He dismisses the objection to character editors by "gaming purists," preferring instead to be able to "repair" the characters quickly and return to the game as if nothing had happened. "Winning" Wizardry I, however, is not just getting to the tenth level and overwhelming Werdna and his vampires with level 1,000 Bishops (quite possible with a well-known bug in Wizardry I). It involves solving all the puzzles the game offers, without character editors and commercial maps, up to and including Werdna's defeat.

A significant part of the roleplaying experience is pushing your characters to their limits and pay-

ing the consequences. I can still remember the feeling of loss I had when my party was all killed on level 5 of Wizardry I. It was a great sense of



achievement, however, when I developed another set of characters and with trepidation went down and rescued my party in six hazardous trips. This experience would not have occurred if I had been able to just boot up my cheat program and edit my characters back to full (or increased) strength. Characters' being drained or killed is as important a part of the games' balance as "finishing."

When No Copi International, Inc., came into being in 1981, "We thought the defense industry would be our primary market," Gardner explains. "They seem to have lots of secrets. But the government was just the tip of the iceberg of confidentiality."

Wizardry IV from Sir-Tech was the first product to employ No Copi paper as a form of software protection. Now, several other companies are warming to its noncopying charms. Upcoming products to use No Copi include the new Jack Nicklaus golf simulation from Accolade and Pete Rose Pennant Fever from GameStar.

So put a higher-watt bulb in your computer-

room reading lamp and reap the benefits of a copy-protection scheme that doesn't beat your disk drive to pieces and allows hard-disk installation of software.—BL

HOW THE WORKS WORK

Of course, it goes without saying that the friendly, self-evident user interface of AppleWorks GS permits instant access and immediate understanding of Claris' sixmodule software marathon. But just in case you need a little extra help (along with the majority of other AppleWorks GS users), Addison-Wesley is publishing *Using AppleWorks GS* (\$19.95).

The 450-page paper-back was written by Douglas L. Brown. Besides being the author of From Pascal to C: An Introduction to the C Programming Language (Gee, how come that never made the New York Times best-seller list?), Brown was a member of the original documentation team for AppleWorks GS. In short, this guy is pretty qualified.

The book contains tutorials, tips, and advanced guides to making the most of this huge product's word-processing, spreadsheet, database, telecommunications, graphic, and pagelayout modules. It's scheduled for publication in February.—*BL*














Making the most of the Information Age

COMPUTING BEYOND BOUNDARIES

he Information Age is upon us, and if you aren't tapping into your share, perhaps it's time to power up your computer. Unlike knowledge, a little information isn't dangerous; in fact, in the late twentieth century, it's downright mandatory. Take, for example, the following questions. Can you guess what they have in common?

How can I get a letter I have on disk to a FAX machine in Saudi Arabia? Which movie would I probably prefer, Nightmare on Elm Street 4 or Friday the 13th Part 6? Where can I find opinions on the merits and possible side effects of two similar prescription drugs from people who have actually used them? What's the most popular gradebook program for my Apple; how good is it, and how much does it cost? Is anybody else up at 2 A.M. regularly, hungry for conversation? How do I go about incorporating a business? What about promoting it on TV? As usual, my daughter's term paper is due tomorrow. Where can she get latebreaking aerospace information tonight? What are the primary demographic differences between greater Los Angeles and San Francisco? How many daily flights are there between Chicago and Atlanta, and how much do they cost? Are any of them nonstop? Those old comic books in the attic—are they really worth hanging onto?

The common element among these questions is that their answers, in addition to answers to just about all other modern-day questions along with a host of

opinions, are instantly available to anyone with access to a personal computer equipped with a modem and telephone.

Let Your Fingers Do the Talking

Several information providers, or commercial networks, stand ready to satisfy your information appetite 24 hours a day. Varying in cost from more than \$50 an hour to less than \$3, their services range from the eclectic to the explicit, and they are far more interesting than simple electronic-mail carriers such as MCI and Western Union.

Many serve as gateways to vast electronic databases (encyclopedic, medical, and legal references, as well as publishing compilations). Some have steep learning curves, whereas others are easy to use and concentrate on more consumer-oriented fare, including plain talk between plain people.

Services such as these were originally devised by computer programmers for sharing programs and techniques. They were extended to businessmen and investors (Dow Jones News/Retrieval, for example) in the late 1970s; then the Information Age arrived in the early 1980s and changed everything. Nowadays you'll find all sorts of professional and personal users online, doing all sorts of professional and personal things.

On-line special-interest groups are dedicated to everything from ASCII to Zen. Topical divisions (sometimes called forums, round-tables, or clubs) usually comprise three standard sections:

- 1. Collections of public messages between members of the group to which you can contribute or simply read.
- 2. Collections of programs and longer text-based files you can transfer to your computer and use later.
- 3. "Conference" or "CB" areas in

which you communicate by typing in real time, with other people connected to the network at the same time.

Most networks also offer private electronic mail, on-line credit-card shopping, multiplayer games, and nonspecific CB areas in which members frequently try out different personalities by using "handles," or pseudonyms.

The Lineup


There are many networks other than those I describe here. Portal, for example, is primarily a computer professionals' gateway to services such as ARPANET (a network for universities, government departments, and corporations) and USENET (a UNIX network), and because of its low cost, it's a CB addict's delight. And there's always Dow Jones for financial information (see "Newsline") and Apple-Link (see "For Your Line Only"). The following gives you a taste of real-world networks, though.

CompuServe

Offering nearly 500 distinct topics and services, CIS (CompuServe Information Service) is the biggest and oldest of the public-access networks still in operation. It offers the most diversity by far, including the well-known MAUG (Micronetworked Apple Users Group) and gateways to scads of professional databases (most of which are surcharged), and it's the service I'd want on that proverbial desert island if I found myself marooned. Information on everything I've ever wondered about is on CIS, from aerospace to scuba diving to transferring electronic files to FAX machines worldwide. It's all there, but it's up to you to find it. You can do better economically after hours, but CIS is the only service that's also affordable during weekday business hours.

GEnie

Moving up fast, four-year-old



Telecommunications

GEnie recently surpassed QuantumLink (sister to AppleLink) to become second only to Compu-Serve in number of subscribers. Overall, it's a friendly, middle-of-the-road kind of place, neither small nor enormous, offering a delightful mix of roundtables devoted to fun (solo and multiplayer games, including an on-line Macintosh flight simulator, MIDI, movie reviews, and personal-computer areas) and productivity (working at home, news, reference, genealogy, financial data, and so

forth). GEnie has lots of appeal, including good Apple-specific services; a new educational-resources area; and, like CIS, a discount for frequent CB users. Since it isn't as vast or well established as Compu-Serve, GEnie carries more personalized services for subscribers—you're not just another number.

The Source

The Source offers lots of meat, including great educational resources, an active matchmaking service, self-publishing, personal computing, and a few real-world special-interest groups. It claims the highest volume of electronic mail among all the services but specializes in small-business communications, so there isn't a lot of hobby or fun activity on-line. The system itself is not very responsive and is somewhat Neanderthal (read sluggish and difficult) to navigate. On the flip side of that coin are The Source's beautiful operations manual and an award-winning, personalized, on-line system tutorial, both major pluses. If you have a small business that would benefit from improved communications between branches and the main office, check out The Source.

American PeopleLink

Unfortunately light in content, "Plink" is the least expensive, fast-

est, and electronically the most responsive of the services surveyed here. It's dreadfully lacking in professional and financial services, though, primarily offering alternative-life-style information and companionship, CB communications, and electronic mail. With a single exception (and it's not Apple), Plink's personal-computing clubs lack depth and activity, as do most of its other services. If you know what you want, what you're doing, and whom you're doing it with, however, Plink's E-mail, CB, and person-to-person file transfers are great bargains.

Byte Information eXchange (BIX)

Owned and operated by BYTE magazine, BIX is bound to be a computer techie's haven. It's the gem of its kind, offering in-depth computer-industry news, computer-specific forums (including an Apple II conference), and wonderfully detailed programming services for every kind of electronic marvel you've ever heard of-and then some. There are also conferences on such nontechnical subjects as science fiction and cats. BIX recently installed a multiuser CB service, but you're better off going elsewhere for real-time chat because of the hourly rate.

The Well

Offering mostly life-style and computer-oriented information, The Well isn't a network per se, although it is relatively extensive along general-information lines if you're into environmental issues, things like the Whole Earth Catalog, or getting into a C-shell operating environment on a VAX. Specialized, unique, and timely, The Well gets the heaviest use by West Coast computer professionals and people who are interested in technological developments.

The Payoff

Because of the wide availability of the Telenet and TYMNET telephone carrier services, you won't have to pay long-distance telephone fees to connect with a computer network, provided you live in a major metropolitan area.

You usually pay for long-distance telephone usage indirectly, as these charges are included in the access fees for the time you're connected to the host system, but it's a lower rate than dialing direct. You may also wind up incurring long-

ntil recently, on-line services have been generalists, trying to be all things to all telecommunicators. These services often offer a great variety of information—but the user interface sometimes makes their information hard to obtain.

The appearance of on-line services tailored to specific types of computers-such as AppleLink and Prodigy-has created more accessible telecommunication. AppleLink—The Personal Edition uses custom software created for the Apple II and Macintosh computers. Prodigy uses software designed for MS/DOS-compatible machines, including Apple II computers running PC Transporter. Both have graphical interfaces that make them easy to use, but people perceive them as limited services, offering little in the way of general information. This perception is far from the truth.

AppleLink

AppleLink—The Personal Edition (see "AppleLink—The Personal Edition," July 1988) has been touted as the service specifically for Apple II and Macintosh users. Its Apple Community section offers much Apple II and Mac-specific information, including tech notes, product specs, manual descriptions, and product-compatibility and bug reports. In addition to the Apple Community, however, AppleLink has an eight-part General Services section.

The General Services Mall area, for example, includes access to American Airlines EAAsy Sabre travel service. The Newsroom contains extensive articles on many subjects, organized in categories and windows. A separate financial section includes industry watch and personal-investing news from USA Today; forums on investing and managing money; and price, trend, change, dividend, yield, earnings, and price/earnings-ratio data on individual stocks.

The Grolier Academic American



YOUR LINE ONLY

Encyclopedia, containing more than 30,000 articles, is available in AppleLink's Learning Center. Grolier also sponsors a Reference Desk on AppleLink, where you can ask questions and get responses, normally within two business days.

The Learning Center's University of Tomorrow offers courses in several departments, including business, English, general studies (courses ranging from SAT preparation to photography), and math. A tutoring center offers assistance in general science, physical science, chemistry, biology, music, general math, English, Spanish, and SAT preparation.

Prodigy

The Prodigy Service is from Trintex, a joint venture of Sears and

IBM. Currently the custom software is available only for MS-DOS machines, but the company is planning to release an Apple IIGS and a Macintosh version in 1989—and possibly even an Apple IIe/c/c+ version.

Prodigy can be described as an electronic combination of *USA Today* and a suburban shopping mall. It is graphics-oriented, using a fast method of sending graphics that, in effect, tells the computer to draw a particular shape of a particular size at a particular screen location.


Prodigy comprises six different areas, called buildings, each devoted to a particular area such as living, shopping (two separate areas), investing, and traveling.

The buildings are themselves di-

vided into floors, or subtopics. For example, the Information building has newsroom, business, sports, weather, and consumer-reports floors, and the Living building has under-21, life-style, health, travelog, and computing floors.

On-line columnists and experts, to whom you can send questions and comments, reside on many of the floors. Among the topics with experts are automotive repair, bridge, careers, clothing, computers, fitness and nutrition, gardening, gossip, health, home maintenance, investments and money, movies, personal advice, personal finance, politics, real estate, restaurants, singles, sports, taxes, teen advice, travel, weather, and wine.

distance charges to the nearest city if you live outside a big city. You simply dial the nearest Telenet or TYMNET "node."

