laris, the software company that recently spun off from Apple, now sells most of the software Apple used to sell, including the blockbuster AppleWorks program, featured in this month's cover story. AppleWorks is not only Claris' top-selling product, it's also the second-bestselling software product of all time (next to Lotus 1-2-3), with more than 750,000 copies sold so far, representing a suggested retail value of more than \$150,000,000.

According to company officials, the name Claris is a reference to "clarity of vision." Having a clear vision is certainly an admirable

corporate goal, but I'm just a bit worried about how big a role the Apple II plays in that vision. To show you what I mean, here's what Claris' first press release has to say about the company's mission: "... Claris was created for three primary reasons: to eliminate direct competition between Apple-labeled software and third-party developers, to create a substantial software company dedicated primarily to Macintosh applications, and to create a vehicle for bringing innovative Macintosh software to market.'

When I read that press release, I thought to myself, "Hey, what about the Apple II? Isn't that where Claris is making most of its money?"

Claris introduced itself to the public in a huge booth at the recent MacWorld Expo in San Francisco. It announced major updates to all of its products except AppleWorks. While MacWrite, MacPaint, and MacDraw owners were getting major new features that were lacking in the previous Apple-labeled versions, all AppleWorks got from

Claris was a pretty new box.

In Claris' defense, I must say that the product plans for the Mac software and AppleWorks were already fairly well set by Apple at the time Claris spun off to become its own company. I also understand that Claris has some new features and updates planned for Apple-Works (such as support for the newly announced AppleTalk network), so we'll have to wait and see what the new version has to offer. I hope Claris discovers how important AppleWorks is to the small-business and education markets and plows some resources back into further development of the software.

Claris seems

Also in Claris' favor, the company **committed to** seems committed to **providing** providing good customer support and reasonable productupgrade policies. In **CUSIOMEP** fact, after seeing how slanted toward the Mac Claris might be, some of the A+ editors **policies.** wondered how well Claris would be able

to support AppleWorks. We called up Claris' support line (without identifying ourselves as A +) and asked technical questions that we knew were tricky. We're happy to report that the Claris technical-support people who answered our calls were very knowledgable about AppleWorks and answered our questions accurately and promptly.

Hopefully, sometime soon, Claris will notice the Apple II and understand that it is just as deserving of attention as the Mac. Claris also needs to understand that now that it has split from Apple, it's just another software company. If Claris wants to continue to reap financial rewards from the Apple II market, it'll have to be as innovative and committed to the market as any other successful Apple II third-party

Big Network News


Apple has finally announced the AppleTalk network and CD-ROM disk drive for the Apple IIe and IIGS. The AppleTalk network and AppleShare fileservers will now work with the Apple IIe and IIGS, by virtue of a newly announced AppleTalk add-in board and software for the IIe and system software for the IIGS (the IIGS already has AppleTalk hardware built in). You can now connect Apple II computers to networks to share resources such as printers, hard-disk drives, and other devices. Apple IIs can be networked by themselves (although you'll need a Macintosh as the AppleShare fileserver), or they can be connected to Macs, IBM PCs, DEC computers, and various other systems.

The new Apple CD-ROM drive is a SCSI device that functions like a read-only hard disk that can store more than 500 megabytes of information. The CD-ROM drive can serve as a single-user device connected to an individual computer or as a network device that can be accessed by any computer connected to the same AppleShare fileserver as the CD-ROM drive. For more information about these important new products, see this month's "NewsPlus" column. And then get ready for next month's issue, where you'll find a special report giving you the full story on the AppleTalk network.



AVAILABLE MODIFICATIONS

Dear A +: I particularly enjoyed your January 1988 issue, especially the review of ThunderScan and Mike Markowitz's review of Entry Level CAD-Apple from Versacad. In the latter article, Markowitz suggests some modifications that could improve the Entry Level CADApple program. Two of the principal modifications Markowitz suggests are to install mouse-based pull-down menus and to provide for screen dumps to dot-matrix printers. Readers

might be interested to know that there is a computer-aided design program that has many of the features of the Entry Level CADApple program but also includes these two features.

The program is discoverCAD from Hearlihy & Co., a supplier of educational materials for drafting. This mouse-based program features pulldown menus, auto-dimensioning, zoom ("windows" on Entry Level CADApple), adjustable positioning of text, and 128 drawing layers (compared with the ten layers on Entry Level CADApple). Although the program does not output directly to a dot-matrix printer, you can use a screen-dump program to get printouts (Hearlihy sells Beagle Bros Triple Dump). The discover-CAD program comes on two disks (rather than CADApple's four), which should improve the diskaccess time, a problem Markowitz mentioned.

The program requires 128K of RAM, whereas Entry Level CADApple requires only 64K of RAM.

The biggest drawback with discoverCAD is its price of \$209 for a single installation (multiple installations, such as for schools, can be as low as \$80 per station in quantities of ten or more). The basic price is more than

(Hearlihy & Company, P.O. Box 869, Springfield, OH 45501).

twice the \$99 price of Entry Level CADApple

An unrelated issue: I don't think that your comments regarding Sensible Software's Graphics Department program's showing its age ("Product All-Stars," December 1987) are justified. For example, Sensible Software just recently offered a low-cost upgrade of the Graphics Department printing module that plots charts and graphs in color on a color printer (such as the Apple Image-Writer II). Although I favor pull-down menus, the keyboard system of The Graphics Department is almost as easy to use. The program does require a lot of disk access, but it permits great versatility in the ordering of operations.

One area in which an improvement might be possible (but that could require considerable reprogramming) would be to go to double-hi-res graphics. Such reprogramming might be more justifiable if it were in

conjunction with making The Graphics Department compatible with the Apple IIGs.

Thanks for producing the best computer magazine; keep up the good work.

Should we go ahead and use the Bit Remover, or should we invest in some ACME Pixel Remover instead? And do you know of any source for a platinum-colored drip pan that we could hang under the monitor to forestall future cleaning difficulties?

We anxiously await your reply.



COMPUTING IN THE LATE '80s

Dear A+: The Apple II is as successful as it is largely because of users and aftermarket suppliers. We users have made it possible for the machine to remain somewhat competitive with products in the MS-DOS world, through some ingenusubstantial often and investments in add-ons such as memory and accelerator boards and enhancements to AppleWorks. The MS-DOS world is moving ahead, however, and most everyone looking for a computer today anticipates RAM-resident programs and multitasking and beautiful graphics and maybe real speech recognition and UNIX and all the rest. Many computer jocks have peddled their IIe and IIc computers and, frustrated by Apple's no-competition policy between the IIGs and the Mac, even their disappointing GS computers, in exchange for IBM clones.

I think that for most purposes, where instant gratification is not necessary in terms of disk access, number crunching, and screen updating, the good old II-series computer is still a machine of choice—if only Apple would drop its ridiculous prices and start seriously supporting the code and silicon necessary to keep the machine in the market.

Your readers might like to see an article in A + comparing a soupedup Apple system, using the Zip-Chip or similar accelerator, a bunch of extra memory, RAMdisk software, desktop accessories, 3.5inch and hard-disk drive, and similar stuff, to an IBM-compatible, maybe even an AT-style, set up for typical office work: word-processing, database, accounting, spreadsheet, and communications functions. The benchmarking could include bottlenecks such as file handling, disk access, calculation of spreadsheets, other numeric



functions, "ease of use" (as subjective as that has to be), and other items that may occur to you. You might standardize on programs that are available in both Apple and MS-DOS format. The piece should describe the typical office activities to which the machines are put: drafting, filing and sending correspondence and reports, project planning, financial calculations (e.g., spreadsheets), and accounting. Interviews with a couple of typical users of both systems might be woven into the story.

Like a lot of other Apple owners, I have been thinking about unloading my IIe in favor of an IBM clone. If a comparison of this sort could be pulled together, showing equivalence and maybe even superiority in some areas, maybe many of us would not duck out of the Apple

community.

By the way, I am very disappointed that Apple continues to treat the II people like reliable but distant relations. This is the same old story at Apple, of course. I wish the company were not so bent on euthanasia for the machine that made all its other indulgences possible. Maybe the 68XXX processor is the thoroughbred cutting edge for the next couple of years, but those folks in Cupertino ought to give a lot more thought to the 65XXX mules that have carried them this far and still produce a substantial chunk of their revenues. Eventually the computer market is going to reach a point of saturation again, and they ought to keep in mind that add-ons can also be "profit centers."

I look forward to seeing something from A + that shows existing and, perhaps, prospective Apple II owners that MS-DOS is not the only way to compute in the late 1980s.



Apple announces network products for the II family and a CD-ROM drive, the Laser 128 means more sales to Apple II software publishers, and other industry updates

AT LAST, THE APPLE II NETWORK

On March 1 in Boston, Apple announced the Apple IIe Workstation Card, which will permit—at last—the connection of Apple IIe computers to AppleTalk networks so they can share Laser-Writers and AppleTalk ImageWriters with other systems. This development leaves the II Plus and IIc as the only models in the Apple II family that you can't use with AppleTalk. The IIGs has always been able to connect to AppleTalk through either of its built-in serial ports.


Apple also announced AppleShare 2.0, a new version of its popular fileserver software for the Macintosh. AppleShare 2.0 now works with the ProDOS operating system (as well as the Macintosh HFS file system and MS-DOS), so networked Apple IIs can use Macintosh hard-disk

drives for file storage. Unfortunately, you cannot use a IIe or a GS as a fileserver—a Macintosh with a hard-disk drive is required. Sharing of files on the server with any other networked computer is easy, although AppleShare allows file creators to restrict access as they see fit.


The IIe Workstation Card contains all the software to communicate properly with the fileserver. With the cs, a new operating system installs special driver programs from the system disk when you boot up.

The other interesting networking product Apple announced was Aristotle, a program to help teachers manage computer activity in the classroom. In a nutshell, teachers use it to assign groups of programs to certain classes, and groups of students to classes. When students log onto the network from a IIe or GS, they can run only the programs in the group the teacher has selected.

At our press deadline, Apple had not yet set suggested prices for these products. Ballpark figures are \$800 for Apple-Share 2.0, \$275 for the IIe Workstation Card, \$200 for Aristotle, and \$100 for the GS software. A + will be examining all these new networking products in more detail next month.

CD-ROM

Apple's other major March 1 announcement occurred on the other side of the continent. At the third annual Microsoft CD-ROM conference in Seattle, Apple unveiled the AppleCD SC, a read-only CD-ROM drive for the Apple II and Macintosh. The optical medium for this drive can contain up to 550 megabytes of text, graphics, and sound information.

Like Apple's hard-disk drives, the AppleCD SC is a SCSI device, so you connect it to an Apple II SCSI interface card (with new revision C ROMs) to get it running. Music lovers can play standard audio CDs on it by buying an optional CD audiochip set.

Apple expects the drive to attract a lot of interest from educators, publishers, and others who require easy access to large amounts of information. We at *A* +

couldn't agree more.
Now it's up to the information providers to begin supplying CDs filled with useful data and the retrieval software we're going to need to sift through it efficiently.

APPLE BREAKS A BILLION

Apple Computer, Inc., had such a knockout Christmas that it topped a billion dollars in revenues in a single fiscal quarter. Chairman John Sculley attributed the results to sales gains of the Apple IIGs and the Macintosh SE in particular. Revenues for Apple's first quarter of 1988, which ended January 1, were \$1.042 billion, up 57% from the \$662.3 million recorded in the yearearlier period. The company's net income zoomed up even more spectacularly to \$121.4 million, or 108% higher than the \$58.5 million of the year before.

LASER ZAPS COMMODORE, NOT APPLE


The Laser 128 series of IIe/c-compatible computers is selling remarkably well, much to the delight of its manufacturer, Video Technology. A + estimates that more than 100,000 128s and 128EXs have now been sold, onethird of these by Central Point Software, the designer of the ROM and most of the system hardware. According to Mike Brown, President of Central Point, "suddenly the Apple II family is alive again."

Video Technology's big coup in 1987 was a deal with the Sears massmerchandising chain in which Sears agreed to promote the Laser 128 in its popular consumer catalog. Doing a deal was difficult, since Sears had been unsuccessful when it tried to sell another Apple II compatible, the Franklin 500. But today, Sears is all smiles, particularly after a strong Christmas season.


Central Point's Brown is convinced that the low price of the Laser computers has caused an erosion in Commodore 64 sales, not sales of the more expensive Apple IIe/c. If he's right, publishers of Apple II software should be ecstatic—now there are many more potential software buyers than there would have been otherwise.

GEOS FOR THE APPLE II

Berkeley Softworks, designer and publisher of the GEOS operating system for the Commodore 64, has announced it will be converting that operating system—and several applications that run under it—to run on the Apple IIe, IIc, and IIGs. In fact, GEOS may already be available by the time you read this column.

GEOS will use the double-hi-res screen to create a pull-down-menu, icon, and windowing user interface similar—but not identical—to the Apple standard interface that GS and Macintosh desktop applications use. Berkeley Softworks expects to sell GEOS in an integrated bundle along with geoWrite, geoPaint, geo-Spell, and geoMerge (four more Commodore 64 conversions) for about \$129. At least two other GEOS applications, geo-Publish (desktop publishing) and geoCalc (a

spreadsheet program), are in the works and may be available sometime this summer.

GEOS is exciting news for IIe/c users who long for the desktop interface Gs users have today, and the integration of the "geo" applications into this environment should result in increased productivity for those who need to transfer data between applications.

