JOURNALIST, TEACH THYSELF

HAVE YOU SEEN THE NIKE COMMERCIAL featuring football and baseball star Bo Jackson? It shows Bo playing a variety of sports. After a football clip, for example, Los Angeles quarterback Jim Everett says, "Bo knows football." Michael Jordan offers, "Bo knows basketball." After a clip of Bo playing ice hockey, however, superstar Wayne Gretsky simply shakes his head and says, "No."

We recently came across a nationally syndicated computer column by ABC White House correspondent Brit Hume and *Washington Post* Rocky Mountain Bureau Chief T.R. Reid. Our conclusion is Reid and Hume know politics; Reid and Hume know MS-DOS; Reid and Hume know business. But the Apple II and education? No.

Perhaps these two should stick to writing and reporting on politics, since they seem lost trying to analyze the Apple II and educational computing. We'd love to write about politics, but we refrain. We all have opinions about Contra aid, SDI, and glasnost, but we don't publish our opinions on topics we aren't qualified to write about.

A couple months ago, Hume and Reid's column discussed Apple's plan to work with grocery-store chains to encourage schools to buy more computers for the classroom. The idea is for parents to bring their cash-register tapes to school; the school can use the tapes to get discounts on Apple computers. Hume and Reid didn't like Apple's arrangement because it might encourage sales of Apple IIs: "The personal computer in most American schools is the Apple II. It's a vintage machine from the earliest days of the PC revolution. It has almost nothing to do with the computers that grownups use on the job every day Teaching computers on an Apple II with one floppy drive is like teaching driver's education on a 1916 Model T."

Yes, the Apple II has been around awhile. So has the Corvette. But the Corvette you bought 20 years ago isn't the same one you'd buy today. The current iteration of the Apple II, the IIGS, is sophisticated in terms of graphics and sound, but it also has the crucial ability to run virtually every Apple II program ever created. Reid and Hume's biggest misconception is evident in their statement: "It [the Apple II] has almost nothing to do with the computers that grownups use." Millions of "grownups" use Apple IIs every day. AppleWorks is probably the most-used software package in the history of computers.

That mistake, however, pales in comparison to their misunderstanding of the role computers play in schools: When Hume and Reid object that "students from coast to coast and kindergarten to senior high are being taught about computers on this museum piece," they're confusing *computer education* with *teaching using computers*. When you sit a first-grader in front of Reader Rabbit or Math Blaster you're not teaching the child how to use a computer. You're teaching him or her how to read or add.

About Apple II educational software Hume and Reid write: "By the standards of business software, most of this stuff is outrageously bad: It's slow, poorly designed, given to crashes if some poor kindergartner hits the wrong key. The education software in most classrooms gives students the wrong lessons—that computers are boring, frustrating tools."

We wonder how anyone, let alone journalists, could come up with this stuff. "By the standards of business software"? Come on, guys—that oxymoron is worthy of "military intelligence" stature. And if you did your homework you'd realize that nothing is written specifically for the Apple II; it's also written for MS-DOS machines and, in some cases, the Macintosh. So if it's "outrageously bad" on the II, it's "outrageously bad" under MS-DOS, too.

You say Apple II software teaches kids that computers are boring, frustrating tools? So you want to save them from boredom and frustration by teaching them what to do when they see the C> prompt and by teaching them to write batch files?

We respect ABC News and The Washington Post—so naturally we were surprised by Hume and Reid's erroneous reporting. And now we watch ABC News and read The Washington Post a little more closely. \Box

UPON MY WORD

THE POINT OF YOUR OCTOBER editorial is well taken ("Fighting Temptation," p. 8), but I'd like to address another side of the copy-protection issue. This scheme, quite simply, isn't an effective deterrent to making copies. Instead, it serves mostly as an excuse for companies' high prices, which would remain high, regardless.

You state, "Just make sure you're ready to live up to your end of the bargain." I feel that when software companies take my money, then absolve themselves of all responsibility, they're also canceling our bargain. For instance, after purchasing one particular package, I discovered a hidden additional fee equal to almost 50 percent of the purchase price simply for providing any support at all for the software.

In addition, after mentioning that a prominent educational-software company is removing copy protection, you express concern about lost revenue because of people making illegal copies. One revenue source that will dry up is the ridiculous \$5–\$50 fee for replacing a defective or damaged disk. A grade-school classroom is an extremely hostile environment for floppy disks. Making backup copies of educational software means that a school isn't subjected to replacement charges when its disks crash—which they do frequently.

There will always be those who try to take advantage of others. I believe, however, that consumer respect for upstanding companies such as Beagle Bros will do much more to reduce software piracy than any protection scheme will.

We agree that software shouldn't be copy protected; inCider has long been an opponent of protection schemes. Every user has the right to make backup copies of software, as well as load the program onto a hard-disk drive or a RAM disk.

As software companies finally begin to realize this, it's important for two reasons that we, as users, don't abuse copyable software. First, if piracy abounds, you can bet that software publishers will return to copy protection. Second, copying software, cassette tapes, or videotapes—no matter how expensive—is illegal. —eds.

DIRECTING THE FUTURE

TOR THE LAST TWO OF MY 20 years in the classroom, I've found a number of constructive ways to use an Apple IIe. All that's required is some familiarity with the Apple II and AppleWorks and a little knowledge of Applesoft BASIC.

My immediate problem is that I have access to just one computer. This occurred while four GSes, four ImageWriter IIs, along with monitors and disk drives, continued to sit in the stockroom all last year.

The school bought this equpment with "magnet funds" and set aside the Apples for the magnet program only. Unfortunately, teachers in this program knew nothing about computers, were uncomfortable using them, and left them parked on mobile carts in the closet. The school used these Apple IIs only one night a week—during our after-school BASIC class.

This now brings us to a larger problem. In my district, and probably in most large districts, there's a complete absence of leadership, direction, and inspiration in the area of computers. Educators aren't encouraged to study computers; by salary-scale recognition, they're actually discouraged from studying this wondrous tool.

Economically, from the teacher's point of view, it makes more sense to take outside classes that involve campfire sing-alongs, canoeing, weenie roasts, and so on. We'll receive salary increments and advanced degrees for doing so.

I'll bet my souped-up IIGS that the central administrators would prove illiterate in computers, technology, and math, if they were tested in those areas. Can we expect such people to be drummers for computers and technology, where the Japanese and other nations are rapidly assuming preeminence? Today, having such people lead our school districts isn't very different from having people who can't read or write directing our children's education.

We need people who can serve as an engine to drive us into computer literacy, and those people don't exist in the educational establishment.





Desktop-publishing programs for the Apple IIe/IIc and IICs are a lot like the

weather in New England: If you don't like a program's features, wait a minute and they'll change. Unlike New England weather, though, the changes in the leading desktop-publishing packages are all good. At AppleFest/San Francisco in September, Milliken, Seven Hills Software, and Timeworks each showed new and improved versions of their desktop-publishing software.

Milliken's Medley was one of the first GS programs available; although the software was ambitious, it didn't stand up well to critics who complained about its speed. As with many GS-specific programs, the fault didn't lie completely with the software: The original version of GS/OS didn't do much to make the machine more efficient. And as Milliken's Michael Moore also noted, "Apple convinced us to program Medley in C to make it more portable." What Medley's first edition may have gained in terms of portability to other computers, however, it sacrificed in terms of speed on the GS.

Medley 2.0, scheduled to ship in early to mid-October, is much faster than its predecessor. "Critical parts have been rewritten in assembly language," Moore explains. In addition to demonstrating the speed enhancement assembly-language programming provides, Medley 2.0 utilizes System Disk 5.0 fully, and offers condensed printing and improved memory management, according to Moore. Medley 2.0 also takes advantage of ExpressLoad, a routine developers can use to make GS programs load much faster than they have in the past.

Registered Medley users will receive an upgrade to version 2.0 automatically. The retail price is \$129. For more information, contact Milliken Publishing, 1100 Research Boulevard, St. Louis, MO 63132, (314) 991-4220.

Seven Hills Software's **GraphicWriter 3.0** has wowed the crowds at the last two AppleFests; the only thing it's lacked has been a shipping date. At press time Seven Hills President Earl Childers said this much-anticipated program would ship in late October, however.

The most impressive thing about GraphicWriter 3.0 is that it works on the 512K GS, a big advantage for schools that can't afford to add extra memory to their machines. It imports AppleWorks 3.0 files, as well as files from older versions of AppleWorks. Another nice feature is its compatibility with Beagle Bros' TimeOut SuperFonts. Seven Hills is definitely bullish on compatibility: This new version of GraphicWriter also reads text files created by Bank Street Writer, MouseWrite, FRed-Writer, and Apple Writer. "We wanted to be compatible with the programs that are most used in schools," says Childers. With that philosophy it's not surprising that GraphicWriter 3.0 is also compatible with Print Shop and Print Shop GS graphics, and with super-high-resolution graphics, such as those you'd produce with Paintworks Gold or Deluxe-Paint II.

According to Childers, if you bought GraphicWriter 2.0 before August 1, 1989, you can upgrade to 3.0 for \$25 by sending in the original disk. If you bought version 2.0 after August 1989, you can upgrade for \$5 if you send in the original disk and your receipt. GraphicWriter 3.0 will carry a retail price of \$149.95. Publish It! (and its successor Publish It! 2) have dominated the desktop-publishing market for the last couple of years; Timeworks isn't content to sit on its laurels, however. That's good news for Publish It! users. **Publish It! 3** makes a great program . . . well . . . greater.

According to Timeworks, Publish It! 3 supports color printing as well as PostScript printers' gray-scale capability (important if you want to add a gray screen behind a box of text, for example). And while it isn't a GSspecific program, Publish It! 3 lets you import super-hi-res black-and-white and color graphics; the program also supports GS fonts.

Publish It! 3 lets you "lock groups" so that you can keep text and graphics frames connected. That is, you can lock your picture's graphics frame with the caption's text frame. You can also cut, copy, and paste groups; for example, you can copy the format of one page to other pages.

As with Medley 2.0 and GraphicWriter 3.0, you can import AppleWorks 3.0 documents into Publish It! 3. Timeworks hadn't set an upgrade policy at press time, but expect something in the \$20-\$30 range, according to a company representative. The retail price will be \$129.95. o news might be good news in some quarters. You decide this one: No particularly intriguing new Apple II hardware devices were introduced at September's AppleFest in San Francisco. Apple Computer had the opportunity last

fall to bring out what could have been the best Apple II yet. But instead of a faster, meaner machine, Apple simply fattened the GS' memory RAM to 1.125 megabytes and ROM to 256 kilobytes. Apple rewrote the firmware to include many of the enhance-

ments first introduced in GS/OS version 5.0 last year. All's not no-news about the new GS, fortunately. The battery that runs the GS clock and charges the Control Panel RAM for about three-fifths of its expected lifetime is no longer soldered in place or hidden under the power supply. And RAM-card manufacturers are elated that Apple no longer hogs the expansion slot; all 1.125 megabytes are on the motherboard.

Perhaps the good news at AppleFest is that other manufacturers, rather than introducing exciting new products, are taking the time to update their proven stock.

For example, Digital Vision (66 Eastern Avenue, Dedham, MA 02026, 617-329-5400) has released an excellent GS version of the software for its video digitizer, ComputerEyes. Features include 320 or 640 pixels by 200 lines; full-color, super-high-resolution graphics with post-digitized dithering, palette, and contrast control; and picture cropping, sizing, and other electronic transformations. The new version of ComputerEyes GS also saves graphics in any of several formats for compatibility with a variety of other GS programs, such as Roger Wagner's HyperStudio.

Speaking of HyperStudio, the latest version is nearly

September's AppleFest in San Francisco wasn't all fun and games, but there were enough new new titles to keep inCider's editors busy.

Broderbund (17 Paul Drive, San Rafael, CA 94903, 415-492-3200) was showing off its latest creations—Prince of Persia and The

Ancient Art of War. We were surprised to not see Downhill Challenge, though, because that was waiting in our mailboxes when we returned.

Prince of Persia is an action-adventure game by the author of Karateka. You play a young prince who has been imprisoned in an evil vizier's dungeon; you have an hour to

bug-proofed. Its demo ran almost continuously for three days at AppleFest.

First Class Peripherals (2221 Old Oakland Road, San Jose, CA 95131, 800-538-1307) has put new cases around its **DF series 20-, 40-, and 70-megabyte hard-disk** drives so that they'll fit comfortably between the GS and the monitor. (The drives' performance specifications aren't too shabby, either.) There's lots of wide-open space insideenough room for another disk drive, a tape backup, and a Conserver-type fan and sockets. Watch for those additional features at the next AppleFest.

Applied Ingenuity (14922 Ramona Park Boulevard, Unit M, Baldwin Park, CA 91706, 818-960-4415) and CMS Enhancements (3080-A Airway Avenue, Costa Mesa, CA 92626, 714-549-2953) provided the other side of the no-news coin. Al demonstrated the CDrive, a hard-disk replacement for the llc's internal floppy. Although cracking open a llc to install a CDrive might not appeal to most llc owners, the disk's speed and performance compared with those o<mark>f floppie</mark>s, or even an external hard drive, should allay most fears

Al has also released a videotape recorder-based backup system for hard-disk drives. A six-hour tape will store some 640 megabytes at a rate of 40 megabytes per hour. That's slow, but to some, worthwhile, compared with the extensive floppy swapping necessary in most standard backup systems.

Finally, CMS seems to have reawakened to the Apple II market after a year or so of neglect. To demonstrate its intentions, the company introduced a 44-megabyte removable hard-disk drive. Yes, take one hard-disk cartridge out and put another in, just like a floppy. And CMS continues to be the only hard-drive manufacturer with multi-user systems for the Apple II.

Madden Football. EA also surprised us with Keef the Thief. Keef is a lighthearted adventure game in which

you're a juvenile delinquent faced with survival in the Tri-City area. You'll have to battle creatures such as a hungover goblin and a killer chicken-definitely not your standard adventure fare. Earl Weaver and John Madden sell for \$39.95 and \$49.95, respectively, and run on the Apple lle, IIc, and IIGS. Earl requires 128K and John needs 64K. Keef the Thief sell for \$49.95 and runs only on the 512K GS.

A new face in the crowd—Victory Software—wasn't showing at AppleFest, but we heard about the company's new adventure role-playing game for the Apple IIGS. 2088: The Cryllan Mission casts you as a soldier, science officer, nurse, or doctor assigned to locate the missing crew of the U.S.S. Houston. You'll need 1.25 megabytes in your GS and \$69.95, but you'll have a lot of exploring to do. You can contact Victory Software at (713) 493-3232 for more information.







GOOD GRAPHICS GALLERY

Powerful computers are doing for science and mathematics what microscopes and telescopes did in an earlier time. Computers could do the same for art.

FINALLY SOMEBODY HAS TIED TOGETHER all the loose ends—fractal geometry, Mandelbrot plots, virtual realities, visual experiments, procedural graphics, image processing, and all the other bizarre kinds of computer graphics being created today—into a tight, coherent theory. I didn't even have to invent it myself. In Visualization: The Second Computer Revolution (Abrams, New York, \$49.95), Richard Friedhoff has done the synthesis for me, I thought, as I glanced through 200 pages of impressive computer "art."