One way to further reduce costs is to join PC Pursuit, a service of GTE Telenet. For \$25 a month, membership in PC Pursuit lets you call computers in 33 major U.S. metropolitan areas during evenings, weekends, and holidays (no, it doesn't work for voice communi-

cations) without incurring longdistance telephone charges. PC Pursuit permits greater access to privately owned electronic bulletin-board services (BBSs or "boards") and reduces the cost of accessing some commercial information services. Chicago-based American PeopleLink and San Francisco-based The Well and Portal (the latter available *only* directly or through PC Pursuit) are examples of qualifying services. They generally cost \$2 an hour *less* than standard fees with a PC Pursuit membership. Contact Telenet (800-835-3638) for information.

Caveat Emptor

At the heart of telecommunications is a device called a modem (it modulates and demodulates elec-

ialog Information Services, Dow Jones News/Retrieval, and NewsNet are deservedly three of the big names in on-line data services.

Dow Jones is the place to go when you want nearly any kind of financial information. The company has published the Wall Street Journal and compiled financial information for years. Dow Jones News/Retrieval lets you search much of this data electronically.

The main menu of Dow Jones News/Retrieval has eight selections: business news, general news, company and industry statistics and forecasts, company profiles and reports, quotes and market averages, business services, general services, and on-line reference tools. A free on-line help and system-information section provides an easy way of learning about the system.

In business news, you can retrieve and search articles that have crossed the Dow Jones News Wire or appeared in the Wall Street Journal; other national, regional, and local publications; or the Japanese Business News.

The statistics and forecasts section includes access to Dun and Bradstreet reports, earnings forecasts, extracts of filings with the Securities and Exchange Commission, and Standard and Poor's Earnings and Income Statements.

This information does not come cheaply, though. The price for Dow Jones News/Retrieval basic services runs more than \$25 per hour, even in non-prime time at 1200

baud, and prime time lasts longer than on most of the on-line services—from 6 A.M. Eastern time to 6 P.M. local time. In addition, there are yearly membership fees and surcharges for some searches.

In contrast to the financial specialization of Dow Jones News/Retrieval, Dialog Information Services has a variety of databases, each with its own cost of \$20-\$500 per hour. The service is fairly cumbersome to use, particularly for those who do not use it regularly.

Fortunately, Dialog Information Services' Knowledge Index provides low-cost access to many of the more popular and useful of these databases, with a greatly simplified search system. There is only one catch: You can use the system only Monday to Thursday from 6 P.M. to 5 A.M.; Friday from 6 P.M. to midnight; Saturday from 8 A.M. to midnight; and Sunday from 3 P.M. to Monday at 5 A.M. (all local times).

Knowledge Index consists of 75 different databases that are divided into the following 13 categories: agriculture and nutrition, bibliography, business information, chemistry, computers and electronics, directories and reference, education, law and government, medicine and drugs, news and current affairs, popular information, science and technology, and social sciences and humanities.

Knowledge Index information consists mainly of abstracts of articles in the Dialog database. Your search will refer you to the location of the articles rather than giving the full text. The service can mail photocopies of many articles for a charge of \$7.50 per article plus \$.35 per page, and rush service is available for a \$7.50 surcharge.

NewsNet is an information service whose databases consist of more than 300 newsletters and publications divided into nearly 40 different industry groups such as aerospace, environment, finance and accounting, and management. The database includes such diverse titles as Fusion Power Report, Latin American Debt Chronicle, Productivity Software, U.S. Rail News, and Computer Book Review.

You search the full text of articles using keywords. Then you can read the headlines or the full text of articles that include your keyword or get a report showing the number of occurrences of your keyword in each newsletter search.

Other services that are available on NewsNet include TRW business-credit profiles, stock and commodity prices, the Official Airline Guide, and the Computer Listing Service (for used listing computer equipment).

The cost of NewsNet depends on whether you are searching or reviewing the results of a search. Search time costs \$1 per minute at 300 and 1200 baud and \$1.50 per minute at 2400 baud. Then, if you want to read the on-line articles, you pay \$1-\$4.20 per minute, depending on the newsletter. Many newsletters charge their print-version subscribers a lower on-line access fee.

tronic signals). Get one that is "Hayes-compatible" and handles speeds up to 2400 baud. You'll also need communications software, or a "terminal program." Initially, sign onto a host system at 300 baud; 1200 is more expensive. You'll spend most of your learning time working your way around the system, reading menus, typing, and getting familiar with on-line practices. Once you know your way around, you can switch to 1200 baud if 300 baud is too slow. Since charges depend on how long your computer is connected to the host, use the higher (faster) baud rate when you're transferring large text-based files or computer programs (called downloading) to

your computer, even if there's a surcharge.

You can do everything on-line, from researching Niagara Falls to falling in love—with lots of stops along the way. But be careful—not only is it informative and fun, but telecommunicating can quickly become habit-forming. Clever, judicious use of your time and resources will make you an activeand satisfied-participant in the Information Age. It can expand your horizons and knowledge, make you more efficient, and provide you with friends all over the world. Just don't let it leave you gasping when your credit-card statement arrives. (Trust me; I have the bills to prove it.) Decide what your limits are and stick to them. That way you won't find yourself wishing you had inside information on the state lottery every month. See you on-line!



On-line shareware and public-domain software

THE PRICE IS RIGHT

In the early days of home computing, hobbyists tinkering in their basements believed that computers were tools to free humans from dull tasks and give individuals the power to explore personal creativity. If computers were the machines of social revolution, as many hackers believed, programs, like all computer information, should be distributed freely for the benefit of all.

Looking back with hindsight, it is easy to dismiss these notions as naive, yet the hacker spirit remains alive today. Many software authors release their efforts into the public domain, making thousands of useful programs, utilities, and templates available free to whoever wants them. Still others allow copying and distribution of their programs without restriction, trusting that satisfied users of this "shareware" will send them a small remuneration. Most of this generic software consists of programs without enough obvious commercial merit to be made available through traditional channels yet is too good to be neglected.

No-Name Software

Not long ago, virtually any programmers with decent products could go into business for themselves. Slap a label onto a floppy, drop the disk and photocopied documentation into a plastic bag, buy a small advertisement in a computer magazine, and wait for orders to fill the mailbox.

Today the commercial distribution of software is a sophisticated business that expects a sizable return on its investment, however. Yesterday's little guys can't compete with today's big-budget software industry. Without alternative means of distribution, such as shareware, many fine programs would never become available.

Honor System

Shareware gives you the chance to preview programs. If you are not

Without shareware, many fine programs would never become available.

satisfied with the shareware offering after a trial period, typically ranging from ten days to one month, you are expected to discard your copy of the program or pass it along to someone else. If you continue using the program, you are morally, but not legally, obligated to send the shareware fee to the author. This voluntary registration often entitles you to updates and documentation.

The primary difference between shareware and public-domain software is that public-domain software belongs to the public, not the programmer, and can be duplicated and modified without concern for copyright laws.

Software Sources


Public-domain and shareware programs are available from a variety of sources. Most users' groups maintain large libraries of software that you can copy for the cost of a disk. To find the users' group nearest you, call Apple at (800) 538-9696, extension 500.

Another convenient place to get such software is on-line. The major information services (Compu-Serve, GEnie, AppleLink, and The Source) have Apple II areas stocked with applications, utilities, and templates, as well as patches for commercial products. (For information on how to sign up for these services, see "Computing beyond Boundaries" in this issue.)

Several companies specialize in compiling public-domain software and making it available through mail-order. The best-known firm is the Public Domain Exchange, 2074C Walsh, Santa Clara, CA 95050; (800) 331-8125; (408) 496-0624. Names and addresses of similar companies appear in the "Public Domain" classified section of "A+ Marketplace" at the back of the magazine.

Wheel

The television game show that made Vanna White a household name can now inhabit your trusty Apple II, for free. That's righta great version of Wheel of Fortune is available in the public

You need three people to play, but if you're short a person or two, the computer will fill in. Few will need the built-in tutorial. since the game is faithful to its TV counterpart. Players try to solve a hidden puzzle by guessing the letters that fill in the blank spaces on a board. The player with control of the board can spin the wheel and guess a letter, buy a vowel, or attempt to solve the puzzle. If the guess is correct, an animated hostess saunters across the screen to reveal part of the puzzle. (Apple Ile/c/GS/ c+, 128K RAM, public domain)

IconEd

Apple's Finder offers an intuitive method of managing files, folders, and volumes with graphic icons and mouse manipulation. With IconEd, users can personalize this environment by customizing existing icons or creating their own.

IconEd can load any ProDOS 16 or GS/OS icon file and allows editing of individual icons with a "fat pixels" display mode. You can color all subdirectory folders yellow or draw Oscar the Grouch in the Finder's Trash icon, for example, No more boring icons—with IconEd, IIGS owners can create desktops in their own image. (Apple IIGS, 512K RAM, shareware, \$15)

Graphics are nice to look at, but why spend time booting a paint program just to show off your creations? With Viewer, picture display takes only seconds.

Written in Applesoft BASIC, Viewer loads and displays any standard- or double-hi-res graphics file. Double-hi-res pictures must be in the single-file format of such programs as Brøderbund's Dazzle Draw (not separate main and auxiliary files). Viewer requires individual filenames for each picture, but since it is in Applesoft, turning it into a slide-show program would take little effort. The Viewer program is well documented and is easy to modify to be a subroutine in other programs. (Apple Ile/c/GS/ c+, 128K RAM, public domain)

Bounce-It!

Bounce-It! is a IIGS adaptation of Little BrickOut inspired by the coin-op arcade game BreakOut.

The object of Bounce-It! is to destroy blocks by hitting them with a bouncing ball. If all the blocks are cleared, the game advances to the next level (nine in all). As the game proceeds, the ball moves faster and the mouse-controlled paddle becomes smaller, making it more difficult to keep the ball in play. You can select paddle size and ball speed.

Programmer John R. Tierney uses the super-hi-res graphics screen of the IIGS to produce a colorful game environment. Bounce-It! also has charming sound effects that you can play in mono through the internal GS speaker or in stereo with an add-on stereo card. (Apple IIGS, 512K RAM, shareware, download \$10, mail-order \$15)







Options for nontraditional undergraduate and graduate learning


DIGITAL DIPLOMAS

nce you've entered the work force, returning to college to complete a degree or to take a course purely for personal enrichment is difficult. Attending formal classes on a campus means giving up work time. Reducing time on the job means less income and becomes a major obstacle to achieving your educational goals if you have a family to support. You may also have to move to meet residency requirements. At this point, most people would say "no way"-going back to school is too much trouble and expense.

With computer technology, many obstacles that have prevented adults from attending college in the traditional manner disappear. Over the last few years, several colleges and universities have designed external degree programs that allow students to use telecommunications to participate in special on-line courses. All you need is a personal commitment, a computer, a phone line, and the software and peripherals to dial into a host computer on the college campus.

The principal advantage of online courses is that they generally do not take place in real time and therefore can accommodate professional and personal schedules. Typically, classes have no set time, and most of the information delivery and student/faculty interaction occurs via computer conferencing at the students' convenience.

Degree programs are plentiful, at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. There is, however, a shortage of major subject options. Limited offerings in business ad-



ministration, general studies, media studies, information science, and social/behavioral science are the only degree tracks I could find. Here's a look at four providers of on-line universities.

Connected Education

Connected Education is a series of on-line courses that carry graduate and undergraduate credit from the New School for Social Research in New York. Most of the courses focus on technology and its effect on society; others provide more practical lessons in electronic publishing, journalism, and telecommunications. Most Connect Ed students are full-time professionals taking courses for personal and professional development.

Currently, a sequence of Connect Ed courses fulfills the requirements for a 39-credit degree program leading to an MA in Media Studies. This master's program is equivalent to the on-campus version at the New School for Social Research and earns students a New School degree. An undergraduate degree is the only prerequisite for the on-line master's program.