FREE SOFTWARE— FOR A PRICE

It may seem a strange idea to pay for public-domain software, but the convenience may make up for the contradiction in terms. Rather than rummage around on online services or in users' group libraries to acquire some of these programs, you can simply order a disk full of public-domain goodies from the Public Domain Exchange. Not only does the PDE handle public-domain

software, but it also sells disks of shareware programs, for which users are expected to pay an additional fee (usually less than \$50) if they decide to use the program regularly. Shareware is sort of a try-before-youbuy concept.

The PDE has just added an Apple IIGs section to its catalog, featuring disks with programs such as desk accessories, Free-Termgs (a telecommunications All-Star in the December issue of A +), SHRCONVERT (a utility that converts graphics from many formats to the super-hi-res mode of the IIGs), and the Diversiseries of utilties (which are shareware programs). In addition, there are two other utility disks, three disks containing GS graphics files, and one disk with music files that work with Music Construction Set, for a total of ten IIGs disks in the PDE's catalog (each of which is priced at \$9, plus \$4 for shipping and handling per order).

The PDE also sells hundreds of Apple IIe/c disks for \$5 apiece. The PDE's winter catalog added several new titles for the IIe/c, including ten AppleWorks template disks, three telecommunications programs, and several education titles.

NYET, NYET, SOVIET

It's not often that a trip to your lawyer's office leads to a marketing campaign for your product, but that's exactly what happened recently to Jim Hammond of Fastfind Company. He was seeking advice on whether he could sell his popular Fastdata Pro program to a potential customer in Budapest, Hungary. (Fastdata is a high-speed textretrieval program that Fastfind sells with computer-magazine-abstract databases.)

Poor Jim was told he could not. According to the federal Export Administration Act, selling high-tech material to residents of Soviet-controlled countries is illegal. The Commerce Department confirmed the interpretation of Jim's lawyer.

Jim trashed the order but concluded that his software must be really hot stuff if the Hungarians were to be denied the opportunity to search for all occurrences of the word AppleWorks in past volumes of A + . So his ads now feature a giant, bright-red hammer and sickle next to two headlines: "Banned in the USSR" and "So useful that Congress prohibits export to Soviets!" Take that, Mr. Gorbachev.

StyleWare has brought out yet another version of MultiScribe Gs. Version 3.0 has a sophisticated 80,000word spelling checker and thesaurus, as well as new word-processing and graphics features. It also has a new command for deleting files. The retail price is the same as that of the previous version-\$99.95-and it costs \$20 to upgrade from older versions. StyleWare also has released a font library for MultiScribe GS and other GS programs that offers a collection of 90 new font files for



AppleWorks is the center of its own universe. In this first of a three-part series, we look at the many software programs that work with or enhance AppleWorks. Part 2, in May, will cover educationally related AppleWorks products, and Part 3, in June, looks at general AppleWorks resources.

ost people who have bought Apple II computers during the past four years have also bought AppleWorks, which has made that program the standard productivity application for the Apple II line. Among the word-processing, database, and spreadsheet programs for the Apple II line, AppleWorks dominates all three categories. AppleWorks never claimed to have the most powerful of any of these applications, but most users have preferred to stick with Apple-Works' smooth integration and

amazingly simple interface rather than migrate to more powerful

programs.

Nevertheless, computer skills and users' needs don't stand still, and AppleWorks users may want more power without abandoning their main program. That's where AppleWorks enhancement programs and AppleWorks-compatible programs come in. Once a solitary program, AppleWorks is now the center of a universe of thirdparty products that offer a wide range of extended capabilities. From custom print formats to custom database reports, and from business graphics to macros, we can choose from many ways to enhance the data we create and store with AppleWorks-and more options are appearing every year.

Two types of software make up the AppleWorks universe. Apple-Works enhancement programs add extra capabilities to AppleWorks, allowing us to use AppleWorks more easily or manipulate Apple-Works data more flexibly. They include spelling programs, outliners, report generators, print utilities, templates, and macro programs.

These programs are specifically designed to work with AppleWorks and with no other program.

Then there are AppleWorkscompatible programs—stand-alone applications that can use data you enter directly, as well as data from the AppleWorks word-processing, spreadsheet, and database modules. These programs include accounting systems, communications programs, stand-alone graphics and spelling programs, and printenhancement programs.

As we explore the AppleWorks universe, we'll look at the different products by application area.

ACCOUNTING AND TAXES

This section includes full-featured business accounting systems as well as personal accounting programs and income-tax templates.

10440Works and 1040Works-X

1040Works and 1040Works-X are sets of federal tax forms set up as AppleWorks spreadsheet templates. Each set includes forms 1040, Schedules A, B, C, D, E, F, R, and SE, in addition to forms for employee expenses, child-care deductions, moving expenses, deductible mortgate interest, passive losses, alternative minimum tax, and children's tax computations. Along with the tax forms, you get a taxplanning worksheet; AppleWorks macros you can use with Super MacroWorks and other macro programs; a tutorial; a W-4-form deductions calculator; and a utility for transferring data from Quicken, Dollars & Sense, and AppleWorks spreadsheets into one of the IRS forms. Most forms print in IRS-ac-

ceptable format. These templates come with a basic typewritten manual that explains how to enter data into each template. The difference between 1040Works and 1040Works-X is that 1040Works-X combines two of the largest forms into one spreadsheet file, so you don't have to transfer data from one file to another. The company updates the templates each year to incorporate tax-form changes. (1040Works, \$21.95; 1040Works-X, \$24.95)

Federal Tax Forms

This set of AppleWorks spreadsheet templates from Sky Computer Resources contains files for all the common federal income-tax forms, updated every year to accommodate form changes. Instructions for using each form are contained in an area of the template itself. When you're done, you can print each file in a format that the IRS has rated acceptable. The diskette contains 14 forms, including 1040, schedules A through F and SE, and forms for employee busi-

ness-expense deductions, childcare deductions, moving expenses, and depreciation and amortization. (\$39.95; extra IRS forms, \$5 each)


Tax ZipFiles


This set of tax-calculation templates includes a tax ledger you can use to record deductions, a depreciation calculator, a file for recording capital gains and losses, and a large template that lets you enter and calculate data for federal tax form 1040 and schedules A, C, D, and E. Because all these forms and schedules are in one file, values from the schedules automatically transfer to the 1040 form. Once you've calculated the data, you can transfer it to the actual IRS forms. These templates come with a 50-page spiralbound manual. (\$29.95)


Applied Scientific Accounting **Templates**

These accounting templates are AppleWorks spreadsheet and database files for tracking accounting matters for small businesses with few customers, employees, and suppliers. Individual template dis-






kettes are available for accounts receivable, accounts payable, payroll, financial calculations, investment-portfolio tracking, and personal accounting. The templates are simple and come with on-disk word-processing files containing instructions for their use. (\$29.95 each)

BPI Entry Series

The oldest full-featured accounting system still available for the Apple II, the BPI Entry Series offers separate accounts-receivable, accounts-payable, general-ledger, payroll, and inventory modules that can all work together as an integrated system. You can transfer data from these modules to the AppleWorks spreadsheet module for detailed analysis. As the oldest accounting system for the Apple II, the BPI Entry Series is showing its age. Its pre-AppleWorks interface is not as easy to master for Apple-Works users, and it offers fewer features than BusinessWorks, its major competitor. On the plus side, the Entry Series is familiar to most Apple II dealers, so local support should be good. (\$295 per module)



BusinessWorks

Manzanita's BusinessWorks is a newer full-featured accounting system for the Apple II line. The BusinessWorks series includes general-ledger, payables, receivables, inventory, and payroll modules and requires either a hard-disk drive or two UniDisk 3.5-inch drives. BusinessWorks was designed to be familiar to Apple-Works users—its file-card interface and open-apple command structure are similar to those of Apple-Works, and you can export data to it in either the AppleWorks spreadsheet or database format for further manipulation. BusinessWorks is a well-designed, feature-packed program designed to handle companies with up to \$30 million in annual sales and hundreds of customers, vendors, and employees. (System Manager module [required], \$95; Payroll, \$445; other modules, \$395 each)

General Ledger Template


The General Ledger AppleWorks Template from Sage Productions is an elaborate AppleWorks spread-



sheet file you can use to create and maintain vendor and customer accounts and enter monthly transactions. It comes with a manual that shows how to enter or modify accounts and transactions and how to create balance sheets and income statements. Because this product is a spreadsheet file (and AppleWorks files remain entirely in memory), you are limited by memory availability. On a 128K machine, for example, you can enter only 65 transactions per month. Furthermore, this template lacks the automation of stand-alone programs: You have to manually transfer one month's balances to the next month, and you must create a new template file for each month's activity. (\$89.95)

On Balance

On Balance is a relatively new personal-accounting program from Brøderbund Software. You can write and print checks, maintain and reconcile a check register, and report information about your finances by account or account group. You can also set up budgets for each expense category and then





On Balance is a more robust program than Quicken (see below), because you can track a variety of asset accounts (checking, savings, credit cards) as well as liability accounts, so you know exactly how you paid for each item. It also lets you keep track of creditcard or other loan balances. Finally, if you want to produce a consolidated yearly budget or expense/income statement, you can transfer values from On Balance to the AppleWorks spreadsheet module. On Balance is fairly easy to learn, and it uses many AppleWorks commands. (\$59.95)

Personal Finance ZipFiles

This set of AppleWorks spreadsheet templates comes with calculators for determining contributions to a college savings fund, whether to finance a purchase or pay cash, how much money you can afford to spend on a house, what your net worth is, and how several different income properties would compare as investments. It also includes a budget template. Each template comes with basic instructions in its own spreadsheet file and a complete manual in a file on the reverse side of the disk. These templates are thoughtfully designed and easy to use. (\$24.95)

Quicken

This personal-finance and checkbook-balancing program's key features are speed, a reasonable price, and an intuitive interface. It lets you write and print checks, maintain and balance a checkbook register, and automatically transfer data to an AppleWorks spreadsheet for budgeting. Most of the program commands are the same as those in AppleWorks. The check-writing screen looks just like a paper check,


and as you write each check, you can automatically record it in the check register. To produce income and expense reports or create budgets, you can set up AppleWorks spreadsheets with special labels in certain cells and then use Quicken's Transfer command to transfer data into those cells. This simple process adds a lot of reporting and analytical powers to Quicken. (\$49.95)


AUTOMATING APPLEWORKS

Macro programs automate repetitive operations in AppleWorks and can save you a lot of time. You can store complex sets of keystrokes and manual operations under a macro key and then execute them all with just one keystroke combination. Macros execute at the maximum speed of your Apple's processor, so you can perfom complex tasks much more quickly than by hand.

Key Player

Key Player is a macro program that installs with the Pinpoint Desktop Accessories in version 1.3 or later of AppleWorks. It can also work with other programs such as WordPerfect and AppleWriter. You use Key Player to create and use macros of up to 3000 keystrokes, ei-





ther by typing a string of macro commands in a macro file or by recording keystrokes you've typed. The program stores the macros in a standard AppleWorks word-processing file, so you can always view and edit them easily. Key Player contains a lot of special commands that quickly perform such functions as opening a file, moving the cursor to the beginning or end of a file, displaying a prompting message, and so on. You can nest macros inside each other, so one macro calls another. Key Player comes with a collection of predefined macros, and its manual covers the complete macro-building process. (\$49)

TimeOut UltraMacros

UltraMacros is one of the Time-Out tools from Beagle Bros that pops up inside AppleWorks. It requires AppleWorks version 2.0 or later. Like Key Player, UltraMacros stores macros in standard Apple-Works word-processing files for easy editing and viewing. It offers several powerful commands you can include in macros to perform various AppleWorks operations quickly. Along with global macros, which work in any AppleWorks files, you can define local macros

UltraMacros also includes some useful predefined macros and special commands that perform activities such as changing a character from uppercase to lowercase and blanking out the screen to preserve your monitor when you're not using the computer for a while. (\$59.95)

BUSINESS GRAPHICS

Graphics programs let you create business charts and graphs from AppleWorks spreadsheet data. You can find AppleWorks-compatible programs for a range of graphing needs.

Graphic Edge

Graphic Edge is an extremely capable stand-alone program that can create pie, bar, and line charts from AppleWorks spreadsheet files. You can create eight different types of charts, store up to ten chart definitions with each spreadsheet file, plot ten different sets of data per chart, and have up to 12 spreadsheet files open on the Graphic Edge desktop at a time. Making charts from spreadsheet data is only the beginning with Graphic Edge, however. You can also draw on the screen, using your Apple's cursor keys; creating lines, boxes, and ovals; and using various fill patterns or colors. You can also import graphics from other programs and use them as backgrounds. A text-entry function on the drawing screen lets you quickly create bullet charts or enhance your business graphs with custom titles. (\$89)


TimeOut Graph

TimeOut Graph is a pop-up program you install in the TimeOut environment under AppleWorks version 2.0 or later, so it offers a business-graphing capability available from inside AppleWorks. You can produce seven different chart types, but you can store only one chart definition for each Apple-Works spreadsheet file, and you can work with only one file at a time. You can perform all the basic charting functions: specify titles and data legends, scale your chart, and choose whether to display grid lines on the chart. You can also plot up to eight data sets at a time. Because it works right inside Apple-Works, this program is fast and convenient to use, but it doesn't let you print in color—because Apple-Works doesn't. (\$89.95)

Visualizer

Visualizer comes in two versions: Visualizer for the IIe and IIc, and Visualizer for the IIGS. Visualizer IIe is a minor update of a firstgeneration graphing program for AppleWorks. It's a stand-alone program that works with one spreadsheet file at a time and lets you save only one graph definition with each spreadsheet file. You can select among six graph types, with up to six data ranges in a graph. You add titles by typing them in, and graph scaling can be either automatic or manual. You can also save a graph as a graphic file, so you can edit it with a graphics program. You can print graphs in two different sizes and in color. Visualizer IIe's operation is relatively slow, and its options are quite limited for a stand-alone program in this price range. (\$79.95)

Visualizer IIGS is more powerful. You can save graph files as pictures for further manipulation with a paint program, as with Visualizer IIe, but you can also load back-



ground pictures into graph files to dress up a graph with a logo or design. You can choose from ten graph types and select from a palette of 136 colors for display. The program also produces statistical graphs (mean and standard deviation). In addition to supplying titles and tick marks, you can dress up graphs by inserting arrows at certain points to emphasize values in a chart. You can also resize graphs and move individual graph elements around on the screen. Like Visualizer IIe, though, this program lets you open only one spreadsheet file at a time, and you can store only one graph definition with each spreadsheet file. (\$99.95)


COMMUNICATIONS

Most Apple II communications programs work only with text files, so you have to save AppleWorks files as text before you can transmit them. One communications program can work with AppleWorks files directly, though.