"When we visualize," Friedhoff maintains by way of introduction, "we restructure a problem so that more of it is processed by the preconscious part of our brain—the visual system that is our silent partner." Computers can make visualization easy: Just imagine the difference between dragging an icon into a trash can and typing DELETE /HARD-DISK/BUSINESS/LETTERS/MOM, or the ease with which TimeOut Graph can make AppleWorks spreadsheet data visible.

One of the many fascinating examples of visualization in Friedhoff's book is the technique by which military computers can make a fuzzy snapshot appear clear—it involves Fourier analysis of a digitized photograph. It would take a while on an Apple II, but you could clean up all those faded family photographs.

The "photographs" of Neptune we saw last year were really visualization of electromagnetic data— Voyager 2 carried no camera, but radios that relayed data to computers in Pasadena that created images of the outer planets. To mathematicians, the very existence of the science of chaos (see Stattus Report, "Something Strange," August 1989, p. 20) was unknown until computers let them "see" numbers on a video monitor.

The word *visualization* means "seeing what was once invisible." In this sense, powerful computers are doing for science and mathematics what microscopes and telescopes did in an earlier time. Computers could do the same for art, as well, just as linear perspective—once an artist's "trick" changed the way people see. I wish Friedhoff had synthesized more. You'll need to make your own connections. A reader ignorant of ray tracing and celluar automata, say, will come away from *Visualization* still wondering why they're in the same book. Perhaps that wonder is what's needed. A reader wondering, "Can a computer think?" and "What is perception?" will see that the questions relate, but not so simply that Friedhoff—or I—could explain it in a sentence. A picture, it's true, is worth a thousand words of explanation of visualization. The illustrations in *Visualization* are more like questions than answers. Visualization is certainly a young science, and the young ask a lot of questions.

Visualization reminded me of Graphics Gallery, the refrigerator door for computer graphics that A + magazine used to publish and *inCider* doesn't. I never much liked Graphics Gallery—it wasn't art I would pay to see, and I think you deserve better when you buy *inCider*.

Roger Goode, *inCider*'s art director and an accomplished computer artist, puts it this way: "The computer is a tool, like paints or brushes. If you don't know how to paint, using a different tool won't make you an artist." Roger created the illustration on page 41 in the July 1989 *inCider*; I'd say that was good art.

There's no real theory of computer art yet; nobody knows what's good. The theory sketched in *Visualization* is as good as any: Computer art should make the invisible visible. I enjoy computer art when I visit a science or art museum, but nobody sends me any at *inCider* that I'd hang on my refrigerator, let alone publish in a national magazine.

That's a challenge. Read Visualization, study your programming or your art history or both, and create something with your Apple that changes the way I see the world. I promise we'll publish it. If you're *really* proud of what you did, send it to Daria Barclay at the ABACI Gallery of Computer Art, 312 NW 10th Street, Portland, OR 97209, (503) 228-8642 (slides only; deadline January 1). I've never seen the gallery, but I hear it's publishing a series of books on computer art.□

Save yourself the hassle of sector editing. Type in our "ProDOS Dater" program to post-date and time-stamp your files.

POST-DATING PRODOS FILES

OWN AN OLDER MODEL (CIRCA 1984) Apple IIc and recently purchased a used Applied Engineering IIc System Clock, which, I understand, has been discontinued. The clock requires that I modify my application disks by installing a "driver" that date/time-stamps my ProDOS files automatically. Some of my disks are copy protected, however, and won't accept the modification. How can I date/time-stamp later the files those copy-protected applications create? I have Copy II Plus. Can I use its sector editor to change the date/time stamp?

There are several utilities you can use, Don, to change the creation and modification date/time stamps on your ProDOS files. A sector editor, such as the one available in Copy II Plus, is the most difficult for two reasons. First, you must do a lot of hunting for the directory entry of the file and the bytes where the date/time stamp for that file are stored. Second, you've got to encode the date and time manually.

published by Addison-Wesley (Reading, MA, \$29.95) comes with a ProDOS Exerciser program (similar to Copy II Plus) that lets you easily select and modify all of a file's ProDOS specifications, including the date/time stamp.

But save yourself the hassle of sector editing. Type in and use "ProDOS Dater" by Martin Lavoie (Hints/Techniques, September 1988, p. 104) to postdate and time-stamp your files. Note that the program contains one small error. Line 12511 should read: 12511 IF M = 10 AND D > 31 THEN 12400

APPLE II IDENTIFICATION


S THERE ANY WAY TO IDENTIFY from Applesoft BASIC which Apple II my student is currently using?

The Apple II Developer Technical Support group at Apple Computer has recommended that programmers examine the contents of four ROM bytes to establish on which Apple II a program is executing. The accompanying **Table** gives those addresses and their corresponding values.

From Applesoft BASIC, simply use an IF PEEK(address) = value... THEN... examination to determine the machine type. For example, to identify an Apple IIc Plus, you might use the code sample: IF PEEK (64435) = 6 AND PEEK (65055) <> 96 THEN is a GS; otherwise, something else.

Note that all current 8-bit Apple II ROMs contain the machine-language RTS command (\$60 or 96) at location 65055 (\$FF/FE1F). Current GSes have a short utility starting at that same address that returns compatibility information in the 65816's registers. I won't discuss those now, except to say that the ROM-byte value might change in later GS ROM versions. That's why in the above example I tested whether PEEK (65055) was 96 or not, rather than use the GS-specific value of 173.

VE GOT DOZENS OF DISKS CONtaining dozens of short AppleWorks files. How do I get a printout of the catalogs? I'm tired of hand-writing the filenames.

Thank you, Alvin, for a simple printer question. You made my day.

Simply boot into ProDOS BASIC from a disk

containing the files ProDOS and BASIC.System, such as your Apple IIC ProDOS System Master. Next to the BASIC prompt (]), type PR#1 and press Return to activate your printer. Then insert your Apple Works data disk(s) into the boot drive and type CATALOG,S6 (,S5 if you booted from a UniDisk or internal $3\frac{1}{2}$ -inch drive) to print a complete listing of your files, or CAT,S6 (or ,S5) for the shortened version.

Notice that you probably won't see the word CATALOG (or CAT) on screen, because PR#1 redirects all output to the printer. Type PR#0 to

This method works with all Apple IIs, not just the IIc. Those of you who have a printer in another slot, simply substitute that slot number as n in the PR#n command. Also, for convenience, many folks clip out the catalog listing from the printed page and paste or tape it to the disk sleeve. Just remember to label the disk with the volume name, so that you can later match the disk to the sleeve and its catalog.

HAVE A FULL 3¹/₂-INCH APPLE-Works data disk that's no longer readable. I think its directory has been damaged. Is there any way to retrieve the disk's files?

Backups, Kit? When will we ever learn? Glen Bredon's ProSel (\$39.95, available through Quality Computers, 15102 Charlevoix, Grosse Pointe, MI 48230, 800-443-6697) contains a utility called Scavenge, which might be able to reconstruct the directory for you. And ProSel contains other block and sector editors, should you have the patience and expertise to repair the disk yourself. Similar products are also available from other sources. Copy II Plus from Central Point Software (15220 Northwest Greenbrier Parkway, #200, Beaverton, OR 97006, 503-690-8090, \$39.95 plus \$5 shipping), for instance, contains an editor.

Better yet, get an expert to fix the disk for you. Pete Johnson, P.O. Box 84, New London, MN 56273, seems to enjoy the work. He should—he's quite good at recovering even the most stubbornly damaged files.

QUICKIES

Format 3½-inch disks using the 2:1 interleave from the GS Finder, unless you're using a UniDisk 3½-inch drive. Otherwise, you'll lose performance and possibly data.

(CDA) with which to manage the drive. It functions identically to the ProDOS software, with the added convenience of a CDA.

On the utilities disk, you'll find a patched version of ProDOS 8 that lets you access eight volumes. (Four would normally be the limit.) A patched version of DOS 3.3 lets you issue an INIT command for volumes on the hard drive, and also fixes a couple of lingering bugs in DOS 3.3.

Once you have your drive volumes configured, you get to a unique set of features. You can turn volumes on and off (in case you have more than eight partitions), "write-protect" volumes so that you can't erase any information from them, and specify the volume to boot at startup.

MANAGEMENT ISSUES

To protect against loss of data, you should back up your hard drive regularly. For this, the Vulcan provides Apple's sturdy Backup II (and for DOS 3.3, a modified version of FID). This brings us, however, to an inherent weakness. There's no Apple II utility software truly suited to maintaining a modern hard drive. Using a combination of utilities, you can get the job done vaguely and slowly. For instance, my source-code library is composed of about 1700 files arranged into some 80 subdirectories, occupying about 20 megabytes. Quick now, how do I find the file I wrote a year ago containing routines to manage windowing in ORCA/Pascal? How do I compare it to files containing similar routines in any of nine other languages? Painstakingly-that's how.

Hard drives—whether a 20-megabyte or a 200-megabyte—need a second-generation file-management utility. You need to be able to search, sort, and manipulate the thousands of files and subdirectories one of these units will hold. The Vulcan shares this shortcoming with any other mass-storage device, but that doesn't excuse it. Applied Engineering has put together the most complete set of utilities to date for an internal hard drive that leads the market in every other way. Now the company needs to take the important step of finishing the job.

LIFE IN THE FAST LANE

Twelve seconds to the GS Finder; 10 seconds to AppleWorks GS. Sounds good, doesn't it? It is. The Vulcan walks all over the competition. Hard-drive speed is usually measured in average access time (how fast it can locate information), but that doesn't provide a realistic measure of how a drive performs under standard system use. The Vulcan's traditional access times are 68 milliseconds for the 20and 40-megabyte units, and 28 milliseconds for the 100-megabyte drive. That sizzling speed is achieved thanks to a high-quality internal tracking unit. The 100-megabyte model also employs caching; the GS adds a custom driver for an ultimate effective rate of 12 milliseconds.

What does all that mean to you? It means the Vulcan is two or three times as fast as the fastest SCSI drives currently available, and seven times faster than most Apple II hard drives. It means that on a GS with a Trans-Warp accelerator and the 100-megabyte Vulcan, your hard drive will actually be faster than your RAM card. That's fast.

EXTRAS

Other features of the Vulcan include a replacement 70-watt power supply (as opposed to the stock 40- to 60-watt units), a built-in cooling fan, enhancements to support the Apple II Plus fully, and compatibility with European power. You can also add an external "in use" light, or a mirror gizmo to turn your GS' green light red when your computer's accessing your drive. The Vulcan's compatible with CP/M, as well—though that statement is somewhat misleading. It works, but you have to buy AE's version of the operating system, which makes several patches necessary for use with the Vulcan.

You can upgrade your drive to a larger model if you ever outgrow yours. Applied Engineering will actually replace the entire inner assembly of the drive and copy the contents of your old unit to the new platter. The cost is the difference in list prices between the units plus a handling fee.

INTERNAL VS. EXTERNAL

The final performance issue you must consider is that the Vulcan is an internal hard drive. Internal drives are nice—they fit right into the CPU case, out of sight and out of the way. With AE's internal drive, you also get a souped-up computer out of the deal.

An internal drive, however, is like an inground swimming pool—it's great to have, but it goes with the house. External hard drives, on the other hand, are a transferable investment. If you change computers, you change hard-drive interface cards, not hard drives.



When you're talking about \$1800, you don't want to have to repeat the purchase if your work should require you to move to a Macintosh or IBM clone.

The other problem with an internal hard drive is that it won't support a network. You can run the Vulcan as an isolated drive in a machine connected to an AppleTalk network, but you can't make it the host hard drive in a network. Who but a school would need this capability? Many people choose, for instance, to keep their old IIe when buying a GS, and don't want to have to buy a hard drive for each machine. You may develop an interest in running a bulletin board. You can pick up an old II Plus or IIe for a couple of hundred dollars and use it to run the board sharing an existing external drive. You may not know where your interests and expertise will be in three years, but you can bet you'll have the same external hard drive.

ELEGANCE AND EXPENSE

The Vulcan is a hard drive in the grand tradition of the Apple II—elegant, innovative, flexible, and in all aspects the leader of the field. That brings us to the price.


Whenever Applied Engineering does something, it does it right. Then the company puts a matching price tag on the product. I'd like to stress, however, that the Vulcan isn't that expensive as far as hard drives with comparable features go, and this is one area in which you most certainly get what you pay for.

You can buy a good, basic, external 60megabyte SCSI drive with 40-millisecond access time and network capability for \$800. Add \$100 if you don't have a SCSI card. Better yet, you can build your own hard drive. You can get 20 megabytes for about \$300, 100 megabytes for about \$800. That's \$1000 cheaper than the 100-megabyte Vulcan (or about \$600 cheaper than the price you'd actually end up paying for it). That doesn't mean you should rush to the phone and start ordering parts. Homebrews are easy to build, but putting the software utilities together takes patience.

I've used a lot of different hard drives and the Vulcan is the best, and Applied Engineering is a most reputable and responsive outfit. Should you buy a Vulcan? Sure, as long as you're aware of the alternatives. All things considered, it looks as though Applied Engineering has done it again.

Ver the years, AppleWorks has undergone several facelifts to improve its performance—a number of upgraded versions and a variety of third-party add-ons that add muscle. The most notable of those extras are Beagle Bros' TimeOut enhancements, which plug some operational gaps by providing such functions as a spelling checker, a thesaurus, bit-mapped typefaces, and keyboard macros. Now comes TimeOut ReportWriter, a utility that lets AppleWorks do something it never could before—combine data from several unrelated word-processor, database, or spreadsheet files, for true "relational" potential.

Like the other TimeOut applications, ReportWriter's a "pop-up": You install it on your AppleWorks program disk, and call it up within the program by pressing Open apple-Escape and selecting *ReportWriter* from the TimeOut menu.

CAN YOU RELATE?

Before ReportWriter came along, AppleWorks files consisted of "flat" or discrete ►

file structures. You couldn't easily link data from separate files in different formats. With ReportWriter, you can incorporate information from up to 11 files into a single master file. Files need share only one common field to be joined.

For instance, teachers can create a master file that merges a database file of student names, addresses, phone numbers, emergency contacts, and so on with a spreadsheet file that calculates overall performance on tests, research assignments, and homework. Corporate users can merge information from an electronic "rolodex" with financial details from an accounts-receivable spreadsheet to generate monthly invoices, complete with subtotals and number of days between any two dates.

You could also use ReportWriter to design parts lists, income statements, and purchase orders with boilerplate text lifted from a wordprocessor document. Because ReportWriter also includes a posting option, you could access an inventory file and generate a sales report that posts sales data in that file while subtracting items sold from the overall inventory list. You can also customize several of ReportWriter's features with other TimeOut utilities. You can configure your disk drive for completed reports, accept or modify the character ReportWriter uses to delimit report fields, position ReportWriter to create new records during posting, and inform Report-Writer whether you're using Applied Engineering's Desktop Expander.

If you do have an Applied expansion card, note that ReportWriter requires version 3.1.4 or later of the company's Expander software to generate accurate reports.

If you have an earlier version, answer no to question 2 in the ReportWriter configuration menu (Using the AE Expanded Desktop). Otherwise, you may get some unexpected results. Technical support at Beagle Bros points out that ReportWriter may crash if you try to print large files (documents more than two screens wide and two screens long) when AppleWorks is patched with Expander versions earlier than version 3.1.4. If you answer no, you'll be able to print small files correctly until you secure an updated version of the Expander software.

While old favorites are hard to part with, here's one exception.