Connect Ed courses are two



months long and cost \$316 per graduate credit and \$296 per undergraduate credit, which includes the cost of connect time. In addition to the per-credit costs, there

are registration fees and local telephone charges for calling the network. Connect Ed welcomes nonmatriculating students, who want to take classes but don't care about credits. These students must meet the same entry requirements as matriculating students and pay undergraduate credit fees.

American Open University


A part of the New York Institute of Technology, AOU offers bachelor's degrees in behavioral sciences, business administration, and general studies. The courses are open to matriculating and nonmatriculating students, with registration fees varying according to registration status. On-line students at AOU can follow a suggested course sequence that leads to a degree or consult with a faculty adviser to design a study plan that more closely matches their particular interests.

The only entrance requirement for the American Open University undergraduate degree programs is a high school diploma. AOU gives credit for college-level courses, work and military experience relevant to the degree, and national proficiency exams. According to the program's director, Andrew Sass, most students receive half the required degree credits for nonacademic learning experiences.

On-line students do an equal amount of work and take the same exams as campus-based students. At exam time, AOU arranges for a local proctor to administer and supervise tests at a location near students' homes.

Students choosing to get their AOU degree on-line receive the same degree as students who com-

plete their course sequence on campus, which is important for students considering graduate study at another institution. If the school they want to attend recognizes the AOU/NYIT degree, it doesn't matter whether it was completed on campus or on-line. Students are, however, advised to make sure that the graduate school will accept the degree.

Base tuition for attending the American Open University is \$85 per credit hour. Additional course costs include computer-conferencing fees; evaluation fees; examination fees; course-change fees if you change your mind after enrolling; and finally, a graduation fee.

Nova

Nova University, in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, offers master's and doctor of arts degrees in computerbased training, information systems, and education. Education professionals can also pursue a "doctor of education in computer education" (Ed.D./CED) degree. Degrees from Nova University are somewhat controversial. Many universities do not recognize the doctor of arts degree, and the Nova

DA and Ed.D./CED degree requirements are considerably less rigorous than campus-based doctoral programs.

ings reflect this institution's commitment to technology in education. Nova uses a sophisticated UNIX-based host environment for all on-line work. In addition to computer conferencing, students have access to statistical tools, relational databases, and simulation languages.

Students must meet standard admission requirements to enroll in a Nova degree program. They need a bachelor's degree for entry into the master's programs and a master's degree for the doctoral program.

Nova does not award academic credit for prior experiences such as military or work activities. Once enrolled, though, students get credits for work-related projects.

In each degree program, Nova students take core courses pertinent to their area of study. Then, instead of a master's thesis or doctoral dissertation, they complete practicums or major field projects. For these projects, students conduct an in-depth investigation of a topic or situation that bears on their profession.

Unlike the American Open University and Connected Education, Nova requires students to show up at the Nova campus twice a year for one-week institutes. With an annual tuition of \$4,500, Nova University is as expensive as some regular university graduate programs. And, in addition to the hefty tuition, Nova recommends that students budget approximately \$2,500 more per year for miscellaneous expenses, including books, Tymnet charges, and trips to the institutes. 

enough to get an advanced degree. Many enjoy learning but can't stand the thought of being enrolled in one more degree program. With the exception of Nova, all these programs let you register for courses as a nonmatriculating student and reap the same intellectual benefits.

Another alternative is the selfproclaimed party school of on-line education, AppleLink University. AU resides in AppleLink-The Personal Edition, Apple Computer's new on-line service. It has one goal: to teach students how to use the power of their personal computer. To accomplish this objective, AU courses last five weeks and focus on programming and how to use specific software packages such as AppleWorks. They vary in the amount of on-line time required and cost \$20. AU doesn't award degrees, but successful completion of a course gets you a certificate.

Students of any age who need tutoring in math, English, computer science, general studies, or science can get it in the AppleLink Learning Center. Tutoring sessions take place nightly and on weekends,

and the only cost is for connect time. In addition to these sessions, AppleLink offers the 20-volume Grolier Academic American Encyclopedia.

The Learning Center is also the gateway to the University of Tomorrow, which includes courses in


business writing, computer science, English, math, and general studies. These classes take place in real time and focus on academic subjects. Between course sessions, students can participate in personal-enrichment courses. Right now, for example, intersession course of-

ferings include seminars on atmospheric ecology and vocabulary development.

The Skeptic Speaks

I went to school the traditional way and admit to strong negative sentiments about on-line degrees. On the other hand, talking to people involved with on-line education programs opened my eyes to the need to offer a greater variety of educational opportunities to nontraditional students.

For instance, American Open University caters to a predominantly male and mobile student body that doesn't stay in one place long enough to finish a degree. For example, AOU students in the military spend time on aircraft carriers or in remote corners of the globe and can't possibly attend an oncampus degree program. Without the learning opportunity offered by AOU, these students would probably never get a college degree. Viewed from this perspective, on-line education performs a vital role in our educational-delivery system and opens educational opportunities for a significant population segment.

As for the educational quality of on-line courses, it is hard to judge from course catalogs and interviews. To get some perspective, I accepted an invitation from Paul Levinson, the director of Connected Education, to peek into a course he teaches, "Ethics in the Technological World."

What I found was an honest-to-goodness college-level course that resembled courses I took in graduate school at Stanford University. The physical bodies were missing, but the course requirements were more or less the same. The on-line lectures were shorter and more focused than in-person ones. Exchanges among students and professor were lively, interesting, and informed. I could find nothing to indicate that this class was qualitatively different than one of the oncampus variety.

So, my attitude has definitely shifted. What excites me about the electronic classroom is its potential to enhance the educational process. Without time constraints, students have more time to think about what they're studying. And because they have to write their com-

ments and arguments, they get valuable practice organizing and presenting their thoughts so that others will understand them.

Furthermore, telecommunications can furnish guest lecturers and provide unique opportunities

for students to interact with experts in their fields. And students don't have to spend time going to the bookstore or library. True to the medium, most on-line course materials are available on-line, eliminating searches for materials on reading lists.

On-line education is just in its infancy. The people involved,

however, see a bright future for it and are working hard to expand course offerings.



Shop till you drop with your Apple

BAUD IT!

hen I log onto an information service, my activities are absolutely predictable. Since my professional interests revolve around computers in education, I spend my on-line time and money in education forums or reference databases. One thing I've never even considered doing is shopping.


After I spent \$73,000 on the Education Dream Machine in the July '88 issue of A+, however, the rest of the editors decided that I had what it took to explore on-line shopping. So, with credit-card numbers and expiration dates in view, I blasted through Compu-Serve's Electronic Mall like a supermarket-sweep contestant.

Before we go shopping, you should know that electronic shopping is not a service unique to CompuServe. Today you can shop on most of the on-line services, but the range of product offerings and merchants may vary from one to the next.

So Let's Go, OK?

I hate to admit it, but I had a great time. Looking at the Mall's product index, I didn't just see categories such as computer accessories, hardware, and software, which is what I'd expected. I also saw jewelry, gourmet coffee, and gardening supplies! What a relief— I really was at a mall! Admittedly, there are no potted palms, crowds, or irate salespeople, but parking is never a problem, and electronic shoppers can buy cosmetics and check out new-car prices within minutes without having to go anywhere at all.

Convenience is only one of the



aspects of shopping with your computer. Another benefit that novice telecommunicators will appreciate is that teleshopping is incredibly easy. If you've ever purchased an item from a mail-order catalog, you have all the experience you need to shop till you drop with your personal computer.

Material Girl

The hardest decision I made during my foray into CompuServe's Electronic Mall was on where to start. I opted to go to the New Car



Showroom and do some comparison shopping for a BMW 635 CSi and a Jaguar XJ-Vanden Plas (1988 models). I was interested to find out that both cars cost about \$47,000 (the BMW costs \$46,325, whereas the Jaguar will run you \$47,950); you cannot order an AM radio for either one; the Jag has more hip room in the rear seat; and if you buy the BMW, you will get

hit with a gas-guzzler tax of \$1,050.

Next stop: the professional shoppette's mecca—Bloomingdale's! I expected to find designer clothes. Instead I found only cosmetics, housewares, luggage, and gifts. Since clothes weren't an option and I'm in my "late" thirties, I thought I'd find something useful in cosmetics. I was right—anti-aging complex, herbal body wraps, skin renewal therapy restorative night creme, and Firmant Des Rides (wrinkle cream) were all there to tempt me.


Thinking about wrinkles at Bloomies was too depressing, so I headed to Brooks Brothers to find something special for the "Him" in my life. Much of BB's best-known merchandise, which is beautifully displayed in the company's print catalog, is also available on-line. You can buy Brooks Brothers shirts and chinos as well as some specialty items such as tartan-plaid boxer shorts, the Silent Butler, and the Executive Jigsaw Puzzle.

The perfect place to buy presents for your doggie is at the New York Kennel Club. Here you can register your dog; buy dog food, grooming aids, and pet beds; have all your pertinent pet-health and behavior questions answered by an expert named Rover; and go through an extensive Q&A to help determine which is the best puppy for you. Another pet-related service for people who really love their pet and can't leave home without it is the Traveling With Your Pet database, a list of hotels and motels around the country that allow pets in the rooms.

By far the most entertaining stop on my shopping spree was Hammacher Schlemmer. Need a heated birdbath for \$62.75? Considering a two-way indoor putting green and a solar-powered ventilated golf cap? Then this is the place for you.

I spent my shopping time looking at everything but computer-related products, but for those of you on the lookout for a good deal, CompuServe's Electronic Mall includes sources for all kinds of hardware and software products. While you're shopping, don't forget to stop in at the major book publishers and book retailers. You'll find many publications that should appeal to computer hobbyists as well as computer professionals.

If you buy only Brooks Brothers shirts or give lots of gift baskets from Crabtree & Evelyn, for example, electronic shopping is as convenient as ordering over the telephone. And, as I learned last Christmas, you can't beat it for ordering books, CDs, computer paraphernalia, prepackaged gourmet food items, and flowering bulbs. +







Orchestrating words, graphics, and pages

Apple II owners interested in desk- such as AppleWorks than it

Apple II owners interested in desktop publishing, or DTP, are probably thinking of combining text and graphics in colorful club newspapers, school reports, small-business presentations, and the like. Most of the handful of DTP programs for the Apple II family work on a broad range of II models and so don't cater to the special powers of the IIGS. As A+ reported back in September 1988, GraphicWriter from DataPak Software was once the only IIGS-specific DTP package. Now there's another choice: Medley from Milliken Publishing.

DTP 1-2-3?

Aldus' PageMaker for the Macintosh and PC is mainly a "page-layout" tool. It does have some rudimentary word-processing features for adding and editing text, as well as a few art features for putting lines and boxes onto a page. But most of PageMaker's command repertory concerns the precise placement, spacing, and appearance on a page of text and art imported from other programs.

Medley doesn't follow that example. Instead, it includes a complete word-processing program, a fairly complete paint program, and the heart of a drawing program, all in the same package. This package is more akin to integrated software

such as AppleWorks than it is to traditional page-layout stuff. Tying together the three parts of Medley are special formatting commands that allow you to accurately place on a page the text, drawn objects, and painted pictures you have created within the program (see figures 1–3). Medley can also read Apple-Works text files directly and can import graphic art from other Ap-

ple II programs.

To run this big bundle, Medley demands a big IIGS: at least 1.25Mb of RAM. If you want to avoid twiddling your thumbs while formatting pages, you'll probably want even more RAM-as much as 2Mb-so you can load the entire program into a RAM disk. Then there's a color printer to consider, pretty necessary if you're going to take real IIGS advantage of this software to design and print in color. I used a single 3.5-inch disk drive and didn't find it too much of a problem, but having a pair of drives, or even a hard-disk drive, would be nice for keeping the spelling dictionary and thesaurus handy, especially if you didn't have a big RAM disk working on your side.