CommWorks

This communications program from PBI Software uses the familiar AppleWorks file-card interface for ease of use and lets you send or receive AppleWorks files in their standard format. With individual files, you can send or receive them in the AppleWorks word-processing format, and you can also transfer complete disks between Comm-Works users, preserving all the formatting and file information on each disk. With CommWorks, you can create individual communications files for different information services or private users. When receiving files, you can capture them either to a RAM buffer (Comm-Works can make use of extended memory cards) or to disk. (\$95)

Making charts from spreadsheet data is only the beginning with Graphic Edge. You can also draw on the screen, using your Apple's cursor keys.




FILE AND DISK UTILITIES

This group of programs performs miscellaneous file-handling chores with AppleWorks files.

FASTData Pro

This is a disk containing a variety of file-searching and -management utilities. You can convert any AppleWorks file to a text file, split a text file into two files, merge two files into one, and search through text or AppleWorks files very quickly. A program-selector utility allows you to quit from one program and load another without going through the normal ProDOS Quit routine. Also, the program includes a free data disk from Fastdata's library of magazine-article disks. Each disk includes content descriptions, page numbers, and issue dates from a year's issues of A + and other computer maga-



zines. The article indexes are invaluable for finding the answer to a specific technical question or locating a review of a particular product. (\$29.95)

TimeOut FileMaster

As one of the TimeOut pop-up utilities that are available from inside AppleWorks version 2.0 or later, TimeOut FileMaster provides most of the functions of the Pro-DOS Filer without forcing you to quit AppleWorks first. Its file operations include listing, copying, comparing, renaming, deleting, locking, and unlocking files. You can also change a file's type, so you can change a text file type to the AppleWorks word-processing file type and then open it with Apple-Works, for example. The disk activities in TimeOut FileMaster let you list all the disks you have on-line, compare the contents of two disks, rename a ProDOS directory, erase a disk's directory (so the disk appears blank), or format a disk (which really erases the disk's contents). (\$49.95)

GENERAL PRODUCTIVITY

Enhancing your basic productivity with AppleWorks means always having a set of useful desk accessories and utility programs available. If you can dial a phone, use a calculator, or consult an appointment book without quitting AppleWorks, then you'll get your work done that much faster.

Desktop Accessory Zipfiles

This collection of AppleWorks spreadsheet files that handle different jobs includes scientific, trigonometric, and factorial calculators; a task list; a calendar; and a

disk-catalog printer. One larger file, called Flash Pad, contains a scientific-notation converter, a telephone and address list, an envelope addresser, and a reminder list, all in one spreadsheet. By using a "map" at the top of the file and pointers in strategic locations, you can find your way through the different areas of the file. This collection of accessories isn't as powerful or convenient to use as programs from Pinpoint or Beagle Bros, but it's also much less expensive. (\$24.95)


Pinpoint Desktop Accessories

As the first successful set of desk accessories for AppleWorks, Pinpoint Desktop Accessories installs inside AppleWorks and puts eight programs at your fingertips: an appointment calendar, a calculator, a basic telecommunications program, a telephone dialer, a graphicmerging utility that lets you put graphics inside AppleWorks wordprocessing documents, a notepad, an envelope-address printer, and a typewriter feature that lets you print as you type. These accessories 'pop up" in front of AppleWorks when you select them from the Pinpoint menu, so they run as separate programs. In addition to using the basic set of accessories, you can add a macro program (see "Automating AppleWorks" in this article) and a spelling checker (see "Writing Aids") to the Pinpoint menu. (\$89)

Programmer's Fingertips

This set of desk accessories will appeal most to programmers, as its name implies. To install Programmer's Fingertips, you must boot it and load it into memory each time you start up your computer. Once it's in memory, you can access the program's menu of options from inside any DOS 3.3 or ProDOS program, including AppleWorks. Programmer's Fingertips offers ten utilities, including a calculator that lets you enter four-function math as well as expressions such as SIN, COS, ATAN, LOG, and square root; a calendar; a screen-dump feature; and a notepad. A disk-utilities option in Fingertips lets you copy disks, set ProDOS prefixes, and transfer files from disk to disk (or from memory to disk or vice versa). The disk options also let you transfer files from DOS to ProDOS or vice versa. The other features are





for programmers only: a mini-assembler; a disk editor that lets you read or write to specific blocks on a disk; a program-line editor; an operating-system monitor; and a set of ASCII, hexadecimal, and other conversion charts. (\$39.95)

TimeOut DeskTools

This collection of desk accessories from Beagle Bros also installs inside your AppleWorks program and makes several utility programs available at any time. Unlike Pinpoint's accessories, it works only

with AppleWorks version 2.0 or later and not with other ProDOS programs. The accessories include a calculator, an appointment calendar, a case converter (it converts word-processing text to uppercase or lowercase), a clock/calendar display, a spreadsheet-to-database (or vice versa) data converter, a telephone dialer, an envelope-address printer, a file encrypter you can use to password-protect files, a notepad, a word-processing page previewer, a puzzle, and a wordprocessing word counter. The TimeOut environment is also open-ended, so you can add the TimeOut spelling program, graph program, font editor, macro program, spreadsheet-printing utility, and file-management program to its menu. (You have to buy them separately—see the descriptions elsewhere in this article.) (\$69.95)

PRINT ENHANCEMENT

Print-enhancement programs let you dress up AppleWorks printouts, either by using different fonts or typestyles or by rearranging data for more efficient printing.

Sideways 2.0

Sideways, a stand-alone spreadsheet-printing program that lets you print spreadsheets sideways on paper, saves you from worrying about how many columns wide your spreadsheet is. Version 2.0 of Sideways works directly with AppleWorks spreadsheet files as well as with other ProDOS files and DOS 3.3 files. The disk contains separate versions of the program for each type of file. The AppleWorks version of Sideways has an interface just like that of the AppleWorks spreadsheet. Before you print, you can specify the paper size, select from six different character fonts in different sizes, and install a header on each printed page. You can also control the size of the margins and the character and line spacing. Sideways works with 16 different types of printers. (\$69.95)

TimeOut SideSpread

TimeOut SideSpread installs in the TimeOut environment under AppleWorks and lets you print spreadsheets sideways without having to quit AppleWorks, which makes it much more convenient than Sideways. Another feature that makes it easier to use is a warning that appears when your spreadsheet contains more rows than you can fit on a page. With Sideways, you have to figure it out for yourself. In short, the TimeOut



Sidespread program is simpler to use and more capable than Sideways and sells for \$20 less. The only disadvantage is that it works only if you install it inside Apple-Works version 2.0 or later. (\$49.95)

TimeOut SuperFonts

SuperFonts, another of the Time-Out accessories for AppleWorks version 2.0 or greater, allows you to customize word-processing documents with various Macintosh-like fonts and typestyles, and it lets you merge graphics into word-processing documents as well. The Super-Fonts disk comes with five fonts, and by inserting style commands into your word-processing text, you can print in bold, italic, shadow, outline, inverse, subscript, and superscript styles. You can mix fonts and styles on the same line of text, and SuperFonts works with most of the AppleWorks word-processing module's printer-option commands and formatting. Using picture commands, you can load hi-res or double-hi-res pictures into word-processing documents, using SuperFonts. This program is easy to use and comes with an excellent manual. (\$79.95)

In an invoice, for example, ReportWorks can use the item number from a sales-order file to look up the price of the item in a spreadsheet file. Along with grabbing data from several AppleWorks files (there's no practical limit to how many files you can extract from to make up one report), you can use spreadsheet-like functions to calculate fields or produce report totals or averages. ReportWorks comes with more than 30 arithmetic and logical functions. This program lets you create complex reporting and data-management applications for invoicing, inventory management, and a variety of other applications. Its only drawback is that it can be slow to compile information and print reports if you're using several AppleWorks files as data sources. (\$49.95)

WRITING AIDS

cludes one to six letters. Categories of letters include collections, congratulations, employee information, sales, stockholder letters, and even a general business contract for services. You simply load a file into AppleWorks and then modify it to suit your needs. With a template, you rely on the author's expertise. These letters show an average (or at times, below average) grasp of business matters and English. They even have occasional spelling and grammatical errors. (\$24.95)

MegaWorks

MegaWorks offers both spelling correction and mail merge in one stand-alone program that works with any version of AppleWorks. The spelling checker uses a 50,000word dictionary, and you can add

up to 10,000 of your own words to it. It displays words in context to let you correct them, but it does not suggest alternative spellings of words. The mail-merge option can merge a form letter containing merge fields with a list of merge data. The merge-data list must be a word-processing file, not a database file, but the manual shows you how to create lists quickly from labels in the database. MegaWorks is slower to check spelling than are some newer programs, and its mail-merging feature isn't as convenient as the one in AppleWorks version 2.0, because you have to use a data list from a word-processing file. Another disadvantage is that the program does not work with hard-disk drives. (\$49.95)

Pinpoint Speller and Pinpoint Document Checker

Pinpoint Speller is a desk-accessory program that integrates into the Pinpoint Desktop Accessories package (see "General Productivity," above). Thus, you can pop the speller up while you're working on an AppleWorks word-processing document, rather than having to


CLARIS INHERITS A

Claris Corporation, the software company spun off from Apple Computer, Inc., now has responsibility for marketing AppleWorks and maintaining its longevity. And what does that mean? Well, for starters, it means the same software at the same price but in new packaging, with vastly improved support behind it. It also means the revival of an upgrade plan that lets you get the latest release (currently version 2.0) of the best-selling Apple II program. And, in the near future, it means a special version of AppleWorks tailored for the AppleTalk network (described in "NewsPlus" in this issue.)

Claris was formed last year to take most of Apple's application-software titles (both for the Apple II and Macintosh) off Apple's corporate hands. Of the many titles Claris is selling, AppleWorks is clearly the cash cow, bringing in more than 50% of the fledgling company's revenues. Yet, of Claris' 118 employees, only 3 comprise the AppleWorks department.

These 3 employees aren't the only ones at Claris with Apple-Works on their mind, though. The dozen or so technical-support people are all schooled in the nuances of AppleWorks as well as of the rest of the programs in Claris' product line. Just the fact that this support line exists (its number is [415] 962-0371) is a heartening show of Claris' goodwill. In previous years, AppleWorks users got zilch in terms of technical assistance from the publisher-Apple referred consumers to their local dealers and thereby washed its hands of the support issue.

You might think that with all those Mac products on their minds,



the technical-help-line people might not be too swift with Apple-Works, so we checked it out. We called twice—once to ask why our version of AppleWorks wouldn't get the date from the IIGS system clock and another time to ask how to get condensed print with the word-processing module—and both times received instantaneous, and correct, answers. Besides useful answers, the support line also provides generous hours-6:00 A.M. to 8 P.M. PST, Monday through Friday-except for a 3–5:30 P.M. break on Friday, when the entire company attends a meeting. Don't worry about whether you're a registered AppleWorks user or not when you call; Claris takes questions from anyone, at least for the time being.

Claris has also picked up where

Apple left off in terms of upgrades. When Apple brought out Apple-Works 2.0, it offered an upgrade to owners of older versions for a limited time only (the offer expired last August). Claris, though, has revived that offer and will now ship you version 2.0 if you send in your program disk and \$75. Claris plans to continually offer upgrades for all its products. To inquire about the AppleWorks upgrade, call (800) 544-8554.

Claris will also carry on the tradition of updating AppleWorks to match the latest in Apple II technology. The latest thing is, of course, the Apple II network, and Claris plans to release a version of AppleWorks modified specifically for it. AppleWorks author Bob Lissner is doing the network modifications for Claris, so in that sense Claris is carrying on in another tradition as well—relying on the original author to bring the product up to date.

All this said, the fact remains that Claris is far and away a Macintosh software company in terms of its dreams and directions. The bulk of the company's resources will go toward the Mac, rather than the Apple II.