Begin by indicating the master file. Master files may retrieve information from database, spreadsheet, and word-processor files, but only database and spreadsheet files can be master files. Next, specify the other files, fields, or records that contain the information you need for your report.

The ReportWriter manual includes a tutorial to help familiarize you with features and operations. It teaches you how to design master-file report formats by defining report "fields" or data items. Each report can include up to 254 fields (considerably more than the 30-field limit of the AppleWorks database) data files, calculations, or keyboard entries. Reports can be up to 127 lines long and 240 columns wide.

Reports larger than the conventional 79column screen width will scroll horizontally, similar to the way the screen scrolls in the AppleWorks spreadsheet when the characters extend beyond the right edge of the screen (and similar to the way the database scrolls in AppleWorks 3.0). The space available on disk determines the maximum number of records any given report can hold.

Reports may contain up to seven different sections. ReportWriter uses special markers to separate one section from another, and the sections will always appear in the same order. If you don't want your calculations or notes to appear in the printed report, you can put them in a special work area.

Each section can include a title (at the top of a page or on a page by itself), a header or footer (with specific information on each report page), an area for the main body of data, one for subtotals, and one for a "closing," which prints after the subtotals at the end of a page or on a page by itself. For instance, businesses could use the closing area for an advertisement such as "Thank you for shopping at..."; educators can use it for personal notes such as "Looking forward to seeing you after Christmas break."

The built-in scripting language is particularly strong; an auto-learn scripting feature lets you record procedures to manage an entire session or selected parts. One obvious use is to record the dialing and log-on process for any bulletin board you call regularly. You may also want to have your mail scanned and saved to disk.

With all its impressive features, Teleworks Plus has a number of operational problems, as well as a couple of features that could have been designed better. Despite its troubles, though, you'll come away from it liking it. In the middle of a work session at your GS, it doesn't seem as much of an interruption to go on line if you stay in the same desktop environment. Teleworks is tantalizingly close to breaking new ground, but for now the ball is in Activision's court.







DOWNHILL CHALLENGE

The best computer simulations—of whacking a golf ball or piloting a jet fighter—make me want to go out and do the real thing. A realistic simulation, then, is paradoxically a poor substitution. If it's that good it reminds me how much I enjoy the live sport. I haven't enjoyed downhill skiing for years. What once was thrilling now seems just dangerous. But Broderbund's Downhill Challenge took my breath away. It made me recall the sensation of throwing myself off a mountain with two boards strapped to my feet. What a panic—just like real skiing.

Downhill Challenge simulates ski racing. I raced mostly against the clock, but you can also compete with a friend. The animation is smooth and fast, so the game calls for total concentration. It's a simple simulation; you control your speed and direction, with the help of gravity. The challenge is that you can't judge how fast you should be skiing or in what direction. You always have to look down the course, anticipating what you'll do around the next bend or over the next mogul.

You can ski Downhill Challenge with the keyboard, joystick, or mouse. The joystick was the equipment of choice among *inCider* staff members, but you have to use the mouse between runs to select courses, check your scores, and take care of other business. That's like skiing into a patch of slush.

It's not hard to imagine a Downhill Challenge in which the mouse was the only interface; it would be a better game. I'm afraid that the selection of input devices, necessary in a simulation that runs on several different computers, doesn't help the game. A company called Microids wrote Downhill Challenge; if it follows up with a motorcycle game for the Apple IIGS, say, I hope it improves the interface.

After you conquer the downhill, slalom, and giant-slalom runs, the only remaining challenge is ski-jumping. This somewhatmisplaced Nordic event is the weakest part of Downhill Challenge—although you can have some spectacular crashes. What else can you do for excitement? Try a TransWarp accelerator card. It's like skiing on an icy cliff—it's fast and fun, but you'll probably die. If you're into that, it's a great challenge.

Broderbund could learn from Accolade's golf simulations and create "mountain" disks with some of the world's fastest, most difficult ski runs. And if Broderbund doesn't do that, I'll have to stand in lift lines again this winter, because Downhill Challenge has reminded me how much I like skiing.

Liens, bugs, and monsters—they're everywhere. A race of *xenomorphs* (don't you just love that word) has invaded the three moons of Talos IV, and, naturally, it's up to you to get rid of them.

Although Xenocide's premise may not win any awards for originality, wait 'til you see it and hear it. Xenomorph is an impressive graphics and sonic achievement. (What I really mean to say is that it looks and sounds fantastic.)

There are four levels for each of three moons you must destroy. On the first, you guide your hovercraft over the alien-infested surface of the moon as you pick up ammunition canisters and destroy or dodge aliens along the way. When you reach the docking bay, you descend to cave level 1, where you fly throughout a cavernous maze to pick up five bombs you'll need later.

On cave level 2, you're underwater and need only find the keys that will let you through enough doors to get to the last level. Then in the bio lab, you plant the five bombs you picked up on level 2. Once that's done, activate the teleporter and get the heck out of there because three seconds after the teleporter zaps you out, all those bombs you planted go boom. If for some reason you don't make it into the teleporter on time, you'll have worse things to worry about than xenomorphs.

The hovercraft level's my favorite. Because that's the first level, it was naturally the one I played the most. The animated view through your windshield is amazing. You zip forward and backward dodging aliens and rock formations while the next moon looms over the horizon.

Your hovercraft is armed with missiles and fireballs, by the way, in case you don't feel like dodging whatever gets in your way. You can also just run into those pesky aliens, but I wouldn't recommend doing that too often. Besides beating on your hovercraft, you also get xenomorphs splattered all over your windshield, which makes it quite difficult to see where you're going.

Xenocide will keep you hooked. If the arcade action doesn't get you, the crisp graphics and dizzying animation will.

The only weapon that can stop them is scattered in pieces across the complex, and you have to get the keys to assemble it and save the world. Sounds like a long night ahead as you play Data East's newest game, Heavy Barrel.

To stop the terrorists, you'll have to fight your way through 12 levels of enemy forces who attack with super weapons and vehicles. You can pick up additional firepower along the way by gathering keys from terrorists you've killed and opening locker chests placed throughout the game. The graphics screens in Heavy Barrel have been improved over those in previous Data East titles, but not by much. The men are larger, but many of the weapons are small and hard to distinguish. The action is a little quicker. When a lot is happening on the screen, however, things slow down dramatically. You can get stuck and find yourself unable to move.

Joystick response is adequate, but can still use some improvement. One fire button controls your shooting weapon, while the other controls your throwing weapon. The only keyboard controls are for pausing and restarting a game, and turning sound on or off.

True arcade aficionados will like Heavy Barrel. Some may be disappointed, especially if they've played the arcade version. Even though some of the game's limitations result from limitations of the machine, Data East can still make some improvements—especially if the company wants Apple II game players to believe the slogan "Data East brings arcade realism home." Right now, I'll still travel to the arcade.

Interplay's Neuromancer is labeled as a "cyberpunk role-playing adventure." It draws much of its story from the novel of the same name by William Gibson. The game features a neat introductory sound track by Devo, good graphics, and quick animation.

You start off in Chiba city in the year 2058. Several people have disappeared, and you feel the answer lies in an area called "cyberspace," a dimension generated in your brain by your "deck," a futuristic portable computer. Private, corporate, and government information systems are hidden from common citizens in cyberspace and are heavily protected by special programs that keep electronic intruders out.

You begin the game by getting your deck back from the pawn shop, then accessing some \blacktriangleright

of those information systems. Talk to everyone you meet—you never know where you'll find valuable information.

Some people will sell you things such as skill chips, which plug into your skull and provide you with new abilities. (Where were they when I was in school?) Other people will return borrowed items or exchange software with you.

Money is an important commodity in the future, and you'll need plenty of it; a special computer chip records credits from your bank account. Credits are the new form of currency; you use them to buy things, pay bills, and use your deck. Yes, every time you use your deck to enter the information systems in cyberspace, credits are deducted from your chip. Didn't they say nothing in life was free?


Game play is smooth and the action is fast and colorful. You move around and activate various options with the mouse and keyboard commands. Icons (Disk, Inventory, PAX, Talk, Skills, and ROM Construct) are small and sometimes hard to distinguish, but after you've played a few times, you'll become familiar with each one.

Other icons tell you the time, date, number of credits you're carrying, and your constitution level—sort of a health meter. (When it reads zero, you're dead.)

The program disk itself is noncopy protected, but the game uses a code wheel as protection. The reference card provides some interesting reading, but it's sometimes difficult to understand because of heavy use of terminology from the novel.

Overall, Neuromancer is excellent. Graphics screens are great and the animation is smooth. GS owners and science-fiction adventurers won't be disappointed. Delve into a futuristic cyberpunk world and put your computer skills to the test. See you in cyberspace.

Checking Out Seven Home-Budget

Programs

Get rid of those money-management headaches—if your monthly bank statement is always a surprise and your records are turning into a mountain of paperwork, invest in an Apple II personal-finance program.

HINK BACK TO LAST JANUARY. WHILE EVERYONE WAS TALKING ABOUT SUPER Bowl scores, the only numbers you were looking at were those endless columns of 1988 financial figures. And they *still* didn't make sense. This January, though, it's out with the old and in with the new. Say "good riddance" to the inefficient manual cash-management system you used in '89, and get some help from Apple II programs such as **Personal Accountant**, **Dollars and Sense**, **Managing Your Money**, **Quicken**, **Alpha Check**, **On Balance**, and **Smart Money GS**.

Now before you rush out to the computer store or dash off a check to your favorite mail-order company, consider the capabilities you're likely to need in a home-finance package. Not surprisingly, any one of these seven "home accounting" packages can help you balance your checkbook, but that's just the start. Some personal-finance programs are both capable and flexible enough to use in many businesses, including home-based ones. (For a look at accounting programs that are "strictly business," see "Business As Usual," January 1989, p. 40.)

No sense, though, purchasing a feature-laden product when all you want is an electronic ledger that prints checks; on the other hand, you want to steer clear of any program you might outgrow. If you invest in stocks or bonds, for instance, you may need a personal-accounting program that also manages portfolios. (If you prefer to keep separate tabs on investments, consider one of the dozen programs featured in "Investment Software," January 1988, p. 42.)

Regardless of which home-accounting program you select, plan on whiling away a few hours

exploring its options. Most packages offer either interactive or printed tutorials, as well as on-line help if you reach an impasse. (In addition, none of the seven products reviewed here is copy protected.) Rest assured that if you continue to use the software, your financial fluency will improve with each passing week, as your Apple helps you pay bills, modify budgets, and track savings and investments.

FISCAL FITNESS

A central function of most personal-finance programs is checkbook management. These products adroitly post and sort transactions such as deposits, checks, ATM (automatic teller machine) fees, and bank service charges. Home-finance programs not only **>** can reconcile a checking (or savings) account with a bank statement, but can just as quickly tally annual heating costs.

The best financial-management programs do even more. Set up a custom chart of accounts and you'll be able to track not just income and expenses, but assets and liabilities, as well. These sophisticated programs let you create flexible budget reports (sometimes with bar graphs) and provide net-worth statements automatically. Best of all, checking, accounting, and budgeting capabilities are all integrated.

A majority of the programs reviewed here can create tax reports to help you get organized before April 15th, too. These reports summarily dismiss the shoebox and manila-folder methods of tax accounting, but they *don't* prepare your tax return. (For a look at a dozen programs that do, see "Tax Time: It's Closing

In," March 1989, p. 50.) What else do the most full-featured though not necessarily most expenisve—finance programs offer? About half the products tested provide calculators to help you assess, among other things, the-long term effects of refinancing your home or setting up an annuity. One program even projects your life expectancy and dispenses insurance advice.

Despite their differences, virtually all the programs mentioned here can print checks for you. Program developers know it's impractical to cart an Apple II to the grocery store, so these programs let you write checks manually and record them later on your computer. Likewise, you can print an individual check. Generally, though, it's a lot easier to schedule weekly bill-paying sessions and let the printer spew out checks in batches.

Most finance packages further automate the bill-paying process by eliminating some otherwise tedious data-entry steps. For instance, several programs look up the date (if your computer has a clock) or remember the date you typed at the beginning of the session. You may never have to type in a longhand amount, either—only the numerical one.

Get cozy with a program's "automatic transaction" feature so you won't have to type a payee's name or address again. Set up *recurrent bill* files, and the program will not only remember the information, it will remind you when payments come due. MouseText-based interface, with program options listed in pull-down menus. You can use either the keyboard or the mouse. The program's default method of data entry is a modified doubleentry system that tends to be confusing despite the short tutorial.


Personal Accountant is neither a complete checkbook manager nor a powerful investment adviser. It's a straightforward *accounting* program. If you want to track accounts (income, expense, loan, equity, and deposit) and generate standard reports, Personal Accountant may suit you. But if you want a program that among other functions prints checks, this one doesn't add up.

DOLLARS AND SENSE

This program's traditional menu-driven interface has one decidedly modern twist: the mouse as (optional) menu selector.

Although definitely beyond the basics, and not as intuitive as programs that comply with Apple Human Interface standards, Dollars and Sense isn't difficult to learn. The program provides general and specific levels of help on line, displays prompts at the bottom of the screen, and sports mnemonic open-apple commands. It also contains such extras as displaying and printing bar graphs and printing checks with vouchers (stubs) attached.

Homegrown financiers who want to get up and running right away will like the program's three ready-to-customize charts of

We dare you—just once!—to print checks by computer (printer alignment tests are usually built into the software) and not be hooked. Ordering continuous-form checks is no more difficult than buying regular ones. Finance programs contain sample voided checks as well as an order form for authentic checks imprinted with your name, address, and account number. And bill paying isn't as painful, it seems, when you simply sign those checks and tuck them into double-window envelopes—one window displays your name and return address; the other window, the payee's name and address. Figure on springing about \$55 for 250 checks and envelopes.

Not unexpectedly, each personal-finance program has its own style. The following capsule reviews are intended to help you gain insight into each program's significant, extraordinary, or unique capabilities. Find the program that appeals to you, then browse through the accompanying product-comparison **Table** to learn more about specific features.

PERSONAL ACCOUNTANT

Arguably one of the least sophisticated of the seven programs reviewed here, Personal Accountant nevertheless has an appealing accounts: Household, Business, and Tax Preparation. Account categories include both numeric and alphabetic designations. Numbers help the program sort categories properly during report generation; plain-English names help you remember the accounts with which you're working.

MANAGING YOUR MONEY

In a class by itself, Managing Your Money probably performs every financial function you're likely to need—ever. Powerful features include checkbook maintenance with automated check printing, budget design and analysis, complete financial reporting, insurance assessment, and stock-portfolio management. There's also real-estate investment analysis, loan projection, and tax forecasting.

Not surprisingly, Managing Your Money's a little pricey. But the benefits—an easy-to-use, menu-driven interface with applekey commands, ready-to-run examples in all program modules, and Andrew Tobias' expert knowledge (and refreshing sense of humor)—make the program a steal for wealthy-wannabees who intend to use most, if not all, of the program's features. And as if to sweeten the deal, Managing Your Money also throws in an electronic to-do pad and the computer equivalent of a Rolodex-type file.

QUICKEN

Any individual or business owner looking to automate a checking account with the least fuss should put Quicken to the test. This popular program displays menus that look like AppleWorks filecards, and check facsimiles that look like the real thing. "Write" a check, press a few keys, and voilà-a batch of checks to sign.