The central part of Medley is the word processor. Here you'll find

most of the features you might look for in an independent word-processing program, tucked into standard pull-down menus: cut/copy/paste, find and replace with whole-word and case options, text style, size, font selection, and so on. Font selection isn't as easy to get to as I'd like. A single menu command opens up a dialog box—I like to see it all in menus—but it does the job.

A spelling checker and a thesaurus are among the sophisticated editing features. The thesaurus is more generous than most computer thesauri in that it includes definitions, showing you synonyms for each meaning and the parts of speech the word can take. Other special editing features include a Shortcuts menu (for moving to a particular page or selecting a sentence or paragraph without leaving the keyboard) and menu commands for moving from one open document window to another. An Undo command lets you step back from too-hasty commands and mistaken efforts. There is no header or footer command.

The word processor shows its page-layout features when you look at the Format and Special Effects menus. Here you can align text to the left, right, or center, or justify it across a page or column. You can also set tabs, which isn't too impressive until you see the variety available: left, right, center, or decimal, each with a choice of four kinds of leaders (blanks, dots, dashes, or a solid line). Medley has horizontal rulers you can hide or show to see what you're doing with text, graphics, and tabs and also offers you the option of seeing special symbols on the screen for spaces, tabs, and paragraph breaks. The program also has a gutter margin setting buried in the File menu and a versatile page-numbering

Then come the big guns: pagelayout abilities that don't seriously challenge professional DTP software but are a cut above what you find in standard word-processing programs. Medley's Hyphenation command can automatically hyphenate an entire document or selected section or ask you about each word to be hyphenated, using information from the same dictionary that feeds the spelling checkMedley is more akin to integrated software such as AppleWorks than to traditional page-layout stuff.

er. The program also gives you the option of entering "soft" hyphens to break words. Unlike the hard hyphens that always appear, these don't come into play unless the word is at the end of a line. Another DTP format feature is the "leading" command, which lets you specify, in points—a standard publishing measurement—the space between lines of text and between paragraphs.

Medley automatically "kerns" letters (moving letters closer together when their shape allows—such as an uppercase T and a lowercase i), but it doesn't let you select your own kerning. I don't know an Apple II program that does offer kerning control, but professional desktop-publishing packages on other computers do.

Word Wrap

The heart of Medley's DTP abilities is in the Change Page Layout menu command. It lets you choose the kind of word wrap you want to use and whether "global" art—graphics that you've specified to appear on all pages of a manuscript—actually appears on any given page.

The word-wrap choices are vital to publishing because they determine whether each line of the text on a page wraps along beside any graphics or continues on the other side of the graphics to the edge of the page. That's how you "flow"

your text into columns and around graphics. What Medley doesn't have is an easy way to continue text from one page or area on a page to an unattached page or area. You know how articles in newspapers and magazines are often interrupted by lines such as "continued on back page" or "see page 108"? Medley doesn't let you position and link boxes of text the way many DTP programs do but instead just flows the text on a page around any graphics on that page. So to continue articles that begin on the front page on later pages, you must use the cut-and-paste option-a major difference between Medley and standard DTP.

Drawing Precision

Putting text and graphics together on a page is central to DTP. Medley offers both drawing commands and an integrated paint program for creating or modifying graphics. It also lets you import graphic images from files you've created with other Apple II paint programs. Text automatically wraps around this art according to the principles you've laid down in the Page Layout dialog box. For example, you could take a page full of text and draw a tall, skinny rectangle down the center, right on top of the text. The text on that page would then run down the left side of the rectangle and leap back to the top of the right side of the page and continue on from there to the bottom of the page. Or, if you chose Wrap Across, each line of text would leap from the left edge of the rectangle to its right edge, continue to the right margin on the page, and then continue back on the next line down at the left margin. In either case, the text would not appear within the object.




Figure 4: Medley's menu of drawing commands lets you draw, group, move, and resize a variety of geometrical shapes.

The drawing commands, on a single menu, let you draw rectangles, rounded rectangles, ovals, and polygons (see figure 4). You can group (for editing as a unit), move, and

resize these shapes. A special window shows numeric values—to the sixteenth of an inch—for positioning and sizing a selected object if the rulers aren't precise enough for you. Another set of drawing commands lets you convert one type of object to another (such as rectangle to oval), turn the object's borders on or off, and dictate whether it will show on all pages. That last option is the only route to creating "guides"—lines to contain text and put it into columns throughout a document. I would prefer explicit guideline commands, especially for making multicolumn documents.

A Bit More Painting

Medley has commands for making its own art or for importing pictures from disk files. Its clip-art disk is stuffed with hundreds of images. It also includes a command for exporting art you've created with the drawing or painting commands. Painting commands? That is right—one of the choices in the Drawing menu is actually a paint program.

The paint program takes a bit of time to load, along with its own menus and icon command palette. You can use it to draw within any "areas" you've created with the drawing commands (rectangles, ovals, whatever). It has colors and patterns to choose from; filled and empty rectangles, ovals, polygons, and so on; and the standard paint paraphernalia: paint can, airbrush, pencil, eraser, selection lasso, text tool, and magnifier. If you've used any Mac or IIGS paint program, you'll be able to navigate through this one without the manual. There are also commands for editing patterns, changing colors, flipping or shrinking selected areas, and so on. You won't find color cycling, palette editing, perspective, and other sophisticated paint commands in this program, though. When you are done editing within an area, you can print or return to the word processor.

You can move, resize, and crop art that's imported from disk files. The three options for selecting the color palette for this art aren't well explained—you have to try one and then another to see which makes the best on-screen display. An option in both the drawing and painting programs lets you switch to gray-scale images on the screen.

Many scanned pictures look better in gray scale, so this option is a nice feature of the program.

Printing

When you're finished editing, drawing, painting, and laying out, you can see the results of your key tapping and mouse clicking by using the Show Page command to see the current page in detail on the screen, or you can just print the thing.

I used an ImageWriter LQ to see the color of my graphics. It's too bad you can't edit the text in color too. If you go with a LaserWriter printer, you'll miss the color, but you'll be able to work with a wider variety of fonts and enlargement and reduction options. Medley can use only the fonts in the Laser-Writer, however; it can't download new fonts. And the clip art that comes with the package is bitmapped at ImageWriter resolution, so it looks jagged when printed on a LaserWriter. There is no option for printing color separations—a necessity if you're thinking of professional printing.

Waiting a Lot

The Medley manual is clear, and the program's on-line help command lets you call up explanations for each menu command.

The one question I really wanted an answer to, however, was "Why is this program so slow?" Medley is a sloth at displaying even simple text. I tried the Show Markers option that puts dots on the page for each space between words and arrows for tabs. Medley needed 5 seconds just to display that change on a mere 13 lines. It is just as slow at times when displaying text without markers—you can watch the lines appear as if you were communicating at 1200 baud with a modem, which is fine for telecommunications but not for a word processor—and even dialog boxes

can take a while to appear.

I also noticed several times when the screen did not properly redraw after I moved a graphic: Pieces of text remained in view even when they should have been erased and disappeared only after I'd scrolled away and then come back. [At press time, Milliken was readying version 1.1 of Medley for release. The company claims the new version will redraw the screen three times faster than does version 1.0.—Editors]

Laying Out Conclusions

Medley is really a word-processing program with an attached paint program, a few drawing commands, and more precise control of margins and word wrap than you'll find in any word-processing program. Its most serious flaws are its inability to link text between separate pages and boxes, its lack of guideline commands, and its distressing lack of speed.

The big pluses are a great thesaurus, its ability to wrap words across graphics and around oddly shaped graphics, a global art command, a good manual, and tight integration of drawing and word-processing commands. The competing GraphicWriter offers a color separation facility; Medley does not. But then, Medley has lots more text-editing features than does GraphicWriter.

If you don't already own a IIGS word-processing program, Medley might be the best DTP choice for you. Otherwise, it is still a solid competitor, if you don't expect professional results and aren't tense when waiting for slow execution.





Serious music-making comes to the IIGS

A lthough the Apple IIGS has more built-in music potential than any other personal computer, software that fully uses the IIGS's Ensoniq sound chip and MIDI (Musical Instrument Digital Interface) input/output has been slow to appear. So IIGS owners who are serious about getting the IIGS to do wonderful audible tricks or want to hook up those megabuck (or minibuck) MIDI synthesizers have just had to be patient—silently patient.

Now the IIGS music connection crescendos with the release of two music products that represent the most substantial effort yet to bring MIDI to the IIGS.

Digital Tape Recorder

Don't let the bogus Norman Rockwell package art and the singalong sales pitch fool you. Diversi-Tune from Diversified Software Research is a serious and potent MIDI recorder.

In one of his several professional lives, programmer Bill (Diversi-Copy/Cache/Key) Basham has spent time behind a recording-studio mixing console. Little surprise,

then, that Diversi-Tune is inspired by the relationship between man, music, and tape recorders. In fact, Diversi-Tune essentially is a multitrack tape recorder without the microphones, mixers, and tape reels. Anyone who has ever manned the transport at a recording session mixing sound on sound or sound with sound, or overdubbing mistakes—will feel at home.

Connect a MIDI keyboard to the IIGS (using either Apple's external MIDI box or an internal MIDI card), set Diversi-Tune to record, and the "tape" is rolling. The software records the notes, rhythm, and—if your keyboard allows it—volume (velocity) of the music you're playing.

Unlike conventional MIDI recording software, Diversi-Tune does not metronomically dictate tempo. Like a tape recorder, Diversi-Tune records whatever you play, irregular tempi and all. It makes Diversi-Tune music files sound more human than those on tempo-rigid MIDI recorders. It can also make finding specific places in the score difficult, though, since

the program provides no reference points related to measures, beats, or notes. An imitation tape counter at the bottom of the screen helps, but it's too imprecise.

Thus, editing scores or fixing mistakes becomes a matter of pure ear power. Listen for the spots you want to change, make note of the counter value, step through the score one note at a time to pinpoint the spot, and then use an overdub feature to re-record the offending passage. In the sound-on-sound tape-recorder tradition, you can also add more notes to existing tracks.

any users will make little use of the program's recording abilities. They will just employ Diversi-Tune to play back prerecorded data disks from DSR. Current disks range from folk songs and Gay Nineties tunes to an agreeable jazz "album" recorded live by pianist Nathen Page during Boston Apple-Fest 1988.

The program also boasts a unique sing-along feature. The lyrics of a song appear on the screen

while a bouncing ball ticks off the text in accurate rhythm (see figure 1). The sing-along song disks from DSR include this feature, and you can add words and bouncing ball to your own song files.

Diversi-Tune's interface truly goes it alone. Basham has created a unique user interface that does not follow Apple's guidelines, which means that this program (written in ProDOS 8, by the way) doesn't look like the mouse/menu products common to the IIGS. In general, operation is efficient, although some functions, such as overdubbing, require more than a few keystrokes to accomplish. Basham suggests having a second person present to handle the recording controls.

The sacrifice of Apple's Human Interface standards boosts Diversi-Tune in the music department. By losing the visual baggage of Apple's sacred interface, Basham has brought off some surprising programming tricks.

Programmers inside and outside Apple doubt that it is possible to use the IIGS internal voices and MIDI at the same time. Diversi-Tune does it, though, turning your computer into a musical instrument. With four piano sounds and a percussion set available on the program disk, whatever you play on the attached MIDI keyboard is relayed directly to the IIGS's audio innards. Instant piano. And when you connect the computer to a stereo card and external speakers, the

audio quality is outstanding.

Although the MIDI specifications allow only 16 channels of data transmission, Diversi-Tune effectively doubles the number by distinguishing between data sent to the printer and to the modem ports. A configuration screen permits users to route Diversi-Tune's 32 tracks to any combination of printer and modem ports as well as the 15 IIGS internal voices. With two MIDI interfaces, Diversi-Tune provides a quantum leap in MIDI flexibility—more power than most Diversi-Tune users will ever need.