Not surprisingly, AppleWorks is certain to be the sole Apple II product in the Claris line. It may not take much to keep the AppleWorks ball rolling, however, as evidenced by the infrastructure surrounding AppleWorks that is the subject of the three-part series that starts with this month's cover story and continues in "AppleWorks Report" in the next two issues. A million or so users (legitimate and otherwise) makes for a lot of momentum.



quit AppleWorks to use it. Pinpoint Speller uses a 61,000-word dictionary, and you can create one or more personal dictionaries, with capacities limited only by disk space. It suggests alternative spellings when it finds a mistake and displays errors in context. It is, however, about the slowest Apple-Works spelling checker on the market for checking whole documents. (\$69)

Pinpoint Document Checker is a stand-alone program that checks files much more quickly than does Pinpoint Speller; it's one of the fastest programs on the market. The program checks complete files or paragraphs, and it can check spreadsheet or database files as well. Pinpoint Document Checker uses the same main dictionary as Pinpoint Speller and can also use the same personal dictionaries. One unique feature in Document Checker is its ability to check up to 16 individual files in a batch, one after the other. (\$69)

Sensible Grammar

Sensible Grammar is a grammarand style-checking program that can read word-processing files

Sensible Speller's lookup feature lets you search through any available dictionary by typing in a string to match

from any version of AppleWorks as well as other programs. Using a file of about 2000 often misused English phrases, Sensible Grammar checks a file for wordy, pompous, vague, sexist, and other problem usages. Sensible Grammar also suggests alternative usages. Along with usage, Sensible Grammar finds punctuation errors, double words, and misused word groups such as "every thing" or "can not" and suggests corrections. You can correct all flagged errors in context. (\$99.95)

Sensible Speller

This stand-alone spelling program can check files from Apple-Works and a variety of word-processing programs. It uses an 80,000-word dictionary taken from the Random House Dictionary. You can set up your own custom dictionary, and Sensible Software also sells auxiliary medical, legal, and technical dictionaries. Sensible Speller counts the words in a document, lists the suspect words, and then displays the suspect words in context and lets you correct them. Its unique lookup feature lets you search through any available dictionary by typing in a string to match. You can do wild-card searches to locate, for example, all the five-letter words that start with W and end with R. Sensible Speller is the most expensive spelling program for the Apple II series, but its large dictionary, extra dictionary options, and lookup feature go beyond what other programs offer. (\$125)


Perfecting WordPerfect

've always listened with envy as my IBM-using friends described the wonders of Word-Perfect, the Cadillac of wordprocessing programs in the MS-DOS world. So, when WordPerfect became available for the Apple IIe and IIc, I decided to give it a try. Even without the split screen, the thesaurus, and a few of the other IBM-version goodies, the program is positively packed with luxurious features. From automatic footnoting to complex macro chaining, from mail merge to seemingly endless formatting options, WordPerfect has it all.

I learned one other thing, though. Cadillacs are built for comfort, not speed. WordPerfect is slow—so torturously slow that sometimes I've abandoned the Caddy by the roadside and gone back to my trusty Toyota (in my case AppleWorks). Unless you really need WordPerfect's lavish features, there's much to be said for a word-processing program that does the basics, does them well, and does them quickly. But if you need or want the first-class ride, there are, I've discovered, ways (in both hardware and software) to minimize the program's sluggishness while getting the most out of its rich options.

Shopping for Speed

If you've been considering adding hardware enhancements to your system, this may be your excuse. WordPerfect is a deluxe pro-



gram, and using it to its full potential takes some fairly deluxe equipment. Technically, you can run it on any Apple IIc or 80-column, 128K IIe with a single disk drive—but technically you can scrub your floor with a toothbrush. Two drives are, in a considerable understatement, "recommended." Of the six diskettes that make up the WordPerfect package, you typically use at least two or three, in addition to your own data disk.

With a single drive, simple operations such as saving or printing require tiresome multiple disk swaps, generally accompanied by the muttering of highly colorful language.

Even if you soup up your system with a second disk drive, some functions that should be instantaneous (such as defining and copying a block of text) take several long moments while both drives are accessed. A better (and comparably priced) solution is to invest in a memory-expansion card. With memory expanded to 640K by, say, Applied Engineering's Z-RAM Ultra (IIc) or RamWorks (IIe) or by Checkmate Technology's MultiRam, you can load the entire WordPerfect program, including speller and utility disks, into RAM and run it from there. This approach eliminates disk-access time and leaves the drive free for your data disk.

ordPerfect suffers from other, even more frustrating, sources of delay. The program is egregiously poky in executing and exiting from many functions—even in moving the cursor from one part of a document to another. (The IBM version doesn't have this problem; presumably it cropped up during


The Speed Problem

o test speed differences, I ran the accompanying article ("Perfecting WordPerfect") on three versions of WordPerfect and four different hardware set-ups. I tested IIGS versions 1.1 and 2.0 on a IIGS with the program in a 3.5-inch drive and data in a 51/4-inch drive, and I tested the IIe/IIc version in three ways: on a IIGS with two 51/4-inch drives, on a IIe with two 51/4-inch drives. and on a single-drive IIc enhanced with a 512K Z-RAM Ultra 1. (This latter configuration shows the benefits of reduced disk access.) As you can see, the GS version 2.0 offers the best performance.

The first two tests measured how long the cursor took to jump from top of the file to the bottom (closedapple/N) and from bottom to top (closed-apple/U). The Search test started with the cursor on the word Caddy (second paragraph) and measured the time for closed-apple/> to find the next occurrence (last paragraph). The Rewrite test involved inserting six words into a paragraph, pressing closed-apple 1, and waiting for the text to rejustify. For the Spell-Check test, I scanned one error-free page of the threepage article, immediately pressing 2 (Skip) for every suspect word. Spell-checking figures may not be entirely reliable, since they involve human reaction time, but they give a rough idea.

Just as a point of comparison, AppleWorks beats WordPerfect hands-down when it comes to jumping from the top to the bottom of a word-processing file or vice versa. Such a feat—on even a much larger file—would take Apple-Works a split second. Searching in AppleWorks is similarly speedy, but I was unable to compare the rewriting of paragraphs, because AppleWorks does that automatically. Also, AppleWorks doesn't have a built-in speller, so I can't compare those either.

translation from MS-DOS.) If you have used another word-processing program that zips instantly up or down a screen (or forward or backward several pages), you'll probably be fed up with drumming your fingers and reading WordPerfect's Please wait message. Even on a document of just a few pages, the delay can be more than 15 seconds just to make the cursor jump or to do a search (see "The Speed Problem").

If you're an Apple IIe owner, you can hurry things up somewhat by adding an accelerator card, but it won't help much unless you've extended your memory enough to run everything from RAM. The truly deluxe solution is to move up to an Apple IIGS, with its fast, 16bit-per-second processing speed. Another advantage is that you can look at a white-on-soft-blue display rather than green or white on black—much easier on the eyes if you do lots of writing. Of course, then you'll want the new WordPerfect that is designed specifically for the Apple IIGS, right? Well, maybe (see "The GS Version: How Good Is Better?" which accompanies this article).

Short of treating yourself to these hardware enhancements, here are some tips for operating more quickly inside WordPerfect documents. (All commands I cite here are for the IIe/c version; although some of these techniques also apply to the GS version, GS commands are different.)

Search High and Low

Whenever possible, avoid scrolling or jumping from screen to screen while looking for a passage you want to read or modify. Instead, think of a key word in the passage and use WordPerfect's highly convenient search function (which can go either forward or backward from any point in the text) to take you there in one step. Using solid-apple/> to begin the search is also a little faster than open-apple/2 1.

Get Me Rewrite

Press the Rewrite key (solid-apple/1) early and often. Because WordPerfect does not instantly rejustify text when you insert or delete words, you can find yourself stepping over holes or wandering through temporarily duplicated text. Eventually, as the cursor moves through the affected lines, they'll fix themselves, but you can save time and confusion by fixing them right away with Rewrite.

Often, though, especially in the middle of a long paragraph, Rewrite can take as long as ten seconds to tidy up the text up to the next hard carriage return. In such a situation, it's faster just to zip the cursor through three or four lines with the down-arrow key and then go back up again.

Block That Text

passage is very long, you can take it out more quickly just by holding down solid-apple/Delete. But be careful! This one can accelerate on you and wipe out more words than you intended. For a longer passage, the fastest way is usually to make sure there's a hard return at either end; then use Move (open-apple/ 9), Paragraph (2), Cut (1). Note that the cursor can be anywhere in the paragraph.

Overwrite and Forget

When first booting WordPerfect and before creating or retrieving a file, you may get this message: Warning: Overflow files already exist!, followed by the choice of using another directory or overwriting the (supposedly) existing files. Don't waste time wondering what these overflow files are, where they came from, or what consequences will result from overwriting them. This situation (not adequately explained in the documentation) is usually the result of not exiting by the prescribed method (open-apple/+) the last time you used the program. Just select 2 (Overwrite) and forget about it. Another timewaster is trying to figure out what Home (solid-apple/Return) is supposed to do and why it won't do it. This Zen command accomplishes exactly nothing.

Spellbound

The Speller is one of WordPerfect's most convenient features, allowing you to check a single word, page, or entire file against a 50,000word dictionary (115,000 in the

IIGS version) without leaving your document. You can make it even more useful and efficient.

When the Speller stops on a suspect word, nine times out of ten you'll wind up choosing either 2 (Skip) or A (the first suggested respelling). Note that you don't have to wait for the Speller to display all your choices. As soon as you realize the word is OK (perhaps a name or some other word not in the Speller's vocabulary), you can press 2 and cruise right on to the next word. If you think your spelling may be wrong, wait for the display of suggested respellings to begin. If the first choice is correct—and it usually is-you can type A immediately, and the Speller will move along without delaying to display other choices. By keeping two fingers poised over the 2 and the A keys (ready to strike-pretend you're playing an arcade game!), you can speed up the process.

Still, spell-checking takes time, time you could spend proofreading for other kinds of errors. In fact, while you're gazing at the screen, waiting for the Speller to pounce on its next victim, you'll probably notice mistakes you want to fix or additions you want to make.

Problem: How do you get out of the spelling function, make your revision, and then get back in where you left off? Solution: As soon as the Speller stops on any word, select 4 (Edit), which allows you not only to respell the current word but also to move the cursor as far to the right or left as you like, where you can make the desired change. When you're done, press Return, and spell-checking continues. This technique does have one limitation: You can move the cursor only one character at a timeno express moving, as with solidapple/arrow, solid-apple/G (Go to), or solid-apple/> (Search).

An unsung bonus of the Speller's wild-card feature is its ability to help you think of words that are on the tip of your tongue. Suppose, for example, you're writing a letter to your old professor Dr. Fafuffnik, and you've forgotten what subject you studied with him. All you remember is that it ends with ology. Just press solid-apple/+ to display the Extra menu and then 3 (Speller) and 5 (Look Up). When you're prompted to type the word pattern,

The IIGS Version:

WordPerfect for the IIe and IIc (let's call it WP-e/c) is the new release 2.0 version for the IIGS? Much better. Is it better enough to run out and buy, learn, and use it? That depends.

Last year, WordPerfect Corporation's release of WordPerfect for the Apple IIGS, version 1.1, raised great expectations. Surely the company would seize the opportunity to overcome the faults of WP-e/c and provide a new program worthy of this racy new machine. What came instead was a disappointment.

True, WP-GS 1.1 conveniently reduced the package of cix 5¼-inch floppy disks to two 3.5-inch disks, and it used the GS's graphics capabilities to represent boldfacing and underlining realistically. (WP-e/c uses reverse video.) Cursor control was simplified through IBM-style use of the numeric keypad, and the spelling checker's larger dictionary (115,000 words vs. 50,000) was more serviceable.

Same Old Program?

Otherwise, though, it was the same old program, one that failed to take advantage of the GS's capabilities. The fundamental problem, speed, had still not been addressed. Although the IIGS runs WordPerfect somewhat faster than the IIe or IIc does, it runs WP-e/c 1.1 and WP-GS 1.1 at almost identically lackadaisical speeds. (See "The Speed Problem," which accompanies this article.)

Version 2.0 is, up to a point, a different story. Its execution time for many commands is still pretty slow, but it is the fastest version yet. Moreover, the program has a whole new look and feel—a true GS environment, with windows, bars, pull-down menus, and dialog boxes. You can do virtually everything with the mouse, except entering text—that makes all the difference.

Because it does so much—because it offers so many options—WordPerfect has a complex structure, which means that doing even simple things can be complicated. The point-and-click approach at least makes one level of WordPerfect's structure simple. There are still more choices than most of us

will need most of the time, but with the mouse you can cruise quickly and easily through them. Simple Is Better

The mouse interface also means the elimination of complicated series of keyboard commands and, along with them, of the little cardboard template that sat over the top of the keyboard in the earlier versions. (What seemed at first like a neat new toy proved to be a nuisance. I never had it when I was working away from home, and it wound up on the floor whenever my finger brushed against it.) Browsing through the manuals of the old versions could induce a severe case of I'll-never-learn-allthis-stuff blues. With the new manual, you often wonder why they bothered printing it. Almost all you need to know is: Click the mouse.

For example, suppose you want to switch from six lines per inch to eight. With WP-e/c or WP-GS 1.1, you have to press solid-apple/3 for Print Format, press 2 for the linesper-inch feature, enter 8 for the

number of lines per inch, and press Return to exit from the Print Format menu. With mouse-driven WP-GS 2.0, you merely pull down the Print menu and click on 8 Lines Per Inch.

The keyboard equivalents of mouse commands have some alphabetic logic to them, for the first time: open-apple/H for Header, open-apple/S for Speller, open-apple/M for Margins, open-apple/T for Thesaurus, and so on.

The 10,000-headword thesaurus is a new feature, as is the capability to generate end notes (in addition


to improvements to the already excellent footnote feature). As with the earlier versions, 2.0 offers such spoil-yourself conveniences as vertical centering, column centering, hard and soft hyphens, right justification, an outstanding file-management system, and a bindingwidth adjustment (it shifts text to the right on odd-numbered pages and to the left on even-numbered pages to make room for holes on two-sided copies—clever, eh?). The program automatically takes advantage of any extra memory you have in your GS, and the windows facilitate working with multiple documents. The Clean Screen feature, which removes everything but your text and a status line indicating document number and cursor position, is handy for straightahead typing. This is the best of both worlds: the advantages of the GS environment without all those bars and window borders to distract you from your dissertation or sonnet.