Quicken, like other checkbook managers, is essentially a "smart" file cabinet. Depending on the entry you store in the check's "memo" section (and Quicken can memorize both oftenused memos and recurring transactions), you can quickly prepare reports that track budget categories, monitor business expenses, and even organize information for your income-tax return. Like the other half-dozen programs reviewed here, Quicken can also convert check-register information to a form compatible with the AppleWorks spreadsheet.

ALPHA CHECK

A relative newcomer to the Apple II finance genre, Alpha Check is a lot like Quicken, but with one blow-your-socks-off difference: Alpha Check doesn't just transfer data to Apple-Works-it works within AppleWorks.

Alpha Check's gusto derives from the TimeOut UltraMacros programming language on which it's based. Fortunately, you don't need to know an iota of computer code, or even own the UltraMacros program for that matter, to enjoy Alpha Check.

Because this program is so intimately associated with AppleWorks, you can use familiar commands to get the job done, whether you're paying a stack of bills or monitoring your company's general ledger. Simply choose from options displayed in the AppleWorks-style stacking file-card menus. Writing checks is as easy as filling in the look-alike on screen-or zooming out to enter information directly into the check register.

Alpha Check prints check stubs and is compatible with checks you may have already purchased for use with other programs. Switch to Alpha Check and you won't have to trash your unused inventory. See? Already you're saving money.

ON BALANCE

With pull-down menus, dialog boxes, mouse input, and a blackon-white screen display, On Balance is an unusually flexible Maclike program that manages to perform admirably and look good at the same time. No other program offers the freedom of choice On Balance provides. You can use the keyboard instead of the mouse, change screen appearance, use double- or single-entry bookkeeping methods, and name accounts whatever you like. The program also lets you group accounts and customize reports to suit your style. There's more: On Balance offers password protection, a four-function calculator, and a split-screen option for displaying bar graphs along with data. On Balance isn't fussy about your Apple II system, either, as the package includes both $5\frac{1}{4}$ - and $3\frac{1}{9}$ -inch disks.

SMART MONEY

The only ProDOS 16-based program in the bunch, Smart Money is authentic GS. (An Apple IIe/IIc version is also available.) The program features seven pull-down menus: Apple, File, Edit, Data, Reports, Planning, and Miscellaneous. Use the mouse to select menu options, scroll through directories, or click on radio buttons. Alternative mnemonic open-apple or control-key commands also elicit quick responses when you want to display accounts (Open apple-A) or toggle to the overstrike cursor (Control-C), for instance.

A demonstration file, together with a 54-page tutorial booklet, introduces you to the Smart Money school of finance. The program's predefined-but easily edited-chart of accounts helps you get organized in short order. Smart Money GS offers a number of special features, including a four-function calculator, bar-graphing capability, check-voucher printing, investment/ retirement planning-and a 30-day money-back guarantee.

WOE BEGONE

Having trouble balancing your checkbook or keeping to a budget? Worrying whether you can afford a college education for your kids or a vacation home for your retirement? Think back again to last January and learn from the pros. Take a timeout, review your software library, and plan a new strategy. Depending on your preferences, any one of the seven products reviewed here can help you on your way to a prosperous 1990.

Do-It-Yourself AppleWorks Checkbook

ERE'S TO THE DO-IT-YOUR-SELFER. IF you'd like to realize a greater return on your AppleWorks investment before springing \$50 or more for a stand-alone finance program, this checking-account template may suit you to a T-bill!

Clearly, this electronic checkbook doesn't do it all. The features of any homegrown template are limited by the inherent capabilities of its host program, in this case the AppleWorks database. Our checkbook, for example, doesn't offer advanced accounting functions, nor does it print checks or display bar graphs.

DEFINING THE DATABASE

Start up AppleWorks and select *Add files to the Desktop* from the Main Menu. Make a new file for the database from scratch, and name it **CHECKBOOK**.

At the Change Name/Category screen, press Open apple-Y to erase the nondescript *Category 1* title. Next, type the categories, or field names, you want to include in your database. Begin by typing the following, and press Return after each name:

Date Check # Deposit Service Charge Payee Amount Memo 1 Memo 2

These categories parallel the information you usually include in your handwritten check register. Until you become confident using an electronic checkbook, it's a good idea to continue maintaining a manual register. When you finally abandon it, be sure to keep a backup copy of your data disk.

If you'd like to track budget categories in your database, add those now. For a personal checking account, you might want to include fields such as the following (specifics depend on your lifestyle):

Mortgage/Rent Food Electricity Heating Fuel Telephone Cable TV Medical/Dental Insurance Entertainment Auto Expense Credit Cards Donations Gifts

If you're setting up a small-business checking account, you could define just one field in this section of your database and call it **Account**. Then, with the AppleWorks word processor, create a printed chart of accounts that specifies each one and its numeric or alphabetic code. Most accountants prefer numeric codes, but letter codes seem easier to remember. Try using **FT** for federal income tax, **SP** for supplies, **AU** for auto expenses, and so on.

For personal use, you may want to include categories for tagging tax-deductible expenses and for helping you organize tax information at the end of the year. Name three fields **Tax Deductible**, **Tax Category**, and **IRS Schedule or Form**. If you'd like your AppleWorks checkbook to help with monthly reconciliation of your figures with your bank's, create a category named **Cleared**.

Reserve remaining categories (of the 30 total that AppleWorks allows) by typing any character. An **X** or an asterisk works just

fine. You may not need these categories now, but they'll be available if and when you do. Just rename them with AppleWorks' Open apple-N command.

As with most AppleWorks functions, you can usually figure out what to do by reading the prompts on screen or by referring to the AppleWorks user's manuals.

After you've set up your categories, the completed checkbook database template should look something like Figure 1. Place a

formatted data disk in the active drive, and save your template by pressing Open apple-S. If you don't have a data disk, use the *format* option in AppleWorks' Other Activities menu to create one.

NAMING YOUR CHECKBOOKS

When prompted, press the spacebar to enter Insert New Records mode. Press Escape once, then use Open apple-N and rename the file currently on the Desktop to **Check.Personal** or whatever seems appropriate. Remember, your original template remains undisturbed on your data disk. Press Escape, then the spacebar when you're ready to begin entering information.

If you want to set up more than one checkbook file, load the

template from your disk as many times as necessary in succession, and give each version a unique name such as Check.Kathy, Check.Condo, Check.League, Check.Business, or Check.Payroll. AppleWorks' desktop lets you keep as many as 12 checkbook files available in memory during a single work session.

ENTERING DATA

Thanks to AppleWorks' friendly interface, entering information into your checkbook on the Review/Add/Change screen couldn't be easier. For a deposit, enter the date in the Date field as, say 1/24, and press Return; AppleWorks converts the expression automatically to Jan 24. Move to the Deposit field (use the Tab key or the down-arrow key) and check it off with an **X** or any other character you prefer. Enter the amount of the deposit in the Amount field. (See Figure 2.)

For a check, enter the Date, Check #, Payee, and Amount. For debits (money taken out of your checking account as a service charge or a check) be sure you enter amounts as *minus* (or negative) values as shown in **Figure 3**. Check off the appropriate budget category and tax-deductible status if you like. Press Open apple-Down arrow to add a new record. Enter the next deposit **>**

or check. After every few transactions, press OA-S to save your database to the current data disk.

So far you've been using AppleWorks' single-record layout to

create a separate record for every transaction, much as you would if you were noting each one on its own index card. To view the complete check register, press Open apple-Z to switch to AppleWorks' multiple-record layout. Your list should look something like **Figure 4**.

MANAGING INFORMATION

In multiple-record layout you can easily arrange (Open apple-A) information to your liking. Sort transactions by date, by num-

ber, or alphabetically by payee. Use Open apple-F to find specific information: check #1845, or all payments made to the electric company, for instance. When the list of "matches" appears, press Open apple-Z to zoom in for a closer look at each selected record. Press Open apple-Down arrow (or -Up arrow) to move to the next (or previous) record.

Use Open apple-R to perform single-, double-, or triple-level searches: deductions reported on Schedule A of your tax return; medical payments exceeding \$50; or business gifts of \$25 or less made at Christmas.

STAYING SOLVENT

Neither single- nor multiple-record layout provides an automatic running balance each time you write a check, but it's easy to design a simple AppleWorks database report that does.

Press Open apple-P and select *Create a new tables format* named **BALANCE**. Using the tab key (or the right- and left-arrow keys) and the Open apple-D command, delete all categories from this report *except* Date, Check #, Deposit, Service Charge, Payee, and

Amount. Use the open-apple key in conjunction with the leftand right-arrow keys to shorten the headings, so that the complete layout spans no more than 79 columns. Press Open apple-T— AppleWorks' Totals command—to add up the Amount category and give you a running balance. (See **Figure 5**.)

Whenever you want to view your checkbook transactions and current balance (you'll see an asterisk) press Open apple-P and

print the report to *The screen*. For a hardcopy of this report, select your printer instead. Careful—a negative balance means your account's overdrawn!

RECONCILING YOUR BANK STATEMENT

When your bank statement arrives, mark the checks you've paid and the deposits the bank has credited by entering an **X** or some other character in the Cleared field on each affected record.

For service charges, add a new record to your database. Check off the Service Charge and Cleared categories. Enter the value as a negative figure in the Amount field.

Press Open apple-P and select the BALANCE report. First you want a list of outstanding checks, so press Open apple-R and create a search selection rule: where *Cleared is blank* and *Check # is not blank*. Press Open apple-P and print the total amount from outstanding checks. Jot down this figure, or get a quick printout (Open apple-H). Next you need to know the total amount of money deposited that the bank hasn't yet credited to your account. Press Open apple-R and define the search selection rule: where *Cleared is blank* and *Deposit is not blank*. Press Open apple-P to get this amount and jot it down.

With a desktop calculator (even better, use the AppleWorks spreadsheet and print to a DIF file on disk), take the bank's reported balance, add the deposits as yet uncredited, and subtract your unpaid (outstanding) checks. The final calculated amount should agree with the current checkbook balance your AppleWorks database indicates. Before using Open apple-P to get the current balance, press Open apple-R and select *all* records.

HAVING IT ALL-ALMOST

This AppleWorks checkbook doesn't pretend to rival the programs reviewed in the accompanying article. But despite its lack of sophistication, this template can help you manage your finances better—and expand your AppleWorks know-how while you're at it!





Balance Your Books with AppleWorks GS

Design a foolproof checkbook with the AppleWorks GS database. It's easy to read and simple to use—accounting's gone from stuffy to stylish!

REATIVE YET PRACTICAL, APPLEWORKS GS is the Renaissance person's dream program. With this 16-bit six-part package you can express your artistic vision, compose a technical report, organize your electronic file cabinet, download timely information, design an advertising campaign, and crunch numbers *ad infinitum*. Is it any wonder, then, that the AppleWorks GS database has a flair for tracking finances?

To prove it, let's design a computerized checkbook that not only substitutes for the handwritten variety but also helps you corral expenses and gear up for IRS Day.

DEFINING SPECS

First, be sure you have a formatted data disk on which to store this checkbook template and file. Next, start up AppleWorks GS (AWGS) and load the database module by double-clicking on the file-cabinet icon.

Don't touch that mouse! Instead, think about the categories of information you should include in this "intelligent" checkbook. Certain kinds of data are *de rigueur* even in electronic check registers: **Date**, **Deposit**, **Service Charge**, **Check #**, **Payee**, **Amount**, and **Memo**. Suppose you want to generate budget reports or an income statement. You may want a separate category called **Account** to track budget items such as food, or business accounts such as FICA. This AWGS checkbook can even relieve some of the year-end drudgery associated with preparing your tax return, if you take steps to flag tax-deductible expenses as they accrue. Add the fields **Tax Deductible**, **Tax Category**, and **IRS Schedule or Form** to your database design.

LABELING CATEGORIES

Unlike AppleWorks Classic, AWGS won't let you get away with merely labeling database categories. For each data label, you must define a database field consistent with its anticipated contents: date, text, or numeric, among others.

Begin by "rubber-banding" labels: Holding down the button, drag the mouse first across the blue background of the formdefinition screen, then downward to draw a small rectangular box about an eighth of an inch high and an inch wide. Release the button; a dialog opens automatically. Click on the *Label* box in the upper right-hand corner.

Press the delete key, and type in the name of the database category. The *Text* radio button is the default; leave it selected for this and all other labels you'll create for this checkbook project.

Now press the return key. Grab one of the label's four corner selection "handles" and shrink or enlarge the label until it's sized appropriately.

If you want to move a label, place the mouse pointer on top of the label, press the mouse button, and drag the label into its new position. Release the mouse button to drop the label into place. This flexibility in database design is undoubtedly one of **•** AWGS' most appealing features.

Below the completed label, rubber-band another. Check the *Label* box in the dialog, and name the category. Resize and reposition the label as desired. Continue until you have a label for every category you want to include in your database. If you've made an error and want to delete a label, select it and press Open apple-X, or press the delete key.

DEFINING AND FORMATTING FIELDS

Next, rubber-band and define a field for each category you've already labeled. Don't click on the *Label* box; type each field's name. For simplicity's sake, use the same name you decided on for its label.

Selecting a field type is relatively easy most of the time. The Date label requires a date field; the Check **#** label requires a numeric field; the Payee label requires a text field. Categories such as Account, however, can pose problems, because you have to decide early on whether your chart of accounts will consist of numeric or alphabetic codes. Don't fret too much at this point; if you make a mistake, or simply change your mind, pull down the Edit menu and select *Field Definition*.

While you're at it, rubber-band a label and a text field named **Cleared**. That way, when your bank pays a check or credits a deposit, you can simply mark the field with an **X** or some other token.

This AWGS checkbook doesn't provide a running balance as

it records each transaction. Shortly you'll design a report that does, so create a numeric field named **Balance**. You don't need to rubber-band a label to accompany this field. Balance is a formula field that tracks the net effect of each database record by changing the sign for debited items to minus. With Balance selected, choose *Field Formula* from the Edit pull-down menu. In the ensuing dialog, double-click on fields and operations in the following sequence to create the formula: [Deposit]-[Service Charge]-[Amount].

When you've finished creating, naming, and defining labels and fields, the form-definition screen will look something like Figure 1.

AWGS affords ample choices for formatting fields. Double-click on a field or select it and choose *Field Format* from the Edit pulldown menu. Date fields can appear in any of three different formats, with or without named days. To simplify data entry later on, select *Auto-Stamp* from the *Format Date Field* dialog; AWGS reads the date from your computer's internal clock. You can enhance dates by selecting any of three type styles, adding borders, setting justification, and displaying one of 16 colors.

Numeric fields can exhibit not only style, justification, and color, but a predetermined number of decimal places and form of expression (*General, Fixed, Scientific, Percent,* or *Dollar*). Capturing an accounting metaphor on screen is a snap with RGB color: Display deposits in black; service charges, check numbers, and disbursements in red!

When checkbook form definition is completed, pull down the Template menu and save the setup as **CHECKBOOK.GS**. Begin with this file whenever you want to create new checking-account databases.

ENTERING AND VIEWING DATA

Like AppleWorks Classic, AWGS lets you deal with data on individual forms or in lists containing multiple records. Form mode (**Figure 2**) is best for data entry, but List mode (**Figure 3**) is best for data analysis.