Diversi-Tune can be a serious tool for creative musicians, but serious musicians are the ones who will spot its limitations along with its genius. The lack of visual indicators in music editing was acceptable in the days of tape-only music

making, but our MIDI world has grown fond of visible editing devices. Moving back and forth through Diversi-Tune's surrogate tape is just not as convenient as clicking on the right spot in a visual display of measures and notes.

Furthermore, since Diversi-Tune currently does not use any of the common MIDI file standards, music you create with Diversi-Tune is usable only with Diversi-Tune.

Still, Diversi-Tune is a remarkable product, one that brings together playback audio quality for musical couch potatoes, turns the IIGS into a good-quality instrument for hands-on musicians, and provides a flexible and powerful MIDI recorder. It's truly an all-in-one music studio.

Junior Master

Like Diversi-Tune, Passport Design's Master Tracks Jr. (MT Jr.) uses the image of a tape-recorder transport for creating music files from MIDI keyboard input. In other respects, however, MT Jr. provides a more conventional and familiar environment for MIDI re-

cording and sequencing. Although MT Jr. costs nearly twice as much as Diversi-Tune, it's priced in the low range of professionally oriented MIDI sequencers.

MT Jr. operates with a MIDI keyboard connected to an internal MIDI card or an external MIDI box connected to the modem or printer port. You can synchronize the IIGS to the internal clock or to an external source such as a drum box.

On-screen tools include a metronome, a slider to set tempo, bar/ beat and elapsed-time displays to locate exact points in a score, and the "tape transport" controls.

Other MT Jr. features common among MIDI sequencers include a Punch In/Out button to define a section of a score for re-recording (great for correcting your mistakes), a Key button that begins the recorder on the first MIDI keystroke, and a MIDI Thru selector to pass incoming data to the MIDI




Figure 2: The status of MT Jr.'s 64 tracks appears in the sequencer window (left). The song-editor window (right) uses filled-in blocks as a visual representation of tracks.

Out port on the channel you choose. In short, MT Jr. is a medium-level, highly capable MIDI recorder and sequencer, clearly the place to start if you're a would-be MIDI mayen.

The status of MT Jr.'s 64 tracks appears in the sequencer window (see figure 2). A one-line entry shows track number; play status (play, mute or solo); record status (on or off); the name you have assigned to the track; MIDI channel; program number; and whether the track is slated to play once and stop or whether it repeats (loops) continuously throughout the score.

Looping is particularly convenient for composing. Record four measures of a percussion track, for example, and have them loop indefinitely, maintaining the tempo while you play the rest of the composition. Then rewrite the percussion track to respond to specific melodic and harmonic events. During recording, MT Jr. can jump to the next track immediately after you've completed the previous track. This instant access is a time and inspiration saver during hot and heavy creative sessions.

The song-editor window (see figure 2) uses filled-in blocks as a visual representation of tracks and provides cut-and-paste editing. Do you think the third measure of track 4 would sound better in the eighth measure of track 32? Highlight it with the mouse, cut it, and paste it into the desired location.

Or if you would prefer to have the measure in both places, copy it to the new spot. Editing a single track or several consecutive tracks in Master Tracks Jr. is as easy as manipulating text in a word-processing program.

Those who are experienced in the ways of MIDI will find many other features that make musical life worth living: quantization (rhythm smoothing) with a variable percentage of correction; recording of all MIDI data including pitch bend, controller info, program change, polyphonic aftertouch, velocity, and modulation; a filter to ignore any of the above MIDI data during recording; and the ability to change the meter and tempo of any or all tracks.

Finally, MT Jr. can export MIDI files in the OpCode Systems format, which means you can trade music files with colleagues who use other OpCode-compatible se-

quencers. If you need to see or print musical notation of your creations, you can use the Pyware MIDI Translator to export your MIDI files to Pyware Music Writer.

Operation of MT Jr. is smooth and surprisingly fast. All IIGS users expect some delays during screen redrawing, however, and they'll find them here, too. The editing and quantizing features are brisk and easy to use, although I found the results of quantizing somewhat eccentric at times. Fortunately, an Undo option lets you try several different quantizing options to get the results you need.

MT Jr. does not access the internal voices of the IIGS. The trade-off is that it does follow the Apple-approved interface guidelines, so you'll find a comfortable and familiar mouse/menu means of controlling the program.

Master Tracks Jr. is the MIDI program IIGS music fans have been expecting. It doesn't have all the fea-



tures of a professional-level MIDI sequencer. You can't directly edit MIDI data values, for instance, because the program doesn't display them. Yet, the program is capable of controlling even an elaborate array of MIDI synthesizers with muscle and flexibility.

MIDI is here, at last, on the IIGS. With Diversi-Tune and Master Tracks Jr., the IIGS has made the first significant strides toward becoming the music powerhouse it can be.

A feature-laden, complex telecommunications program

MODEM MGR

odem MGR is a telecommunications program that meets nearly every need, although it is not designed for everyone. The program has more features than you are ever likely to need, but it also has a sometimes complex and less than modern user interface.

Modem MGR handles all the common forms of file transfer, including text (normal speed, variable slow speed, and Xon/Xoff paced) and protocol. You can select the standard XModem protocol, a modified XModem for slow packetswitching networks, the so-called AE Xmodem, or a special Modem MGR protocol for sending files between Apple II computers running Modem MGR. The program can perform Binary II translation during uploading and downloading and can save the current screen image to a capture buffer.

Modem MGR comes with a robust set of 36 macro commands that enable you to automate many of the operations you would otherwise have to perform manually, such as dialing, waiting for calls, or sending strings of text. My only criticism is that the "if" type command is limited to comparing two single characters rather than full strings.

The user interface resembles that in ASCII Express: You enter commands as single letters and specify other information on menus that appear when you select a particular command. You can also call for online help at any time.

Some other telecommunications

programs use a device like the AppleWorks file card or mouse-driven menu to make using the program more intuitive. For newer users, Modem MGR's "unfriendly" interface may be a problem, but more-experienced users who want this program's features and power should not have any trouble.

Composing and Receiving

Every telecommunications program worthy of the name includes at least a rudimentary text editor.

Modem MGR has a full-screen editor with multiple (including reverse) scroll, cursor movement, and 24 editing commands such as insert, delete, justify, find and replace, and file merge.

A split-screen option uses the top 19 lines on the screen to display incoming text while the bottom 4 lines display text that you are entering to send to a remote computer. This division keeps your text separate from what you're receiving. In the split-screen mode, you can also choose to send each character as you type it or to send text a line at a time when you press the Return key. My only quarrel with the split screen is that you must select it as part of the installation pro-

cess, rather than switch it on and off while using the program.

When you are communicating with a remote minicomputer or mainframe, your computer functions as a terminal connected to that remote computer. In the case of most on-line services, your computer emulates a TTY (teletypewriter) terminal.

In some cases, particularly when you're working with a university, corporate, or other special remote computer, your program must be able to act like a specialized terminal. The remote computer sends signals that tell your computer how to format text that appears on the screen, but it works only if your telecommunications program can interpret the signals properly. This interpretive ability is known as terminal emulation.

Modem MGR can emulate the DEC VT- 220, VT-100, and VT-52; Soroc; ADM3-A; IBM 3101; Televideo; Data General D200; and ADDS terminals. In addition, Modem MGR comes with a program that lets you define your own terminal features if you need a terminal-emulation capability that is not predefined.

Compatibility

Many programs that work with older Apple II computers and interface cards do not work with newer equipment. Modem MGR, by contrast, runs on every member of the Apple II family, from the original Apple II to the IIGS. It works with nearly all 80-column display cards for the earlier Apple II models and a wide variety of



Exploring Japan with Jet - Now that Japan Scenery Disk is included with Jet, we'd like to offer some suggestions for exploring the Japanese countryside from the cockpit of your F-16.

First, a close-up view of Tokyo. Take off from Hyakuri Airport (North 18542, East 32874) and turn to a heading of 187 degrees. This flight path takes you into the peninsula forming the right boundary of Tokyo Bay (see Tokyo area chart). At Mach 1 this heading should bring you to New Tokyo International Airport at Narita in about five minutes. Turn right to a heading of 270 degrees at Narita to put yourself on a direct course to Tokyo. When Tokyo comes into view, throttle back to 45% and drop altitude to 1,000 feet to explore the city. Highlights including Tokyo Tower and the Emperor's Palace will be clearly visible, with many high-rise skyscrapers to the north. Head for Tokyo International Airport (Haneda) in the southwest part of the city. Make your approach and land at Tokyo International. Keep your airspeed low and don't overshoot the runway or you'll end up in Tokyo Bay! Next month - another Japanese adventure!

ThunderChopper Missions - While ThunderChopper puts you at the controls of a heavily armed attack helicopter, you'll have to complete a set of introductory flight/rescue/combat training missions before you can fly into battle. In the first combat mission, Armed Escort, you must guide your battle-weary ground troops to safety through enemy territory. Their only way out is through a valley guarded by heavily-armed guerilla fighters. Its up to you to locate and destroy any enemy units that attack your men along the way. Deadly accurate aim is essential; there's no way to rearm in combat. Get yourself and your troops back safely to receive a mission evaluation and performance rating. (Coming next month - Rescue at Sea)

new and old serial-interface cards, internal and external modems, printer-interface cards, printers, and clock cards—including such oldies-but-goodies in the Apple II world as the Videx UltraTerm display card, the Apple-Cat II modem, and DOS 3.3.

This richness of compatibility comes with a small price that you have to pay at least once, however. Because Modem MGR has so many options from which to choose, the installation process is more complex than that of most modern telecommunications programs.

Support

Modem MGR is available only by mail order direct from the author. Support is available by telephone (not toll-free) on an unlimited basis for the first two months after purchase and once a month thereafter. The manual provides excellent instructions on using the program and serves as a telecommunications reference as well.

Some people may find Modem MGR too much program. If all you want to do is perform simple, TTY-type telecommunications, the program is too powerful, and the added complexity is not for you. But if you want one of the most flexible and full-featured telecommunications programs available for the Apple II today, you should look into this program.

Can a computer game make you crazy?

Ask the red-eyed, callus-fingered multitudes who've surrendered to the paddlemania of Taito's smash arcade hit, Arkanoid. They know the answer: A big "you know it, good buddy.'

Taito's Arkanoid proves that you can teach an old mouse new clicks. Consider the game play. Move the controller (mouse or joystick) to shift a paddle across the bottom of the screen. That paddle is bouncing a ball at a wall of bricks. Every time the ball hits a brick, the brick disappears. The goal? Destroy

Sound familiar?

The bricks that built Arkanoid are the same ones that formed the foundation of Break-Out, lo these many computergame-playing years ago. In fact, it's hard to go much further back in the history of electronic games than Break-Out.

But Arkanoid is Break-Out with modern genius, a classic that has been tickled, crowbarred, and crystallized into one of the most fascinating arcade games of all time. At least that's the way it was in Taito's arcade original.

And that's also the way it is in Taito's Apple IIGS conversion, the company's first Apple game.

The bogus science-fiction plot stretched around Arkanoid isn't what makes the game intriguing (I still can't figure out what the plot has to do with the game). It's the whole slew of Break-Out advances.

ers require two or more contacts before they disappear. Still others never go away at all but act as obstacles that send your ball careening away at desirable and undesirable angles.


And the nasties. The little, irritating, meddle-

Of course, the greed factor takes over when you're intercepting power pills. Legions of





SINK THAT BATTLESHIP

Dive Bomber is a new concept in flight simulators. It integrates a historical incident with a twist of fantasy to let you play the key role in one of the most significant naval actions of World War II—the sinking of the German super battleship the *Bismarck*.

The game puts you into the cockpit of a Grumman Avenger, an American torpedo bomber that became the most effective airplane of its type. On May 26, 1941, the day the game recreates, Avenger was an unproven design. In Dive Bomber, the prototype has been secretly shipped

to the British aircraft carrier Ark Royal. Your mission: find the German battleship and send her to the bottom of the ocean.

