Minutes from Nov 90 Meeting

The November 1990 meeting of the Rhein-Neckar Apple Users Group (RNAUG) was held at 1900 hours, 8 November 1990, at the Multi-Purpose Room, Patrick Henry Village Middle School. Forty-four persons attended the meeting.

The meeting was opened by RNAUG President, Wes Sisson. The first item of official business was an introduction of the RNAUG officers in attendance. Wes then announced the RNAUG special events for the evening: First, our annual yard sale with ridiculously low prices and secondly, a display and demonstration of Apple's three new Macintosh computers, the Macintosh Classic, the Macintosh LC, and the Macintosh IIsi. In addition, two new 12" monitors were on display.

The public domain disk-of-the-month for November was Disk A-03 from the BRCC library and features Cat. Text, PS. Upgrader, Type Changer, and Label Maker. Wes reminded members that the monthly disk is free, however, we ask that the member provide us with a blank disk or \$1.00. Wes also had catalog listings of the various RNAUG public domain disks available for members.





This months' meeting will see the election of your new officers. Enclosed in this months newsletter is a ballot. Please be sure to return it


by mail as soon as possible.

PRODUCT UPDATES

Although this item is not an update, it looks exciting and deserves mention



in our newsletter. According to the October 1990 edition of "inCider," (page 21 under "Apple Bits," three Beagle Bros - Alan Bird, John Oberrick, and Rob Renstrom - have joined together in a new company called WestCode. Their first product is "InWords," a neat optical character-reading program that works with any scanner to create AppleWorks word processor, database, or spreadsheet files or as an ASCII text files from printed words. This optical character-recognition (OCR) program for the Apple IIe and IIGS lets you scan up to 3000 characters per minute. - a lot faster than anyone can type. According to Oberrick, WestCode has "established the feasibility of OCR technology in both the 8-bit and 16-bit environment of the Apple II." WestCode expected INWORDS to be available in Sep 90 for \$129.00. The program lets you use your Quickie (Vitesse) or LightningScan (Thunderware) scanner. 
