graphics tablet, and interactive book pad. Like the Muppet Learning Keys, it plugs directly into the game port. It

"Everyone is interested in the future, because that is where you and I are going to spend the rest of our lives."

Those immortal words of The Great Criswell (star of everyone's favorite bad movie, *Plan Nine From Outer Space*) are appropriate this month, as "GamePort" gazes into its crystal byte to speculate on the hot trends in computer gaming for 1988:

•Despite the lone-wolf personality streak that inspires computer game players to spend long, solitary hours gaping at a video screen, two-player telegames are likely to be an important trend in 1988. Playing against another human by connecting two computers via a telephone modem can satisfy gamers' need to be

alone, while allowing them the challenge of a living opponent.

Micro-Illusions already has planned a trio of arcade-style games with telegaming options in its One-to-One series for the Apple IIGs. You can play all these games-from tank combat to spaceship jockeying—over telephone lines. And for Electronic Arts, superstar game designer Dan "Seven Cities of Gold" Bunten's newest creation will make extensive use of telegame techniques. Hybrid designs that combine role-playing, strategic, and arcade elements will enhance the richness of computer games in 1988. Legacy of the Ancients (Electronic Arts) for the Apple II line incorporated elementary arcade sequences within a fantasy/role-playing context. Even Infocom's Beyond Zork allowed aspects of role-playing to invade the verbal world of the text adventure. Upcoming titles, including Cinemaware's Defender of the Crown for the IIGs, will go further to put high-quality arcade action into a strategic framework.

•Designers and publishers will realize that computer games aren't just for computer game players. In short, they will release entertainment products with broader appeal. Automatic mapping and on-line hints

now are helping to bring new players into the computer-game arena. Role-playing games with less combat and more plot will reach toward a goal of producing audience-participation "movies" in a computer.



•The year 1988 will see a resurgence of arcade-action games, brought on by the superior audiovisual potential of the IIcs. Game fans will recover a zest for shoot 'em ups and realize that a well-placed laser blast can be as satisfying as a month in a dungeon.

And now, let's adjourn to the joystick for a year and return in 1989 to tally the prediction success rate of "GamePort."

games. The folks who believe all jokes start in prison believe that games are created in the next cell. Others have concluded that games are just picked up off the floor in the office hallways of San Mateo, Mountain View, Cambridge, and San Rafael. And those few who think milk comes from cardboard cartons are convinced that games begin in software stores.

"But do you want to know the truth, Tommy? Computer games come from people, and the best of them come from very talented people."

"Naaahh, pull the other one, Professor GamePort; I don't believe it."

And neither do many other game buyers. The anonymity of game designers is examined by Balance of Power creator Chris Crawford in an article for *The Journal of Computer Game Design*, an industry newsletter that Crawford began publishing in June 1987.

Crawford suggests that game publishers promote their corporate image at the expense of the actual creators of games. To make his point, he browsed through the front-cover packaging of four types of entertainment products and compared the ratio of the artist's name to the publisher's name.

Books provided the most recognition for the author, followed by compact discs, with videotapes lagging behind.

Computer games

brought up the rear, however. In most cases, the computer-game publisher's name was larger than the designer's—or the designer's name was not present at all on the front of the package.

"We authors of computer games do not get as much recognition as our compatriots in other entertainment fields," Crawford writes.

The Journal of Computer Game Design contains many other fascinating points of view expressed by some of the best game professionals in the business. In the October/November 1987 issue, for instance, Brøderbund producer Don Daglow discusses the elements he looks for in a game design, Silicon Beach Software's Frank Boosman comments on the importance of meaningful icon design, and David "Dr. Cat" Shapiro of Origin Systems provides an essay on fantasy games.



ON THE WINGS OF PEGASUS

More than a year ago, "GamePort" visited the fantasyland that film mogul George Lucas has built at Skywalker Ranch



in California. The occasion was the release of P.H.M. Pegasus, a military-hydrofoil simulation created by the artists of Lucasfilm Games.

Now designer Noah Falstein and his Lucasfilm Games colleagues still can't get enough of surface naval combat. They return to the missile-infested waves with Strike Fleet, another naval-combat simulation for the Apple IIe/c/gs published by Electronic Arts.

Players will have to get into a split-brain, multitasking mode to excel in this new effort based on an enhancement of the P.H.M. Pegasus game system. Instead of commanding a single hydrofoil, keyboard commandos call the shots for an entire fleet of warring vessels, including destroyers, frigates, hydrofoils, and helicopters.