That's the fantasy. In reality, the Bismarck was damaged during a battle with the British battle cruiser Hood. The Bismarck sank the Hood, but on May 26, 1941, while she attempted to escape to Brest, a British Swordfish flying from the Ark Royal torpedoed her, crippling her steering gear. Early the next morning, the British battleships King George V and Rodney and two other warships sank the Bismarck.

Flying the Avenger requires you to perform the duties of three crew members: the pilot, who flys the plane, operates the forward-firing machine guns, and drops the torpedo; the gunner/engineer, who fires the ball-turret guns and

tracks enemy threats.

Dive Bomber consists of five increasingly difficult missions, which you choose by drawing straws from the Captain of the *Ark Royal*.

A typical mission begins with a look at the navigator's situation map to note the locations of the German Dornier aircraft; mines; E-boats; U-boats; and, of course, the Bismarck. But don't worry about her yet. First you've got to clear the sea lanes around your ship. If it's sunk, you have no recourse but to ditch into the cold North Atlantic.

Strategy is important. Throughout the mission, you'll encounter enemy aircraft that attack both the Avenger and the Ark Royal. At times, the threats come so quickly you must choose which one to deal with. Meanwhile, you must monitor the position of the Bismarck, which is trying to escape by sailing off the map.

Dive Bomber is not easy. Success requires a sound strategy for attacking multiple threats in order of priority. Sinking the *Bismarck* isn't a piece of cake either. You must come in low and hit the target. If you miss, the mission ends abruptly, which is the most frustrating aspect of the game.

The documentation is brief but provides excellent step-by-step infor-

mation for most Avenger operations, but the section that deals with torpedo attacks, the most important part of the game, offers little advice other than altitude and airspeed information. You hone your technique through trial and error.

Dive Bomber has a lot to offer: The graphics are strikingly brilliant and smoothly animated, the action is fast-paced and challenging, and the game builds tension from takeoff to torpedo drop. You soon forget it is a fantasy and concentrate on your one objective: sinking the *Bismarck*.

Any RPs you don't use are available for use on other worlds you inhabit, and they even accumulate at a rate of 6.25% every other turn. That's better than passbook savings! Save enough RPs, and you can move to a higher technological level, where warships are more powerful, and more expensive.

To conquer the galaxy, or even to avoid being conquered, you have to

build a significant armada, and for that you can't just pump every RP into the defense department. You have to increase your population, bolster your industrial capacity, and even devote some RPs to "social level." Without social investment and investment in the Planetary Environment, you can end up with "a lower birthrate, industrial sabotage, and pollution."

As you create task forces of starships, you receive reports of new systems that your scoutships have seen. The list of visited worlds, as well as the productive capacity of your own worlds, makeup of task forces, and all other details are available from pull-down menus in the IIGs version of the game. These menus sit atop a graphic depiction of the star systems of your galaxy. The simpler II version of the game makes do with a cruder graphic of the galaxy and information/action screens with the same details.

After you decide on your movements and

production or let the computer "auto-explore," you see your moves, as well as the moves of your enemies, on the screen. If you win in space and have the force to overwhelm any Planetary Defense Bases, you can land colonists and a garrison force. Then the planet will begin cranking out RPs for your side.

On your way to a heady total of victory points, you can save a game for later continuation or try some of the basic options such as solar debris, novas (random star explosions that destroy everything in a system), natural disasters (earthquake, plague you know, the stuff that reduces productive capacity), and xenophobes (weird life forms that stop interstellar trade and magnify battle losses).

Then there are the advanced options such as playing computer "veteran" empires, changing the costs of production, introducing levels of Navigation Technology and Industrial Technolo-

gy, and so on. In fact, since you can also alter the Victory Condition equation, you might even add some humanitarian concern. But not much.

The manual includes a tutorial game, which tells you step by step what choices to make and what effects to watch for. It concludes with a set of strategies including the Classic Opening (increasing industrial technology early and then reaping big RPs later), the Trout Variant (eliminating your army at first to reap even more RPs later, but risking a quick invasion), and the Gilligan's Island (a variant of the Trout Variant that depends on starting out from an isolated star system). This game has the feel of real star wars. Good luckand watch those Social Level expenses.


REVENGE WITH HANDS AND FEET

cued the princess from the evil warlord in that game, I began clamoring for a sequel. Well, the wait is over, and my clamoring has ceased. Although, to my knowledge, the creators of The Last Ninja (System Three Software Ltd.) have no connection with the creator of Karateka (Jordan Mechner), the new game qualifies as a worthy spiritual successor.

I am no Bruce Lee fan, and I abhor violence in real life, but I have spent the last few weeks glued to my Apple IIGs computer, pummeling the daylights out of the evil Ashikaga Clan, in accordance with The Last Ninja's plot. When you play, you seek revenge on the evil Shogun Kunitoki and his men, the Ashikaga Clan, because they have slaughtered not only your father, your brothers, and your closest friends, but also the entire brotherhood of the Ninja. That is, everyone except you. You are the last ninja (get it?).

The Last Ninja does not just appeal to your baser instincts by being

mindlessly violent. You need to use your strategic skills to make your way through the beautiful—but treacherous—island of Lin Fen in search of sacred scrolls belonging to your slain comrades.

The first of six areas you explore is called The Wastelands. I have seen wastelands before, but none so picture-postcardpretty as in the 16-bit IIGs version of this game. (The 8-bit version's double-hi-res graphics are a bit blocky but still create a fairly detailed environment.) If they want to call the manicured lawns and blooming shrubbery wastelands, though, so be it. On the first screen, practice your moves and fighting options, because no matter which direction you choose, you will meet your first foe. Even though your enemy has a weapon, you have only your hands and feet. But you're a ninja, right? and feet and hands can be formidable weapons.

As you go through the different areas, be sure to explore every possible direction—including river crossings and lava flows. You are expected to find (and use, when appropriate) many items throughout the six levels of the game. All the things you need are easy to spot (they blink), but if you miss an item, you will probably be stumped at some point and may have to start from the beginning. You can backtrack through a level, but you can't revisit a previous level.

Sometimes you won't have any trouble figuring out what to use where, and at other times, in true adventuregame fashion, you have to experiment. Some of the other weapons available to you are a staff; shuriken stars; and, of course, the weapon no self-respecting ninja would be caught dead without, a numchuka.

You can save your game at any time, and I recommend doing so both before attempting anything difficult and after accomplishing anything challenging. You can also restore the game at any point, which means you can stop after a few hours of game play, secure in the knowledge that your progress has not been in vain. You can resume from that same place whenever you wish.

And resume you will, for if fighting games are your thing, The Last Ninja will keep you entertained until your fateful encounter with the Shogun. You won't let him get away with his dastardly deeds now, will you? See you in Lin Fen.







Programming with Iconix

BY ROBERTA SCHWARTZ AND MICHAEL CALLERY

nce upon a time, in days of yore, when Steve Wozniak reigned supreme in the Apple kingdom, we recommended that all artists planning to work with microcomputer graphics learn to program. In those days, we didn't have the broad range of commercial software that we have now. If we wanted anything more elaborate than a simple

painted screen, we had to program it ourselves.

Today, with the availability of animation programs such as Fantavision, display programs such as Show Off, and a variety of paint programs that offer color cycling, we can create a dazzling graphic production without typing a single GOTO.

We still like to program, though. Programming can add special effects to our graphics, allowing us to create interactive images that respond to the viewer, for instance.

Ye olde Applesoft BASIC, the programming language built into all Apple II computers, lets you work with only low-res and hi-res graphics, however. If you want to work

with double or super hi-res, you have to seek alternatives. You can work in assembly language, use Apple Programmer's Workshop (APW) languages such as C or Pascal or even Apple's own GS BASIC, which is available in preliminary form from the Apple Programmers' and Developers' Association (APDA). But, if you're not already

an accomplished programmer, you face a steep learning curve with any of these options. None of them are as convenient and available as Applesoft.

Fortunately, several developers have created tools to allow Applesoft access to these formerly inaccessible graphics modes. Beagle Graphics (from Beagle Bros, naturally) provides hopeful hackers

res screen, place text anywhere on the screen, plot shapes, and draw graphic images with your favorite paint program and then move them around for animated effects.

The core of Iconix is a small binary file that must be loaded prior to the GS tools. Once you've loaded it, you can access super-hi-res graphics by using the Applesoft PEEK, POKE, and CALL commands.


These commands let Applesoft read the contents of a memory location (PEEK), store a number in a memory location (POKE), and execute a machine-language routine stored at a particular address (CALL).

POKE and CALL are particularly dangerous commands, as a POKE to the wrong address can destroy information your Apple needs to work properly, and a CALL to a wrong address can do just about anything. You can't damage your hardware with an incorrect POKE or CALL, but you can easily erase a disk or cause a spectacular software crash. If you follow Iconix's instructions carefully, though, you should have nothing to worry about.

Iconix provides commands to clear the screen, create a bar of color, invert a bar of color, load and display super-hi-res pictures, write text to the screen, read the mouse location, and plot an icon on the screen. This last routine is where Iconix gets its name (and its power).

Iconix defines an icon as a block

(Buns even quicker and more conveniently. (Runs with an AppleWorks GS or Three Easy Pieces on an Apple III, too.)

of pixels-that's it. (The icons in this program are not to be confused with the icons that Apple's Finder uses.) An icon can, therefore, be as small as one pixel or as large as almost the entire screen. You start with a special icon-starter screen and use the icon editor to create the icon sheet from any super-hi-res graphic that was previously created with a paint program. You can have up to 14 icons in a single "icon sheet" (see figure 1). You load the icon sheet, using standard ProDOS commands, and plot the icons on the screen with a couple of POKEs and CALLs. The POKEs tell Iconix where you've loaded the icon sheet, which icon you want to plot, and the icon's x and y coordinates; the CALL does the actual plotting. Using icons creatively, you can do nearly anything, from emulating Apple's desktop interface to doing fancy animation.

In programming terms, Iconix is really a block-shape utility much like Polarware's Graphics Magician for hi-res and Beagle Graphics for double hi-res. In fact, the only thing that makes Iconix less than a full-fledged super-hi-res blockshape animation system is the absence of high-level programs to help you manage your animation, such as those in Baudville's Take One (for hi-res) and Brøderbund's Animate (for double hi-res). We hope So What Software will create such tools, but even without them, vou can use Iconix to create effective super-hi-res animations.

The Package

In addition to the binary core of Iconix, So What Software provides several utility programs, including a palette editor and an SCB (scan line control byte) editor. (Iconix provides full access to the 16 possible palettes on the super-hi-res screen, so you can create screens with 256 colors!)

Documentation comes only on the disk, so you must print your

own manual. No big deal actually, but we'd prefer to have a professional-quality, bound manual on hand. (Editor's note: So What Software plans to release version 3.0 of Iconix in early 1989 with a revised, printed manual.) The documentation is fairly comprehensive, but it could use a better tutorial and more examples on the disk. So What Software provides two technicalsupport numbers and promises expert advice to help you overcome any problems. It also produces a newsletter with tips on using its products.

If you've never programmed before, we don't recommend this product. To effectively use Iconix, you already have to know something about how to program in Applesoft, but you don't have to be an expert Applesoft programmer to create useful utilities such as a slide-show program.

Did we say slide show? Slide Shows at Last

One of the major problems for Apple IIGS artists is that they cannot show their super-hi-res images outside of the paint program in which they created them. With Iconix, however, it's a breeze to show a 65-sector, binary-saved, super-hi-res image. The ability to easily create a slide show might alone be worth the price of Iconix. Of course, once you've got the program, you might as well play with all the other capabilities it provides. Next thing you know, you'll be a super-hi-res whiz.