Slouching Toward Desirability

What makes a word-processing program desirable? In the formula $D = T \times U/M$, D is Desirability, T is the number of Tasks the program performs, U is the average Usefulness of each task, and M is the amount of Misery the writer must endure to learn and use the program. With WP-GS 2.0, WordPerfect is, more than ever, the handsdown champ in the Tasks division. Usefulness, though, is a highly individual consideration. Most of us can live quite happily, thank you, without nine different footnotestyle options, but if you use several of WordPerfect's special features occasionally, or a few of them frequently, U goes way up.

The big question is M. Slow response time still keeps the Misery factor high. So does the annoying way the screen display responds to insertions and deletions (holes in text, duplicated text, and text marching off the right margin) until you reformat with the Rewrite command. Fast typists are now less likely to find themselves waiting for the program to catch up with them (infuriating! unforgivable!), but other imperfections persistthe hyphenation feature, for example, still fails to recognize many words that should break.

WP-GS 2.0's intelligently applied mouse-and-menus approach gives WordPerfect such ease of use that, for the first time, Misery may fall within acceptable limits, however. For a graduate student who does extensive footnoting or for a businessperson who creates a lot of highly formatted documents, the

mands and moving around within a file may not matter much to secretaries who type manuscripts mainly from start to finish or to users who usually work straight through a first draft before going back to edit. As a professional writer who likes to jump around, composing and revising (an obsolete distinction) in several places at once, I still find that AppleWorks, enhanced by Super MacroWorks, most comfortably meets most of my needs and fulfills the ultimate purpose of a wordprocessing program: helping me to forget about word processing so I can write.

WordPerfect Corporation certainly has the right attitude. Its superb customer support, via a tollfree number, is unrivaled, and it keeps churning out new and better products. enter =ology. The Speller will display every word that ends in ology, preceded by zero or more letters. In this case, you get 46 words.

This method is also handy if you're studying English or linguistics: You can use =fect=, for instance, to find every word containing the root fect. (Poets can use the technique to find rhymes!) If you want a word with a specific number of letters (say for a crossword puzzle), use a dash instead of an equal sign. S---ter gives you snorter, shyster, and 19 others.

More Perfect

The richness of this program lends itself to countless applications and innovations. But the next big step in perfecting WordPerfect must come from WordPerfect Corporation. The company has made exciting improvements in its IIGS version, and its upgrade policy is commendably liberal. What we need now is something worth upgrading to. Users who have put their faith in WordPerfect's top-ofthe-line reputation deserve a version that moves at an acceptable speed. In the meantime, we'll keep finding ways to run the Caddy faster and cooler-but not in the left lane, please.



EDUCATION BY LESLIE EISER

A look at several simulation programs for the Apple II that can help instructors bring history alive in their classrooms.

Would you like to have your students experience life on the Oregon Trail, participate in the Constitutional Convention, interview Christopher Columbus, or debate how to prevent a revolutionary war? Well, roll a computer into your classroom and start looking at what the newest crop of history software has to offer.

Organizing sufficient material to keep an entire class on a topic for even one period, much less for several weeks, is almost impossible. It is worth doing, though, because it gives students the opportunity to experience history from a personal perspective, to discover for themselves how difficult some decisions are to make, even when they start off knowing the "right" answers. Wouldn't it be wonderful to obtain these benefits with less groundwork? All the programs I discuss here can help you do exactly that. They provide the materials you need to run excellent simulations, and, although they do require some preparation, they make it easy to give your students an opportunity to participate in making history happen.

Teaching Early American





ADVENTURE GAMES

Adventure games provide a universe of rules, people, and places to discover. In historically based adventure games, you choose a period, cast students in appropriate roles, and challenge them to accomplish a specific task. Their goal might be to lead the French in racing the English to the New World (Quest for Canada), survive a trip through the American wilderness (The Oregon Trail), or discover gold in California (The 49ers). Guided by directional commands (N, S, E, or W), characters are free

to move around and "experience" life. In many adventure games, the rules are not clearly stated, and part of the realistic flavor is in the challenge of determining the rules while gaining familiarity with the terrain.

Entrex Games

Four historical adventure games that have a great deal in common are Quest for Canada (Scholastic-Tab), Pacific Nor'Westers (Scholastic-Tab), Race for the West (Hartley), and The 49ers (Hartley). Even though they are available from two different publishers, all four pro-

grams were written by Entrex Software, a Canadian company that specializes in simulations. The layout and interfaces are quite similar—the major differences are in content rather than style.

All four programs divide the computer screen into three sections. The bottom left is reserved for terrain graphics and the method of transportation: canoes, sailing ships, keel boats—even oxendrawn wagons emblazoned with the word GOLD. At the top of the screen is a map of the route already traveled, showing only explored




territory. This area is completely black at the beginning, and only as the characters explore the environment does their knowledge of the territory grow. On the right of the screen is the command list, which you use by pressing arrow keys to highlight various options and then pressing Return to select a specific choice. Movement commands such as Drive, Walk, Portage, and Paddle are available, as are direction options such as North, South, Downstream, and Southeast.

You can interrupt travel to hunt for food, trade with other travelers, scout out territory, build forts or camps, or consult detailed maps of the entire territory as it is known today. A bird's-eye view of a river can help a navigator avoid wrong forks or spot an upcoming fort. Although hardly historically accurate, this kind of information encourages students to learn how to read maps and helps them avoid frustration in reaching the real goal, education. On-line reference

material is in the form of short essays on various topics and a nice glossary of unusual words.

To be sure that students don't forget to consult these materials, multiple-choice questions periodically interrupt travel. After consulting the subject-based reference works and glossary of words, students must answer the questions correctly to continue moving.

Extensive teacher controls make these excellent simulations even more attractive. You get options for changing the level of play to make it more challenging and for changing the text of the multiple-choice questions (you can rewrite the ones that come with the program or develop your own) or using the simulation without them. If an adventure-game simulation sounds right for your classroom, these are superb. Be aware, though, that the four programs bear a close resemblance to each other. Use only the one that best fits your classroom situation.

Mindscape Games


Revolution and Constitution, and Exploration and Discovery, both from Mindscape, are a different type of adventure-game simulation. The general idea is the same—explore an environment using directional commands—but these programs are for younger students and thus severely limit the size of the universe they are to






explore. Each package contains seven different "environments," each of which comprises a network of five to nine linked locations. Thus, teachers can strictly control the amount of exploration time and keep it well within a 45-minute class limit. By looking, listening, and asking questions at each location, students can identify the characterized event. For an exploration to be successful, students must correctly identify events, after which a multiple-choice system asks them to indicate how they unearthed their information. Simplified teacher controls include a management system as well as level adjustment.

The Oregon Trail

In an impressive update of The Oregon Trail by MECC, excellent graphics (some of the best in all the history simulations I reviewed for this article) make the visuals appealing and interesting. Every rest stop on the trail offers an opportunity to talk with local people and pick up advice from more-seasoned travelers. Trading, a common practice, is always under player control. Each landmark you pass has a de-

tailed graphic, but looking at it is an option—nice when you play for the second or third time. Variables under user control include the amount of food consumed (you can choose from three different levels of food consumption), pace, and amount of rest.

The hunting routines are fairly standard amusement routines but have one particularly nice touch. Although you can, with practice, get good enough to shoot lots of animals, only 100 pounds of meat can be carried back to the camp. This proviso helps discourage students from wanton slaughter and parallels historical fact.

Forts provide breaks in the trail,

and, as leader of your family, you can decide whether to follow the more popular routes or try an alternative path. This program has no question-and-answer component, but it's fun to use-an effective way of getting students to appreciate how hard travel must have been in the days before Howard Johnsons and McDonalds!

ROLE-PLAYING

All adventure games require role playing, but some role-playing games are not adventure games. Creating the U.S. Constitution and Washington's Decisions by Educational Activities, Settling America from World Book, Interviews with History from Educational Publishing Concepts, and Indian Wars by Hartley are all good examples of this type of simulation.

In all five programs, students pretend that they are specific characters, but the total freedom of the adventure-game format is missing, replaced by greater structure. In Interviews with History, for example, each student is a reporter interviewing a well-known historical figure. By asking skillful questions and reading the answers carefully,





students can fill in a fact sheet about their subject, eventually writing a "report." What makes this program extraordinary is the amount of information available for discovery. Three different interviews with the same character may yield completely different perspectives, depending on the questions.

In Creating the U.S. Constitution, students have a choice of characters to portray and are graded on their ability to behave consistently. As the characters participate in the Constitutional Convention, the students are exposed to opposing points of view and can decide how their character would have voted. Regardless of the students' decisions, the program doesn't change history.

The idea of allowing students freedom of choice while not letting them affect history is most clearly evident in Washington's Decisions. This easy-to-use and fascinating simulation consists of a series of situations describing key points in Washington's life. The program asks students what they would do, and, after they enter their choice,

gives the historically accurate answer, along with a brief discussion of the ramifications of Washington's actual decision. Despite the predictable outcome, young testers found this program worth delving into several times, just for the unusual insight it gave into that great man's life.

Settling America is yet another variation on the role-playing theme but one that gives users more freedom than does either Creating the U.S. Constitution or Washington's Decisions-still without allowing history to be affected, however. Students get a taste of pioneering in the Ohio Valley by helping a family of four try to

build a new life. Deciding how to charge for the use of a gristmill, what to plant, how to cure snakebite, and even whom to call for help during childbirth, students constantly face decisions that affect the health, happiness, financial status, and popularity of the adopted family. A wide variety of outcomes is possible, but the family always survives, making this program a good choice if your students have a low frustration threshold.

Indian Wars, from Hartley Courseware, differs from all the others because it is a war-game simulation. Half the class is cast as the leader of the Indians, and the other half becomes the leader of the U.S. Army. Despite the clearly stated goals (the Army is to wipe out the Indians; the Indians just want to survive), this program is not a simple, easy-to-use simulation. Luck never enters into the picture; strategy and skill are allimportant if the Indians want to defeat the Army. Although you can "change history" with this program, most students discover that the Indians never really stood a



chance. This program provides a huge on-line reference library and ensures that students consult it by making them answer questions, correctly of course, before moving armies or fighting battles. This program is not for casual use, but it is perfect if you really want your students to explore this tragic chapter in our history.

DATABASES

One popular way to liven up a history class has always been with large-scale simulations. Everyone in the class gets a role, and consen-

sus discussions achieve specific goals. Unfortunately, this type of teaching requires huge amounts of preparation time—each student's role has to be sufficiently detailed to permit the student to operate effectively. The teacher also has to moderate the discussion and be prepared with new information as necessary. Is it any surprise that few teachers actually manage to pull off a simulation every year?

The Decisions, Decisions Series

Two publishers have come up with high-tech solutions to these problems. The Decisions, Decisions series by Tom Snyder offers two simulations that are appropriate to current American history: Revolutionary Wars and Colonization. The Decisions, Decisions series is specifically for one-computer classrooms. Every student gets a booklet containing a synopsis of the situation and almost 50 different commentaries listed by keyword.

In Revolutionary Wars, a group of dissidents wants to have control over its own trade and taxes and is becoming increasingly dissatisfied with the central government. In Colonization, a company wants funding to establish a colony on the moon and approaches the government to arrange a deal.

Students, as a group, play the role of the head of government in each of these simulations and must start by specifying the relative importance of their goals. Once they have done so, the program presents them with a choice of actions, plus four keywords (help from four different advisers). The teacher has

the students read the advice from the booklets and then coordinates discussion until they have reached a decision. When they've selected an action, the computer determines a reaction, and the whole procedure repeats. After four or five such cycles (encompassing a class period or even several days), the computer holds an election and





then rates the head of state on popularity and success at meeting the goals the students selected at the beginning of the simulation.

The exciting aspect of these programs is clearly the improved opportunity for discussion and reading. With the Apple computer coordinating the materials and monitoring results, teachers are free to run the simulation. One caution: Revolutionary Wars and Colonization are not game-like programs—they aren't fun to play by yourself. These programs are powerful classroom tools that can turn an ordinary presentation into a heated debate.

The U.S. Constitution Then and Now (consisting of AppleWorks database files) and the U.S. Government Data Base (which works with pfs:File) provide all the materials you need to run super simulations of the Constitutional Convention right in your own classroom. Students are assigned a specific role and are asked to become familiar enough with their character to present their point of view in the classroom discussion. Both packages furnish excellent resource materials and provide fascinating insights into the political process.

When students participate in a simulation of the Constitutional Convention without necessarily voting exactly as their character did, they can rewrite the history books. This approach runs the risk of having students remember fictional results rather than the historically correct ones, but it also gives them a sense of control over their own learning—and a real understanding of how history happens. When we give our students a chance to participate actively in their own learning in this way, we also encourage them to better appreciate not only the past but also the present.

An İmmigrant Experience

Immigrant, the Irish Experience, is an AppleWorks database that provides the materials for a close look at the difficulties of surviving and building a good life in Boston in the 1840s and 50s. For it to work well, a lot of teacher involvement is necessary, but the results can be rewarding. I found this package captivating, but when I tried it with young people, they found it a

little too unstructured. To use it effectively, plan on spending lots of time helping your students make meaningful decisions and encouraging them to write creatively about what they imagine their "family" was like.

WORTH THE EFFORT?