Data entry couldn't be simpler. Click on the *Form* box in the lower left-hand corner of the form-definition screen and, with the mouse, select the field where you want to type information. Double-click on a Date field to date-stamp it automatically. When you're finished with a record, press the tab key to move to the next field, or press Return to move to the beginning of the next record. (Don't press Return until you've finished with the record on which you're working.)

View your check register anytime by clicking on the *List* box in the lower left-hand corner of the screen. Run through the check register with the vertical or horizontal scroll bars or the arrow keys. If fine-tuning's required, click on a cell (the intersection of a column and a row, where AWGS stores information) and edit its contents on the spot.

Besides re-arranging the order in which categories appear, AWGS can alter the list layout in many ways. Refer to your AWGS user's guides for more information on features too numerous to describe here.

Return to Form mode at will by clicking on the *Form* box in the lower left-hand corner of the List screen. Incidentally, you can press Open apple-P to print database information displayed in either Form or List mode.

Enter some initial data and save your file by selecting *Save As* from the File menu or by pressing Open apple-A. Name the file Check.Jim, Check.Business, or whatever suits you. Later on, you can quick-save the file from time to time during data-entry sessions by pressing Open apple-S.




Figure 4. AWGS Match Record dialog.

Options listed in the Organize menu help you sort data, search for specific information, and determine ground rules for reports. Arrange transactions by account code or use *Find* to help you locate all payments to the telephone company. Invoke the *Match Records* feature (**Figure 4**) to set up selection rules for more

complicated searches. Don't be put off by the odd syntax of some AWGS search selection rules. While [Payee] = Heritage Cablevision may be nearly intuitive, Contains("y", [Tax Deductible]) may seem quite foreign.

AppleWorks GS can transform database reports automatically into word-processing documents. Let's create a report now that shows not only the current checking-account balance, but tallies deposits, service charges, and disbursements, as well.

Switch to List mode if you're not already there, and one by one select, mark, and hide the following categories: Date, Check #, Payee, Account, Memo, Tax Deductible, Tax Category, IRS Schedule or Form, and Cleared. Select a category by clicking on it with the mouse. Mark and hide it by selecting *Mark Fields* (Organize menu). Make sure *Display Marked Fields* (Organize menu) is turned off. Pull down the Report menu and select Format. The names of the four unmarked database categories—Deposit, Service Charge, Amount, Balance—appear in a scrolling directory. Select them one by one and for all but Balance, click on the Count radio button. For all four, click on the Sum radio button. In the Subtotal Break After directory leave the Totals Only selection as is. Click on OK. In the Report menu select Summary Only, then choose Create Report.




Figure 5. AWGS checking-account balance report.

Within moments, a word-processing window opens to display your account balance, as well as the number of deposits, service charges, and checks *and* their subtotals (**Figure 5**). Print the window's contents, or jot down the balance. Remove the window by clicking on its close box.

If you want to re-enter the database to record additional transactions, turn on *Display Marked Fields* (Organize menu) before proceeding in Form mode. Whenever you want to see the account balance, turn off *Display Marked Fields* and create a new report.

Coaxing your account to jive with the bank's monthly report isn't complicated. Denote each recorded transaction with an X in its Cleared field. *Match Records* with the selection rule *IsBlank*([Cleared]). Turn *Display Marked Records* off and *Hide Unselected Records*.

Generate a report that totals these outstanding checks and uncredited deposits. With a hand-held calculator (or a pencil and paper) add the deposit subtotal to your bank balance, and subtract the check subtotal. This final tally should agree with the AWGS check-register balance.



THE II/MAC CONNECTION:

As the II and the Mac share more features, home, school, and smallbusiness users reap the benefits of those technological advances.

S A RULE, APPLE II OWNERS RESENT THE MACINTOSH; Mac owners barely recognize the II's existence. Sometimes it seems as though the computers are manufactured by separate companies. They look different. They have incompatible operating systems. One's the talk of the town, the yuppie's choice for "in" computing. The other's a workhorse with a proud history of durability and flexibility—and a dubious future. But beneath the marketing hype of the Mac, and the lack of marketing for the II, are these two computers really that different? For years the rumors coming out of Silicon Valley have speculated about a "bridge" computer that'll run both Apple II and Macintosh software. Apple Computer, of

course, steadfastly refuses to make any public comment on this, or any other, unannounced product.

While it's impossible to know Apple's plans, after examining the company's product introductions over the last couple of years one conclusion seems likely: Engineers at Apple have been deliberately working toward bringing the two computer families closer together in both hardware and system software. Most of the foundation is already in place for the long-awaited "bridge," but if and when it'll arrive is anybody's guess. As we wait, though, Apple II and Mac users continue to benefit from the evolving technology.

Despite the growing sentiment that Apple's been treating II owners like second-class citizens lately, many of the technology transfers between the two siblings haven't been hand-me-downs from the Mac. On the contrary, some of the more important concepts and products that have helped make the Mac successful originated on the Apple II. The Mac didn't really take off, for example, until its architecture was "opened up" with NuBus slots, much like the expansion slots in the original Apple II. Conversely, Apple II owners continue to reap the real-world rewards of Mac research and development. It's this two-way relationship that has fostered many significant technological advances for Mac and Apple II users.

SHARE AND SHARE ALIKE

One of the most recent signposts on the road to connectivity is **System Disk 5.0**, also known as GS/OS, which Apple released last August. (See "System 5.0: From a Trot to a Gallop," November 1989, p. 64.) Finally, IIGS owners have a true 16-bit operating system, based on the popular Macintosh desktop metaphor, that can recognize an AppleShare file server on the AppleTalk network. And that file server, which appears on the Finder's desktop and is handled as if it were a hard-disk drive, can contain Apple II, Mac, and IBM programs and data files. With System Disk 5.0, you can copy Mac applications and data files from the server to a local GS disk. You can't use any but the most rudimentary data files, and you can't run Mac applications. The server eliminates the disk-format barrier between the II and the Mac, but you'd need a Mac-specific logical data interpreter to run Mac programs and read Mac data files.

You can use Apple II files on the Mac, however. COMPUTER:applications' software emulator II in a Mac lets you run certain 8-bit Apple II programs on the other machine. In addition, Apple includes a free program called Apple File Exchange on Mac system disks. This program converts data files among Apple IIs, MS-DOS machines, and the Mac. There's no reason why Apple can't release a similar program for the Apple II, as the GS' hardware has the ability to read Mac-formatted disks; it just needs the right software to drive it. Roger Wagner's **Graphics Exchange**, which can read files directly from $3\frac{1}{2}$ -inch Mac disks, proves it's possible.

While GS/OS incorporates some neat Mac features that have been around for years, such as the Control Panel NDA (new desk accessory), scrollable menus, resource forks, and pop-up menus, Apple has also announced that the next revision of the Mac's system software will take a cue from the II. For instance, installing fonts and desk accessories on the Mac currently requires you to use a utility called Font/DA Mover. With System 7.0 you'll soon be able to drag these files into folders just the way you do under GS/OS. The new Mac system should also contain an extended implementation of its External File System, which will let you insert ProDOS and MS-DOS disks into the drive and perform file-maintenance tasks at the Finder's desktop, just as if they were Mac disks. That procedure is similar to the way GS/OS utilizes FSTs (file-system translators) to let you use ProDOS disks and CD-ROM.

HIGH-CAPACITY STORAGE

The original Mac had a built-in $3\frac{1}{2}$ -inch, 400K floppy-disk drive. When Apple released the Mac Plus with a double-density, doublesided 800K drive in January 1986, it was clear that the $3\frac{1}{2}$ -inch floppy was the wave of the future.

These compact disks, enclosed in a rugged plastic shell, have a spring-loaded door that protects the magnetic medium when not in a drive. With such obvious benefits, 3¹/₂-inch drives migrated quickly to the Apple II, even though the 143K, 5¹/₄-inch floppy continues to be a popular medium for the IIe and IIc. The first of these smaller units, the Apple UniDisk 3.5 Drive, contained its own microprocessor and was thus referred to as "intelligent," although it was incompatible with the Mac. As technology progressed, Apple came up with the idea of putting the brains into the computer, not the drive. The result was the SmartPort drive connector and the Integrated Wozniak Machine (IWM) chip, appearing first on the IIGS, then on a revision of the IIc. Not only could these computers use the old 51/4-inch and UniDisk drives, but they could also use the same 31/2-inch 800K drives as the Macintosh. This move laid the foundation for the two computers to share storage media, swap files, and eventually run each other's programs.

When the Mac SE/30 made its debut, it sported a 1440K FDHD (floppy-disk, high-density) internal drive. Every new Mac since then has come standard with an internal FDHD drive, also known as a SuperDrive. What makes this possible is a SWIM (Super Wozniak Integrated Machine) chip, a custom integrated circuit based on the IWM. The SWIM and IWM are basically chip-based descendants of Wozniak's ingenious disk-drive controller card that made it possible to use 143K, 5¼-inch disk drives on the original Apple II.

Is an FDHD drive in the cards for Apple II owners? Probably not. While FDHD drives offer increased capacity, their main benefit is that they can read MS-DOS-formatted disks directly. If you want this capability on your II, investigate Applied Engineering's **PC Transporter**. Not only does this board let you read IBM disks, it also lets you run IBM programs on your II. And if the FDHD's 1.44-megabyte capacity has you salivating, consider purchasing a hard-disk drive for your II. For roughly the same amount of money as a SuperDrive, you can get a much faster 20-megabyte hard drive.

SCSI DEVICES-AND ALTERNATIVES

Speaking of hard drives, did you know that you can use virtually any Mac hard-disk drive with your Apple IIGS or IIe? Because of economies of scale, buying a Mac drive is sometimes cheaper than getting one that's tailored to the II. All you need is an Apple-SCSI (small-computer-systems interface) card.

SCSI defines a standard way of interfacing peripherals to your computer; you can daisychain up to seven SCSI devices to your Apple. The Mac Plus was the first Apple computer to come with a SCSI port standard, and every Mac since has one, too. If you want to add SCSI capability to the Apple IIe or IIGS, though, you need to buy a SCSI interface card and plug it into one the IIe's or GS' expansion slots. Although you hear of SCSI hard-disk drives most often, there are other types of SCSI devices. Apple's CD-ROM drive is one example, but it doesn't come highly recommended. Apart from being slow, there are virtually no Apple II applications currently available on compact disc. If it's any consolation, the situation isn't much better in the Mac market.

A SyQuest drive is a much more prudent investment. Popular in the Mac community, this drive is essentially a 44-megabyte hard disk in a removable cartridge. SyQuest drives are great for archival purposes, and you can add as much capacity as you need. Also, you can keep valuable information secure by storing the cartridges in a safe. Because SyQuest drives are slightly more complicated to use than regular hard disks, you're better off dealing with one of the companies that actively service the Apple II market, such as CMS Enhancements, First Class Peripherals, or American Micro Research.

SCSI tape drives are also making their way to the Apple II market as a convenient method for backing up large hard disks. First Class Peripherals is currently the only third-party firm that offers such a device. Another option is to purchase a DC 2000 minicartridge tape drive through a mail-order house. For this, you'll need the appropriate driver software, **HDTape**, available as shareware from Tim Grams. Currently HDTape supports only 40-megabyte DC 2000 minicartridge drives manufactured by 3M. It's conceivable, though, that someone could write drivers for DC 600 cartridge drives, as well as TEAC tape drives. These latter drives are capable of storing 60 to 150 megabytes on a single cassette the size of a standard audio tape.

Similarly, a lack of software is the only obstacle preventing Apple II owners from using the **Apple Scanner**; this SCSI device currently works only on the Mac. Place a photograph or other flat document in this scanner and minutes later a digitized rendition appears on the Mac screen in up to 16 levels of gray. Until someone writes the necessary driver software, Apple II users must content themselves with Thunderware's **ThunderScan**, a popular optical digitizer (for both the Mac and the II) shaped like a ribbon cartridge. Plug

BUS IT

The Apple II's keyboard has come a long way since its all-uppercase past. Over the years the layouts of keyboards for the Mac and the II have become indistinguishable. Look inside the IIGS keyboard and you'll find the same components as in the standard Mac keyboard, so you can switch one keyboard to the other computer.

The technology making this possible is the Apple Desktop Bus (ADB), which first appeared on the IIGS and later migrated to the Mac. ADB is much like SCSI in that it defines a standard way of daisychaining up to 16 devices to a single computer. Input devices such as keyboards, mice, joysticks, and graphics tablets are the ADB's primary users. Because the ADB exists on both the GS and all Macs since the SE, these systems can easily share peripherals. Also, non-ADB mice, like those used on the IIe and IIc, will work on the original Mac and the Plus.

SERIAL CONNECTIONS

The Apple II and the Mac have long been able to share serial devices. The original Mac sported two serial interfaces (one for printers and another for modems) with DB-9 connectors, while the slots in the IIe allow for up to six serial cards. Taking an external modem, for example, from a II and connecting it to a Mac was simply a matter of switching cables to accommodate each machine's different connectors. Data communication was possible thanks to the compatibility between the Mac's RS-422 protocol and the II's RS-232 standard. All that was missing was a common connector.

Enter the 8-pin mini-DIN (Deutsche Industrie Normal) connector, two of which have been standard equipment on every Mac since the Mac Plus. Soon after they appeared on the Plus, they showed up on the IIGS, and more recently, on the IIC Plus.

Mini-DIN connectors are nice because of their small size—barely thicker than the cable—and a slotted "key," which prevents mistakes when plugging in equipment. Now that the two lines of computers share the same physical connectors, you can move serial peripherals (such as printers, external modems, and AppleTalk devices) between them easily.

WISH LIST

-

A number of useful Macintosh peripherals could work easily on the Apple II; all that's missing is someone to write the necessary drivers, and that should be Apple. The difficult and expensive part designing and manufacturing the hardware—is already done. All Apple needs to do is write and release the appropriate software, so that you can use these devices on the Apple II family. It's up to you, Apple II users, to remind Cupertino of the II's versatility and to point out that you're ready to put to good use several products currently available only to Mac users.

ONE FOR THE MONEY

Compare your spending habits with the national average, and see how you measure up.

MARLEY'S GHOST IN *A CHRISTMAS Carol* conjured up Christmas past, present, and future. The spreadsheet in this month's column evokes money past: You'll discover how the ghost of money past (what you've already spent) measures up to the way other people spend their money.

LIFESTYLES

If you live life to the hilt with nary a care for tomorrow, you're not alone. On the other hand, if you routinely squeeze every penny before letting go, you've got plenty of company.

The spreadsheet in **Figure 1** lets you compare your spending habits with everyone else's by referring to the national averages shown in column D.

When you list your annual income, taxes, and living expenses, the formulas produce your total income and taxes, calculate aftertax income, figure out how much is available for savings and investments, and show each expense as a percentage of after-tax income (national averages courtesy of U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics).

Create a new AppleWorks spreadsheet file and name it **LIVING**. You should now see the spreadsheet Review/Add/Change screen with the cursor in A1. Use the following summary to start the spreadsheet: Long lines. Enter a double line in A2 through D2: Place the cursor on A2 and type quotation marks. Hold down the equal-sign key until the sign reaches the right edge of D2, then move the cursor to A14. Use a minus sign in the same way to enter a single line in A14 through D14.

Leave the cursor on A14 and copy the singleline row to the clipboard: Press OA-C to start the Copy command. Type T to select *To clipboard* and press Return once to confirm *rows* and again to confirm row A14–D14.