During a battle, omnipotent admirals can move from vessel to vessel and take over the bridge of their choice. Although some defensive systems are under automatic control, the player has all the responsibility for offensive weaponry.

If ship-hopping isn't power enough, the program provides a war map with three levels of magnification to provide an (Admiral) Byrd's-eye view of the conflict and provide overall perspective as the battle rages on into the night and through varying weather conditions.

The combat scenarios sound suspiciously like front-page headlines. Encounters take place in the Falklands Islands and the Persian Gulf. One multipart scenario requires that you manage your resources and weaponry through four different confrontations.

BARD BEATERS BEWARE!

It's not nice to cheat the Bard—satisfying perhaps, but not nice. And a few "GamePort" readers who used the Bard's Tale character editor offered by Milind Limaye found it could be downright maddening.

It seems there are some bugs in the editor, several of the little devils, that will render your edited characters extinct. When you try to add the edited character to a party, the program can't find it.

The bug is not all-encompassing, however. If you want to increase your gold or experience level or spell points, The Bard's Editor really, really works. But diddle with experience or attributes, and your character is sentenced to The Phantom

Zone. It only reinforces the old saying "There's no such thing as a free hit point."

Here's some solace for those who've lost characters: Limave reports that he is unable to allow himself time to fix the bugs because he is enrolled in his freshman year at Notre Dame University, "and the work is rough." The next time you try to add a character and painfully discover that The Bard's Tale won't recognize it, think of Milind sitting behind a late-night word processor, sweating over a lastminute term paper.





UNFRIENDLY TO WIZARDS


You're the only remaining good wizard left, and your duty is clear. That doesn't make it any easier to start out in search of Anakar's six scattered Eyes. As an apprentice, you know only two spells, Blink and Vanish—useful spells, to be sure, but limited.

However weak and unprepared you feel, the responsibility is yours. You must set off in search of the Eyes, freeing prisoners of the evil Zahgrim as you travel, while avoiding his many nasty minions. It certainly sounds like a job for your master and teacher, Goff, but, alas, he's been butchered by the everpresent demons. And that will be your fate as well if you are not very careful and very lucky.

Such is the stage on which you play Datasoft's Black Magic. Billed as an Action-Adventure game, it is a fast-paced arcade-like foray into an evil world of Death Spitting Plants, Demons, Ghosts, Water Creatures, and other odd and un-

friendly creatures. There are a few more or less neutral creatures around, such as the Roc, a bird that occasionally carries you randomly elsewhere, and friendly trolls who offer you favors in exchange for food, but the overall composition of this world is decidedly unfriendly.

Magic plays a major role in successful game play. You can't win without it. As you gain points from recovering lost Eyes or from destroying the evil creatures and freeing prisoners, you move from Apprentice to Wizard to Sorcerer, and finally to Necromancer. At each level, new spells become available. Spells include Vanish, Blink, Chill, Bolt, Fire, Fear, and Conjure. Conjure is useful since it allows you to create food or arrows in a pinch, but it is available

only to Sorcerers and Necromancers. The trick is to survive to the highest level, where the most potent spells become

Survival is not easy. You must penetrate deep dungeons, prisons, and castle keeps in order to find and retrieve the lost Eyes. Timely use of spells and careful study of the enclosed map are prerequisites if you wish to become a Necromancer and have a chance at defeating Zahgrim.

Each time an enemy hits you, you lose some health points. When all your health points are gone, you die. In the absence of a save-game feature, dying means starting over. The only way to recover your health is to find food. Slowly, if you aren't killed in the meantime, food replenishes your health. But food, spells, and arrows are not everywhere, and you can have only so many of each at any time. And the locations of these items change each time you play the game. The Eyes are always in the same places, but other items are randomized, making it difficult to plan where you'll stock up on food or spells (commodities more scarce than arrows).

Once you've returned the six Eyes to the statue of Anakar, he will reveal to you the secret of defeating Zahgrim. Now your toughest challenge begins: You must penetrate Zahgrim's castle, puzzle out its secrets, and defeat the evil warlock.

This game is fun—no question—but it is also quite difficult to complete. The playing mechanics make it fast and exciting, but the strategic aspects make it far more than a test of hand/eve coordination. Even if you have a well-planned strategy, success is not guaranteed. A little luck helps. One mistake along the way can cost you in health, food, or spells just enough to bring on defeat.