Is using simulations in your classroom worth the effort? Is getting students excited about history important to you? Have you considered simulations but been discouraged by the amount of work required? If you answer yes to any of these questions, take a look at these programs. They offer accurate historical information and interesting activities, and they radiate the joy of learning that we'd all like our students to catch!

A "shareware" keyboard-macro program for the lies

DIVERSI-KEY

f anyone deserves the title The Wizard of DOS, it's Bill Basham. Many successful commercial programs use his highspeed Diversi-DOS, and his Diversi-Dial is a unique communications package (see A+, May 1987). Dr. Basham has now turned his considerable talents toward the IIGS and produced Diversi-Copy, Diversi-Cache, and Diversi-Key.

Diversi-Key is a keyboard-macro utility for the Apple IIGS. It is specially configured to enhance AppleWorks Version 2.0, but you can use it with earlier versions of AppleWorks and with many other ProDOS, Pascal 1.3, and DOS 3.3 applications. Its ability to work with applications other than AppleWorks distinguishes it from macro programs such as Beagle Bros' MacroWorks and AutoWorks. Pinpoint's Key Player works with other applications, too, but only after a special installation step.

Diversi-Key is published as "shareware" on an unprotected 5¼-inch disk—you can print out 26 pages of documentation by selecting a menu option.

A keyboard macro is a sequence of keystrokes that you trigger by pressing a simple combination of keys. Diversi-Key uses the Option (or solid-apple) key, since Apple-Works doesn't use it for any other purpose. Macros can be tremendous labor savers. For example, you can define a macro that types Very truly yours, skips three lines, and then types your name and title. It makes 1 keystroke combination do the work of about 35.

Since the keyboard has only 96

keys (the program does not distinguish between uppercase and lowercase letters), you might expect an upper limit of 96 keyboard macros. Diversi-Key breaks through this barrier, however, by letting you define "numeric macros" from 1 to 9999. To use a numeric macro, you hold down the Option key and type the number on the numeric keypad (not the row of numbers above the letter keys). The macro is triggered when you press the keypad's Enter key or let up on the Option key.

If you use a IIe upgraded with the new IIGS motherboard, you don't have the numeric keypad. You can still use Diversi-Key numeric macros, by holding both apple keys down simultaneously and then typing the appropriate digits. The program offers a similar fix for owners of Pinpoint, AutoWorks, or MacroWorks (which also use the Option key as a trigger), so that the two products will not conflict with each other.

One of the hardest things about using keyboard macros is remembering what combinations produce what results. Diversi-Key provides a variety of ways to display your current macro definitions, by turning them into a word-processing file, which can include comments. You can save the current macro file to disk by entering a special macro from the BASIC prompt. Macros in Diversi-Key have no length limit, as long as you have enough memory and disk space.

Especially for Programmers

Advanced features for programmers include pausing in the middle of a macro for keyboard input, displaying a message during the execution of a macro, conditional branching (IF/WHILE/TEST), and calling macros from a machine-language program. You can also create up to ten macros that are triggered by mouse movements.

The program disk also includes Diversi-Hack, a programmer's utility that is installed as a desk accessory. It lets you interrupt any program, enter the IIGS monitor, print the text screen or send control characters directly to the printer, and then continue from where you left off.

Diversi-Key is not as elegantly packaged or documented as the competing products from Pinpoint and Beagle Bros, but it is elegantly programmed and reasonably priced. The documentation could be improved with more examples of typical applications. The user interface is a bit austere, but it does the job. You need some knowledge of DOS and BASIC to use Diversi-Key and to get the most out of it. •

Use your modem to access a wealth of resources.

ppleWorks is not likely to bring the subject of telecommunications to mind immediately, particularly since its three modules don't include communications capability. You can actually find many connections between these two subjects, however.

You can find a lot of support for AppleWorks users once you go

searching for it with cal bulletin boards offer help files and answers to questions, not to public-domention main programs and templates that enhance the program's utility.

CompuServe

The Micronetworked Apple Users Group (MAUG) Apple II Forum on the Compu-Serve Information Service has an area on its bulletin board devoted to AppleWorks and its sister Apple III program 3EZ Pieces (Topic 11). The two unofficial leaders of this board are Dave Gair (CIS Number 71260,2752) and Rick Oshlo (CIS Number 72247,1577). Gair and Oshlo don't operate the board but do tend to appear quite of-

The last year has seen a great increase in AppleWorks traffic on MAUG. On any particular day you are likely to find a sixth to a quarter of the messages on MAUG related to AppleWorks. The AppleWorks library (DL 11) has more than 125 files, including reviews of Apple-Works add-on products, macro

files, "how to" articles, templates, and patches to apply to Apple-Works to allow such things as more than one custom printer. The library is strong in such matters as patches, reviews, and macros but is fairly sparse in templates, although it does have a 1987 Federal Income Tax template.

An unusual AppleWorks application in the MAUG library is MBE

GEnie and Other Services The American Apple Roundtable

(AART) on GEnie (General Electric Network for Information Exchange) has one category on the bulletin board for AppleWorks (#16) and two different libraries, one for templates and one for accessories. There are more than 100 files in the templates library, more than 10 in the accessories library,

and more than 15 in other AART libraries.


The AART messageboard area has more than 30 different topics, with more than 700 messages. The subjects include printing with AppleWorks, tips and techniques, templates, accessories, macros, and "power usage." The area was formerly led, on a volunteer basis, by Oliver (Oli) Roosevelt, but he has recently left that position to officially host an AppleWorks forum on a new national network that will debut in May. Word has it that the National AppleWorks User's Group will also be involved in that forum.

The AART Apple-Works group has hosted periodic on-line chats to discuss various AppleWorks related is-

sues. As of this writing, new management has just taken over AART, and the plans for a continuation of these chats are unknown.

The recently revived AppleSIG on The Source has one topic on the Post Plus bulletin board devoted to AppleWorks, with more than 50 messages on more than 20 subjects. The subjects include printing, tem-

plates, and auxiliary programs such as spelling checkers.

The library on The Source has almost 40 AppleWorks files with nearly 25 templates, 5 programs, 3 patches, and 5 how-to articles. Some of these files—such as the 12 that each contain an entire disk of templates from The AppleWorks Users Group (TAWUG)—are quite extensive.

The Apple Group of the Delphi service has an AppleWorks area on its bulletin board, as well as a library database for AppleWorks. The traffic in these areas is fairly slow, with about six items in the library database.

Local Bulletin Boards

In addition to the national online services, several bulletin boards scattered throughout the country provide substantial coverage of AppleWorks. Unlike the national networks, these boards cannot normally be accessed by a local call from anywhere in the country, but, other than the long-distance charges, you won't incur a fee for their use. Several of the boards can be reached through PC Pursuit, which I discussed in my August 1987 telecommunications column. The list of areas that you can reach through PC Pursuit is rapidly changing. If you use PC Pursuit, you should check to make sure you can access these boards through that service.

The most significant Apple-Works bulletin board is that run by the National AppleWorks Users Group (NAUG) in Michigan. The board is cosponsored by the Ypsilanti Public School System, which supplies the hardware on which the board runs.

You don't need to be a member of NAUG to use the board, although membership information is available on-line. Among the benefits of NAUG membership is access to the volunteer list of experts whom you can reach either by voice telephone or on various local bulletin boards nationwide.

The NAUG board, which contains more than 200 messages, has several message boards related to AppleWorks generally, AppleWorks applications, and AppleWorks add-on programs. You can also download files from the board in such areas as databases, spread-

sheet templates, and product reviews. Templates from TAWUG are available here.

The sysop (system operator) of the NAUG Board is Richard Lewandowksi. The NAUG President, Warren Williams, is also active on the board. You can reach the NAUG board 24 hours a day at (313) 482-8090; if you want to speak to someone, call (313) 397-1594. You can also get a list of board commands by sending a self-addressed, stamped envelope to NAUG, P.O. Box 87453, Canton, MI 48187.

Lissner's Board

A very technical bulletin board for AppleWorks is run by Bob Lissner, the author of AppleWorks. The main attraction of this board—indeed its only feature other than electronic mail—is a 20-file section called "Literature," which is the most complete documentation of the internal workings of AppleWorks that is publicly available. The section contains large portions of the source code for AppleWorks version 2.0, including file formats, printer code, and hooks for tying AppleWorks accessory programs

•ProBeagle ([619] 452-5565], an official support bulletin board of Beagle Bros Software, developer of the Timeout series of AppleWorks-enhancement programs. A rumor on this board is that Beagle Bros is planning a telecommunications program that will work from within AppleWorks. The board con-

tains areas for discussing Beagle Bros programs, including each member of the Timeout series.


•ProColony ([214] 370-7056), a board run by Dale Therio, an employee of Applied Engineering. Applied Engineering makes memory-expansion boards for the Apple II family of computers; the boards come with software that overcomes many of the limitations of AppleWorks.

•ProSol ([619] 281-7222), a board run by Morgan Davis, author of the Proline BBS software, which Pro-Beagle and ProColony, among others, also use. This board averages 70 calls per day and has an Apple-Works conference with more than 100 messages. Overcoming doubts about technology in the classroom

ast December I attended the annual meeting of the California Mathematics Council in Pacific Grove, California. The evening's special event was a debate on the use of calculators in mathematics education. Because the state of California has endorsed calculator use in mathematics framework), I was interest-

ed to see what perspectives would be aired and how people would respond.

The proponent of calculator use was Dr. Elizabeth Stage, one of the architects of the math framework. The opposing view was expressed by John Saxon, a textbook author who feels that children in grades K-8 should not use calculators to perform arithmetic in school.

The highly charged exchanges between the speakers and extreme quiet of the intensely attentive audience evidenced the concern that many of us who believe that technology has a proper role in education believe: Namely, supporting technology use is easy when the scale of a pro-

ject is small or when the technology is available only to a few students for a limited period of time. When technology is available to all, however, we must face irreversible changes, changes whose consequences may not be obvious at the time we are making them.

Given the rate at which technological advances have allowed

price reductions in computer products, it won't be long before the current debate about calculators applies to computers. Thus, I think an examination of the current debate on calculator usage is worthwhile.

The Obvious Arguments

One of the major arguments against calculator use is that it reduces childrens' need to have a

master these skills, having them spend a lot of time doing hand calculations makes little sense. They argue that students can better spend this time by solving more complex problems. Fourth-graders throughout the country learn that "dead mice smell bad" (divide, multiply, subtract, bring down), but I assume that most students who know this algorithm have no

idea why it works.
Those who opp

Those who oppose calculator use were once able to assert that the cost of this technology prohibited equitable access. Anyone who has looked at the racks of \$4 calculators in the local drugstore knows that price is no longer an issue, though.


A favorite query is: "What do you do when the battery goes dead?" As Elizabeth Stage says, you should use this argument only if you keep a horse in your garage. In fact, most of the new inexpensive calculators are solar-powered and work well in the lighting of normal classrooms.

The Real Arguments

The foregoing arguments, stated with deep conviction and concern, are probably just


cloaks that cover a deeper worry. By placing calculators in the hands of every schoolchild, we open a Pandora's box, changing forever the way mathematics is taught. Irrevocable changes must be made with care, and the public, at one point or another, has to trust that those who mandate calculator use know what they are doing.



The world into which our children graduate is one in which calculators are as commonplace as watches. I remember (many years ago) learning an algorithm for extracting square roots. As I recall, the method looked a lot like long

I'm sure that, within a few months, I had completely forgotten how this algorithm worked—I certainly can't remember it now. By the time I needed to calculate square roots, I had learned about slide rules and had access to some good math tables.

On those rare occasions when I needed to find a square root and didn't have access to my tools, I used the following method: I found the roots of the perfect squares on either side of the number I was working with and did a linear interpolation to get a first guess. For example, If I wanted the square root of 20, I knew that the result fell between 4 (whose square is 16) and 5 (whose square is 25). Since 20 is almost halfway between 16 and 25, my guess for the square root of 20 would be 4.5. As it turns out, this result is close. A much better guess is 4.47, but 4.5 is probably close enough for most applications.

Incidentally, estimation skills (exemplified by my "quick and dirty" square-root trick) are of critical importance to those who favor increased calculator use. Although my emergency algorithm wasn't precise, it was fast and good enough. Of far greater concern to me (and to most math teachers) is knowing when to extract a square root, not knowing how to do it!

This issue is foremost in the minds of math teachers who think that calculators should be used in the classroom. Once children have developed an understanding of numbers and the basic operations, it is time to help them develop problem-solving skills that take advantage of this knowledge. If a child thinks that a certain word problem requires addition rather than multiplication, calculator use won't make any difference.

By spending years having children master their number facts, we turn mathematics into a boring topic in which numbers appear completely out of context. It makes as much sense to have children repetitively add up long columns of

numbers as to teach writing by having them write out long lists of words that don't form sentences or express ideas.

It is little wonder that few children have a deep love for mathematics. They've been too busy playing the role of a machine to ever get to enjoy the topic!

Computers in Education

Given the anxiety that comes with the increased use of calculators in the classroom though, what arguments will soon lie like boulders on the path of universal computer use?

Will some argue that children need to write their essays in longhand rather than use word-processing programs? Some have already advanced this argument, but it will become even more commonplace as computers show up in more children's backpacks. If children can use word-processing programs, what about spelling checkers? On-line thesauri? Style checkers? Where will it stop?

Hopefully it won't ever stop.


The detractors of educational technology are missing an important point. Our technology does not exist to "make life easy" for students; it exists to free them to develop their minds, to explore domains that were unknown to their parents and to move forward, unencumbered by the limitations of the past.