Four stand-alone MouseText packages

pple IIGS owners have been anxiously awaiting the release of AppleWorks GS (AWGS) ever since the package, then called GSWorks, was announced in June 1988. Claris has done an admirable job of nurturing this ambitious project to fruition, and many Apple IIGS owners will buy AWGS simply because the product bears

the same surname as Bob Lissner's classic productivity package 🎵 for the Apple II. But the simple fact is that with A its super-hi-res (SHR) interface, AWGS can't possibly be as efficient as the text-based, 8-bit original AppleWorks.

IIGS programs that use SHR graphics are inherently slower than comparable text-only applications. A bitmapped SHR display has 128,000 pixels to manipulate, whereas a text screen has only 1,920 characters. Is it any wonder that SHR screen updates seem sluggish compared with screen updates of textbased applications?

about AWGS is that it

didn't have to suffer from the lethargic performance of the SHR screen. A special set of 32 symbols called MouseText characters (see figure 1) in the ROM of every IIGS and IIe/c/c+ was designed to create the familiar IIGS/Macintosh desktop user interface in the text mode and can be mixed with normal alphanumeric characters. Since they can be generated by character codes instead of groups of SHR byte values, MouseText

symbols can be manipulated with great speed.

To suggest the creation of a MouseText-based paint program would be ludicrous. I have no complaint about AWGS's page-layout and graphics modules' taking advantage of the SHR graphics mode. In fact, I'd be disappointed if they didn't. These two applications require the highest resolution avail-

Text alternatives to the individual AWGS modules are available that are comparable in power to their 16-bit brethren and don't get bogged down in the mire of SHR graphics. Best of all, the following packages run on any IIe/c/GS/c+ with at least 128K of memory.


MouseWrite

Anyone who has used Multi-Scribe GS (the program on which

the AWGS word-processing module is based) will attest to the program's slowness. Typists who have progressed beyond hunting and pecking can outtype the program, and the documents' bit maps slow down printing on a dotmatrix printer.




Figure 2: With it's pull-down menus and pop-up dialog boxes, MouseWrite gives you the feel of writing on a Mac.

MouseWrite, from Roger Wagner Publishing, closely adheres to the IIGS user interface with a full complement of pull-down menus and pop-up dialog boxes (see figure 2). You use the mouse to select menu items, highlight blocks of text for cutand-paste operations, and rapidly scroll through the document. Keyboard shortcuts are available, although a

mouse is strongly recommended. The main disadvantage of MouseWrite is that it lacks WYSIWYG capability. For example, instead of accurately displaying boldface characters on screen, it encloses bold text with inverse Bs. Other styles include underline, narrow, wide, sub/superscript, italics, proportional, and even color, depending on the capability of the printer. MouseWrite comes with 15 custom ImageWriter fonts that al-

able because they are graphics-oriented. From the standpoint of productivity, however, there was no reason for using SHR graphics for the other AWGS modules (word processing, database, spreadsheet, and communications). MouseText would have been a better choice, allowing AWGS to maintain the speed of AppleWorks while offering a convenient Mac-like mouse/ menu user interface.

Fortunately, stand-alone Mouse-




Figure 3: MagnaCharta automatically scales graphs and adds legends, titles, axis values, and names.

low even more control over the final appearance of documents. Unlike AWGS, MouseWrite lacks the ability to incorporate graphics into a document, however.

MouseWrite includes built-in desk accessories for mail-merge, communications, and spell-checking against a 62,000-word dictionary. The program can read Apple-Works word-processing and DOS 3.3 text files directly, and you can save MouseWrite documents as AS-CII text files in order to use them in other applications.

MagnaCharta

I'd like to recommend a good mouse-based spreadsheet program, but, unfortunately, none exists. The now-defunct International Solutions used to market a program called MouseCalc, but no firm has picked up the rights to this product. Too bad. MouseCalc had great features, not the least of which was built-in graphing. The AWGS spreadsheet module also has graphing features, but both pale in

comparison with MagnaCharta, a stand-alone data-charting program from Third Wave Technology.

MagnaCharta uses MouseText characters to create a Mac-like work environment with a menu bar at the top of the screen and a grid below, into which you can enter data manually. AppleWorks, DB Master, and AppStat files require only minor preparation before loading into MagnaCharta.

MagnaCharta offers nine different types of charts: column, stacked column, bar, line, line/column, scatter, area, three-dimensional, and pie. To graph a range of numbers, use the mouse to place the cursor on the first value in the grid, drag it to the last, and choose Graph & view from the menu bar. In seconds, the graph appears on the double-hi-res screen with automatically added title, legend, and division marks (see figure 3).

The power of MagnaCharta becomes apparent in making adjustments. You can fine-tune graphs by

specifying details such as axis and mark style; pixel, line, width, and depth spacing; title and legend position; and screen, chart, and legend borders. MagnaCharta adapts to the new settings and creates modified graphs in a flash. For further enhancement, you can save charts as graphics files and load them into Brøderbund's Dazzle Draw paint program or Timeworks' Publish It! desktop-publishing package. By comparison, AWGS offers minimal control over the appearance of its five chart types.

MouseTalk

There is no valid reason to use graphics for the AWGS telecommunications module, since most commercial information services (such as CompuServe, GEnie, and The Source) transmit information as ASCII text. Systems that do use graphics, such as AppleLink—Personal Edition, do so sparingly and require dedicated software. Moreover, the AWGS black-on-white telecom screen is difficult to read,




Figure 5: ProFILER lets you specify field formats and rearrange database layouts with point-and-click ease.

and the default font is inalterable.

MouseTalk, from United Software Industries, is a general-purpose telecommunications program for logging onto commercial networks, accessing local bulletin boards, and connecting to other computers either directly or over telephone lines. A macro feature defines complex procedures that can, for example, log onto a system, read any waiting electronic mail, and hang up.

The program has all the power of its popular predecessor, ASCII Express Pro, but its interface is infinitely more accessible to casual telecommunicators. A large scrollable capture buffer (like that of AWGS) allows easy review of online exchanges (see figure 4), which you can edit with the builtin full-screen text editor and store on disk or print.

MouseTalk works with all internal and external Hayes-compatible modems and can operate at 50–19,200 baud. Its 12 terminal-emulation modes include DEC VT-100 and VT-52. For error-free transmission, you can use the XModem and YModem protocols and have the program auto-extract multiple files downloaded in the Binary II format.

ProFILER

Perhaps the neatest new AWGS database feature is the special field type that allows integration of graphic images with text information in a record. This feature first appeared in SoftWood GS File (which can also play sounds stored in fields) and is now available to all 8-bit-computer owners who are using ProFILER.

Profiler has been around for several years but is upgraded regularly. Version 4.0 displays hi-res, double-hi-res, and super-hi-res (on a IIGS only) graphics files contained in a record. Enter the pathname of the file into a field that has been defined for graphics and press G-L to view the picture. This innovative feature can be useful for cataloging an art collection or maintaining digitized photographs in employee files, for instance.

Along with the graphics, ProFIL-ER has most of the options typical of a database program. You can sort information on up to four fields, merge databases, print mailing labels, and create multiple report for-

mats. As with AWGS, changing the arrangement of fields in a record layout means clicking on a field and dragging it to the desired position (see figure 5). ProFILER converts AppleWorks database files to ProFILER format as it loads them from disk.

Although ProFILER largely adheres to Apple's human-interface guidelines, it does take some liberties that make using it somewhat confusing. ProFILER has many desirable features but also several idiosyncrasies that may frustrate AppleWorks users. I wouldn't give up AppleWorks for ProFILER, but in many ways I prefer it to the database module in AWGS.

APPLEWORKS HELPFILE

COMBINING DATABASE FILES

I have two AppleWorks database files that I want to combine into one file. Both files contain names and addresses, and both have the same number and type of categories (First Name, Last Name, Address, City, State, ZIP). I've used the G-L command to arrange the categories of the files in the same order, but when I copy from one file to another, the first names from one file end up in the last-name category of the other file. Similarly, the last names from that file go into the first-name category of the file I am copying to. All of the other categories transfer correctly. Can you tell me how I can combine these two files without transposition of the first and last names from the second file when I copy them to the first?

It sounds as though you created the first two categories of your two files in different order. You must have created file 1 as First Name, Last Name, Address, City, State, and ZIP and file 2 as Last Name, First Name, Address, City, State, and ZIP. AppleWorks retains this original order when you copy via the clipboard to another file.

Using G-L to arrange the order of the categories affects only their appearance on the screen, not the

order in which they will copy, which accounts for the transposition of the first and last names of the second file when you copy them to the first file.

To solve the problem, enter either the list or form view and press Ó-N, which displays the original creation order of the categories. Write down this order for both files. Then create a tables-style report for one of the files. Arrange the categories in this report to match the original creation order of the categories in the other file. Next, print the report to an ASCII file on disk and create a new database from this ASCII file. The categories in this new database are now in the proper order for copying. The steps for creating the ASCII file are as follows:

- 1. Enter the list view of the database you want to rearrange.
- 2. Press O-P.
- 3. Choose Create a new ''tables'' format and press Return.
- 4. Type a name for the report and press Return.
- 5. Use $\circ <$ or $\circ >$ to arrange the categories of this database to match the original creation order of the categories in the database to which you are copying.
- 6. Press O-P.
- 7. Choose A text (ASCII) file on disk.

8. Enter the pathname, which tells AppleWorks where to print the ASCII file. For example, to print an ASCII file to a disk named DATA with the filename TRAN, enter the pathname /DATA/TRAN.

9. Press Escape until you return to the AppleWorks main menu.

- 10. Choose Add files to the Desktop.
- 11. Choose Data Base.
- 12. Choose From a text (ASCII) file.
- 13. Enter the number of categories in response to the question How many categories per record? (1-30). In this example, the correct number is 6.
- 14. In response to the question Pathname?, type the same pathname you used to save the ASCII file (e.g., /DATA/TRAN).
- 15. Type a name for this new file (any legal filename).
- 16. The categories are now in the correct order for copying.

SPREADSHEET CUBE ROOTS

I notice that the AppleWorks spreadsheet module has a square-root function—
@SQRT. What I want to do is find cube roots. How can I use a spreadsheet to do this?

The AppleWorks spread-sheet module does not have a built-in function for finding cube roots, but you can find the cube root of a number by moving to the desired spreadsheet cell and entering that number followed by a fractional exponent. For example, to find the cube root of 27, enter 274(1/3). The result of raising 27 to the 1/3 power is 3.

LEARNING CURVE

Multiple intelligences, a challenge for educational technology

veryone involved with education wants to help children be their best—to become all they can be. Educational computing was born out of a belief that this technology would make children better able to grasp concepts. In the late 1970s, one of the prime attractions of educational computing was the promise that it would simplify the individual-

ization of education by allowing learners to proceed at their own rate. This feature, coupled with the computer's ability to provide auditory and visual rewards, made the computer a tireless basicskills tutor.

While educational computing has grown in popularity, the computer as tutor has become only one of the roles of this technology. The approach to education embodied in Logo represents the opposite extreme. Logo gives children programming tools that allow them to test ideas and experience the consequences of their reasoning.

The recent surge of interest in the field of thinking-skills development leads us toward a more current view of

the computer's role in education. Bloom's taxonomy of thinking skills is the framework we use for teaching these skills as well as for designing complementary course materials. It consists of the following skills: knowledge, comprehension, application, analysis, synthesis, and evaluation.

Each of these six skills is impor-

tant, and yet contemporary education has focused on knowledge, comprehension, and application rather than on the "higher-order" skills of analysis, synthesis, and evaluation. In an effort to apply technology to remedy this perceived deficiency, many software developers have created programs that address the development of higher-order thinking across the

the thinking processes that led them to a solution.

This formal attempt to correlate software with thinking skills is laudable but incomplete. While acknowledging the need to develop all thinking skills in all children, it ignores the personal computer's potential to truly individualize instruction.


Computer-based individual in-

struction has traditionally assumed that students differ in their speed of learning, and not in their intrinsic learning styles. I believe that we are now on the threshold of a understanding new that will allow educational computing to reach its potential. The key to unlocking this secret lies within learners-not teachers.