Graphically, Black Magic is very good. The screens are well drawn, and the monsters animate smoothly. You can

your character disintegrates before your eyes and is buried under a gravestone. It's an amusing touch as an unseen entity says (through a speech balloon), "You're dead," to which you reply from under your tombstone, "No kidding!" For all Black Magic's humor, however, you will wish Datasoft had provided a way to cut the display short after the 20th or 30th time you've witnessed the same scene.

casting has set Basil Rathbone aside and replaced him with Simon Sez.

But then 221B Baker Street doesn't pretend to be anything else. Adapted from a real board game created 12 years ago, it's remarkably faithful to its original source. Sometimes it's too faithful: It loses many of the advantages of the board game without getting much back in return.

In the game, you take one of four parts: Holmes, Watson, Inspector Lestrade, or Irene Adler. Using a brief narrative as a starting point, you move these animated figures around the board and collect clues. (The program asks if you want to use a joystick, although it refused to accept mine. As an alternative, the keyboard worked just fine.)

The cases are well designed, ranging in difficulty from easy to moderate. Don't waste time looking for subtlety, though. The game-board graphics are well designed, too. The board itself is as close to three-dimensional as it can get. And each detective has a unique personality: Holmes leaves a trail of pipe smoke behind him; Lestrade clasps his hands behind his back as he plods along.




These features are all handy, and they show the care that's gone into making this translation as complete as possible. But any translator will tell you that translating can be an impossible task. After playing the computer version of this game a couple of times, you may find yourself vearning for the original.

Think about the things you normally do with a board game: take your turn over if you make a mistake, keep your cards hidden from your opponents, move to your target position instantly, move the game onto the porch, tuck it under your arm when you head for the beach.

That last might not bother you if your computer's already set up in the family game room, but playing sequence remains unforgiving. Once you've rolled the die, you're stuck; you can't back up without starting

ARMCHAIR **STRATEGY**

The invasion of Normandy, on the northern coast of Nazi-occupied France on June 6, 1944, is perhaps the most controversial battle of the Second World War. Over the past 42 years, armchair strategists have expended buckets of ink and millions of war-gaming hours refighting the bitter battles of that summer. If the Germans had concentrated their forces along the coastline, as Rommel wished, could the invasion have been crushed at the water's edge? If American paratroops had not been so scattered, or if British commanders had been more aggressive, could the Allies have beaten the Russians to Berlin?

Battles in Normandy simulates eight major

battles during this critical phase of the war. It allows gamer/historians to experience the dilemmas the opposing commanders faced and to explore some of the "What If ...?" alternatives.

The game system is adapted from Roger Keating and Ian Trout's Battlefront game, which was a breakthough (or at least a major evolution) in computer-war-game design. The player takes the role of a corps commander, directing two or three divisions. The basic maneuvering units are battalions (typically about 1000 men, 50 tanks, or 36 cannons). The computer can play either side; in fact, it can even play both sides if you want to sit back and watch. Each hexagonal cell on the map represents one kilometer of terrain. The entire Normandy peninsula is mapped in the game database, but most of the battles are fought over small segments of this area, which is just as well, since the screen display is limited to a 13×7 -hex window.

The game is realistic, in that it rewards good tactics and punishes poor planning severely. If you fail to rest and refit your battalions, they will disintegrate. If you don't coordinate air support, artillery, and ground troops in your attacks, they will be repulsed.

Battles in Normandy, like its predecessor Battlefront, provides an elaborate kit of design utilities that make it possible to simulate virtually

any division-level operation of World War II.

The game would be easier to play if it had a "zoom out" feature that let you view the entire battle on one screen. The game is handsomely packaged, with an excellent manual. A large, detailed map of Normandy comes in the package. It's plastic-laminated, so desktop generals can mark up battle plans with grease pencils.

Your task would also be easier if the multiple layers of control menus referred to units by their historical designations, rather than as "DIV 1" or "REGT 4." You need to keep notes on a pad beside the computer to keep track of your forces. A useful screen-dump

feature lets you print out any status report, map, or menu. Unfortunately, it does not work with the Apple IIc or with serial printers, including the ImageWriter.

Battles in Normandy is a complex war game that will appeal to experienced players. To fully appreciate the game, you need some familiarity with the history of the campaign, though.