It is good that we debate the merits of educational technology, choosing our tools with concern for their long-term impact and not restricting their use just because we didn't have access to them when we were young.

Many years ago Bob Dylan wrote, "The times they are a'changin'." They still are changing, and-if we are fortunate-they always will be!

An introduction to educational database programs

Today database programs hold the educational promise that once belonged to programming languages. They are gaining acceptance as an effective means to develop higher-order thinking skills. To use these programs, students need to formulate questions about the information in the data files and figure out appropriate search-and-sort strategies to answer their questions. Once they've reorganized the information, students can analyze, interpret, and ultimately draw conclusions based on their findings.

What's especially interesting is the evolution of the programs for teaching database design and management to students. A few years ago, the first programs to catch the attention of educators were create-your-own-database programs such as Scholastic's pfs: File/Report, and The Bank Street Filer.

These educational database classics eventually inspired publishers to create a variety of add-on curriculum-based data disks. Why? Because teachers complained about the time investment necessary to design a usable database. Today the availability of large data files to use with introductory database programs increases the popularity of these programs because they create a unique educational situation—students combine learning subject-

area content with developing their information-management skills. Here is a look at several of the latest educational database programs.

Dataquest Composer

A relative newcomer on the classroom database scene and a good example of the current state of the create-your-own-database programs is the Dataquest series from MECC. The core program, Dataquest Composer, is a teacher utility that produces read-only database diskettes. Students search, sort, and report information but can't edit the disks. Dataquest Composer is easy to understand, so when students are ready, they too can use Dataquest Composer to create and edit custom databases.

With Dataquest Composer you create databases with simple key-board commands; they can contain as many as 254 records, up to 64 categories per record, and a maximum of 64 entries within each cat-

egory under a single record. Dataquest Composer uses four types of data: words, numbers, dates, and short text paragraphs. You can get around quickly in your newly created database by using the Find command or the ruler, which allows you to move through the file with a special combination of keyboard commands. The program accepts multiple entries within categories as well as data from transfer files.

MECC also provides databases for the Composer, including The World Community, The Dataquest Sampler, The Presidents, and The Fifty States. You can edit the Dataquest databases, using Dataquest Composer.


Because the files are so large, you have to delete existing data if you want to add information. One other feature worth noting is the availability of network versions of the Dataquest Composer and the other MECC databases.

BookBrain 4-6

Once educational database programs made curriculum-based data files a standard, teachers started voicing a new complaint: Database programs are boring. Most recent database-program releases reflect developers' response to this complaint. In general, they incorporate graphics and are either read-only or have some degree of interactivity. Of the newer educational database products, I have two personal favorites: BookBrain from Oryx Press and Life Science Information Laboratory Software from Addison-Wesley (see below).

BookBrain's manual describes BookBrain as an interactive, reading-incentive database of children's book titles. BookBrain is also a simulation of a library card catalog. The disk stores more than 2100 book titles, 765 of which are annotated, selected from several library and reading-resource guides for children in grades 4–6.

level, children interact with a smiling Book Detective who asks a series of questions to help children locate books that interest them and suit their reading level. At the practical data management skill level, BookBrain allows children to conduct standard library searches by author, title, keyword, or subject. BookBrain also provides children with the opportunity to make comments about a particular book. The comments become part of a permanent set available as reference for other students interested in the same book.

Other features include the design of personalized book lists and a customizing feature for teachers or librarians that allows them to mark titles already owned by the school. BookBrain generates bookordering lists, complete with ISBNs as well as usage statistics on how many children use the program, their grade and interest level. If you have a printer, you can print book lists for students, book-ordering lists for teachers or librarians, and usage statistics. Oryx Press plans to release BookBrain 1-3 and 7-9 in the near future.

Life Science Information Laboratory

The Life Science Information Laboratory is a huge read-only database designed for the IIGS (there is also an Earth Science Information Laboratory). The program covers 18 life-science subject areas, including cell biology, human anatomy, plants, and animals. All information is presented on cards that reside within decks of related cards, some accompanied by beautiful illustrations. Information is organized hierarchically, and you can search topics from a table of contents or a card index, by subject area, or from the illustrations.

The Life Science Information Laboratory is definitely limited by its read-only status. Because of the underlying structure of the information, the program's educational value is higher than that of other read-only databases, however. In terms of conceptual-mapping techniques, the program has an underlying open structure based on a conceptual map of life-science subject matter. The documentation includes information on the mechanics of using the database as well as search sheets to guide students

through the information hierarchy in a way that increases their understanding of the facts as well as of conceptual relationships between subjects.

GeoWorld

So now that you have data files to search and pictures to make them more interesting, what do you do when your students master the basics of the introductory database programs and are ready to ask deeper questions and design their own variables? Introductory instructional programs lack the power and flexibility to get beyond the basics of alphabetic, numeric, or chronologic searching and sorting of all or a subset of the data. What these activities amount to is the simple reorganization of information—they don't provide the means to design a search for hidden relationships among the data with customized variables.

To do such designing, you need to take your class to a more sophisticated and powerful database

product that accepts a greater variety of data types and custom mathematical functions and allows more control over the design of data fields and display formats. Once you've taken your students beyond the introductory database, you run into the old problems: no curriculum-based data files and boring display formats. What can you find that has the flexibility to serve as an introductory as well as an advanced database program, has reasonably large data files, and is also interesting?

In my opinion, GeoWorld from Tom Snyder Productions is an example of what the next wave of educational database products should strive for. This product is fun and visually exciting, teaches the basics of information management, provides opportunities for engaging in sophisticated cognitive tasks, and can be used in conjunction with a more powerful database program.

GeoWorld combines a naturalresource database with a geological-exploration simulation. The simulation can be played as a game or be treated as a research exercise by single students, teams, or entire classes. The program makes you think. You can search for only one resource at a time and have to make decisions based on geochemical measurements, charts of an analysis of the earth's core, and diagrams of cross sections of the earth's core. Once you think you've located the resource you're looking for, you mine the area to see if you're right. As you mine, you also create a database of the information you collect during your expeditions.

The unique feature that makes GeoWorld an exceptional product is that students can transfer the GeoWorld database over to Apple-Works and have a field day with their information. For example, the documentation describes how to transfer a file to AppleWorks and includes examples of some elementary AppleWorks functions such as

calculating column totals and how to use a simple mathematical function to create a new variable out of existing information. Students can also use the AppleWorks wordprocessing and spreadsheet modules to manipulate their data, useful options for generating reports. Compatibility with AppleWorks makes GeoWorld an excellent choice for teaching introductory and advanced information-management skills.







April's bonus: an enlightening look into our mailbag

audville's 816/Paint is finally shipping in its full version: a 3.5-inch disk contains the total package for the Apple IIGS, and a 51/4inch disk holds the standard- and double-hi-res versions for the Apple IIe and IIc.

If you're looking for 3-D perspective, anti-aliasing, two drawing pages, and other deluxe fea-

tures, you'll not find them here. What you will find is all of the standard features you have come to expect in paint software, along with several unique features, in a solid, easy-to-use program.

Perhaps the most significant advantage of 816/Paint over its competition is that it includes versions that work in all the Apple graphics modes, from standard hi-res up to the super-hi-res 640 mode. The standardand double-hi-res versions lack some of the features of the superhi-res versions, but they look and function in pretty much the same way.


The only competition for a standard-hires, ProDOS paint program is MousePaint;

816/Paint (in the standard- and double hi-res versions) works with the Apple Graphics Tablet and the KoalaPad in addition to the Apple-Mouse. Unlike with MousePaint, you can remove the menus and tools to work on the entire screen and easily use standard colors and dithered mixes. We were never too fond of MousePaint (except for the

price: free when you buy an Apple-Mouse II), so we feel that 816/Paint serves a useful function at the hires level alone.

We appreciate the file-utilities program that comes in the package. It allows you to convert standardand double-hi-res files to super hires and can even read DOS 3.3 disks directly, although you can save only to ProDOS disks.

NEW ACTORS ON THE GRAPHICS STAGE



Other features are more subtle. but they make 816/Paint an interesting product. The color-mixing module in the super-hi-res mode offers eight palettes to work on simultaneously, and you can spread the colors across all eight palettes. Other products on the market at this writing offer editing of only the current palette. 816/Paint also

handles color cycling differently than do other products. Rather than cycle within a palette, 816/ Paint cycles through different palettes, with up to eight palettes in the cycle. This method of color cycling allows beginners to employ color cycling much faster than they can with the more complicated method of DeluxePaint II. Finally, the 640 mode uses a dithered pal-

> ette rather than requiring you to create your own pattern mixes to achieve the appearance of 16 colors on the screen.

So, although it's lacking in power, 816/Paint has some distinct advantages over other paint programs; we think it belongs in the libraries of serious Apple IIGS graphics people. We do wish, nevertheless, that it were not copy-protected or that an unprotected version were available at extra cost. You can, however, install 816/Paint on a hard disk, even though it's protected.

By the way, we want to call your attention to a new adventure game from Baudville called The Dream Zone. We don't review game software, but we're men-

tioning this program because of its impressive graphics—all created with 816/Paint. We'll leave it to "GamePort" to run it through its paces, but we're rating the graphics: A + .



Although we'll reserve our final opinion for the released version of the product, we were impressed. The program offers all the abilities of DeluxePaint II but with a standard Apple interface. You won't find yourself poring over a manual to use the advanced features (such as 3-D distortions) of this program. If you're new to the Apple IIGS and have heard that DeluxePaint II is the program to get, you may want to take a close look at Paintworks Gold; it's much more than an upgrade of Paintworks Plus—it's a whole new product.

We also recently received Accolade's The Graphics Studio and will discuss it next month. For the time being, suffice it to say that the program generated a debate between us. Are the program's features worth the overhead of learning a new interface? Stay tuned.







PIRATES!

It's the nefarious tale of a gang of heartless soft-ware thieves armed with nibble copiers and sector editors. On their copyright-violating raids, they steal with impunity and pillage the income of decent programmers everywhere.

No, wait a minute. That's not a game. That's a real-life scenario.

What we're really here to discuss this month is MicroProse's Pirates!, designer Sid Meier's romantic, marauding action/adventure game of booty hunters on the historic high seas.

To get into the spirit of 17th-century oceangoing larceny, I'm going to put on this pocket protector, glasses, and a white cotton shirt. No, wait a minute, that's the reality

again. Better make that an eye patch and a parrot.

In Pirates!, you are a scurvy but ambitious captain on a quest for plunder and prestige in the golden age of Caribbean piracy, 1650–1700. England, France, Spain, and Holland are jostling for control of the New World. Riches and power await the knave who has a cargo of courage and a conscience light enough to flap in the political breeze.

MicroProse's Pirates! captures the kind of hybrid amusement that is growing more and more popular in computer games. Instead of walking the narrow plank of pure text adventure or role playing, Pirates! sails across several game-design styles. It anchors itself in strategic waters; tacks through sea and land battles; navigates into the shoals of trade, politics, and commerce simulation; and even gets the wind at its back in a lively arcade-like dueling sequence.

Although the arcade/ strategy/simulation-style game is rapidly gaining popularity with designers, it seemed an unusual prospect from Meier and MicroProse, the simulation specialists who created F-15 Strike Eagle, Silent Service, and Solo Flight.

"The game design basi-


cally flowed from the idea," says Pirates! designer Meier. "The idea of pirates conjures up a lot of fantasies and visions in people's minds: sword fighting, ship battles, running around town. We tried to bring the most fun to people by putting all these parts together. We didn't try to

make the subject fit the formats we knew how to do. It is a MicroProse game, though, in the sense that it has a lot of depth and that a lot of work went into it."



game. The response of play testers led to several design changes and resulted in the game's multifaceted nature.

"We initially saw Pirates! as more of an adventure game with dialogue and inner negotiating, talking with merchants, haggling over prices. It slowed down the game, though. We found it was more fun to do the action things of being a pirate.

"I'm not a fan of games where you have 13 agility points and 14 body points," Meier confesses. "That distances you from the game. You're not playing it yourself. You're playing it as a puppet with 12 intelligence points.

"In Pirates!, we tried to let you apply your own skills directly as a player. If you're good at sword fighting, you win. It's not because your character has 12 sword-fighting points. We put you directly in contact with the situation, but we also designed the action sequences to have enough simulation that they

aren't limited to learning a few tactics."

So, when you face off with the captain of a rival ship, you are personally wielding a joystick saber against the various fencing techniques of your opponent. When the enemy fleet comes into view, you are pulling the sails, riding the wind, and maneuvering yourself (you hope) into a perfect "crossing the T" battle position.

And while we have you at the short end of the gangplank, Sid, how about giving us a few tips on how to win?

"A couple of concepts underlie Pirates!," Meier explains. "One is the idea that four countries have relations among each other that vary over time. You should learn how to feel that and play off it to your advantage. If everybody hates the Spanish, you can attack the Spanish. Then, just the Spanish don't like you, and the rest do like you. Or if one country is rich and the others poor, you can try to improve your standing with the rich country because it will pay more for goods.

"There's also the treasure fleet and silver trade. You can try to decipher where the ships will be (and capture them). They're the juicy targets, but they're very difficult to find.'

So, yo, ho, ho and a double-sided flippy, me hearties. Yer galleon awaits. Pirates! is \$39.95 from MicroProse for Apple II computers.

Epyx continues to please Apple II game fanatics with first-rate new products. The down-home abilities of these homegrown hotshots add a delightful new twist to sports simulations.

Epyx also is scheduled to release the Apple II conversion of its Sub Battle Simulator this spring, along with SpiderBot, a fast-paced arcade game in Epyx's mid-priced Maxx Out line of software.