Now copy from the clipboard: With the cursor on A21, press OA-C and type **F** to select *From clipboard*. Now place the cursor on A23. Again, press OA-C and type **F**. Next, place the cursor on A50, press OA-C and type **F**. And finally, place the cursor on A52, press OA-C, and type **F**.

Column width. Each column is now nine characters wide. Use the Layout command (OA-L), *Columns*, and *Column width* to increase the column widths as follows: column A to 41 characters, column B to 10 characters, and columns C and D to 11 characters each.

Short lines. In B12, type quotation marks, press the spacebar once, type eight minus signs, and move the cursor to B19. Enter the same line in B19, then do it again in B48. In C26, type quotation marks and hold down the minus-sign key until the sign reaches the right edge of D26. In C48 and D48, type quotation marks, press the spacebar five times, and type five minus signs.

Labels and numbers. Referring to Figure 2, enter all labels and numbers. In A1, type quotation marks and press the spacebar 25 times before typing the spreadsheet title. In C24, type quotation marks before the percent sign. To indent a label under a general heading (such as *Earner #1 gross wages or salary* in A4 under *ANNUAL INCOME* in A3), type quotation marks and press the spacebar once. To indent a label that identifies a total (such as *Total Income* in A13), type quotation marks and press the spacebar twice.

Instead of pressing Return after typing a label or number, move the cursor to the next cell that needs an entry, and AppleWorks will enter what you just typed in its cell. After typing the last entry, hit Return.

Formats. Use the Value command (OA-V) to set a standard *Value format* of *Dollars* with zero decimal places. Use OA-L and *Block* to reformat the cells in columns C and D (rows 27 through 51) for Percent with one decimal place.

Right-align the labels in rows 24 and 25. Now press OA-S (AppleWorks' Save command) to store all your work on disk.

ENTERING FORMULAS

Formulas perform your calculations. First read how the formula works; then place the cursor on the cell receiving the formula. Move the cursor to the cell locations shown in the formula, and type everything else.

When the formula's complete, compare each character on your screen with the way it appears here. If everything agrees, press Return. If something's amiss, press Escape and start again.

Each SUM formula (B13, B20, B49, and D49) includes the empty cell above the list of amounts and the dashed line below the list. That way, if you later insert rows for items not listed here, AppleWorks will adjust the formula to add the new entries.





FORMULA 1: TOTAL INCOME

Formula 1 adds each source of income (B4 through B11) to produce total income in B13.

Cell location: B13

Formula: @SUM(B12.B3)

Before continuing, protect Formula 1 against change: Leave the cursor on B13, press OA-L, and hit Return. Type **PN** (for *Protection Nothing*). As you create other formulas, protect each one the same way.

FORMULA 2: TOTAL TAXES

Formula 2 adds each type of tax (B16 through B18) to produce total taxes in B20. Cell location: B20 Formula: @SUM(B19.B15)

FORMULA 3: AFTER-TAX INCOME

Formula 3 subtracts total taxes (B20) from total income (B13) to produce after-tax income in B22.

Cell location: B22 Formula: +B13-B20

FORMULA 4: TOTAL LIVING EXPENSES

Formula 4 adds the list of living expenses (B27 through B47) to produce total living expenses in B49.

Cell location: B49

Formula: @SUM(B48.B26)

Formula 4 can add the percentages in columns C and D, so copy it: With the cursor on B49, press OA-C, and hit Return twice. Move the cursor to C49, type a period, move the cursor to D49, and hit Return again. Both cell references are relative, so type **R** twice.

Okay, so there's a dollar sign in percentage cells C49 and D59. That's because copying the formula copied its standard dollar format, too. To correct matters, place the cursor on C49 and press OA-L.

Type **B**, move the cursor to D49, and hit Return twice. Type **P1** (for *Percent 1 decimal*) and hit Return again.

FORMULA 5: SAVINGS

Formula 5 subtracts total living expenses (B49) from after-tax income (B22) to produce the money available for savings and investments in B51.

Cell location: B51 Formula: +B22-B49

FORMULA 6: PERCENTAGE OF INCOME




Figure 1. Nine lines for creating template.

Formula 6 divides rent or mortgage payments (B27) by after-tax income (B22) to show Figure 1. Compare your expenses.

Formula: + B27/B22

Now copy Formula 6 down the column: Leave the cursor on C27, press OA-C, and hit Return twice.

Move the cursor to C28, type a period, move the cursor to C47, and hit Return again. To tell AppleWorks that the first cell reference is relative and the second is absolute (no change), type \mathbf{R} and press Return.


Copy Formula 6 again: With the cursor on C27, press OA-C and hit Return twice. Move the cursor to C51 and hit Return again. Type **R** and press Return.

PRINTING THE SPREADSHEET

LIVING is 73 characters wide and prints at the standard 10 characters to the inch. Press OA-O to bring up the Printer Options screen. To position it properly on the page, set these margins: Type **LM** and press Return. Type **.4** and hit Return again.

Now type **RM** and press Return. Type **3** and hit Return again. And finally, type **TM**, press Return, type **.5**, and hit Return again. All other print settings remain at AppleWorks standards. Press OA-S to store the margin settings on disk and return the spreadsheet to the screen.

INSTEAD OF RESOLVING TO LOSE weight (again) this year, why not make a New Year's pact that's guaranteed to succeed? Spend just a few hours with **Publish It! 2** and create a custom calling card.

CARDS FOR ALL REASONS

You don't have to be a whiz-kid entrepreneur to benefit from so-called business cards. Even if you're seventysomething, these $3\frac{1}{2}$ -by-2-inch cards are an inexpensive, convenient way to make all kinds of contacts—for your sports club, senior association, or investment group, for instance.

While you're at it, create a batch of moreor-less generic cards, carry a few in your wallet or purse, and hand them out to new friends and acquaintances. You won't have to interrupt conversation to write down your name, address, and phone number, and the folks you're talking to won't have to decipher your hurried scrawl on that used table napkin!

Truth is, if you're like Dennis Krill—an Apple IIc user and architectural designer from Bellefonte, Pennsylvania, and the creator of this month's template—you're probably involved in *lots* of activities and need a different card for each of the many "hats" you wear.

Krill's calling-card template lets you fit ten cards on a single $8\frac{1}{2}$ -by-11-inch page. You can create ten copies of a single design—or as many as ten *different* designs—all on one print master.

LINE IT UP

Amazingly, this template is composed of just nine straight lines and is a snap to create. Start up Publish It! and work in *Size to Fit* mode: Press Open apple-4 or pull down the Special menu. Overall, this project is compatible with any version of Publish It!; certain optional procedures may not be available, however, if you're using the program's original version.

Click on the line tool in the Publish It! tool box. Pull down the Objects menu and select *Set Line Weight*. Click on the radio button corresponding to the narrowest line thickness. (It may be selected already by default.)

Pull down the Objects menu again. This time select *Set Pen Pattern*. Click on the first pattern in the second row. Drawing with striped patterns, such as this one, creates dashed lines you can use later as cutting guides for separating your printed business cards.

With the line tool, draw six horizontal lines anywhere on the page. Remove the selection handles from the last line drawn by clicking off to its side. Now pull down the Objects menu and click on *Set Pen Pattern*. Select the last pattern in the second row. Draw three vertical



lines anywhere on the page. Your creation may look somewhat disjointed, like the one in **Figure 1**.

GET IT TOGETHER

To bring order to this seeming chaos, choose the pointer and click on the topmost horizontal line. If your aim is true, a selection handle appears at either end of the line. If you're having trouble selecting the line in *Size to Fit* mode, switch to *Show Half Size* or *Show Full Size* mode by pulling down the Special menu or pressing Open apple-3 or Open apple-1, respectively.

With the line selected, press Open apple-M or pull down the Objects menu and choose *Show Specifications*. At the dialog, enter the precise values for horizontal line 1 listed in **Table 1**. Press Return or click on the OK button. The line sizes and positions itself automatically. No question—this method of placing objects saves a lot of mouse dragging and eyestrain.

Select horizontal line 2 and use its *Show Specifications* dialog and the values in **Table 1** to size it and move it into position. Repeat this process for the remaining four horizontal lines. Proceed in the same manner for the three vertical lines.

That's all there is to it! If you're not working in *Size to Fit* mode, switch now. Your easy-aspie calling-card template should look like **Figure 2**. Pull down the File menu (or press Open apple-A), and save this basic layout as **CALNGCARD.TMPLT**, or some other meaningful name.

CHOICES, CHOICES

The sky's the limit when it comes to designing your business card. Thanks to Publish It!'s free-form flexibility, you can place rules, pattern-filled shapes, text areas, or illustrations nearly anywhere within each card's boundaries.






Figure 3. Sample business-card designs.

specifications for the objects in the suggested layouts.

Notice that these examples accommodate the "who, what, where trio," as Krill calls these vital pieces of information. Perhaps more importantly, each offers the visual impact that's crucial to good design. As Krill asserts, "Receivers of cards see hundreds of them every year.... An elegant layout or a catchy graphic can influence a reply.

"My architectural work requires that several design options be offered to clients," Krill adds, "so I try to provide card variations for the business-card purchaser. Once a design is selected, we go back into the file and copy the choice to the other fields."

DUPLICATING EFFORTS

One you've created your final design in one prototype card area, use the pointer to select objects and copy/paste them to the remaining nine card areas on the page. Begin with illustrations and graphics elements—rules and shaded rectangles, for instance. Select an object with the pointer. Press Open apple-C to "copy" a picture of the object into your Apple's memory. Then press Open apple-V to paste a duplicate on screen. Drag the copy into place in the second business-card area. Press Open apple-C and Open apple-V, then drag the next copy onto the third "card," and so on.

Now copy text areas. Initially the copies are devoid of text, but we'll correct this situation shortly. First select the text area. Press Open apple-C, then Open apple-V. Drag the text area into place on card 2. Continue pasting copies of the text area (Open apple-V) onto the remaining business cards.

To transfer the text to these now-empty text areas, scroll back to card 1, place the I-beam within the text area and drag it across all text. Here you have two options: Press Open apple-E, or pull down the Edit menu and choose *Select All*. Either action selects a range of text and inversely highlights it.

Press Open apple-C. Move the I-beam to the empty text area on card 2. Press Open apple-V, and the text should flow into place. Sure beats typing, huh? Now insert the I-beam into card 2 and press Open Apple-V. Continue with this procedure until the text areas on all ten business cards are filled appropriately with information.

Unfortunately, pasting text this way sometimes disrupts formatting options, such as centering, which you may have defined on your prototype card. To correct situations like these, select the text, pull down the Format menu, and reaffirm your choices in the *Justification* dialog.

A LITTLE BACKGROUND

Design options for business or calling cards abound. "Maps (created with Apple's **MousePaint** or another paint program) can add an extra dimension to common name/ address/phone-number cards," Dennis Krill suggests. "A simple map background with cleverly placed text can help others find your place of business."

Ralph Tolbert, an Apple IIGS user and computer teacher at Niles (Ohio) High School, notes that "using **ThunderScan**, your supply of DHR (double-high-resolution) graphics is unlimited. For our school newspaper we scan original cartoon sketches of students, teachers, and sports players."

Another Tolbert technique is digitization of the high school's logo; he alters the shading of the black-and-white scan via ThunderScan software filters, then imports the logo into Publish It! and overlays the graphic with copy contained in a transparent text area.

CREATE CUSTOM PATTERNS

Luckily you don't have to use accessory programs or extra hardware to flex your design muscles. Here's a simple method for creating custom patterns with Publish It! alone.

Onto a business-card area on the template you just created, rubber-band (press the mouse button and drag) a rectangle, round rectangle, or circle with the appropriate shape tool. Pull down the Special menu and select *Define Pattern*. At the dialog, select the rightmost pattern displayed. In the enlarged "sketchpad" area, click each black pixel "off" to erase it, creating a blank 8-by-8-pixel canvas in the process.




Figure 4. Creating custom background pattern.

Now click pixels "on" to create a custom design or logo. **Figure 4** shows a pattern composed of uppercase *Fs*. You can construct any letter of the alphabet—or any small symbol or icon—just as easily. And editing is a breeze: Erase unwanted pixels by clicking on them. When you've finished your pattern, click on the OK button or press Return.

Select the shape you drew previously on your business card, pull down the Objects

menu, and choose Set Fill Pattern. Select the design you created; it's in the lower right-hand corner. Click on OK. The shape on your business card—or in any publication you're designing—fills with the new, tailor-made pattern.

ON THE BORDERLINE

With the text tool, overlay one or more text areas onto the pattern-filled shape. Place the I-beam into these text areas, and type business or club information. Place a border around the text area by pressing Open apple-M and clicking on the *Frame Border* radio button.

To adjust the thickness of the border and the offset (the margin between the border and the text), pull down the Page menu and select *Frame Borders*. At the dialog, select the line thickness and the amount of offset you want. See **Figure 5** for a hypothetical layout using my custom pattern with bordered text areas superimposed on it.

your original basic template's. You don't want to destroy it inadvertently.

ROLL THE PRESSES

Use Publish Iti's double-strike printing mode, a fresh ribbon, and good-quality paper to create a proof of your business-card layout. Set it aside for a few hours before final editing. Make necessary adjustments on screen, save the edited file, and print a final copy.

Take this master printout to your local copy center, and reproduce the original on plain or colored card stock using black or colored toner. Expect to pay about 15 cents for each sheet of card stock or about one and one-half cents for each business or calling card.

You may want to ask the copy shop to cut large batches of cards for you. For small press runs, however, you'd be wiser to invest in an inexpensive paper cutter and cut the cards yourself. Besides, you'll soon discover that a paper cutter, like a mouse, is an indispensable desktop-publishing tool.

HAVE APPLE, WILL PUBLISH

Calling cards represent one traditional approach to promoting business, but they can be equally useful for spreading the word about clubs and organizations. Next time you meet a potential client or prospective club member, get your two cents' worth in—for less than a penny and a half! \Box



TEACHER'S TUTOR

Writing a well-designed program begins with a series of subroutines that handle one specific task at a time.

WRITING A COMPUTER PROGRAM IS A LOT LIKE PUTTING together a jigsaw puzzle. First you break down every task you want the computer to perform into several smaller tasks; then, when you've identified and written all the pieces (*subroutines* in BASIC), you must still put them together to form the complete, functioning program. The advantage of programming over arranging a jigsaw puzzle is that you can control the shapes and sizes of your program's pieces.

Each section, or subroutine, in a program should be a nearly selfcontained module that accomplishes one specific task. One feature common to most well-designed programs is *modularity*. In this month's column, I'll show you how important—and easy—it is to write modular programs. You can use the example I've chosen—a basic educational program—in a variety of applications. Use **Listings 1** and **2** as the basis for programs that test math or English skills; evaluate students' knowledge of astronomy, history, or chemistry; or check pupils' understanding of concepts such as auto mechanics or welding. Only those subroutines that deal with the specific subject material of the program will be unique.

DESIGNING THE PROGRAM

Suppose you've decided to write a program to tutor students in calculating simple geometric areas and volumes. Having decided *what* you want the program to do, you now need to determine *how* to get the program to do it. One easy approach is to imagine yourself doing the same tasks you want the program to perform. Think of the individual events and steps, and write them down in the order in which they occur.