If you're using AppleWorks and want to place the same title, say your name, on everything you print, I have a tip for you. Select the Specify information about your printer(s) option from the Other Activities menu and then indicate you want to change printer specifications. When the Change Printer menu appears, select the Interface cards option. AppleWorks asks you to enter a printercommand string, which normally Control-I 80N for an ImageWriter.

Instead, enter the title string you want to use. Since AppleWorks prints the printer-command string before the main document is printed, the string appears at the top of the first page of anything you print.

ASSIST GOES TO THE MACINTOSH

Apple IIGS owners who have only one 3.5-inch disk drive can cut their disk-duplicating time dramatically if they also have access to a Macintosh with an internal 800K drive and the latest version of Copy II Mac from Central Point Software. (Standard Apple utilities require multiple disk swaps to make a single-drive copy.)

To make copies, first disconnect the drive from the GS and connect it to the external-drive port on the Macintosh (with the power off, of course). Then run Copy II Mac to make a copy of the disk. Unlike the Macintosh operating system and most Mac software, Copy II Mac works with disks correctly, at least for the purposes of making copies in the "sector" or "bit copy" modes.



HIGS KEY DETECTION

Q. I need some programming hints for the GS. How can you tell whether the open-apple key or the Option key is being pressed at the same time as another key? Are there character codes for these two keys?

C.F. STEPHENS ATLANTIC BEACH, FL

A. The open-apple and Option keys are modifier keys, not character keys, so they don't generate a signal at the standard keyboard input/output location (\$C000). They are actually single-bit push-button inputs. To see whether they are off or on, check the high-order bit of the byte read from \$C061 (open-apple) or \$C062 (Option)—if the bit is 1, the key is being pressed.

Bit #	Function
7	Open-apple active
6	Option active
5	Modifier register updated without keypress
4	Keypad key active
3	Repeat active
2	Caps Lock active
1	Control key active
0	Shift key active

Figure 1: The key-modifier register at \$C025 in the IIGS

This technique also works on the IIc and IIe (where the Option key is the solid-apple key). On the GS only, you can determine the status of these keys at the time the character key was entered by reading the key-modifier register at \$C025 after reading the keyboard code. If bit 7 is 1, open-apple was active; if bit 6 is 1, Option was active. As figure 1 indicates, you can inspect other bits in the key-modifier register to determine the states of other modifier keys, such as Caps Lock, Control, and Shift. It is not possible to determine the status of these other modifier keys on the II Plus, IIe, or IIc.

Here is a short subroutine you can use to determine if the user is requesting help—it checks to see if open-apple is being pressed when either? or / has been typed (? and / share the same keycap):

This subroutine returns a keyboard code in the KB variable. You can convert it to a string variable with the CHR\$ function.

WHERE'S AMDOS 3.5?

Q. I really enjoyed the "IIGS Survival Guide" article by Bob Lindstrom in last October's issue of A+. In it he referred to a program called AmDOS 3.5, which gets DOS 3.3 to work with 3.5-inch drives. Where can I get this program?

A. AmDOS is now available from Gary Little (that's me) at 230 22nd Avenue, San Mateo, CA 94403. The price is \$20. It also works with special DOS versions such as Pronto-DOS and Diversi-DOS and with drives that are connected to Central Point Software's Universal Disk Controller.

MEMORY EXPANSION AS RAMDISK

Q. Is there any way I can configure the memory on an Apple IIGS Memory Expansion Card as a DOS 3.3 RAMdisk?

A. You can easily use the GS Control Panel to partition an area of memory on the memoryexpansion card for use as a ProDOS RAMdisk but not as a DOS 3.3 RAMdisk. The solution for diehard DOS 3.3 users is to use a driver program such as RAM 3.3 from RDC, Inc., 408 South Baldwin Street, Madison, WI 53703 (written inquiries only). Depending on the size of your memory card, RAM 3.3 adds one to eight RAMdisks to your system. Each RAMdisk uses 192K of memory, so if you have 1.5 megabytes of memory, you will have access to all eight drives. RAM 3.3 costs \$40.

AT-HOME FORTRAN

Q. I am taking a FORTRAN course in college and I want to do my homework at home on my IIc. Where can I find a FORTRAN compiler?

A. I am aware of only one FORTRAN compiler for the Apple II series, The Power System: FORTRAN/Apple II. The compiler costs \$99 and is available from Pecan Software Systems, Inc., 1410 39th Street, Brooklyn, NY, 11218; (718) 851-3100. A slightly different version is available for the IIGS for the same price.