In my entertainment picks for the Apple All-Stars in the December 1987 issue of A + 1, I identified subLogic's Flight Simulator II as being compatible with the Apple IIGs.

"GamePort" reader and IIGs owner Dale Garvey of New London, New Hampshire, wrote in to complain, however. Seems he's been distressingly earthbound since getting his IIGs, since FSII doesn't run properly on the system.

Initial compatibility tests at subLogic showed that FSII did work on the IIGs. That was the information subLogic provided to me in September, but company spokesperson Holly G. Hardyman now says that the company has discovered that FSII works "only sporadically" on the IIGs. As a result, Hardyman states, subLogic may be motivated to write a IIGs-specific version of the popular flight simulator.


This month's games let you fight a naval battle, take yourself out to the ballgame, and contend with a campus computer

gone awry.

SUSPENDING THE LAWS OF **PHYSICS**

From deep right field, Miller scoops the horsehide out of the crabgrass and tenses his biceps to rocket the ball into second base for a possible putout. His mighty muscles spring the orb into the ozone, and the crowd waits in hushed hope. And the crowd waits some more. And then a little longer.

While the crowd watches in a state of Newtonian befuddlement, the ball drifts lazi-




ly toward second, hovering over the backfield like a Spielberg alien. How could it be? Not to worry, this seeming suspension of the laws of physics isn't real, it's just a "simulation," courtesy of Accolade's baseball arcade/strategy game Hardball!


It's hard to argue with the well-deserved success of designer Bob Whitegraphically vivid sports game has sold more than 200,000 copies in versions for a variety of computers, including the Apple IIe/c. The newest version for the Apple IIGS makes the audiovisual most of that computer's sound and graphics.

Aside from the fastpaced arcade-style sports action of Hardball!— a real joystick slugger's delight-great graphics make Hardball! a heavy hitter. The eavesdropping view over the pitcher's right shoulder and the TV-like shot of the playing field pack a youare-there wallop. On the Apple IIGs, the ball diamond shines like a real diamond from the mottled turf of the backfield to the smoothly realistic





animation of pitcher and batter. And the digitized IIGs sounds of howling umpires, raucous crowds, and cracking bats take the illusion all the way home.



Aside from the visual embellishments, other elements of Hardball! on the IIGs help it retain its best-selling status. The pitching/batting screen displays full-size figures, while a small inset window provides a schematic overview of the field showing "who's on first." When the ball is hit, the display cuts to a view of either the left or the right half of the field (depending on where the ball goes), along with the same overhead diagram of the field.

At all times, a command window sits patiently at the bottom of the screen waiting for player input. It allows the pitcher to choose fastball, curveball, changeup, or slider and aim his pitch at one of nine locations, from high and out-

side to low and inside. Batters can place their swing over the same range of locations or opt to bunt.

When fielding the ball, the computer automatically chooses which player is active, a sometimes frustrating situation when the computer's defensive decision differs from your own. Throwing the ball requires moving mouse or joystick in the direction of the desired base (an on-screen display indicates which one you've chosen) and then pressing the fire /mouse button. Overall, Hard-

ball! still has one of the most logical and easy-tomaster solutions to joystick/mouse control.

On the strategic side, managerial options include determining player lineup, substituting players, changing player positions, issuing intentional walks, and setting the location of outfield and infield players. The fictional players on the roster have been assigned some statistics, but the absence of real player stats dilutes the strategic aspects of the game. Accolade's Hardball! is a brilliant arcade baseball game with little interest as a statistical simulation.

Despite its many home-run features, Hard-

ball! on the IIGs often makes you wish you were back in the dugout. Somehow, the timing is off. Runners charge swiftly around the plate while fielders lob a suspended-animation ball to the infield—fine when you're pummeling them on offense, but frustrating when you're on defense. The opposing team skips rapidly toward home while your ball grinds arduously through the air. Although this disparity may be an attempt to simulate real-world

conditions, the

conflict be-

tween reality

lusion grows irritating. Interestingly enough, other conversions of Hardball! do not share this quirk.


Hardball! plays equally well under mouse or joystick control, and you can take on the computer or another human player. Its graphics and sound place it solidly in the big leagues. The eccentricity of the timing and ball handling, though, make you long for the sandlot.



PROUD VESSEL RUNS AGROUND

"No captain," said Admiral Nelson, "can go far wrong if he lays his ship alongside that of an enemy."


Naval tactics in the Age of Sail were pretty crude. Battles were usually won by excellent seamanship, superior gunnery, and the fierce discipline that enabled crews to endure hour after hour of horrible casualties from cannonballs and flying splinters. These ships were tough—the USS Constitution ("Old Ironsides") was launched in 1797 and is still afloat in Boston Harbor. Being made of wood, warships of this era were hard to sink. Many fights ended with sword and musket, as boarding parties slugged it out across shattered decks.


Ralph Bosson's High Seas is a detailed simulation of ship-to-ship combat during the late 18th

and early 19th century the Napoleonic wars, the American Revolution, and the War of 1812. A player takes the role of an individual ship captain or the admiral of a small fleet. The game system allows up to 68 ships in a scenario, but more than 10 on a side would slow the action to a crawl. Eleven historical and hypothetical scenarios come on a separate disk.

The game models three kinds of ships: The "ship of the line," or battleship, is ponderous and thickskinned, mounting 64–130 guns; frigates are more maneuverable and carry 24–50 guns; and merchant ships are virtually unarmed and serve as helpless victims in the





game. You can create new ships or "edit" existing ones and store them on a specially formatted "shipyard disk."

The game uses an elaborate system of nested drop-down menus. The menu bar is a representation of the view from the deck of a ship. You see one set of menus during the game setup and another set during the actual course of play. By using the joystick or arrow keys to select menu items, you control maneuver, combat, displays, and status reports.

You can call up a view looking out in any direction from a selected ship and choose any ship in sight as a target. There is a map view (a section of ocean seen from above) and a chart view (a much larger section of ocean). The game reflects the effects of wind direction on maneuvers. The time necessary to reload guns and change sails is accurately modeled. The 43page, illustrated manual is nicely printed and provides well-researched background information on the period, but the explanations of the game's mechanics are confusing in many places.

Unfortunately, High Seas was too ambitious and complex a design for the skill of its programmers. I found the game virtually unplayable. Even with seven ships in a scenario, on a IIGs at the fast system speed, the game is painfully slow. You cannot get a good grasp of the battle, since the graphics are rather limited and hard to interpret. Ship silhouettes, for example, do not change to reflect damage or change of ownership. When more than a few ships are involved, the map view is too constricted to show more than a part of the action. The symbols on the chart view are blurry and often overlap. In short, High Seas suffers all the symptoms of a game that was written for the Commodore 64 and converted to run on the Apple II without sufficient thought about the limitations of Apple graphics.

The designers at Gardé Games are talented people, with a rare devotion to historical accuracy, but they need to remember that computer games, above all, must be fun to play.

CAMPUS CONUNDRUM

Just when you thought it was safe to turn on your computer, Infocom has released the first interactive-fiction horror story, entitled, appropriately, The Lurking Horror. Written in the style of Stephen King and H.P. Lovecraft, the new tale was penned by Dave Liebling, coauthor of the classic Zork series.

The Lurking Horror is set at G.U.E. Tech, a fictitious university whose geography bears more than a passing resemblance to M.I.T. (I have this on good authority). You take on the persona of a student who's waited until the last minute to finish an important term paper.

You've stored your working copy on the university's mainframe computer, and in the middle of the night before it is due, just as you're ready to finish-wouldn't you know-a blizzard is raging outdoors, and all the computer terminals in your dorm are occupied. So you brave the elements to go to the computer center—and what do you discover when you arrive? A computer glitch has rendered your partly finished work unintelligible. Dumbstruck, you stare at the curious melange of nonsense on the PC screen. Suddenly and inexplicably, you

Now as if you haven't been through enough al-

ready this evening, you awaken to find yourself in a dense black void, amidst a surging crowd, facing a foul creature whose tentacles reach out in an effort to engulf you in its maw. At the moment you think you're done for, you mysteriously snap back to your seat in front of the computer screen. Was it all a dream? Or did it really happen? Wait a minute what's that in your hand? A stone, inscribed with strange symbols. The very same stone you found in your vision! Tangible evidence—but of what?

By the time you're through with the game, you will have found several uses for the strangely inscribed stone and will know the answer to the question of what is really going on at G.U.E. Tech and who (or what) is behind it. But in the meantime, being the resilient sort, you ignore the stone (and your nightmare) for the moment. You continue with your quest to find the term paper, pursuing a clue that you should check out the computer in the Department of Alchemy. Uh-oh, on account of the blizzard, you cannot traverse the campus on the outside; you must use the large, dark, lonely, spooky, underground tunnels that connect most of the buildings.

Your journey through the campus takes you to many locations not mentioned in the G.U.E. Tech student guidebook, from

the top of the great dome to the bottom of the elevator shaft. And although not many students are awake at this hour in the morning, you'll meet up and interact with several strange people and creatures, from a nerdy computer hacker to a thieving street urchin with a suspiciously lumpy parka.

Speaking of films, several sequences in The Lurking Horror have the breathless rush of movie scenes, and I defy you to get through the episode with the alchemy professor without your spine tingling and your heart beating faster.

One hint: Don't even think of traveling around the school without a passkey—you won't get very far, as many doors are locked, in traditional adventure-game style.

Since Infocom no longer grades the difficulty levels of its games, it's up to me to tell you that The Lurking Horror is not the hardest game yet devised, nor the easiest. Players with some experience at interactive fiction will enjoy the brain teasers, and novice players should be able to plow through the adventure, enjoying the stretching of their mental muscles.

As is usual with Infocom games, you will spend many challenging hours playing The Lurking Horror, and since you are unlikely to finish the game in one sitting, you can save your place, using the standard eightposition routine. So go ahead, get The Lurking Horror. Then, if you dare, turn on your computer. You don't have to be afraid. The horror lurks inside your computer, not outside. Or is that the other way around?

LOCK INSPECTION

If you need to determine whether a given file on a ProDOS disk is locked or not, use the following program fragment:

100 PRINT CHR\$(4); "VERIFY MY.FILE"

110 LK = PEEK(48823)

120 IF LK = 33 OR LK = 1 THEN PRINT "File is locked."

The access code of the file is stored at location 48823 after you use the VERIFY command. Files you lock with the BASIC.SYSTEM LOCK command have an access code of 1 or 33, which means they can't be deleted, renamed, or rewritten, but they can be read. Hence the test in line 120.

PAPER-PAD POWER

Did you ever wonder what to do with those little strips of paper that you tear off the sides of fanfold printer paper? Well, wonder no more! Use them as pads on the bottom of computers, televisions, desk lamps, and other appliances that may scratch your desk or countertop. Just follow these simple instructions:

- 1. Carefully tear the side off a single sheet of printer paper.
- 2. Fold the strip so that the first hole matches the second.
- 3. Continue to fold the strip over and over until you reach the end, folding it tightly each time.
- 4. Use a small piece of tape to keep the pad from opening up.

5. Attach the pads to the bottom of the appliance.

Do not tape the sides of the pad closed. For thicker pads, use longer strips of perforation.

WORD WRAP MADE EASY

I've developed a short subroutine you can call from an Applesoft program to display long text strings on the screen with full word wrap. That is, the subroutine prevents words from splitting across the end of one line and the start of the next.

To enter the subroutine, type CALL-151 from the Applesoft Command mode and enter the machine-language program in figure 1. Then type Control-C and save the subroutine to disk with BSAVE WORDWRAP, A\$300, L\$61. To test it, enter the following short program:

10 PRINT CHR\$(21)

20 PRINT CHR\$(4); "BLOAD WORDWRAP

30 A\$="WORDWRAP is an extremely useful subroutine"

40 PRINT A\$:REM Normal print job

50 CALL 768:REM This prints A\$ with word wrap

Notice how the word-wrap subroutine keeps the word *subroutine* from splitting across two lines. It also converts each caret in the string into a quotation mark.

Use CALL 768 to call the subroutine. It prints out the first string variable the program defines—in this case A\$. To print another string, simply redefine A\$.

A. The default print-buffer size on the GS is only 2K, and, unfortunately, you can't change it with a simple Control Panel command. You can, however, increase the buffer size to a maximum of 64K by running a program that invokes a special serial-port firmware command called SetOutBuffer. For a detailed explanation of how to issue this command, consult Chapter 5 of Apple IIGS Firmware Reference (Addison-Wesley, 1987).

If you have at least 512K in your GS, use the program in figure 1 to increase the print-buffer size to 64K. You have to BRUN the program from Applesoft under Pro-DOS 8. Once installed in this way, the buffer survives until you turn off the GS or perform a "cold" reset (Control/open-apple/Reset). If you BRUN the program and hear one beep, a 64K buffer has previously been set up, so another one is not created; two beeps means that you do not have enough memory to create the buffer.

In order to ensure that the serial port uses the buffer, be sure to turn buffering on with the Control Panel. Choose the Printer Port command in order to access the buffering option.

Note that if you BRUN the program while a job is printing, the job is suddenly aborted because of the initialization call the program makes. Therefore, don't put the BRUN command inside a start-up program that might get control after you leave an application that has commenced printing.

Another caveat: Once the 64K buffer is installed, don't attempt to boot a ProDOS 16 disk with a PR# command.

When you warm-boot ProDOS 16 in this way, ProDOS 16 purges the memory the buffer uses but forgets to tell the serial-port firmware. If you try to print something, you will overwrite any data that may be occupying the area where the buffer once was. Use a cold reset instead.