For example, your list might look like the following:

- 1. Student arrives at my desk.
- 2. I greet the student.
- 3. I ask the student if he/she wants to work an area or a volume problem, or let me decide.

- 4. The student answers my question.
- 5. Depending on the student's answer, I: a. make up an area problem
 - b. make up a volume problem
- c. toss a coin, and then do either 5a or 5b
- 6. Present the problem to the student.
- 7. Obtain the student's answer.
- 8. Evaluate the answer and either:
 - a. praise the student for a correct answerb. inform the student that the answer is wrong
- 9. If the answer is wrong and this is the student's first attempt at this problem, I'll provide a hint and go back to step 6.
- 10. If the answer is wrong and this is the student's second attempt, I'll show the student the solution to the problem.
- 11. Now I'll go back to step 3.

Looking over this initial list reveals specific tasks that belong in separate subroutines. Steps 3 and 4 look like a menu (choice selection) subroutine. Steps 5a and 5b are likely candidates for separate subroutines as well, while steps 6 through 10 are clearly defined tasks that belong in their own modules.

MAP IT OUT

Modifications to this list also come to mind. You might want to get the student's name in step 2 along with the greeting. In step 3, you need to offer the choice of quitting the program, and add step 5d, "End of program." You might also want to keep score. You could give a full point or half a point, depending on whether the student solves the problem correctly on the first or second try. This requires some bookkeeping steps, and you must add a scoreboard-display module between steps 8 and 9.

A list, written in everyday English and describing the program's steps, is called *pseudo code*. The list above is a pseudo-code description of the main program (**Listing 1**) used with this article. The accompanying **Figure** is a flowchart of this program and serves as a roadmap or diagram illustrating the sequence of steps outlined in the pseudo code. The flowchart can reveal problems in a program's logic more readily than pseudo code and aid in devising solutions to those problems.

ADDING MENU ITEMS

Listing 1 contains references to ten subroutines. If you run Listing 1 by itself, the program will crash, because it can't execute any GOSUB commands. This program is completely generic, however, for any \blacktriangleright





Figure. Flowchart of program logic for Listing 1.

educational application that presents a menu with four choices: end, select problem-type 1 or problem-type 2, or let the computer select the problem type. All you need to do is add subroutines appropriate to the types of problems you want to generate.

If you want to change the number of problem types to one, change N=2 to N=1 in line 10. Then delete the references to subroutines 3000, 3100, 3110, and 3120 in lines 45, 50, 80, and 90. These changes modify the main program to handle one problem type. To change the main program to handle more than two problem types, change N in line 10 to equal the number of problem types. Then add appropriate subroutine references to the end of the subroutine lists in lines 45, 50, 80, and 90.

SUBROUTINE ORGANIZATION

Of the 12 subroutines the main program calls, all those with line numbers below 1500 can remain unchanged, no matter how many problems types you generate. The only requirement is that you express menu responses and problem answers as numbers (including multiplechoice selections). These all-purpose subroutines include the greeting, input and evaluation of the student's answer, the computer's positive and negative responses, the scoreboard, and the goodbye message. Listing 2 contains these seven subroutines.

The remaining five subroutines include the menu (see Listing 3), two subroutines used to pick the specific problem to be displayed, and two subroutines that contain the actual problems. Listing 4 contains the code for these problems.

HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS

The main program sets D (line 10) to 0.01. D is the +/- percentage of the actual answer that defines the range within which the student's answer must fall. This percentage comes into play for math problems. For example, if D=0.01 and the math problem's solution is 5.83, then the program counts the student's answer correct if it falls within the range 5.83 +/- 0.0583. Line 405 (**Listing 2**) shows how the program uses this.

If the absolute value of the difference between the solution and the student's answer is less than D times the solution, then the student's answer is correct. This subroutine passes K\$ back to the main program as either *OK* or *NO*, indicating whether or not the student solved the problem correctly.

The scoreboard routine (line 1000) uses T, RT, and C, which the main program initializes and uses in lines 20, 40, and 95. T is the total number of different problems worked, and RT is the number of problems worked correctly.

Each problem worked correctly on the first attempt adds one point to RT. If the student works the problem successfully on the second try, after the hint, the program increases RT by 0.5. C is the increment for RT.

MESSAGE BOARD

Before each new problem, the program assigns a value of 1 initially to C. C then decreases to 0.5 after the program displays a hint and to 0.0 if, after two unsuccessful attempts, it must display the problem's solution. You can use the value of C in the program to determine the stage of this process the student has reached for the current problem (line 75). Listing 1. Main program segment for Teacher's Tutor.



After each student response, the program displays a randomly selected message from one of two lists (subroutines 500 and 700). The first line in both subroutines selects a random number between 1 and 5. The second line uses this number, M, to go to the selected message routine, display the message, and return to the pause subroutine (line 150) before returning to the main program. You may change these messages to anything you like.

If you want more messages, include them after line 565 (or 665), being sure to end each new message with a Return. Then change the 5 in line 500 (or 700) to the number of messages you're using, and add the appropriate new line numbers in the ON M GOSUB list in line 505 (or 705).

GIVE ME A HINT

For this example, two different problem types are available. Lines 2000-2990 contain the code for math problems, which can use randomly generated numbers. This lets you create many different problems with a minimum of code. Lines 3000-3990 contain a set of multiple-choice problems. With this type of problem, you must write out each individual question completely within the program.

The subroutines at lines 2000 and 3000 generate a random number to select the question from the set of problems contained between lines 2200-2990 and 3200-3990. If the exercises are math problems, this subroutine also generates the random numbers they use.

Each problem in the 2200-2990 and 3200-3990 blocks is totally selfcontained. First come the lines of code used to display the problem, followed by Return. Then come the lines containing a hint or partial solution to the problem, followed by Return. Last are the lines containing the complete solution to the problem, again followed by Return.

PROBLEMS AND SOLUTIONS

The main program calls line 2100 to display the problem. Because Q, the problem number, already has an assigned value (subroutines 2000 and 3000), lines 2100 and 3100 use an ON Q GOSUB command, directing the program to the appropriate line number to display the problem.

Similarly, when the program must display the hint or solution to problem O, it calls line 2110 (or 3110) or line 2120 (or 3120). These lines also contain an ON Q GOSUB command, directing the program to display the hint or the problem's solution.

TAILOR IT

Follow this same general pattern for the specific problems you write into the program. Be sure to change the problem-count value in the random-number generator from 4 (line 2000) or 5 (line 3000) to the appropriate value for your problem set.

If you have more than two problem sets, put the additional block(s) of lines at intervals of 1000, and pattern them after those in the 2000-2990 or 3000-3990 blocks.

LEARNING PROCESS

Although this program may lack fancy graphics and bells and whistles, its simplicity makes it easy to duplicate and tailor to the field of study you indicate. Its modularity makes it easy for the more advanced programmer to add those extra frills.

The program lacks two important features. As written, it can't handle problems that require text-string input for answers. It also can't keep track of which problems it's already asked. Because of this, a given problem may appear more than once during a tutorial session. My next column will address both of these difficulties.

SHRINKING MARKETS

Why aren't more programmers writing more software, especially in the field of Apple II graphics? Today the only outlets for the small developer are on-line services.

"WHAT ARE YOUR FAVORITE PAINT PROgrams?" During our presentations at AppleFest and other computer shows, we often pose that question to our audience. The answers come rapidly: Dazzle Draw, Paintworks Gold, 816/Paint, DeluxePaint, and so on. But asking, "Who wrote these programs?" almost always brings silence.


Imagine where we'd be without these software authors! But who are they? Why aren't more programmers writing more software, especially in the field of Apple II graphics? Perhaps they are, and perhaps they're facing the same frustrations Mike MacDonald has experienced.

IF AT FIRST YOU DON'T SUCCEED

In 1979 Mike MacDonald, manager of a finance company's data-processing group, developed Apple II loan-negotiation software for independent finance companies. It was relatively successful, and Mike formed his own company, Mint Software, to market the program. He soon realized that selling, training, and support took him away from doing what he did—and enjoyed—best: creating software. So when he couldn't find an Apple II program that would let him present data graphically, he designed one; this time, though, he let an established software company handle the business end of the operation.

Sensible Software marketed **The Graphics Department**, one of the first and finest Apple II business-graphics programs. Mike wrote release 2 shortly thereafter, but ProDOS-based release 3, with USA mapping and 3-D bar charts, never reached the public. Why? Despite rave reviews, Graphics Department sales weren't high enough to justify skyrocketing advertising costs, especially because the Apple II was losing its position as a choice business computer.

Undaunted, Mike developed **Graph Art I**, a portfolio of graphics images with a picturemanagement program that interfaced with the Graphics Department. To Mike's dismay, the only people who knew Graph Art I existed were those who found a promotion inserted into the newer copies of Graphics Department.

Sensible Software, according to Mike, never advertised the program publicly.

Through the years, Mike continued experimenting, exploring, and creating. His last projects, **The Scribe** and **Stretch-a-Sketch**, are clip-art-type programs that'll probably interest most readers.

As you know, most graphics programs store images pixel by pixel (bit mapping). These images look okay in their original sizes or reduced, but when enlarged they get the jaggies. Mike's images, produced on a digitizing tablet with a resolution of 1000 dots per inch, avoid this effect. The Scribe uses 11 graphics fonts and Stretch-a-Sketch uses more than 100 line pictures. The programs are available in standard-hi-res or double-hi-res versions. You can load a graphic you've created with a paint program into either of these applications and place any of their line fonts or pictures on your graphic. When you rotate, move, or scale these images, they retain their integrity and print at your printer's resolution.

TRY, TRY AGAIN

A popular "magazine on disk" was supposed to offer Stretch-a-Sketch as a bonus disk for new subscribers, but the company went into receivership and the deal fell through. Then a major software company worked out a deal with Mike whereby he'd sell exclusive rights to his art library and the technique he used. The company postponed working out the details until it began a new project that was in the planning stage at that time. That project never came to be. Other promising offers also fell through.

Like us, you may remember when someone could write a program, advertise it in one or several—Apple II publications, and if the program was good, reap the rewards of a job well done. Today the only outlets for the small developer are on-line services. And although there's little money to be made from share-

The Sound Graph is the waveform at the bottom of the screen. Portions of the Sound Graph are selected with the mouse and then edited using the cut, copy and paste options within the Edit menu.





NEW PRODUCTS

Let's not finish this column on a down note;


there are still new products to be had. Lynx Computer Products' **Supergraphix 256** is a programmer's utility for GS graphics. Unlike **Iconix**, a similar utility from So What Software, Supergraphix 256 doesn't require you to use PEEK and POKE commands. Instead, it uses the Applesoft ampersand command to tap the GS' graphics power. Supergraphix 256 adds 35 graphics commands and a number of sound commands to Applesoft and lets you do just about anything you might want with the super-hi-res screen.

We haven't put the program through its paces yet, but it looks as though it delivers on its promises. If you want to program superhi-res graphics, but are intimidated by the complexities of Apple IIGS toolbox routines, you might find a save haven here.

Along with Supergraphix 256 came a blurb announcing a product that's still in development. **Color It!** is a paint program that uses the Supergraphix 256 routines and features extensive control of the GS screen. With Color It!, you can use all 16 palettes on the superhi-res screen. You can also control the resolution of each line of the screen, using 640 mode for part of the screen and 320 mode for the remainder. We haven't seen a finished product, so we must reserve judgment, but it looks like an interesting product.


A small booth tucked away at AppleFest/San Francisco last September offered a promising product. SYNnovation, Inc., showed a prototype of a new display adapter, Turborez GS, for the IIGS. 

content of each data field; you must indicate whether data should be taken from a file, a calculation, or the keyboard. Defining a field also specifies format (justification, fixed, dollars, commas, percentage, and so on) and data type (numeric, text, date, or time). After configuring the report fields, press Open apple-G and ReportWriter pulls the required information and saves your reports as text files.

ReportWriter includes several features that facilitate report generation. You'll be able to round numbers, find an inverse, calculate a square root, capitalize the first letter of every word in your text, convert all letters to upperor lowercase, find specified data, import selected paragraphs from designated files, carry out arithmetic operations on dates, insert current time, and perform many other helpful functions.

THE PRICE OF POWER

ReportWriter isn't easy to learn. Although several of the keyboard commands are exactly like those within AppleWorks, others are much less intuitive. For example, if you select Open apple-P—the AppleWorks command to print—you'll get a report showing the definition rules for each field within every record of the report. To get a conventional relational report, you must exit to the ReportWriter main menu and select option 3—*Print text* (ASCII) files—which lists all text files currently on the data disk. Select the appropriate ReportWriter file and the program will print your report.

ReportWriter comes with both $3V_2$ - and $5V_4$ inch disks. You won't need any additional hardware to run it, but—as with all applications in the TimeOut series—you can minimize disk swapping by installing it on a $3V_2$ -inch AppleWorks disk or a hard disk.

ReportWriter adds power and sophistication to your everyday AppleWorks capabilities. Its relational report-generation features and special math and string functions help you perform calculations and text manipulations that weren't possible before. Combined with ReportWriter and the other TimeOut applications, it's no wonder AppleWorks continues to breathe life into the 8-bit Apple II.

MASTER TRACKS PRO GS

n the old days-we're talking early 1980s here-if you wanted to make music with your computer, the Apple II was the only game in town. Then came synthesizer cards, electronic keyboards, and MIDI-the musicalinstrument digital interface that forever changed computer music-and with that Passport Designs' first MIDI sequencers, simulating four- and eight-track tape recorders. They faithfully reproduced what you played on your synthesizer-mistakes and all. Editing was a matter of redoing part of a track by "punching in," a method of overdubbing on the fly. Punching in required tremendous coordination and nerves of steel: You had to hit the correct computer key and a split second later the right keys on your synthesizer or all was



lost. These days, though, the Apple II is a more proficient maestro, thanks to Master Tracks Pro GS.

When you start the program, the first thing you see is a black-and-white graphics screen with just a touch of color. There's a reason for that: Master Tracks Pro GS is a translation of Passport's highly acclaimed Macintosh sequencer. The differences are slight. The Mac version can send system-exclusive messages to a synthesizer; the GS version can't, owing to current limitations of the computer. Unlike many GS-specific programs, however, this one's fast. Files load quickly, screens redraw promptly, and control-button responses range from reasonably fast to instantaneous.

The main screen is divided into the Track Sheet, Song Editor, Conductor, and Transport.

The Track Sheet in the upper left-hand corner of the screen lets you record up to 64 tracks of music. Chances are you won't use that many, but they needn't go to waste. Unused tracks make a handy notepad for sequencer settings, reminders, and so on. The Track Sheet allows for a variety of solo and ensemble playbacks, track looping (continu-

ously playing a short passage such as percussion or bass), and channel or program (synthesizer voice) allocation.

The Conductor window in the lower left corner of the screen shows the current values for tempo, beat, and meter, which you set on a special Conductor track. You can use this feature to change tempo quickly, although more sophisticated tempo and meter settings are handled in the Change Conductor window. You can also make changes in the Conductor Edit window.

In the lower right corner of the screen you'll find the Transport window, which resembles the controls of a tape recorder. Here you can play, record, pause, fast-forward, and reverse. To help you locate a passage precisely, Master Tracks Pro includes both a measure counter which includes MIDI clock settings—and an elapsed time counter. You can play back or record at any point in your song.