Many years ago, a study on IQ-test scores examined the correlation, if any, between these scores and academic performance. There was a high level of correlation between IQ scores and academic performance, but there was no correlation between these scores and performance outside the classroom.

This observation intrigued Professor Howard Gardner at Harvard, who launched into a detailed study of intelligence by looking at the performance of prodigies, idiots savants, and others with special gifts. His work appeared in the book *Frames of Mind*. As a result of his study, he concluded that we all have at least seven intelligences, including linguistic,

curriculum. logical/mathematical, intrapersonal, spatial, musical, bodily-kinesthetic, and interpersonal.

Each of us may excel in one of these seven areas, but we all have capabilities in the other six.

Superlearning

"Superlearning," an educational technique developed in Bulgaria, produces remarkable results in the amount of material covered in a short period of time and in its retention. One of the things that distinguishes superlearning from what takes place in the traditional classroom is that it teaches to all our intelligences.

Although the principles of superlearning were developed independently of Professor Gardner's work, description of the technique helps convey the essence of teaching to multiple intelligences. For example, during a week-long intensive French course I recently took, we listened, wrote, played games, worked by ourselves, drew pictures, sang songs, danced, and talked with each other. Furthermore, these activities coalesced to contribute to our eventual success at speaking a new language.

The atmosphere in today's classrooms is often quite different from the superlearning model. Our tendency is to teach to the linguistic, logical/mathematical, and intrapersonal learners and virtually ignore the other intelligences. This tendency has two negative consequences. First, it ignores the needs of children whose dominant intelligence is not one of these three. Second, it misses the chance to validate and develop the other intelligences in all the children. Time and time again, we have found that the more ways a subject is presented, the more that subject is learned and remembered.

The Harvard work is a floodlight that illuminates a new path for education, one that can do much to help children retain their natural love for learning.

Just how is a classroom teacher supposed to design a curriculum that caters to all the different intelligences? Are bodily-kinesthetic children supposed to practice their spelling words by writing them on the school wall with a squirt gun? (Not a bad idea, by the way.) Many marvelous ideas get lost in implementation because they are too time-consuming or because they pull educators in new directions too fast. Fortunately, computer technology is tailor-made to allow education to reach the dominant intelligence of each child.

The reason for tying computer activities to the intelligences is simple: From the beginning of the personal-computer revolution, we have heard that this technology will allow the individualization of instruction. For many people, that means nothing more than self-

paced instruction. Now, with this powerful theory to guide us, we can bring that dream into sharp focus. We can explore the match between the software we already have and the dominant intelligences of our children. Also, we can highlight areas for new software creation, and, best of all, we can develop specific sets of criteria for judging such software. To my mind, this focus is what's been missing in educational computing. Your Ideas

In the next few months, we will explore existing computer applications as they apply to the various intelligences, starting with the linguistic and logical/mathematical intelligences. In the meantime, think about the software library in your school and about how various programs seem to reach some children better than others. I'd love to hear your insights on this topic. Please write to me.

Choices, Choices is an elementary school adaptation of valuable critical-thinking-skills activities that the company originally developed for the Decision series. Here's a look at TSP's first releases in these two series.

Reading Magic Library

The Reading Magic Library brings a new dimension to story time because it involves a

Four programs in two new series for young learners

Reading Magic Library, is a collection of interactive, colorfully animated stories for parents and their children to read together. While the parent reads aloud, the little one in Mom or Dad's lap can press the space bar to progress through the story. At several crucial points in the story line, the program interrupts with a prompt asking your child, or the two of you together, to choose between two directions for the story to follow. How many Golden Books let you do that?

The real magic is in the two stories that currently make up the Reading Magic Library: Jack and

the Beanstalk and Flodd, the Bad Guy. Credit for these gems goes to Tom Snyder and Peter Reynolds. Their rendition of Jack and the Beanstalk strays a bit from the classic story line—at least I don't remember Robocow, do you?—

but remains true to the original tale. As for Jack and the baby gooselet who lays golden eggs, they're to your left here, reading A +, of course.

Flodd, the Bad Guy is an original Snyder/ Reynolds fable about a real meany named Flodd who makes life miserable for a young king named Alex and his dog, Ollie (see figure 1). Things get so bad that King Alex has to resort to using his magic lamp to stop Flodd's evil deeds. When he's down to his last wish and Flodd has dognapped Ollie, Alex faces a true test of character.

I can't divulge much more of the stories be-

cause they are too special. I can say that you must help Jack and King Alex make many choices during their adventures (see figure 2). For example, when Alex needs to find Flodd, the program asks you to decide whether to ask other people if they've seen Flodd, or follow Ollie's nose. And, when Alex chases Flodd, you have to decide whether he goes by boat or helicopter.

In addition to the many ways children and their parents can go through these stories, Reading Magic Library's interactive tales offer opportunities to discuss what Jack or King Alex should do, prac-

tice letter recognition, learn new vocabulary, and make new imaginary friends.

There is a strong positive correlation between parental involvement with their childrens' education and the childrens' academic success. What better time to start this involvement than when children are young and still at home? If you happen to have a computer and love reading with your child, Reading Magic Library is a must.

Choices, Choices

As a series, Choices, Choices is conceptually similar to TSP's Decision series but for students in grades K-6. The programs facilitate a structured, teacher-led exercise in making choices about responses to a set of circumstances. Rather than focusing on lofty topics such as global politics or media ethics, Choices, Choices deals with issues elementary students face at school.

One computer is all a teacher needs for the lesson, since it is designed as a collaborative, whole-class exercise. The two current Choices, Choices titles, Taking Responsibility and On the Playground, come with an excellent, extensive teachers' guide and a numbered picture set for use with the software.

On loading into the computer, the program presents a description of a dilemma. In Taking Responsibility, two students accidentally break their teacher's prized possession. On the Playground deals with students' attitudes toward a new kid at school who doesn't fit in. Once the computer has displayed the explanation of the situation, the program requires hierarchical

organization of four behavior goals and resolution of goal conflicts that arise during the exercise.





Figure 3: Goal-statement cards K-6 students use in Taking Responsibility

To help the class prioritize these goals, the Choices, Choices package includes four large cards, each of which contains one goal statement and a picture illustrating the goal (see figure 3). The teacher can ask four students to hold a card while the rest of the class contemplates the best goal sequence.

After the class has agreed on the priorities, you enter the goal order into the computer. As the story unfolds, students make choices about how best to handle the situation in light of their chosen goals and their previous behavior. The class uses the program's picture cards to

build a comic strip depicting what is going on.

When the program prompts students to make a choice, it also provides the numbers of four picture cards for building alternative behavior sequences and considering their consequences before committing to a course of action. The picture cards provide students with visual cues that help them discuss the pros and cons of a particular action. The final step in the exercise is class evaluation of how they handled the situation.

The decision-making model at the core of this program series is "think it through before you do." Students practice analyzing a situation, prioritizing goals, considering

the options that will get them to their goal, making a choice, and then facing the consequences. In real life, you don't get the chance to undo what you've done if you figure out a better way. In Choices, Choices, you can return to the program with a different goal-priority sequence and experience the situation from a fresh perspective.

In the introduction to Choices, Choices programs, the authors bring home the importance of learning how to make complex decisions at an early age. Given the likelihood that our children will face life-and-death decisions regarding drugs and sexual behavior, these programs couldn't come at a better time. Children need to critically evaluate their options and be aware of the consequences. The Choices, Choices series provides a framework for practicing real-life decision making and introduces the process of critical thinking.

T I P S A N D TECHNIQUES

APPLEWORKS SPLIT SCREEN

As most AppleWorks users know, the word-processing module does not provide a split-screen mode—an invaluable aid for translating from one language to another. I have figured out how to create one, however.

First, print (Ć-P) your Apple-Works word-processing document to a text (ASCII) file on disk.

Now make a database from the text file and specify one category per record. Create a new "tables" format for the database (\circlearrowleft -P) and, using the arrow keys in conjunction with \circlearrowleft , make the single column as wide as the screen and print the report to a DIF file on disk.

Make a spreadsheet from the DIF file and, using the Layout option (\circ -L), expand the column to the full width of the screen. Finally, to create a split screen, open a top and bottom window (\circ -W) and use the

bottom window for typing your translation. If the file is too long to fit into the spreadsheet (999 lines), you can copy parts of it into an adjacent column and synchronize the windows ($\acute{\text{C}}$ -W).

After you have made any necessary modifications, using the split screen inside the spreadsheet module, print the revised manuscript as a text file on disk and create a new word-processing document from this ASCII file.

GENTLE RESTART

When resetting Control Panel options that require you to turn off your IIGS to activate the change (reconfiguring the RAM disk or slot assignments, for example), try typing Control-G-Option-Reset instead. This sequence activates a self-test, from which you can exit at any time by pressing Control-G-

Reset, causing your new Control Panel settings to take effect. This method is much quicker and puts less wear and tear on the computer's components than cycling the power.

Go to the new-desk-accessory (NDA) menu and select About the Finder . . . while holding down the Option key. The entire desktop, including the cursor, flips upside down!

ALIEN MIND BACK DOOR

Warning: Seeing the higher levels or the alien early takes away much of the joy of getting there by yourself. Be sure you want to take that chance before trying this tip.


THE FLASHER

Ever since GS/OS was released, users have reported numerous sightings of a flasher. If the Volume setting in the Control Panel is at its lowest level (off), the screen border flashes whenever a system beep is called for. VERTICAL BLANKING

Q. I'm looking for more information about the vertical-blanking signal on the IIe, IIc, and IIGS. Is the method for detecting an active signal the same for all these computers?

DOUGLAS B. EAMON WHITEWATER, WI

A. All three of these systems have a softswitch at location \$C019 that you can inspect to determine whether the video screen has been blanked for the vertical-retracing operation. On the Apple IIe and IIc, bit 7 of the location is 0 during the retrace period, but on the IIGs it is 1. If you're writing a program that uses this softswitch, you should include code that determines what type of system is present at run time so that it can interpret the switch status correctly.

The vertical-blanking softswitch is important to programmers writing animation programs. Such programs should change data on the screen only when the screen is blanked; if the screen isn't blanked, the image will flicker.

Another technique animators can use is to enable a verticalblanking interrupt signal and respond to the interrupt by drawing a graphics frame to the screen. This type of interrupt is available on the IIc/GS and on a IIe with a mouse card installed.

DECIMAL-TO-HEXADECIMAL CONVERSION

Q. I need to convert decimal numbers to hexadecimal numbers from within an Applesoft program. Can you provide me with a subroutine that will do the job?

A. If you call the subroutine in figure 1 with the decimal number in the N variable, the result comes back in the HX\$ string variable. The subroutine works only with num-

bers from 0 to 65535, and the result is always four hexadecimal digits long.

ProDOS 8 AND GS/OS

Q. I have a IIGS and a hard-disk drive, and I've installed GS/OS on it, even though I still run a lot of ProDOS 8 applications, such as the original AppleWorks. My problem is that I often want to run one of these ProDOS 8 applications without having to wait for GS/OS to boot and the Finder to start up. Is there any way I can boot ProDOS 8 instead of GS/OS? And can I start up GS/OS from within a ProDOS 8 environment?



A. There is a solution, but you have to copy and rename some files. First, rename the PRODOS file in the root directory of your hard disk as GS.OS, copy the P8 file from the SYSTEM subdirectory to the root directory, and then rename P8 as PRODOS. Next, place your Pro-DOS 8 startup program—a system program with a name ending in .SYSTEM (ideally a selector program such as Glen Bredon's ProSel or Pinpoint Publishing's RunRun that provides you with a menu of programs to launch)—into the root directory. Make sure the selector is the first program in the directory with the .SYSTEM suffix. When you next boot the system, the Pro-DOS 8 selector program takes control right away. With it you can run any ProDOS 8 programs you like. If you want to start up CS/OS and the Finder, just run the GS.OS program (the old PRODOS file).