You can also "punch in" to edit any section you want. There are two ways to do this double-click on *Punch* to bring up a dialog box that lets you assign in and out locations, or select an area for editing from the Song, Edit, or MIDI data windows.

You don't have to punch in and out to edit unless you want to. If you're a consummate Apple IIGS musician, you can record your entire piece in real time and bask in the glow of success. If you're fallible like the rest of us, however, there are other ways to handle MIDI. You can record a piece at a slower tempo, then play it back faster; you can also try note-by-note entry. If you prefer, you can



even "draw" the notes in the Step Editor.

You'll do the majority of your editing with the Song Editor, which displays every track of your piece in the upper right-hand portion the screen. Select the areas you want to edit with the mouse, then cut, copy, and paste sections from a single track or an entire sequence. You can insert empty measures, renumber measures, and place song markers, which let you skip instantly to that part of a song.

Song markers have another function, as well. You can combine a number of completed sequences into one large file and insert a marker with the title of the song and any pertinent notes at the beginning of each piece. Depending on the amount of memory in your computer, Master Tracks Pro can play dozens—even hundreds—of sequences as if they were a single song. For selective playback, you can use the markers to tab different sections.

A quick way to get acquainted with the Master Tracks Pro sequencer is to record a simple musical phrase, then play with it. Once the melody is on track 1, go to the Song Editor, copy the track, and paste it to tracks 2 and 3. Now insert two blank measures at the beginning of track 2, and four blank measures at the beginning of track 3. You've just created three-part harmony.

Paste three more tracks into the song. Open Quantize and slide one track 48 clocks to the right for a quarter-note delay. Now you've got an echo. Assign a wispy little synthesized voice to that one. Slide another track six clocks to the right for a reverb. Give that one a rich lead voice. Transpose another track down two octaves and assign a bass voice to it.

Now you're ready to play it back. Does it need more dynamics? No problem—open the Change window and select *velocity*, the control that makes a synthesizer play more loudly or softly. You can make changes by measure, by phrase, or throughout an entire piece.

Want to change voices in the middle of a measure? Open the Program Change window—a few mouse clicks and it's done. Now try drawing a few slides in *Pitch Bend*. If you don't like the way it sounds, click on *Undo*. Make all the changes you like. Master Tracks Pro does windows—lots of them. In addition to the ones already mentioned, there's a window for channel pressure, key pressure, modulation, and MIDI controllers.

If you think your creation is sounding pretty

good, try selecting Humanize to make it sound less like a machine and more like a live performance. Humanize lets you randomize start times, durations, and velocities. Tiny increments-shifting a clock or two-work best here, and the results are amazing.

Master Tracks Pro GS accepts input from other sequencers, and allows data stripping and "unmerging." It's also compatible with external SMPTE-to-MIDI sync devices, which let you synchronize music with videotape or film.

So how long will it take you to learn this program-weeks, maybe months? The learning curve is surprisingly easy. Master Tracks Pro GS is intuitive and the manual is clear and concise. My only quibble with the documentation is the lack of an index.

If you've never used a sequencer before, you should be up and running in a day or two, and up to speed within a week. If you're familiar with sequencers, you'll be recording within minutes.

Master Tracks Pro GS is the premier sequencer for the Apple II. Its ease of use and multitude of professional features are unexcelled. If you're serious about your music, this is a must buy.

andscape is to property planning what a spreadsheet is to financial forecasting: It lets you see the way your home would look within any of the infinite number of landscape you can design. A selection of 46 different tree and shrub icons; special icons representing fences, fountains, and so on; and powerful drawing and painting modules for creating steps, sidewalks, and flower beds give you complete freedom of design.

Landscape for the GS is another conversion from the Design Your Own Home series originally produced for the Apple IIe and IIc.

Once again, the upward move to the GS has brought an increase in speed, more options (including color printing), and a friendlier interface.

Anyone familiar with the Design Your Own Home series will know what to expect when they start up Landscape. The package includes more than two dozen sample plans featuring a variety of home styles, such as Spanish, contemporary, traditional ranch, colonial, and Victorian.

If you'd rather start from scratch, however, the process is pleasant, simple, and intuitive. Begin by creating an outline of your house as it would appear from above. This top view is basically a rectangle in the appropriate size and shape. Add windows and doors in corresponding locations. After completing the rough draft of your house, move outside and plant trees, shrubbery, sidewalks, steps, and flowers. Add finishing touches, such as different plant colors, textures, or sizes, and modify the house itself.

Modifications are usually simple because Landscape GS uses an object-oriented interface activated by a combination of keyboard

and mouse commands. You can call up every icon in Landscape by pressing a single letter key by itself or with the option key. Once you get them on screen, you can activate and manipulate icons with the mouse.

During any stage of creation, you can view your landscape from five perspectives—north, south, east, west, and above. Selecting the viewing perspective is simply a matter of clicking on the directional arrow icon. Landscape automatically reorients your design.

All tree and shrub icons are sized to indicate a plant at half its mature age. Whenever you select a plant with the mouse, an Age window appears, complete with scroll bar. By adjusting the scroll bar in either direction, you can make the plant younger or older. The icon will adjust its size accordingly.

Landscape also features some impressive printing options. You can use an ImageWriter or a LaserWriter and select sizing, quality, orientation, and several special options. You can assign and print unique identification numbers that correspond to a plant information list—each plant's name, number reference, and size.

Even the best-laid plans require some finetuning. Landscape provides ten powerful editing commands, accessible from pull-down menus at the top of the screen. Three commands in particular provide extra versatility and editing ease.

Select All lets you choose every object in the drawing. For example, if you want to provide yourself with another ten yards of front lawn,

you might use the *Select All* command in conjunction with the measuring devices and distance finder on screen, and move all objects back 10 yards. What if you want to move 75 percent of the objects? Before using *Select All*, choose the *Lock* command to anchor the objects you don't want to move.

Another command that comes in handy is Change House. You can create an entire landscape around one type of house and then see how another home would look within the same design. You can still edit a substitute house, just as if you had drawn it originally.

Other editing options let you group and separate objects, and cut and paste objects on screen. A program like this wouldn't be complete without some way to provide labels, as well. You can use six different fonts, any of six type styles, and a variety of type sizes to label elements of your design.

The program's Arrange function simplifies

your text placement. Simply choose your options from the horizontal and vertical boxes that appear in the *Arrange Text* window and Landscape does the rest. You can leave your text as is, or place it automatically to the left, center, right, top, or bottom of your page. You can display or hide rulers; display measurements needed for calculations; scale and rescale objects or entire screens; even change the slope of the ground by up to 30 degrees.

You can further enhance Landscape's versatility by adding Abracadata's Regional Image Libraries, five add-ons containing regionspecific trees and other landscape items.

If there's anything disappointing about Landscape, it's the relative simplicity of the home drawings in the sample plans. Considering that Landscape is GS-specific, you might expect highly detailed, colorful images. What you get is more akin to a collection of bland stick drawings. For those who don't have the inclination to use the powerful House Painting program included with Landscape, the predrawn illustrations might be a letdown. On the other hand, the unadorned sample homes are perfect for someone who wants to create an exact replica of his or her existing home or a dream home without having to undo someone else's idea.

Landscape will appeal to both casual and professional designers. It's simple enough for novices and powerful enough if you're serious about landscape design.

RENAISSANCE IN EDUCATION

By DAVID D. THORNBURG, Ph.D.

ONE OF THE BYPRODUCTS OF THE assembly-line model of education is one fiction with tremendous negative impact: the idea that knowledge can be divided into neat, distinct classifications called "subjects"—math, history, language arts, and so on.

Each one is often presented as if it were isolated from the others. It's as if education had gathered up the fabric of human existence and shredded it into small pieces, with no hint as to how the student is to reassemble those parts into the wholeness of life.

NATURAL ORDER

Fortunately, some teachers realize the danger of this artificial separation and go out of their way to make sure they point out relationships whenever possible.

For example, an astute biology instructor might ask students to examine the spiral patterns of pine cones. Each cone has two sets of spirals running in opposite directions; by counting in each direction, students might find that one cone has three lefthanded and five right-handed spirals. Still another might have five left and eight right.

The biology teacher might then point out that the two numbers are adjacent Fibonacci numbers from the series 1, 1, 2, 3, 5, 8, 13, and so on. Furthermore, students might discover that the ratio of these number pairs approaches the Golden Mean as the numbers increase. The teacher could also use other plants with spiral patterns, such as sunflowers and artichoke hearts, to extend this exercise, bringing the beauty of mathematics into the study of biology.

PUTTING IT ALL TOGETHER

Activities like this, and the joy they bring to teacher and student alike, help heal the rift in an educational process that has reflected for more than a century a philosophy of separation.

Current educational buzzwords, such as *whole-language approach*, on the other hand, reflect recent attempts to rebuild a holistic framework for knowl-

edge. Unlike Humpty Dumpty, we *can* put the pieces together again—and the computer can be our ally.

TRAVELS WITH MY APPLE

A year or so ago, I had the pleasure of visiting Venice, where I spent hours photographing the floor of St. Mark's Cathedral. If that seems like a strange way to spend time, you need to know that I love geometry, and the tile patterns on that floor are spectacular.

As I looked at those intricate geometric wonders, I wished I had some students with me—we could travel through Italy and study history, art, math, science, and music without thinking about where one subject ended and another began. I had visions of us sitting in the plaza outside the cathedral, using Logo on our laptop Apple IIs to re-create the tile patterns we'd seen.

Some students would be capturing their impressions of the city in poetry, while others would be creating a database on the Renaissance. On their return home, they'd put together a multimedia presentation that would teach what they'd learned to those who hadn't been able to be there in person.


That sort of adventure isn't available to most students, but let's not abandon the underlying idea. Any teacher with an Apple II and a desire to design an integrated educational program can do it. 

its spectacular landscape, he or she might encourage students to imagine themselves as members of an ancient tribe of Native Americans—the Ohlones, for instance. Student research on this tribe would allow them to think about the rich civilization these people enjoyed during the period when the pyramids were being built halfway around the world in Egypt.

IN THE WILD

As they learned more about this ancient people, students might also learn how to identify animals from their tracks.

The program Animal Trackers, for instance, from Sunburst Communications (39 Washington Avenue, Pleasantville, NY 10570, 914-769-5030, \$65), provides clues from which students must identify a particular animal. Because the program supports databases for grasslands, deserts, and wooded areas, you can use it all over the country.

Each clue offers information of a different sort—habitat, nesting habits, food, and footprint. After working with the program awhile, students learn a great deal about animals as well as hone their higher-order thinking skills.

This activity provides an opportunity for the teacher to integrate science and social studies.

EXPLORATION

As the year proceeds, students might come to see a new animal the Spanish explorers on horseback—through different eyes, as strange creatures with two heads and six legs.

At this point, some students might want to retain the Native American perspective, while others might join forces with Portolá or Father Serra during the colonization of California.

Later on in the course, the teacher might show the film *Dream West*, a dramatization of the life of John Charles Frémont as he explored the continent and paved the way for the United States to expand its boundaries.


At this point, students could use the simulation program **Oregon Trail**, from MECC (3490 Lexington Avenue North, St. Paul, MN 55126, 612-481-3500, \$59 school, \$39.95 home), to see how well they might fare in their own journey across the country in a covered wagon.

The software not only reflects the tremendous challenge of such a trip, but hones problem-solving skills, as well, as each player makes life-or-death decisions regarding food, camping locations, travel during inclement weather, dealing with hostile environments, and so on.

A PROCESS OF HEALING

The personal computer running simulation programs can be a wonderful tool for healing a broken curriculum. We have the technology and the software; do we have the courage to use them effectively? It's up to you.

DECISION MAKER

By David Leithauser and Sandra Jones

OME DECISIONS IN LIFE ARE SIMPLE, SUCH AS chocolate ice cream versus vanilla. Others, such as right from wrong, are much more complicated. Decision Maker can help you determine the correct path to follow, whether simple or complex.

Type in the accompanying **Program listing** and SAVE it as Decision. Maker. When you RUN it, the program first asks you to state your question: "Which vacation spot?" for instance. Then Decision Maker asks the number of choices you have, and prompts you to label each one.

Let's say you're interested in vacationing in Florida, New Zealand,

or Peoria. In this instance you'd type 3. The program then asks the number of pertinent factors that will determine your decision. In this example, time, expense, and fun might figure into it. Decision Maker then groups these criteria into two types: costs and benefits. Time and expense might be your two cost criteria, while fun is a benefit.

Decision Maker lists all the determinants and prompts you to list the most important one. You then rate all other criteria on a scale

of 1 to 100. For example, if expense is the most important criterion here, the program rates it as 100 automatically. Deciding that the fun factor is about half as important as expense, you'd give it a rating of 50. Travel time might not be very important, so it would earn a rating of 10.

Finally, Decision Maker asks you to enter criteria values for each choice. Some will be actual, such as the cost of traveling to each of the three vacation spots; others will be subjective or relative, such as those you assign for fun. If you decide that Florida's the most enjoyable spot, for instance, give it a fun value of 100. If you don't consider Peoria very exciting, assign a fun value of 25.

After you've entered all your information, the program takes that big step you've been avoiding-making a decision. It does so by analyzing ▶





GOOD MORNING, MCGEE

UN'S UP, IT'S EARLY IN THE MORNING, AND McGEE'S awake. Sshhh . . . Mom's still sleeping and there's a whole house to explore, so let's have some fun.

Lawrence Productions' McGee is a delightful little character who's bound to appeal to any child from 2–32. The name *McGee*, combined with the character's appearance and voice, lends an asexual quality that won't put off either boys or girls.

Your child wakes up with McGee in the bedroom and can go anywhere from there. Wander into the bathroom or Mom's bedroom; roam into the living room or kitchen; step outside into the backyard. As you travel along with McGee, you'll always have four choices to explore. Simply point to an option, click the mouse, and McGee goes into action—bouncing a ball, giving the dog a bone, playing in the tire swing, or even waking Mom up. Each scene is beautifully animated and sounds like the real thing: The cat meows, the dog barks, the swing creaks, and Mom says, "Good morning, McGee."

McGee has no menus or words—nothing that could intimidate a child. When it's time to insert the program's second disk, McGee's cherubic little voice asks you to "please put in disk 2." The disks are clearly labeled with the numerals *1* and *2*, so most kids should be able to make the right selection. If yours needs a little help, you can color the disk labels.

There's no winning or losing in McGee, no points or time limits to worry about. Your child simply takes mouse in hand and guides McGee about the house to examine whatever he or she desires. In the quality of its exploration, McGee's similar to Activision's CD-ROM product Manhole. Click on what you want to investigate, then just keep looking around. It's a refreshing, noncompetitive approach to software.

"At AppleFest in San Francisco, there were kids at the Lawrence Productions booth showing their parents how to explore the world of McGee," says Review Editor Lafe Low. "They were having a blast.

"For something as simple as McGee," Low adds, "the benefits are plentiful. Kids will feel a sense of accomplishment being able to use the computer; they'll get a charge out of exploring the house; and they'll develop some eye/hand coordination by using the mouse. Most of all, they'll have fun. That's the all-important part."

"The only good thing about being a yuppie is that everything I do turns out to be a trend," says Paul "Poppa" Statt. "Just about the time my wife has a baby, I start to see great software for preschoolers and McGee goes to the head of its class. It's simple; it's fast; the pictures and sounds are great. I can't imagine a kid not liking McGee."


